NEW YORK, May 25, 1870.

Wall street has shown no essentially new feature since our last report (12th inst.) The two last weekly statements of the City banks, showing an aggregate increase of nearly \$3,300,000 in the excess over their legal reserve, have again been favorable to a continuance of the monetary ease. Rates of interest for call loans on stock collaterals range from 3 to 6 per cent, the latter being the exceptional rate on inferior collaterals. Owing at the same time to the prevailing dullness of general trade, lenders have some difficulty in employing their balances at the ruling rates, and in some instances placed them at 2½ per cent. Commercial paper has been scarce and in good request: country banks being, of late, prominent as buyers; choice names pass at 5@6½ per cent; inferior at 7@10.

Rates of Foreign Exchange have again been advanced; commercial and bond bills being scarce. To-day's quotations are on the basis of sterling: 60 days' commercial, 109½@109¾; bankers', 109¾; sight, 110½.

The Gold market has, of late, been repeatedly affected by sensational and contradictory despatches from Washington, in regard to the Currency and Funding bills. The premium has fluctuated between 115½ and 113½. At the time of our writing, gold is selling at 114½.

Alteration by Chemical process of a Bank Check. Defying Experts.

On the 25th inst., a man by the name of Coleman obtained from Messrs. Ernst & Crest, of Whitehall street, a check for \$20 on the Chatham National Bank. On the same afternoon he presented to Henry Arthur, 83 Gold street, in payment for one hundred dollars worth of leather, a check for \$400, of Ernst & Crest upon the Chatham National Bank. It was sent to the bank to see if correct, and certified without hesitation. Sent the second time for closer inspection, and again pronounced genuine. Mr. Arthur was suspicious, and forwarded the check to Messrs. Ernst & Crest, when the forgery was discovered. All of the original writing except the signature had been obliterated by some chemical process, of which no trace whatever could be found. Coleman was arrested and lodged in the Station house.

The treasure shipments overland from San Francisco to New York, during the past week, amount to \$150,000 in coin.

Accompanying the report of the Finance Committee of the bill to reduce taxation Senator Sherman on the 19th inst. submitted a table showing the internal revenue taxes collected in the United States for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1869, the amounts of such as are repealed and the amounts that are retained:

Repealed by this bill—Salaries of United States officers and employees, \$561,968; special taxes on banks and bankers, \$1,139,462; other special taxes, \$8,801,455; gross receipts, \$6,300,993; sales, \$8,206,839; income, about, \$14,000,000; legacies, \$1,234,837; successions, \$1,189,756; schedule A, \$882,860; passports, \$29,452; miscellaneous, \$1,240,150. Total, \$13,597,774.

Taxes retained—Spirits, \$45,026,402; tobacco, \$23,430,768; fermented liquors, \$6,099,780; banks and bankers, \$2,196,054; income, about, \$20,229,593; stamps, \$16,420,710; gas, \$2,116,006; penalties collected, \$877,088; excess of gaugers' fees, \$44,829. Total, \$116,441,570.

The efforts of numerous individuals at Washington, in and out of the government service, to add somewhat to their incomes by obtaining for a trifling consideration the agency of National banks, has raised such a swarm of bank attorneys as materially to interfere with the satisfactory transaction of business in the Currency Bureau that the Comptroller has been impelled to issue a circular requesting National banks to confer agency appointments only upon those who make this business a specialty. Many persons have distributed their circulars proffering to serve as attorneys for the paltry sum of five dollars per annum, and there seems to be not a few banking institutions which are ready to employ the cheapest agencies, some of which will probably prove dear enough, should the hint of Commissioner Hulburd not be heeded.

As stated on the faces thereof, coupons of five per cent notes are payable by the United States only when presented with the notes attached, and are absolutely void if detached from the notes except by an authorized officer of the Government. The object of this stipulation was the prevention of fraud upon the Government and the public; it having come to the knowledge of the Treasury Department that parties had, in the case of notes somewhat similar, detached the coupons from the notes; passed the latter at their full face value; and, as the coupons matured, claimed and obtained payment of them; by this means obtaining payment of interest to a certain date on a principal which they had received, it may be months or years previously.

There can be no regular rules laid down which will furnish an infallible test for the detection of counterfeit money. Careful comparison of suspected notes with those known to be genuine, familiarity with the different issues of money, and quick natural discernment are some of the necessary qualifications. At the present time, parties cannot be too careful in the handling of \$10s and \$20s of National bank notes, as there appears to be large quantities of these denominations in circulation, and a majority of them are exceedingly well executed, and are likely to deceive even good judges.

