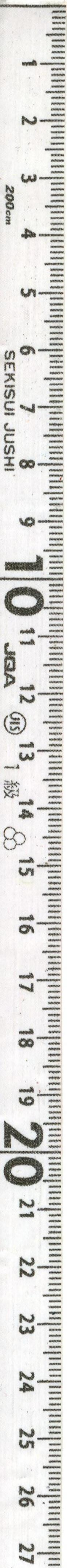

SUBJECT: Rotation of 1st Cav Div RCTs to Korea

1. BASIC: XVI Corps msg GX 51823 RCGO, 1 Nov 52, which requests confirmation of plan to move 7th RCT from Hokkaido on or about 16 Dec 52 to Korea, utilizing same surface transportation for return of 8th RCT to Japan. Requests information as to location 8th RCT will return to in Japan.
2. REFERENCES: a. CINCFE msg CX 52386 DTG 221019 Jul 52, a warning order, which outlines procedures to effect rotation of 1st Cav Div RCTs to Korea (TAB A).  
b. Memorandum for CofS from SGS, dated 19 Aug 52, which contained the following remark (par 3b) by the CinC, with respect to subject: "Two regiments of the 1st Cavalry Division are to be kept in Japan at all times." (TAB B).  
c. CINCUNC msg CX 57333 DTG 201101 Oct 52, refers to CINCUNC OP Plan 5-52, 13 Sept 52, and CINCUNC Ltr of Instrs, 3 Oct 52, which directs execution of a Joint Amphibious Demonstration off the east coast of Korea, directs the movement of the 8th Cav RCT to Korea and the movement of the 187th RCT from Korea to Japan; authorizes downgrading of CINCUNC OP Plan 5-52 and Ltr of Instrs to Secret; requests comments and recommendations on CINCUNC OP Plan 5-52; and re-imposes CINCFE msgs relating to administrative movement of 1st Cav RCTs and 187th RCT to and from Korea (not attached).
3. In ref a the schedule of movement is arranged so that the RCT being relieved in Korea (8th Cav) utilizes the transportation of the relieving unit (7th Cav RCT) for its return to Japan, whereas the remark made by the CinC in ref b dictates that the schedule of movement be revised so that the RCT in Japan (7th Cav) utilizes the transportation which returns the relieving unit (8th Cav RCT) from Korea.
4. Due to the critical housing shortage on Hokkaido, it will be necessary for the 8th Cav RCT, upon its return from Korea, to occupy the area vacated by the 7th Cav RCT. Therefore, if the 8th RCT returns to Hokkaido prior to the departure of the 7th RCT, it will be necessary for one RCT to establish a temporary "tent" housing area during the off-loading and loading of personnel and equipment from the respective RCTs. Further, if the 8th Cav RCT is moved from Korea prior to the arrival of the 7th Cav RCT, it will cause KCOMZ to reduce the number of troops now on PW duty in order to perform the security missions currently being performed by units of the 8th Cav RCT.
5. Subsequent events which have taken place in Japan since the CinC made the remark contained in ref b are:

SUBJECT: Rotation of 1st Cav Div RCTs to Korea

- a. The 187th Abn RCT has returned to Japan from Korea.
  - b. The Regt Tank Cos of the 1st Cav Div have been organized.
  - c. The Japan National Safety Forces on Hokkaido have been greatly increased.
  - d. Events listed in 4b and c above have increased greatly the already critical housing shortage on Hokkaido.
6. Due to the extreme climatic conditions which exist on Hokkaido during the month of December and in view of the events enumerated in pars 4 and 5 above, it is considered that a "calculated risk" can be taken against the enemy attacking Hokkaido during the 8 to 10 day period the 1st Cav Div would have but one RCT available in Japan. Therefore, it is recommended that subject move be made in accordance with the provisions of ref a.
7. Basic msg was passed to CG AFFE, COMNAVFE and CG KCOMZ on 1 Nov 52 for information, approved by SGS (Lt Col Shoemaker).
8. G3 in D/F requested G2 concurrence.
9. Gen Emnis concurred by initials on D/F on 7 Nov 52.

1. Reference par 2 (a) basic correspondence:

Report in question; FEC INTSUM 3604, 22 Jul 52, is evaluated as "probably false." We have been informed by controlling agency that source of this report is suspected of submitting false or "phony" information. No subsequent information has been received of such a movement of troops into Korea. It is acknowledged, however, that the CCF has been and continues to maintain a steady flow of replacement troops of material to the Korean Theater of Operations.

