

Sheep camp with John
Patterson - Warren came
after an hour - Sorted
out sheep from Phillips
flock - got home at
1 $\frac{1}{2}$ o'clock. Repaired the
well at sheep camp -
At 2. P.M. attended the
Grange meeting - as
Master of National
Ranch Grange.

Wrote J. P. Abbott, Antioch
S. L. Adams. 2207. Full-
more St. S. F.

Saturday 2^d July, 75
At Warren's house and
set up horse rake and
John Patterson has been
raking brush for Charlie
Dimond all day - so
charge C.W.D. or
Man + Horse raking

I deposited to my private

Brought Mr. Lemons cow
for (and calf) 25.00
Lemon Dr.

Harr herded our
band of lambs over

in as Charter members
Got through at 4 o'clock
Rec'd. a letter from
Milton Landers
also from Harry Bell

Thursday the 11th Jan'y 75.
At sheep camp up
Sweetwater with John
and Warren - with my
horses - started at
day light - brought
back an Indian to
lead the flock of lamb.
at twelve dollars
per month. and
hired another to stay

with Mr. Williams -
at fifteen dollars per
month. brought the
Indian to the house
and he has been cut-
ting wood with John
at Sweetwater a part
of the day -

Friday 15 Jan'y 25
Mr. Meeker of New York
was here in Am. I
showed him around
my place and also
went to Paradise
Valley and to Georges
place - got my "labor
for my pains" - In
P.M. started to cut
wood - but went over
Swatwata to look after
the Indian - Jesus -
who began to urge
his morning heffuck
hans get in the flock

in Am. to stay all
night -

Saturday 16. Jan'y 75

Setting down a pile of
hot ironware tie &
A.M. there at Devil-
water George, Clinton
& Gus. cut wood with
the balance of the day.

Mr. Baird came
back from town.

lambs, while John & I took
a load of the corral to new
camp back of Whalers &

Total 1020. currn 2400\$, 5100\$, 5000\$ = 13000\$
with privilege of paying the three notes
within 90 days - without interest and at
five per cent discount -
Paid D.W. Dimond for making deed to Mr
Baird and mortgage - from him to F.A.
& W.C. Kimball covering the two 5000\$
dollar notes 200

Sunday, 24. Jan'y 1875.

At Warrens and told him of the conclusion of the trade with Mr. Baird and compared note & Mortgage also description in deed & Mortgage - Endorsed Geo. L. K. note for 120⁰⁰ dollars for purchase of horses.

Drew check for 250⁰⁰ dollars to pay Dr. Hammus note of 150⁰⁰ the balance for sister to use while I am gone to San Francisco. Also check \$7.00 to pay milk bill to Mr. Penny - also to W. C. K. to buy tobacco 25.00 Met Warren at Steam and with him & Mr. Baird rode to Stollers office & signed deed - Mr. B. signing his mortgage and left them all with Stollers to record - then aboard the steamer which did not sail for an hour after notice - have got outside and ~~are~~ are in calmer water so will go right for Sister Ill. turn in.

Monday 25 Jan'y 75
A S.W. gale of wind with heavy
rain struck us before mid-
night last night - could make
no landing at Anakena or San
Pedro - so have floundered about
all day in a wicked sea - and
so sea sick O.m. - till we
reached a harbor under the lee
of Santa Catalina Island here
I got a pail of hot water boiling
hot and warmed my feet
and legs which had become as
white and cold as ice - this
has relieved my headache

Tuesday 26. Jan. 1875
Leaving off under Catalina Island, where we anchored yesterday - Rained and hailed last night - Sun today - and a gale of wind ever since Sunday night at 11 o'clock Capt. sent men ashore for sheep - but could not get any - There seems a prospect of getting away from here at midnight as the wind has shifted to the North - and the clouds are breaking away -

day - and away from home -

Wednesday 27. June 75
Left our Harbor under
the lee of Santa Catalina Island at a little
past midnight and called at San Pedro
fired a gun but no
one came out so
went to Anaheim &
found all the lighters
ashore - except one -
after a long time this
lighter came off and
took her freight, then
went to San Pedro and
loaded freight and got
off about Six o'clock
P.M.