Postmasters, according to the regulations of the Post Office Department, are not required to receive minted currency in payment for post office stamps or stamped envelopes. Such currency is redeemable by the Treasurer of the United States, and by no other officer.

It is announced at Washington that the special fund created by the purchase of bonds now amounts to \$80,586,200, and the sinking fund to \$33,842,900, showing a total of \$114,429,100, or absolutely that the public debt has been reduced the latter amount by the present Administration.

A firm styling themselves "Moore & Co." purporting to have a "bank" at 619 and 621 Broadway, who have been sending letters over the country, stating that they had over \$100,000 in bills of their own bank that they wished to circulate before a certain date, and offering them at the rate of \$20 for \$100 are frauds.

The following explanations of some of the phraseology used in transactions "on Exchange," taken from "Men and Mysteries of Wall Street," by Jas. K. Medberry, will, no doubt, be of interest to many of our readers.

"A 'break' in the market. Where stock is kept up by artificial means, and a money stringency, or similar cause, makes it difficult to carry the load, the attack of a bear clique or the actual inability of holders will produce a decline in value. The market 'breaks' down.

"Ballooning. To work up a stock far beyond its intrinsic worth, by favorable stories, fictitious sales, or other cognate means.

"To 'buy in.' The act of purchasing stock in order to meet a 'short' contract, or to enable one to return stock which has been borrowed.

"Carrying' stock. To hold stock with the expectation of selling it at an advance.

"Clique. A combination of operators, controlling vast capital, in order to unduly expand or break down the market.

"Corners. When the market is oversold, the shorts, if compelled to deliver, find themselves in a 'corner.'

"Collateral. Any kind of Wall street values given in pawn, when money is borrowed.

"Cover," to 'cover one's shorts. Where stock has been sold and the market rises, the seller buys where he can, in order to protect himself on the day of delivery.

"Forcing Quotations is where brokers wish to keep up the price of a stock, and to prevent its falling out of sight.

"Holding the market is to buy sufficient stock at the boards to keep the price from declining.

"Load. To 'load' one's self with stock is to buy heavily.

"Long in stocks. When a man is carrying stock for a rise.

"Milking the street. The act of cliques or great operators who hold certain stocks so well in hand that they cause any fluctuations they please. By alternately lifting and depressing shares, they take all the floating money in the market.

"Pool. The stock and money contributed by a clique to carry through a corner.

"Short. When one has sold stock.

"Teist on the shorts. A clique phrase used where the shorts have sold heavily, and the market has been artificially raised, compelling them to sell at ruinous rates.

"To unload. is to sell out stock which has been carried for some time

"Washing, is where one broker arranges with another to buy a certain stock when he offers it for sale. The bargain is fictitious, and the effect, when not detected, is to keep it quoted, and, if the plotters buy and sell the stock to a high figure, to afford a basis for bona fide sales.

"Watering a stock is the hydraulic artifice employed by modern managers to double the quantity of a stock without improving its quality."

On the return of General Schenck from Ohio the Ways and Means Committee will proceed with the consideration of the Funding bill. The impression seems to be general with the members that four per cent will be the uniform rate of interest agreed upon by the committee in the bill which they will report. Whether this will be sustained by the House remains to be seen. It does not meet the approval of the Secretary of the Treasury, for the reason that he does not think that the debt can be funded at so low a rate.

Counterfeit Tobacco Stamps.

The points of difference between the counterfeit and the genuine stamp are so marked as to be easily detected by the glass. They are as follows:

FIRST: The imprint in the counterfeit is badly engraved, and a trifle larger than the genuine. The words "Continental Bank Note Co., New York," in the genuine are small, distinct, and not connected, each letter standing separate, while in the counterfeit the letters are heavier, and more crowded, larger, and closer together, and in the word "Continental" the "I" joins the "n," making the "I" and "n" look like an "m," with a period at the end of the imprint in the counterfeit, which is omitted in the genuine.

SECOND: In the sky of the counterfeit, over the mane of the horse, will be observed four small dots: in the genuine the sky is made of straight lines.

THIRD: The ornaments resembling small stars on each side of the vignette in the lathe work of the counterfeit, look imperfect and blurred, while in the genuine they appear bright.

