On Wikimedia projects

The institution Z uploads images to Wikimedia Commons. The Wikidata item of the collection X is marked as having one or more Local Contexts labels attached to it. This way, the Wikimedia Commons page knows it must display the related traditional knowledge labels on the page.

This requires also that the labels are described on Wikidata, the label images are available on Wikimedia Commons and they are openly licensed. `{{cc-zero}}` and `{{PD-textlogo}}` templates are added to the label images. To mitigate the misuse of the labels, a `{{Trademarked}}` template will be used with the images.

Traditional Knowledge Labels can be applied to items, collections or the whole institution, but Wikimedia contributors should not be able to add labels themselves.

Add Notices!

Engagement Notice



The Engagement Notice is used to indicate a researcher or institution is committed to equitable engagement and ethical partnerships with Indigenous communities.

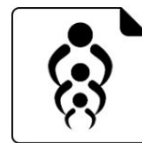
Disclosure Notices



The Disclosure Notices are used to identify Indigenous collections and data and to recognize there could be accompanying cultural rights, protocols, and responsibilities.
