1. a. Under the supervision of SCAP the Japanese Government compiled inventories which were later used for preparing catalogs of reparations equipment. The source documents (original inventories) were returned to SCAP and are now stored at the Hakozaki Warehouse. Along with these records are individual inventory sheets for approximately 500,000 items of reparations equipment located in Arsenals, Aircraft and Munitions Plants. These inventory sheets did not contain sufficient information on which a location could be made. Therefore, a re-inventory was made but the old inventory sheets were retained.
    - b. The finished product (catalogs of reparations equipment) of the above mentioned source documents and the re-inventory sheets are in the files of the Civil Property Custodian.
  2. a. Early in the Occupation, in response to a directive from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, the Japanese Government enacted legislation requiring that all assets of Japanese Government agencies, corporations and individuals which were located in foreign countries be reported to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers via the Ministry of Finance, Japanese Government. The reporting form was standardized as to format and submitted in sextuplicate.
    - b. The Office of the Civil Property Custodian presently has custody of some 494,000 reports of external assets containing detailed information re assets owned by Japanese agencies, corporation, or individuals.
    - c. During the past five years this detailed information has been reduced to IBM summaries in catalog form and a comprehensive three-volume report which are in the files of the Civil Property Custodian.
  3. a. These reparations and external assets records in the Hakozaki CPC Warehouse are in various sized bundles and will not permit a ready adaptability to storage in foot lockers or other such containers and still maintain their identity with the card index, which is needed in order to locate any information desired.
    - b. It is conceivable that at some future date one of the Allied governments might request information which would require reference to an individual report. If such a request were received by any one of the Allied embassies in Japan, it would no doubt be referred to the Japanese Government for action.
  4. a. The above records are of use only to the Japanese Government

1 (Cond) which has expressed a desire for them. They are of no possible value to any U.S. Government agency as they are duplicate copies of records presently in the files of the Civil Property Custodian. It is therefore strongly recommended that these records be turned directly over "as is, where is" to the Japanese Government.

B. It is further recommended that the SCAP Records Disposition Unit survey these records and make final determination on the spot. It will take from 3,500 to 4,000 foot lockers to ship these to the SCAP Records Holding Area which would then have to re-handle them and return them to the same warehouse, resulting in a great waste of manpower. This multiple handling is believed unwarranted and would necessitate request by CPC of additional labor funds for this funds for this purpose.

In view of comments expressed by the Department of the Army representatives in a recent visit to this headquarters and check note 3 from Diplomatic Section, all files in Hakozaiki Warehouse will be prepared for shipment to the Departmental Records Branch, AGO, King and Union Streets, Alexandria, Virginia, except the I.B.M. punch cards which will not be shipped.

1. For some unknown reason, representatives of the DA here from Washington received an entirely erroneous impression of what was in the records at the Hakozaki Warehouse and of their possible value to the U.S. Government.

2. If the Adjutant General in Washington thinks the reports which were compiled from the Japanese Reparations records should be destroyed, as indicated in Inclosure No. 1, then the records themselves must be almost valueless to the U.S. These records pertain to war-time industrial facilities of Japan and are now obsolescent. Up-to-date records and plant folders are in the hands of CPC and ESS, are a part of SCAP Records and will be turned over to the AG at the proper time. In addition, the Major Commands have complete information regarding the Reparations plants being used by them. Placing so much emphasis on a lot of out-of-date records, especially when the information is available in other and more usable form, is an indication that the representatives from Washington were not given the true picture. I am sorry that I was not present at the time of their inspection to see that this was presented. These records should have been destroyed some time ago or returned to the Japanese Government along with other unusable material as has been our custom in the past. The Japanese officials have evidenced some interest in the return of these records, however, due to the labor necessary to bring them up-to-date will not protest their removal to the U.S. so their request is not a deciding factor.