FOURTH: Over the white faced figure "6" on the left side of the stamp in the genuine is a small black figure, a part of the lathe work pattern which is wanting in the counterfeit, and the imitation lathe work of the counterfeit has a muddy appearance, while in the genuine the patterns are clear and distinct.

NEW COUNTERFEITS.

Every counterfeit that has ever been made has one or more mistakes in it. Our aim is to show what that mistake is.

FIRST NAT. BK, Philadelphia, Pa.

10s, imitation. Well executed and a very dangerous counterfeit. This is the second 10 on this bank, and all the omissions on the first plate are corrected in this issue.

ONEIDA NATIONAL BK, Utica, N. Y.

20s, imitation. The paper is rather poor, the shading irregular, impression imperfect. The child on the lap of the Indian girl, on back of the bill is very indistinct. Dangerous.

50 CENT FRACTIONAL CURRENCY.

New Issue—A very good counterfeit. The portrait of Lincoln is coarser and darker than the genuine, and the lathe work in the centre of the die is also darker.

20s, imitation. The paper is rather poor, the shading irregular, and impression imperfect, but it is a very dangerous counterfeit. The words "New York," read "Mew York."

MARKET NAT. BANK, N. Y. CITY

20s, imitation. Well done and very likely to deceive. The green ink is darker than on the genuine.

5s, GREENBACKS.

The green ornamental engraving, lengthwise of the bill, in the counterfeit, is of a paler color than in the genuine, and has a brighter look than the dark green of the original. Seen under the microscope the engraving is coarse, but to the naked eye the bills have a very good appearance.

10s GREENBACKS.

The engraving is coarse. The vignette of Lincoln is a very indifferent engraving, and the scroll work around the medallion is poorly imitated. Letter C, twenty-third series.

10s, GREENBACKS.

An excellent imitation of the genuine. Note the following discrepancies. In the genuine, the shading around the 10 in the medallion appears like a fine net work, and runs close up to the figures. In the counterfeit, the shading is "picked up," and becomes coarser as it reaches the figures, forming a light streak or circular haze. Another test is on the figure 10 within the light circle. The genuine has three and one-third dots on the left on the fig. 10, while the counterfeit has but three. Thus:

But the surest test is under the left wing of the eagle. The genuine has FOUR DISTINCT ROWS OF FEATHERS under the wing, while in the counterfeit the rows of feathers are undefined. One issue of this counterfeit is of the new series, letter D, No. 53; another is letter D, with a small 5 under the D, No. 23. These counterfeits are the best we have ever seen.

Newer issues have appeared lately, in which the defects above referred to have been corrected. We would advise our patrons to refuse all tens, greenbacks, unless they know the parties from whom they receive them.

20s, GREENBACKS.

A dangerous counterfeit. Green ink a good color, but the paper too yellow. Principal defect is the die. No clear and distinct lines around the 20. Looks more like a collection of several spots. Female well done, but the face rather coarser than the genuine.

50s, GREENBACKS.

Imitation. Observe the figures 50 on back of the bill around the margin. The 5 in the imitation runs into the 0 on the lower left corner, and reads 50 instead of 50. The buttons on Hamilton's vest which are very distinct in genuine are scarcely discernable in the counterfeit. Genuine has FIVE while in the counterfeit you can hardly see FOUR. The note is dated March 10th, 1863. We would advise our patrons to scrutinize carefully all \$50 Treasury Notes, unless they know the parties from whom they receive them.

FRACTIONAL CURRENCY.

Old Issue.

50s, imit., the portraits of Washington differs one from another; in the genuine they are all alike; the green color looks light and pale.

25s, imit., well executed. Look out.

2d Issue.

10s, imitation. All gen. on the top has the word "Depositories," the imitation reads "Depositories."

50s, imit., have a pale slate color. The small barrels on lower right corner are very indistinct. The gen. have six barrels perfectly clear and plain. Three on lower row, two on next, and one on top. The counterfeit barrels are black, and gen. are white.

50s raised from 5s.

3d Issue.

50c. imit.; two kinds of the new long 50 cent currency. The imitation of one kind has DISINTEGRATED on upper right corner instead of DESIGNATED. The second kind has designated correctly spelt, but on the little American Shield, under the Eagle, there is a black line drawn across the upright bars of the shield. Not so on the genuine.

25s, imit., are very pale and coarse. The letter G in cents on left end is smaller than the other letters, and too far off.

