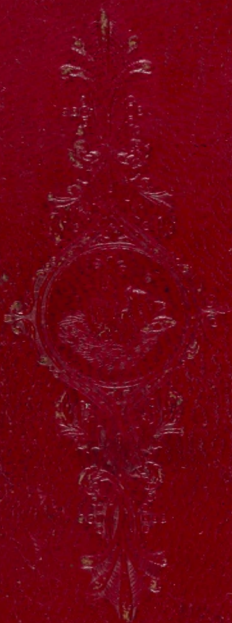

Frank A. Kimball's
Diary

Went at 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ and off for the
Sheep camp with John
Patterson. Warren came
after an hour. Sorted
our sheep from Philips
flock. Got home at
1 $\frac{1}{2}$ o'clock. Repaired the
well at sheep camp.
At 2 P.M. attended the
Grange meeting as
Master of National
Ranch Grange.

Wrote J. P. Abbott, Antioch
S. L. Adams. 2207. Fill-
more St. - S. F.

Saturday 2^d Jan'y 75
At Warrens house and
set up horse rake and
John Patterson has been
raking brush for Charlie
Diamond all day. so
charge C.W.D. 2^d
man + Horse raking

Borrowed of Commercial
Bank - 750.00
on G.L. Kimballs note with
our endorsement; which
I deposited to my private
credit. (No 23)

Baird & Warren & I
rode to East end of our
Ranch. Picked up
three more lambs &
three old shep on the
way - Gym drove the
horses - Warren & I
walked home from
Spring Valley -

Friday 8 Jan'y 75
Rode to East end of
Ranch, and to Janna-
Chu Shep corral, to
find stray sheep - got
one on the road which
Mr Geary had picked
up; Came back by
way of Telegraph road
Rode in warrens
team with him +
Mr Samuel Baird
Attended meeting of
officers of National
Ranch Grange of
P. of H., and in-
stalled a candidate
under direction of
Mr Baird

Saturday 9, Jan'y, 1875
 At the fine sheep camp
 and helped get out the
 sheep - our Switwater
 found the herder - in his
 house lying down after 9
 o'clock - Rode back with
 Bowles - Made pen for
 the cow - in rear of the
 stable shed - in AM,
 Bought Mr. Demons cow
 for (and calf) 25.00
 Lemon Dr -
 To 3 Mos. rent 15.00
 Due on Cow - 10.00

K Bros Cr
 Chick of H. M. Higgins
 for 3/4 m Shingles 16.25
 Agree to pay the herder
 at Clinis Corral twenty five
 (25.00) dollars pr. month
 one month already up

Sunday 10. July '75
Have herded our
band of lambs ever
since 10¹/₂ o'clock this
morning - have been
on foot over 30 miles
- did not get in till
nearly 7 o'clock and
am most "pegs" out
- the herder went off
after his horse in
A.M. and did not
get back till 4 P.M.
I had nothing to
eat from breakfast
to seven o'clock evg.

Monday 11 Jan'y 1895
Rode in town to meet
Board Supervisors +
make sale of National
Avenue - found them
busy + left proposition
with Mr. Pauley -
Mr. Baird rode in
with Warren + I -
After noon rode to
our wharf and over
Town Plot with Mr.
Baird - after which
went hunting with
Mr. Baird - got one
"Cotton tail"
In evg. attended our
Singing School -

Tuesday 12. June 1875

Took care of the flock
of last years lambs
all of A.M. Clint &
Guss in P.M. - Gib &
Peter looking up a
band of lambs which
the 2 ran lost yes-
terday.