Information recently obtained from a source who resided in Tientsin from Jan 51 to 29 Jun 52 tends to indicate that enemy troops in Korea are being rotated. The source reported that, commencing on 24 Jun 52 and through 29 Jun, far more troops "definitely from Korea" arrived daily in Tientsin than previously. Number of troops involved could not be accurately determined. Moreover, it could not be determined whether intact units or merely individual troops are being rotated.

(Comment: This report, if true, may account for the Peking-Tientsin railway not accepting private freight during the period involved.)

2. Reference par 2 (b):

Although the report indicated that approximately two divisions plus artillery moved each and every night, additional information reveals that the reported movement involved only about two division plus the amount of artillery mentioned during the entire period.

Approximately 80 trucks towing big guns (20 by 122 mm howitzer, 15 by 76mm div guns 44 by 76.2mm mountain guns and 14 large mortars) moved with them"..... "in addition other reports have indicated large size movement to the KOREA - MANCHURIA border and into KOREA"..... "one source well placed to observe stated the PEKING - TIENTSIN railway is not accepting private freight for three weeks as from last week in June. (Note a similar stoppage of freight traffic occurred on the same railway when the CCF were transporting reinforcements to KOREA in the winter of 1950/51 "....." although these reports cannot be substantiated at this time the above reports do indicate movements of sizeable enemy force towards KOREA."

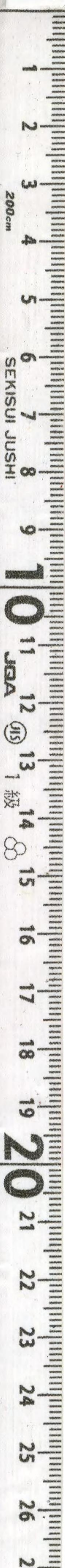

1. It is requested that action be taken to increase the ASA effort available to this Corps at the earliest practicable time.

2. The ASA teams now operating with Divisions have proved to be an invaluable source of intelligence. In several instances the course of actions have been directly affected to our advantage by means of the information secured while the action was in progress. In other instances commanders have been warned of enemy knowledge of their dispositions, or of enemy intentions, so that timely and effective counter measures could be taken.

3. At the present time, teams are allocated one (1) per Division. This gives insufficient coverage, and the teams are unable to accept all the traffic available, so that much is being lost. The team presently located with the First Marine Division is saturated in its attempt to monitor 60 or more stations.

4. I consider it a matter of the most pressing importance that the number of teams available to the Corps be increased to a minimum of two (2) per Division, with a minimum of three (3) teams to be allocated to the west flank.

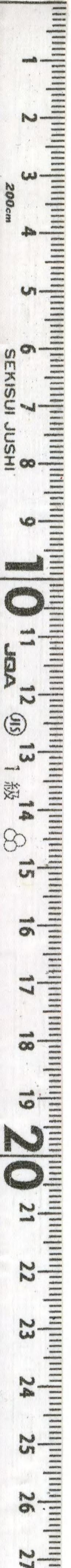

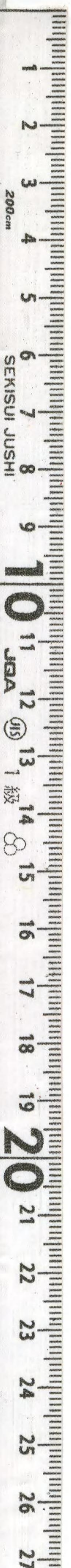

2. The circumstances which resulted in the decision to allocate one rather than two Communication Reconnaissance Companies to the Eighth Army (reference 1a) have been altered. During the past year there has been outstanding success in exploiting the enemy's low-level signal communications for intelligence purposes. The success of this operation revealed the necessity for increasing the communication security monitoring support to the Eighth Army to assist in preventing exploitation of friendly communication by the enemy.

3. Inclosure 1 is a request from the Eighth Army for increased security monitoring support. Another Communication Reconnaissance Company (Security) will be needed to meet the requirements as stated. The 351st Communication Reconnaissance Company, which is scheduled to arrive in Japan during August 1952, can be allocated to the Eighth Army. Previous plans had been to attach this unit to XVI Corps.

4. The Commanding General, Eighth United States Army Korea, has been advised to make a formal request to the Far East Command for the 351st Communication Reconnaissance Company. It is recommended that action be taken to have the company diverted to Korea upon receipt of the Eighth Army's request.

Reports placing 27th Army, or elements thereof, in South China, particularly Kwangtung Province, have been continuously received since prior to the commitment of the army to Korea. At the very time it was in actual physical contact in Korea, 27th Army together with all three divisional designations and most of its regimental designations were reported in various locales of Kwangtung Province.

