XII. TACTICAL AND OPERATIONAL DATA. (Narrative and comment. Describe action fully and comment freely, following applicable items in check list at left. Use additional sheets if necessary.)

On 9 April 1945 8 FM-2s of VC-88 on a mission of target combat air patrol at Okinawa were released toward the end of their scheduled period for direct support missions. The patrol had been completely uneventful.

One division, consisting of Lts(jg) C. S. RHOTES, R. J. HERRAN, E. A. WHITE and Ensign E. L. CARRON strafed the town of Yomababu in southern Okinawa, damaged several buildings and hitting trenches and dugouts observed. The attack lasted 30 minutes, from 1450 to 1500(I). Four runs from west to sast, begun at varing altitudes from 2500 feet to 1000 feet, there being a ceiling of 100-1500 ft. The runs were shallow and long. No All fire was encountered.

The other division, led by Lt. J. G. SANFORD and consisting of Lt(jg) W. J. ARRESTRONG and Employs F. D. TAYLOR and C. S. ADAMS attacked five cassouflaged baildings in le Shime in target areas 3854 G. 8754 I and 8555 S. All five were set after and destroyed. The brush which covered the baildings was easily fired on the first runs and increased on two subsequent runs. The attack lasted 20 minutes, from 1445 to 1505(I). All runs were flat and low. No AA fire was encountered.
