


GENERAL INFORMATION

The Shenandoah Nurseries were established 1870 and are still under the same management. Our plant consists of over eight hundred acres, and all up-to-date equipment necessary for the proper and rapid handling of Nursery Stock.

LOGATION: Are located in Southwestern Iowa, fifty miles southeast of Omaha, Nebr., and seventy miles north-west of St. Joseph, Mo.

PACKING SEASON: With the exception of Evergreens, Black Raspberries, and some heavy shade trees, we are in a position to ship assorted orders all through the winter and can, as a rule, get refrigerator service although we do not guarantee this. Can generally begin digging about March 10th, although some seasons not until later.

RAILROAD FAGILITIES: We have the C. B. & Q., Wabash, and Keokuk & Western Railroads and have low freight rates with direct lines to Chicago, Denver, Kansas City, Minneapolis, Omaha, St. Joseph and other Central points.

EXPRESS COMPANIES: The Adams and Wells Fargo give good service.

CONDITIONS OF SALE

SHIPPING: If no directions are given, we will forward to the best of our judgment but in no case will we assume reponsibility after consignment to purchaser.

When losses occur by delays or other causes of whatever nature while goods are in

transit make claim AT ONCE on the forwarding companies.

PAYMENT: Cash or security before shipment of goods, except with established firms, when if unknown to us references will be required before goods are forwarded. Orders to be sent C. O. D. should be accompanied by one-fourth cash.

PRICES: Are limited to Spring 1915 and supercede all previous lists and are subject to change without notice.

CAUTION: We accept all orders upon condition that they shall be void should injury befall stock from frost, fire, hail storm or other causes over which we have no control.

GRADES: We grade carefully; in some cases by caliper; in others by height. When graded by both caliper and height, the caliper must govern.

CLAIMS: For deduction, will receive consideration only when made within six days after receipt of goods.

PACKING: Prices contained herein arc net; cost of boxing and baling will be added.

CERTIFICATE OF INSPECTION: Will be furnished with each shipment.

OUR GUARANTEE OF GENUINENESS: While we exercise proper diligence to have our trees etc., true to label and hold ourselves in readiness, on proper proof, to replace all trees, etc., that may prove untrue to label, free of charge or refund the amount paid, it is mutually understood and agreed between the purchaser and ourselves that our guarantee of genuineness shall in no case make us liable for any sum greater than originally received for said trees, etc., that prove untrue.