Since March 52, 27th Army has been reported in East China's Chekiang Province, where it reportedly received Soviet arms, as well as in Kwangtung.

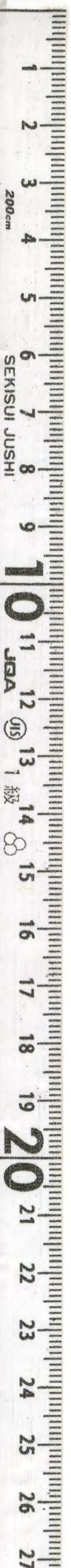
It is believed that reports received prior to March 52 which placed 27th Army components in Kwangtung were based upon presence of service elements only or upon completely false information. Attention is invited to similar circumstances concerning frequently reported presence of 38th, 39th, 40th, and 42d Armies in Kwangtung and recent British change in attitude with respect these units.

Reports received since March and which place unit in China can not be summarily dismissed in view fact 27th Army has not been physically contacted in Korea since September 1951 and latest reports placing unit in Yangdok area were as of late February 52. However, as yet there is no indication from prisoners or other intelligence sources in Korea itself that 27th Army has returned to China. Pending receipt of more

1. Several late reports indicate large scale enemy troop movements in Korea. These movements, if substantiated, indicate the concentration and positioning of sizeable enemy reserve along his logical avenues of approach. A large scale southward movement of CCF units from Songjin (EA 1702) to Hamhung (CV 7517) has been reported by CCRAK and, on May 22 and 23, by naval air observers.

2. Request addressees take the following action as soon as possible:

a. FEAF, coordinating with NAVFE, intensify day and night reconnaissance of main routes south, southeast and southwest of Wonsan (CU 6535) to present line of contact, paying particular attention to vehicle and foot movements and troop concentration areas.

b. Eighth Army insure that all POWs are interrogated as soon as possible to determine information of this reported movement and to determine order of battle information.

c. Chief, FEC/LG determine details of movement and identification of forces being moved in the eastern part of Korea, particularly in the Hamhung and Wonsan areas and south thereof.

3. This Specific Request for Information is assigned identification number 2-EST-1. It is desired that all addressees report information as obtained to HQ FEC, Attn G2 Intl Div and to interested major commanders and that reports in reply to this request bear the identification number 2-EST-1.

1. The nature of military operations in Korea during the past several months has resulted in the capture of far fewer Chinese prisoners of war than can normally be expected in combat operations. Since captured enemy personnel, rather than deserters, provide the best possible identification of enemy units in contact, the lack of a sufficient number of Chinese prisoners of war has been and is a matter of grave concern to this headquarters and to Eighth Army. Periodic positive identification of enemy units of division and larger size in contact with UN forces is considered essential to the maintenance of reliable and current order of battle intelligence and other intelligence.
  2. Of particular concern at the present time is the 42nd CCF Army, currently carried in contact with UN forces north, northeast and northwest of Chorwon. Positive identification of this Army since 1 January 1952 rests on information furnished by five prisoners of war, three of them deserters. The information furnished by deserters is generally considered less reliable than that furnished by a captured prisoner of war, and requires additional confirmation prior to being accepted. The locations at which these five prisoners of war deserted or were captured are shown on the map attached hereto as TAB 1. It will be noted that no identifications have been made between the 34 and 49 eastings along the front north, northwest and northeast of Chorwon since 24 February 1952. This meager identification is considered inadequate to meet the intelligence requirements of this headquarters and Eighth Army.
  3. Intelligence Collection Directive No. 1 issued by this headquarters on 21 March 1952 is a command instrument which contains the minimum intelligence requirements to satisfy CINCPAC's Essential Elements of Information. This directive is attached hereto as TAB 2. Paragraph 4 b of the forwarding letter states "Each command and agency will consider assignment of an intelligence requirement to be an order of this headquarters to secure the intelligence required thereby." Paragraph 3 a, Part Two assigns Intelligence Requirement E-54 to CG, Eighth Army, which requirement deals basically with order of battle information. It is believed that Intelligence Collection Directive No. 1 constitutes command authority to conduct necessary operations to capture prisoners of war in such cases as the 42nd CCF Army referred to in paragraph 2 above, except in cases where restrictions are placed on operations of Eighth Army by a higher command level. G2 has no detailed knowledge of such restrictions.

4. A draft message to Eighth Army to meet the immediate requirements as pertain to the 42nd CCF Army has been prepared and is attached hereto as TAB 3. This message directs Eighth Army to undertake operations to secure prisoners of war for purposes of identification of enemy units opposing UN forces in the Chorwon area.