New Issue.

25, imitation. Above the words "Treasury Department," on the bottom of the bill in the genuine there is a fine dotted line—the counterfeits have a straight line.

Notice the shading of the "25" on the back of the note. The genuine is dark, while the counterfeits is very pale, and very little darker than the other green. The word "of" on the face of the genuine appears thus—"of"—on the counterfeit "of."

25s, imit., well executed, but may be detected by the absence of a period (.) after the word Treasurer under Spinner's name; the work is better than any we have previously seen and liable to deceive unless carefully examined.

25s, well executed; head of Chittenden; where it reads "Furnished only by the Assistant Treasurers" the Assistant is spelt "Assistatn." In the genuine the shading of the letter "E" in "Five" is unbroken, while the counterfeit has a little notch in it.

50s, well executed. The engraving on the face of the note is excellent. The adverse is slightly blurred. The notes are an eighth of an inch narrower than the genuine.

50s, the "y" in "Colby's" name crosses a line of the coat in the genuine, but not in the counterfeit.

50s, the line of stars on counterfeit between the figures "50" at the top and bottom of the back of the note have white centres, while the entire stars on genuine are in green. The reading in black on the genuine note clear and distinct, while on the counterfeit the bronze is printed on the black, the words "FIFTY CENTS" being almost obliterated.

50s, well done. The last "e" in the signature of F. E. Spinner is omitted in some, and the (.) after print. on one end, and the d. after March 30.

50s. New and dangerous counterfeits of the last issue of the fifty cent fractional currency notes, which bear upon their face the head of Treasurer Spinner, have been detected by the Treasury Department. It can be detected by the absence of a period (.) after the word print on the right end, and also under the letter "d" in "March 3d," on the left end. The paper is thicker than that of the genuine notes, and the general appearance is calculated to deceive unless closely inspected.

COUNTERFEIT 7.30 BONDS.

The seal is slightly larger than the genuine; the red ink with which it is stamped is a shade lighter, and the points projecting from the seal are blurred and a little longer than the genuine. The imprint at the bottom of the face of the bond is set different in the margin, there being more space given it than in the genuine. The borders of the ornamental litho work are blurred and somewhat indifferently executed. The figures denoting the bond are slightly uneven, while the blue ink in which they are printed is a duller blue and lacks the metallic glossy appearance of the genuine.

5s—vlg. Columbus discovering America, on lower left end; right end, Columbus introducing America to Europe, Asia and Africa, countries represented by female figures. Other side—vlg., landing of Columbus.

10s—vlg. Franklin drawing lightning from the clouds—Allegorical representation of Genius of America, a female figure upon an eagle in the clouds grasping a thunderbolt. Other side—vlg., De Soto discovering the Mississippi.

20s—vlg. Battle of Lexington. Allegorical representation of Loyalty, figure of Liberty in foreground, bearing national ensign; farmers, artisans, &c., rallying around the flag. Other side—Baptism of Pocahontas.

50s—vlg. Washington crossing the Delaware. Allegorical representation, Prayer for Victory. Other side—Embarkation of the Pilgrims.

100s—vlg. Battle of Lake Erie. Allegorical representation, Maintenance of Liberty and Nationality. Other side—Declaration of Independence.

500s, vlg. right end, arrival of the Sirius, 1838—left end, female sitting on a gun overlooking the sea, steamship in distance. Other side—surrender of General Burgoyne.

1000s—right end, Capitol of Washington—left end, Gen. Scott entering the City of Mexico. Other side, Washington resigning his commission.

GREENBACKS.

1s, upper left end, a large oval portrait of Chase; 1 in green below—right end, 1 in a fancy die; signatures of Treasurer of United States and Register of Treasury on a green tint below; a strip of black lathe-work between signatures.

2s, lower left centre, a large oval portrait of Alexander Hamilton—left end, 2 on a die; 11 below on a green die; right end, 2 on a die; signatures below on a green tint separated by two strips of black lathe-work.

5s, in centre, FIVE DOLLARS across a green 5 and die work—right end, an oval male portrait; left end, female statue erect, with sword and shield, on a black ground work—fancy green back.

10s, upper center, eagle on a shield; 10 in green die each side; a strip of green lathe work below—right end, female erect by pedestal holding tablet, etc.—left end a large oval portrait of President Lincoln—fancy green back.

