

### Wikis

- A website where anyone can edit any page at any time
- Meant to be "quick"
- Remembers all versions (nothing ever destroyed)
- Hyperlinks between pages

## Wikipedia policies

- Neutral Point of View written so all sides can agree
- Notability significant independent sources -> importance
- Verifiability Using reliable sources to reference information
- No original research point to existing scholarship
- Assume good faith start with congenial spirit
- Conflicts of interest disclose and abide by terms of service



**Olive Ann Beech** (September 25, 1903 – July 6, 1993) was an American aerospace businesswoman who was the co-founder, president, and chairwoman of the Beech Aircraft Corporation. She earned more awards, honorary appointments, and special citations than any other woman in aviation history, and was often referred to as the "First Lady of Aviation".<sup>[3]</sup>

There are conflicting sources of the Beech Aircraft founders. Ed Phillips is an aviation historian who provides detailed accounts of the Beech history. Olive Ann was the Secretary and K.K. Shaul was the Treasurer. Ted Wells was VP of Engineering and investor C.G. Yankey was also named a VP. 

In 1924, at the age of 21 she took a job as an office secretary and bookkeeper for the newly formed Travel Air Manufacturing Company in Wichita. After learning the business she handled correspondence, kept the records, and conducted transactions. 




After retirement from Beechcraft, Beech continued to oversee her personal investments and contribute to various civic and philanthropic projects and the Wichita Art Association, her church, and Soroptimist International of Wichita.<sup>[19]</sup>

Beech died in her sleep at her home in Eastborough, Kansas on July 6, 1993.<sup>[20]</sup> Olive and her husband are buried at Old Mission Mausoleum in Wic

ech Aircraft built cabin pressurization equipment used in the Gemini series of spacecraft.<sup>[1]</sup> In response to the introduction of constown Wichita rival Bill arjet in 1964, Olive Ann decided that Beechcraft should produce a turboprop version of the Queen Air instead of a jet. Asked by a reporter for *Forbes* chcraft would be producing a jet, Beech replied "We will, when it is compatible with our other activities."<sup>[9]</sup> This was another example of her "Slowly We ad adopted after government contracts were cancelled after World War II and the Korean War.<sup>[10][11]</sup> Although piston aircraft sales for Beechcraft were 3 the 1960s, her policy would affect the company's late entry into the jet market.<sup>[9]</sup>