In P.M. walked up
Paradise Valley as far
as Mr. Owers - called
on Mr. Crow. and
looked over Mr. Ashes
nursery; did not
get home till dark
or nearly - Reading in
evening -

1875

Wednesday 13 Jan'y
Counted the last years
lambs in A.M. and
drove them to water at
"Laguna Bonita"

Aus + Clint + John Pat-
terson. Herded them today

Attended National

Ranch Grange meeting

Ed. Lawry - Miss. Perry

Ms + Miss Farley came
in as Charter members

Got through at 4 o'clock

Recd. a letter from
Milton Landers

also from Harry Bell

also Postal card

from Capt W. C. Dozier

Thursday 14. June 75.
At Sheep camp - up
Sweetwater with John
and Warren - with my
horses - started at
day light; - brought
back an Indian to
herd the flock of lambs
at twelve dollars
per month, and
herd another to stay
at the other camp
with Mr. Williams,
at fifteen dollars per
month. brought the
Indian to his home
and he has been cut-
ting wood with John
at Sweetwater, a part
of the day -

Friday. 15, Jan'y 95
Mr. Meeke of New Jersey
was in Am. I showed him around
my place and also
went to Paradise
Valley and to George's
place - got my "labor
for my pains" - In
P.M. started to cut
wood - but went over
Sweetwater to look after
the Indian Jesus -
who began to urge
this morning - helped
him get in the flock
I carried
the Bird in town
in Am. to stay all
night -

Saturday 16. Jan'y 75
Getting down a pile of
hot ironware till 9-
A.M. then at Sweet-
water - George, Clinton
& Gus. cut wood with
me balance of the day.
Gib herded sheep for
me - Warren to draw
me a load of wood and
I pay Gib for herding
me. Baird came
back from town.

Mr. Parsons & Mr & Mrs.
Walker in this evening
to send order to Grange
agent to buy pipe &c
for Mr. Parsons.

the old corral - did
not get home till after
dark - At Singing
School in eve -

Mr. Baird went in
town this morning -

Rain last night

Wednesday 20. 1875. Jan
Up early and with John
Patterson & Clinton K. went
to Sheep camp in valley in
near of Lenos Houses. Peter -
Nordstr & Gus - came also.
- but not till we had moved
all the sheep and lambs over
to the crossing of River -
Peter followed & picked up the
lambs, while John & I took
a load of the corral to new
camp back of whulus & I
built the corral - out of
Johns two loads. Peter
drew one load and a
barrel of water - I had not
a mouthful of Lunch.

Sunday 24. Jan'y 1875-

At Warrens and told him of the
conclusion of the trade with Mr Baird
and compared note & mortgage also
description in deed & mortgage -

Endorsed Geo. L. K. note for 120⁰⁰ dol-
lars for purchase of horses.

Drew check for 250⁰⁰ dollars to pay
Dr. Hammus note of 150⁰⁰ the bal-
for Sister to use while I am gone to
San Francisco. Also check \$ 7.00

to pay milk bill to Mr Perry - also

to W. C. B. to buy tickets 25.00

Met Warren at Steam and with him

& Mr Baird rode to Stollers office &

signed deed - Mr B. signing his
mortgage and left them all with

Stoller to record - then aboard the
Steamer which did not sail for

an hour after notice - had got

outside and we are in calm water
so with good night for Sister Ill.

turn in - Ticket 15.00

Monday, 25 Jan'y 75

A S.W. gale of wind, with heavy rain struck us before mid-
night - last night - could make
no landing at Anakena or San
Pedro - so have floundered about
all day in a wicked sea - and
so sea sick O. my, - till we
reached a harbor under the lee
of Santa Catalina Island - here
I got a pail of hot water boiling
hot and warmed my feet
and legs - which had become as
white and cold as ice - this
had relieved my headache -

Tuesday 26. Jan. 1875
Lying off under Catali-
na Island, where we an-
chored yesterday - Rained
and hailed last night
- sun today - and a
gale of wind ever since
Sunday night at 11 o'clock
Capt. sent men ashore
for sheep - but could not
get any - There seems
a prospect of getting
away from here at
midnight as the wind
has shifted to the North
- and the clouds are break-
ing away -

My 43rd Birth
~~day~~ day - and
away from home -

Wednesday 27. June 75
Left our Harbor under
the lee of Santa Catalina
Island at a little
past midnight and
called at San Pedro
fired a gun but no
one came out so
went to Anaheim &
found all the lighters
ashore - except one -
after a long time this
lighter came off and
took her freight, then
went to San Pedro and
loaded freight and got
off about six o'clock
P.M.

Wrote sister and also
E. H. Spence of Ashier Co¹
Bank San Diego, enclosing
Samuel Bairds note of 2,000
for des court
