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


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# A BIBLIOGRAPHY

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# NATHANIEL HAWTHORNE

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NATHANIEL HAWTHORNE has been justly called the foremost spirit of American prose literature. His birth occurred at Salem, Mass., July 4, 1804, where he is known to have resided for several years, following which period he took up his residence with his uncle in Raymond, Maine. Later, at the age of fifteen, we find him again returned to Salem, where he remained for two years, and while at this place we are led to believe that his first literary efforts were published. As to the nature of these early productions, little is known, as few facts have thus far been established, though it has been positively affirmed that some poetry and possibly some prose had been issued in the Salem papers and in several periodicals, previous to the appearance of "Fanshawe" in 1828. Proof of this is to be found in his correspondence with his sister, wherein he writes of his verses, and intimates as early as 1819 that articles by him had already appeared in print.

Of these early writings, the manuscript of the little magazine entitled *The Spectator* is still extant, and in the possession of the Manning family in Salem. This remarkable specimen of early juvenile journalism consists of six numbers, the first being a prospectus and the remaining five issued weekly from August 21 to September 18, 1820. The work was all done by pen upon small note-size paper.

Of the early anonymous literary attempts of Hawthorne some will, from time to time, in all probability be made known.

In the preparation of this Bibliography, I have examined every title mentioned (and, in the majority of instances, several different copies have passed through my hands), with the single exception of "A Rill from the Town Pump" (1857), of which, to my knowledge, there is no copy in this country, and the information relating to it, which is given herein, was obtained through the courtesy of the British Museum.

No attempt has been made to enumerate reprinted editions of the various works, except when new material was incorporated or changes made in the text, as they could be of no use to

the collector of first editions. In every instance an effort has been made to trace the several works back to their first appearance in print.

The Table of Contents and the Index will give, it is hoped, an adequate key to the arrangement of the various divisions and sufficient aid to turn quickly to any item.

No effort has been made to make the list of magazine reviews of Hawthorne's works and of sketches of his life absolutely complete, nor has it seemed to me necessary to include all the various literary text-books which treat of Hawthorne. A sufficient number of these have been mentioned, however, to enable the collector and lover of Hawthorne's writings fully to acquaint himself therewith.

An examination of the auction prices in Part III, which it has seemed advisable to add, shows that the early editions of Hawthorne are becoming rarer each year, and that there is a steady advance in their values.

And now it is a pleasure to extend thanks to all who have so generously offered their aid and encouragement. Among the first. Mr. J. Chester Chamberlain of New York has

generously offered to me the results of his extended study of Hawthorne's works, and the use of his magnificent collection of first editions; this gentleman has in every way done all he could to make this list complete and accurate. Mr. G. M. Williamson, Grand Viewon-Hudson, early placed at my disposal his collection and many items of information gathered by him. Mr. Stephen H. Wakeman of New York has supplied much of the information concerning the early manuscripts, the greater part of which are now in his own collection. Mr. P. K. Foley, perhaps in opposition to his own plans and interests, has generously allowed the use of two items discovered by him, namely, "Autumn Leaves" (1837) and "The Child's Friend" (1844). Mr. Victor Hugo Paltsits of the Lenox Library, Mr. Henry E. Lower of the Congressional Library, the Essex Institute of Salem, and the Boston Public Library have all extended valuable aid. And to all these I extend my thanks, and trust that, in view of the recent centenary of Hawthorne which has aroused so much interest in his works, a compilation of this kind may seem fitting, and it is hoped that its

publication will prove of value to the collector and that the time devoted to it, most enjoyably to myself, will in the end be considered to have been justifiably expended.

This was anonymously issued at the cost of \$100 to the author. As Hawthorne afterwards seemed dissatisfied with the production, he called in all the copies accessible and destroyed them, thus making "Fanshawe" one of the scarcest of his works. Some twenty-nine copies are known thus far (September 25, 1904) to be in existence.

Copies are in Lenox Library, N. Y. (imperfect), Boston Public Library, and Essex Institute at Salem.

- The MS. was sent to S. G. Goodrich (*pseudonym*, Peter Parley), in September, 1836, but the work was not published until 1837.
- This was written with the assistance of his sister Elizabeth, to whom he gave the one hundred dollars said to have been the amount received for the work. See Bridge's Life of Hawthorne, p. 77.
- The second edition appeared in Boston in 1838, and a later edition in New York in 1839, with some changes in the vignettes. Successive editions appeared for many years, so that the total issued reached nearly a million copies, as stated by George P. Lathrop. In the 1838 and following editions, there was added to vol. 11 a list entitled. "Important Dates," pp. 375-380.





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

The printer's imprint is reset in the second edition. P. 31, line 7, the words "for a" are printed as one word in the second edition. Or if the works as now printed are in chronological order, this might find its place in the appropriate volume.

I am very fond of following in order of time, in publishing a complete collection of an author's works. This consideration may be of some weight with Mr Fields also.

A NUMBER of editions of Hawthorne's collected works, previous to 1883, have been issued, more or less complete. There is no need of mentioning more than two here: the Riverside Edition of 1883, which contains George Parsons Lathrop's Introductions, and the Autograph Edition, the latter supposed to be a definitive edition of Hawthorne. The Old Manse Edition, issued later, is simply a reprint of the Autograph Edition, on smaller paper, and less elegant in other respects.