20s, in center, a female erect, with sword and shield, between figures 20 and two green dies; figure 20 each side—TWENTY DOLLARS across each end in green die work—fancy green back.

50s left centre, oval portrait of Hamilton; Treasury die in pink on right of die; 50 on die on each end of note.

100s, upper left centre, large spread eagle sitting on a rock; Treasurer's die in pink and 100 in green die on right of vlg.—right upper corner 100 on a black die—lower left corner 100 on a black die.

500s, in centre, portrait of Albert Gallatin encircled in a green die—right end, 500; FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS below—left end same as right.

1000s, in centre, portrait of Robert Morris in green circle—right end M with 1000 across it; ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS on a green die below—left end, same as right.

may be a counterfeiter's dodge to have it described and alter it afterwards.

5s, imit., this bill is well calculated to deceive, and the only difference we can detect is in the die on the right end enclosing the figure 5. The genuine has three black circles enclosing the 5. The imit. has only two, and on lower right end figure 5, and on left end series 90.

10s. Paper very light, and the green ink of a lighter shade. Dated March 10th, 1862.

10s ult'd from 1s, portrait of Chase on left.

10s imit. There are 16 small X's on upper right margin, and only 15 on the genuine. The words "Printed by the National Bk Note Co." on lower left margin extends over 9 of the X's on imit. and 8 on the genuine.

10s, imit., has 14 small x's on upper right margin—15 on left. The gen. has 15 x's each side of engraver's name. Portrait of Pres. Lincoln is very coarse and pale looking; imit. are dated Washington, March 19, 1862, letter C.

20s, very close imit. of gen., the engraving is good, in the center figure the foot of the female can scarcely be seen. On the left end bottom are the words "Payable at the Treasury of the U. S. at New York." The A's in payable are too small and uneven. The letter 'I' in the word 'The' is not crossed in the centre. The imprint is defective; the green ink is of too light a color.

50s, alt'd from 2s, portrait of Hamilton on left centre. The vignettes of the two-dollar and fifty-dollar Treasury note are the same. Ingenious persons are counterfeiting the body of the fifties and using the vignettes of the twos, producing a note that deceives experts.

50s, imit. observe the figures 50 on back of the bill around the margin, the 5 in the imit. runs into the 0, gen. does not. The word 'FIFTY' around the above 50 can scarcely be read. Words 'LEGAL TENDER' is very much blurred. Letter C dated March 8, '63. On the left lower corner the No. 550 instead of 50 enclosed in one circle.

50s, imit., observe the head of Hamilton upon the face of the note, which represents the line of the waistcoat crossing the white collar at the neck. The acute angle formed by the shape of the collar, so far as it is shown, is perfect in the counterfeit note; but in the genuine the lines of the flesh were drawn by the engraver across the point of the collar at its junction with the waistcoat, for the purpose of relieving the angle of the sharpness it would otherwise have exhibited. This difference is not readily observed unless the notes are perfectly clean. The other discrepancy is in the shape of the ornaments in the border on each end of the face of the bills, and in the whole border on the back. The figures "50" are engraved on a green ground, of which the rim, in the genuine bill, is in octagonal form, rather well defined, though the angles are not sharp. The eight sides of what at first view appeared to be circles, may be easily discerned. In the counterfeit bill the border ornaments, containing the "50" are octagonal in only a very slight degree, and seem to be perfect circles. The general appearance of the counterfeit gives no indication of its true character.

100s, imit. the red figures are much larger than the figures of any Treasury Notes, the wings of the eagle are very coarse—the double rule running from it is heavier, and the curve twice as large, while there is a diagonal shading at the joint of the imprint with the rule, which does not appear on the genuine. On the right end of the back of the bill, the 100 in the circles are inverted, thus, 001. In the genuine this inversion is on the left end. The imprint, American Bank Note Co., is very uneven, and too large.

100s, imit., (2d kind) of the notes issued under the act of February, 1862, well executed. The spurious note is smaller, and the coloring on the back is paler than on the genuine bill. The words "one hundred dollars" on the right hand side of the counterfeit are smaller than on the genuine note.

100s, imit., (3d kind) the note is smaller than the genuine, the spread eagle is very coarse, and the shading of UNITED STATES is badly done. The bill is calculated to deceive.

On the new series of letter "A," around the figure of Liberty on left end is a plain black line. On the counterfeits, this line along the bottom of the figure is running towards the right of the note forms two distinct lines, on gen. only one. But this