3. In the case of the External Assets records, however, it is understood that the Prime Minister Yoshida will shortly address a letter to General Ridgway for their return to the Japanese Government to whom they will be of great value in the processing of future claims. As in the case of the Reparations records, they also have been condensed in report form and sent to all interested U.S. agencies. The value, even of these reports, has long since passed. The Acting Chief of the Department of Justice Mission in Japan, who is thoroughly familiar with these records has already extracted therefrom the small amount considered to be of possible value to the U.S. These records as a whole pertain to Japanese assets present in many foreign countries during the war and the Japanese Government is interested in them because of possible future claims for reimbursement for confiscation of these assets by foreign nations. Such claims will be presented by Japanese who lost property, not to the U.S. Government, but to the Japanese Government. The records therefore should be in the hands of the agency which will process claims and not in the AG storehouse in Alexandria to which many communications would have to be addressed for research after SCAP responsibility will have ceased under the Peace Treaty.

4. With regard to Para 2 of C/N No. 6, CPC does not have the personnel necessary for this work. Light extensions could be arranged but adequate heating

for a high-ceilinged warehouse of this size would have to be requested from the proper agencies. Considering the recent letter from Secretary Pace regarding the necessity for conservation, and considering the value of the records concerned, I do not feel justified in requesting expenditure of Government funds for the hire of laborers or for installation of heating facilities.

5. It is recommended that these records be turned over to the Japanese Government "where is, and as is" by turning the key of the warehouse over to the representative of the Finance Ministry, and that no additional American effort, time or money be expended on them. There are too many important responsibilities still to be carried out by SCAP to warrant such effort on items of little value. At least, the project outlined in C/N No. 6 should not be started pending preparation of a reply to the letter from the Prime Minister. Since the matter has gone this far, a senior Board of Officers may have to be appointed to relieve the AG from the responsibility for what seemed to me from the beginning to be a very simple matter, solved under the terms of the Peace Treaty by turning the records over to the Japanese Government, a sovereign nation responsible for settling their own claims. I did not think the matter of sufficient importance to take a personal part in it, but if I had suspected that any discussion over the solution of the problem was going to arise, I would have, some time ago and on my own responsibility, turned the records over to the Japanese Government as has been the case in the past whenever SCAP had no further use for borrowed material.

6. It must not be lost sight of that these are Japanese records (not SCAP) and were borrowed, along with other material, and which will have to be returned in order to permit the Japanese Government to carry out its responsibilities under the terms of the Treaty. SCAP of course can ship these records, along with anything else belonging to the Japanese, to Washington prior to the dissolution of SCAP, but I do not believe that the U.S. Government can legally or morally retain them after the effective date of the Treaty. To do so will start a series of diplomatic negotiations for their return which will waste the time of a lot of people and the money spent in shipping them both ways. We should not confuse U.S. records with Japanese records and property, nor lose sight of SCAP's responsibility to assist the Japanese Government to carry out its responsibilities under the Peace Treaty. It is suggested that the solution of this problem be reviewed on this basis.

1. The following information pertaining to reparations records is submitted per verbal request from Colonel Fensterstock of your section.

2. In 1946 SCAP required the Japanese Government to make a physical inventory of industrial machinery and equipment located in Japanese Arsenals, Aircraft and Munitions Plants. Exhibit "A" is the form in which this inventory was prepared. This inventory was prepared primarily for two purposes:

- a. To prevent dispersion, scrapping or other destruction of assets
- b. To permit SCAP to license the use of any of these facilities by industrial concerns and the Occupation Forces.

When it became necessary to allocate industrial assets under this Advance Transfer Program, it was soon determined that the inventory information was not adequate to meet requirements of directives from the Far Eastern Commission. Therefore, a second inventory (exhibit "B") was conducted. This second inventory contains all the information included in the first inventory plus additional information showing life expectancy of the machinery and equipment, depreciation that had occurred from time of installation of the equipment to the time of inventory, and other information necessary to meet engineering and accounting requirements.

3. The inventory sheets representing the first inventory have been retained. CPC has no foreseeable requirement for these records.

4. In addition to the original inventory records reported as surplus, there are a number of blue prints (catalogs) made for distribution to Nations claiming reparations from Japan, but which were never distributed due to unilateral action of the United States Government which halted the Advance Transfer Reparations Program. These catalogs are surplus to any known requirement of CPC.
