Mr. E. J. ALBRIGHT, 1204 North State Street, Chicago, Illinois, telephonically contacted this office on July 17, 1963 and said that he is a businessman in the export-import trade, dealing in food machinery and other items. *u*

He said he is very disturbed over the recent events, and opinion rendered by Judge RICHARD B. AUSTIN against the government in connection with the suit brought by GIANCANA in Judge AUSTIN's court. ALBRIGHT is of the opinion that the entire 7th District is "the worst in the United States" and he stated he is interested in instigating some action to get a "clean up". He claimed to be very well acquainted with the Attorney General and with Senator MC CLELLAN and other prominent Congressmen in Washington. ALBRIGHT said he plans to go to Washington for three days in the very near future to get a complete investigation by the Senate Judiciary Committee of Judge AUSTIN and of the entire 7th Circuit. *u*

He said he is fed up with the "mess" in the Judiciary here and stated that a lot of other citizens have similar views. He said he just wanted to discuss his views with us and, if possible, obtain our views and comments even if only "off the record". *u*

He was courteously, but emphatically advised that while his comments and interest are appreciated, the FBI could make no comment whatsoever in this matter either on the record or off the record. He said he understood our position, but just wanted us to know how he felt about the entire situation. *u*

ALBRIGHT is a current PCI of this office. He travels extensively in the United States and Europe and is reported to have a wide acquaintance. In 1961 he was part-owner of the Albright Sales Corporation, 14 West Division Street, a purveyor of food processing equipment. He has furnished information in ITSP cases and in an Internal Security matter. He is 57 years of age and considered emotionally stable. *u*

It is also noted that ALBRIGHT was the subject of Bufile 105-96184, Chicago file 105-9602, in which he was allegedly in contact with the Soviet Embassy in 1961 regarding travel to USSR; and with the Polish Consulate, Chicago, concerning business promotion regarding his products in Europe. He was also engaged as an agent to secure the release of paintings from the Polish Government in 1962. In July, 1963, a complaint was received from the Director of International Trade Fair, Chicago, in which ALBRIGHT had contacted the Director of German exhibits regarding his desire to sell "Broasted Chicken Equipment" to the East Germans. U

The above information is furnished to the Bureau in view of PCI's contemplated trip to Washington to contact prominent individuals and in view of possible future inquiries that may be received. U
