HENRY HUDSON 1609

It is not disputed that Hendrick Hudson in the Half Moon visited Catskill in 1609, after a trip of several weeks up the Hudson River. Just how long he remained does not matter. Indians met him in their bark canoes. Doubt-

less they were members of the five tribes who gave names to the streams, and mountain ranges. The Indians called the river Mahacanntuck, and they called



the mountains the Onteoras. They regarded the Half Moon as the Manitou or Great Spirit.

Spirit indeed it was, for as time rolled on came civilization to the section, the sloops being followed by steam vessels, of which the Clermont was the first steamer in 1807. Other boats followed, Armenia, Alida, Francis Skiddy, Daniel Drew, and many other great steamers, the last and greatest being the great floating palaces of the Day Line, of which the Hendrick Hudson, Robert Fulton and Washington Irving take their names from the great historicals that made famous the region of the Catskill Mountains.

LAND OF THE ONTEORAS



The Clermont sailed from Paulus Hook (Jersey City), Sept. 4, 1807, at 6 a. m. and arrived at Albany on Saturday, Sept. 5th at 6 p. m. Steamers make the trip now in 8 hours and the fast N. Y. Central trains in 3 hours. Fulton's boat, which appeared in the Hudson Fulton parade, could make about 3 miles an hour.



The first locomotive was the DeWitt Clinton, made at West Point and was taken to Albany by boat, where it was put in operation on the Mohawk-Hudson Railroad. It made the trip to Schenectady in one hour and 45 minutes. This was a speed of 7 miles an hour. The third railroad in the state was from Catskill to Oak Hill and the cars and locomotive were of the same pattern, which we show in cut.

Compare all of this with the present day boats, trains, automobiles and air ships.

Greene county is famous for its mountains, lakes, and waterfalls. There are fourteen towns, and all are more or less devoted to the entertaining of city guests in the summer season, when the vacation time is on. Catskill is the distributing point to the entire section, being the point of landing of the Day Line steamers, and main stations of the N. Y. Central and West Shore railroads,



HAUNTS OF RIP VAN WINKLE


The completion of the two great railroads and the advent of the river greyhounds made possible the boarding industry that has dotted the mountain section with well kept and commodious boarding houses. Good roads and automobiles have served to bring the mountain section within a few hours of the crowded city centers, and the pure air, and health giving influences of the Catskills have made them the resort for millions seeking rest, recreation and health.

With the advent of the automobile the railroads were forced to give way. State roads were building along the great arteries of travel. The mountain section commenced to get them. The importance of connecting up the mountain section resulted in the building of the Clove road. George B. Van Valkenburgh, Hon. J. Lewis Patrie, George H. Chase and Harding Showers, prominent men of Greene county, were largely instrumental in bringing about the construction of the road. It is readily to be seen that this road is one of the most important in the state at least branching from the great artery of travel north and south, linking up the West Shore, N. Y. Central, Day Line, Evening Line as well as the New York state roads on both sides of the Hudson.





CATSKILL VILLAGE



Catskill stands first as the county seat, with a population of 5,400. There are many splendid buildings, including a court house costing \$250,000, a Carnegie Library, Y. M. C. A. building costing \$40,000, three fine banks, splendid school buildings and model churches, two theaters and many fine stores. There are several large summer boarding houses, and excellent hotels, the Saulpaugh taking the lead. The manufacturing includes knitting mills, cement plants, brick yards, glass works, as well as several large and well equipped garages. The garages are Post's, Lacy & Norton, Catskill Tire and Vulcanizing, Timmerman's, and Barlow's.

Catskill is on the main line of state roads, and two great main routes to the interior start at Catskill. The East Windham route, and the Palenville Haines Falls route. Palenville at the foot of the mountains and Haines Falls at the top.

Catskill is reached by automobile lines from the rural sections, New York Central and West Shore Railroads, and several lines of steamers, chief of which is the Day Line from New York and Albany, and the Newburgh Line. Catskill has a municipal ferry which makes several trips hourly.

The village has electric light and gas plants and owns its water plant. Water that has always stood the most exacting test.

Good state road's main line between New York and Albany, state road to Leeds, Cairo, Windham, and Prattsville. State road most of the way between Catskill and Stamford and Oneonta, via Tannersville. A splendid road connects Catskill with Palenville, where the new Clove road, the most wonderful in the world reaches to the mountain top and the mountain section. At Hunter, state road to Hensonville and the Windham Prattsville road.

There are bus lines from Catskill to Leeds, Green Lake, Cairo, Palenville, Cementon, Alsen and Saugerties. There are large boarding houses at Leeds, Green Lake and Palenville.

This is the great amphitheatro where thousands spend their summers. Every farm has its cottage and every village its large and we'll equipped big boarding houses. The summer guest chooses between the quiet farm house or the larger hostelry with its many and varied attractions.

Here you have wonderful fishing and many fine boats. The woods are


traced with footpaths to places of note.

Once at the mountain top there are fine state roads that stretch away to other points of the resort section. On the main road west Haines Falls, Tannersville, Hunter, Lexington, Prattsville and thence to Grand Gorge, Stamford, Harpersfield, North Kortwright, Davenport and Oneonta. North from Haines Falls or Tannersville, Onteora Park. North from Hunter by state road Hensonville, Windham, East Windham, Ashland.






LAND OF THE ONTEORAS

The Kaaterskill Clove, through which passes the wonderful new state road to the top of the mountains, is one of the most wonderful glens. Towering gorges, whose sides rise hundreds of feet, the rushing stream, plunging over dizzy heights in scores of cascades, are alone worth a trip of hundreds of miles to see. Haines Falls at the head of the gorge



has a plunge of 260 feet and the Kaaterskill Falls is still higher—These are the two greatest of the cataracts. The Five Cascades, Fawns Leap, Bastian Falls, Wildeat Falls, Niobe Falls, Trumpbour's Falls, Du Bois Falls and many others are to be seen.



LAND OF THE ONTEORAS

No visitor to this section should fail to make the trip to the mountain top through the wonderful Kaaterskill Clove. The Clove is 8 miles from Catskill on a direct road which is always in good shape, though not a state road. The Clove extends for four miles, commencing at Palenville and following a rushing mountain stream through one of the most picturesque glens in the world. It is an 8 per cent grade road to the very mountain top at Haines Falls. This is on the shortest and direct route to the heart of the Catskill mountains, and good state roads are to be found not only from New York or Albany but all through the mountain section.

Near the Mountain Top

The route to the top of the mountains for years commencing in 1823 was by a road built by the Catskill Mountain House Company, and a road at Palenville through the clove. Both these roads were very steep and dangerous to travel though thousands traveled over them taking from four to five hours to reach the Mountain House or Haines Falls. In order better to accommodate the throngs the Catskill Mountain railroad and Otis Elevating railroad were built at a cost of \$750,000.



Here the sun rises in its golden splendor and sets in a halo of purple and red at twilight. Here nature lends a charm, which only those who visit the section can fully appreciate. The pioneers forsaw it all and made possible their fondest dream when in 1823 a road was built to the summit of North Mountain and the Catskill Mt. House erected. The old four horse stage, a wonderful contrivance of its day, conveyed the tourist from Catskill to the mountain house, and great men like LaFayette, Burr and Alexander Hamilton were among those who visited the section. Some of these men went from there to the old Prevost house which we show in another part of this book. The erection of the mountain house has been followed by hundreds of other hostelries and the section has become the health and pleasure summer resort of millions since. There are great hotels like the Laurel House, also a pioneer, Kaaterskill, Antlers, Overlook, Twilight Inn, etc.