5. To obviate future individual Chief of Staff actions, as in the case of the 42nd CCF Army, it is recommended that G3, acting under authority contained in Intelligence Collection Directive No. 1, be authorized to direct Eighth Army to conduct operations to capture prisoners of war. In each case, the action will be initiated by G2, when in his opinion and that of G2 Eighth Army, such operations are necessary. It is also recommended that any operational restrictions in effect on Eighth Army, which are in conflict with the proposed action be waived for this purpose at the time such operations are ordered. Check Sheet to implement this recommendation has been prepared and is attached hereto as TAB 4.

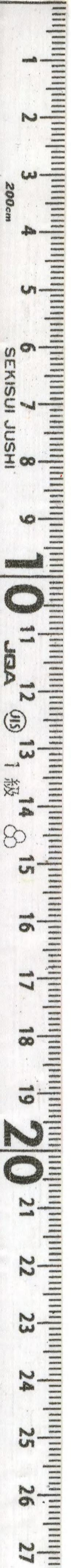

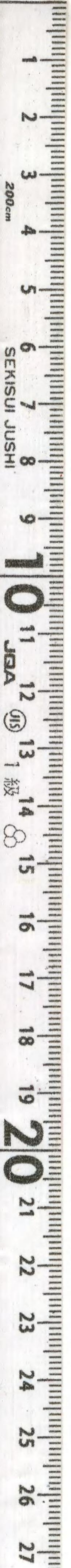

This letter prompted the Chief of TC to send a ltr to the Trans O FEC, which mentioned Gen Ennis's ltr, and stated that two TC Team would complete training about 1 Apr and one could be made aval to FEC.
3. 22 April TC sent to G3, thru G2, a C/N which stated that 563d Transportation Detachment (Technical Intelligence) could be moved to FEC, provided FEC troop ceiling is increased by number of spaces involved. G2 while concurring, stated that "assignment of team is necessary irregardless of FEC ceiling". DA replied that spaces must be absorbed by FEC.
4. 22 May 52, TC rqstd 563rd on 90 days TDY. G2 again concurred with the hope that once a team was placed on TDY with FEC that it would be a step in the right direction to get the team here permanently. DA came back stating team not aval on TDY basis and must be absorbed within FEC ceiling.
5. This matter has been discussed at great length between G2 (Major Shaw) and TC (Col. Losey and Lt. Col. Kinsula), on the 23rd and the 25th of June. TC states that they want the team, that they realize they need the team; however the present personnel slash undergone by Trans Section, (as well as by the other sections of Hq FEC) has placed them in the position of being unable to absorb the 9 personnel in question. This fact has occasioned their reply. It is the opinion of Major Shaw that TC will have to be forced into the business by piling the work on TC to the point that they will be forced to ask for this unit to fulfill their theater intelligence mission.
6. 251600 June 1952, the deputy transportation officer, Col. Losey, in a conference with Major Shaw, agreed to augment the TC intelligence effort in FEC by the TDY acquisition of two additional officers to the TC Intelligence section. Although this is in the right direction, it is felt that the assignment of TDY personnel to intelligence functions of this nature, while better than nothing, is not the answer to the problem, and that steps must be taken to get the troop ceiling increased to permit the utilization of the 563rd Transportation Technical Intelligence in the FEC.

7. Trained Transportation Technical Intelligence Teams are rare items. If FEC does not request this unit at this time, there is little or no hope that such a qualified unit can be secured in the future.

8. 211000 June 1952, while Major Shaw was briefing General Ennis, (at Col. Rasmussens request on the SC TI SOP) Gen Ennis brought up the TC TI team situation and was thoroughly briefed as of that date. In accord with this conversation, it is proposed to send as much work as possible to TC, to attempt to force them into the business.

9. Instant C/N from G2 to G3 states that G2 non-concurs in C/N 2; and that G2 considers the acquisition of a TC TI team a top priority matter, occasioned by the inability of TC to perform its intelligence mission.

In response to a letter from ACOFS, G-2 FEC to ACOFS, G-2 DA relative to the assignment of a TC Technical Intelligence Team to FEC, information was received, thru technical service channels on 2 April 1952, that the 563d Transportation Detachment (Technical Intelligence) could be made available upon request. Unit is organized under T/O&E 55-500, 29 September 1944, w/c 1, 2 and 5, cell AC with a strength of 4 officers and 5 enlisted men.

2. Subsequent coordination with Troop Control Division, G-3, GHQ prompted the transmission of a staff service message on 10 April 52, to the Office of the Chief of Transportation. This message requested that consideration be given to the transfer of 9 spaces to FEC from TC General Troop Reserve, due to the non-availability of troop spaces under present FEC ceiling.

3.
