The Foreign Minister requests you to tell conclusively to Ambassador OSHIMA, concerning the misunderstandings occurred to Mr. Matsuka about the promise presumably given by the Foreign Minister to place the excerpts of the records of conversations with the Führer and the Foreign Minister at his disposal, that there must have been in this matter a misunderstanding. Such a promise on the part of the Foreign Minister was not given and could also not at all be given, because such excerpts are not made by us as a matter of principle. The Minister Schmidt took note only of catchwords for the purpose of translation. Ambassador OSHIMA will be asked to inform Mr. Matsuka in this sense.

In the same sense Ambassador Ott is also to be informed telegraphically.
