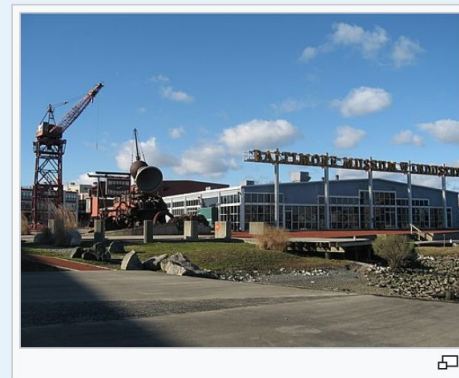

Wikis

- A website where anyone can edit any page at any time
- Meant to be "quick"
- Remembers all versions (nothing ever destroyed)
- Hyperlinks between pages

Wikipedia policies

- **Neutral Point of View** - written so all sides can agree
- **Notability** - significant independent sources -> importance
- **Verifiability** - Using reliable sources to reference information
- **No original research** - point to existing scholarship
- **Assume good faith** - start with congenial spirit
- **Conflicts of interest** - disclose and abide by terms of service

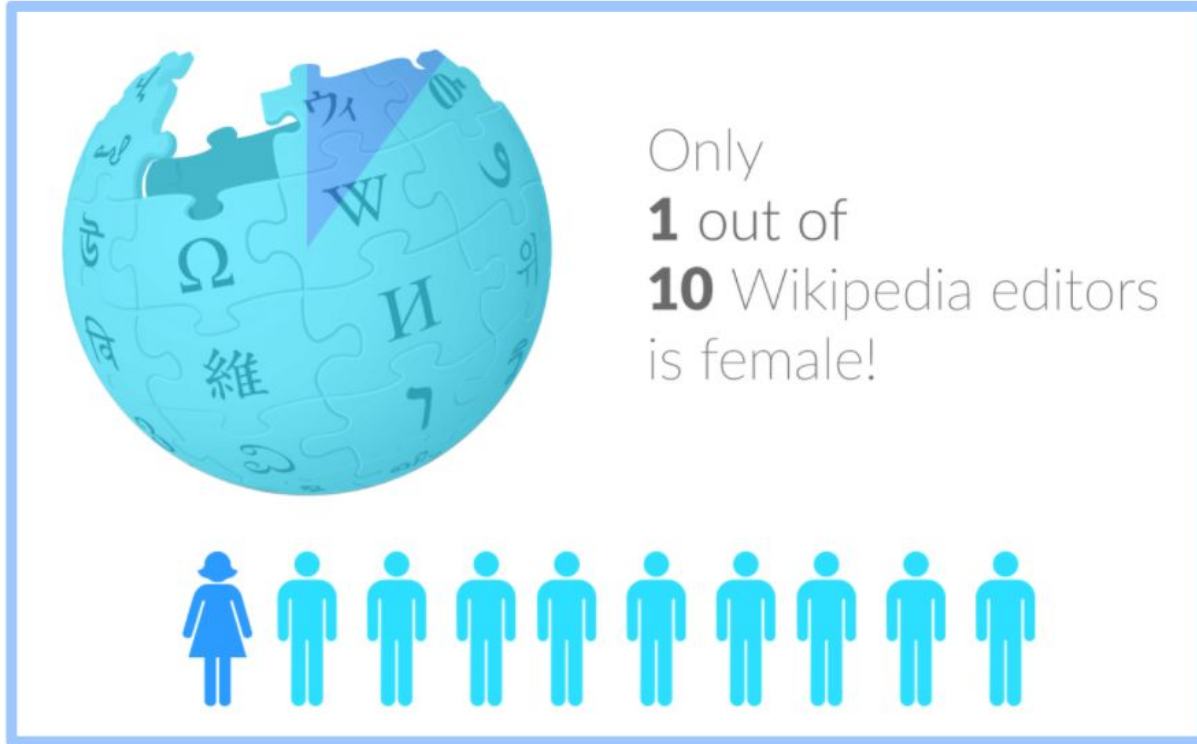

There are conflicting sources of the Beech Aircraft founders. Ed Phillips is an aviation historian who provides detailed accounts of the Beech history. Olive Ann was the Secretary and K.K. Shaul was the Treasurer. Ted Wells was VP of Engineering and investor C.G. Yankey was also named a VP. 



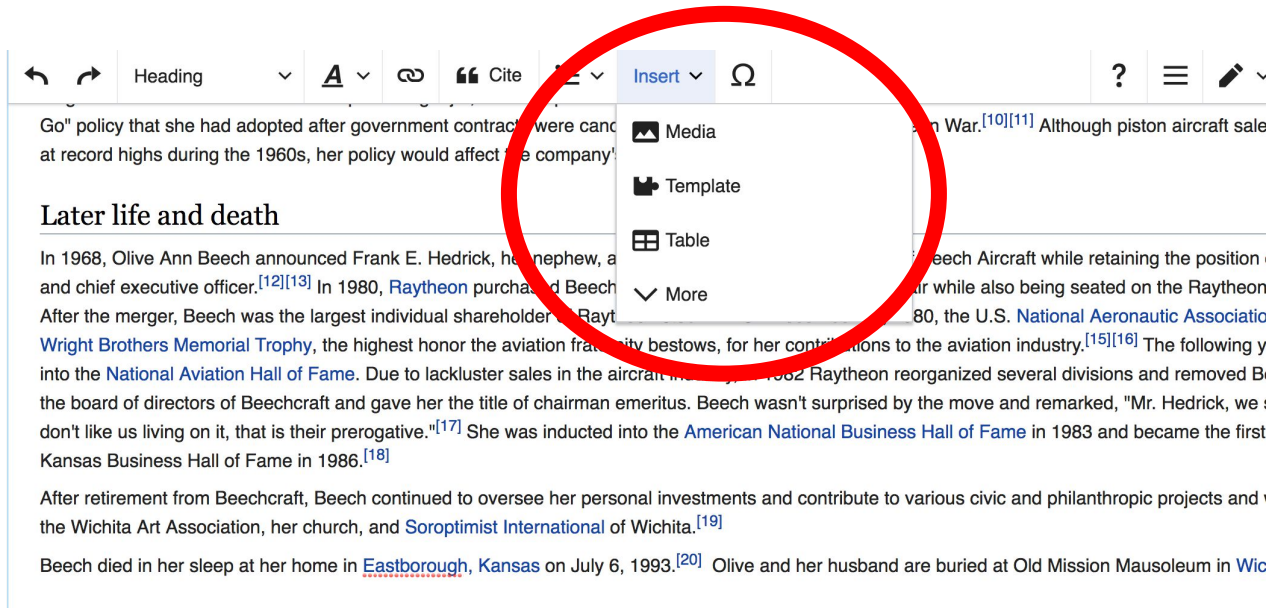

In 1924, at the age of 21, she was promoted to secretary of the newly formed [Travel Air Manufacturing Company](#) in Wichita. She was soon promoted to president and conducted transactions. She merged with the Curtiss-Wright Company and served as president of Travel Air.^{[4][1]} Travel Air moved to New York City and Curtiss-Wright moved to New York.^{[4][6]}

Beech Aircraft

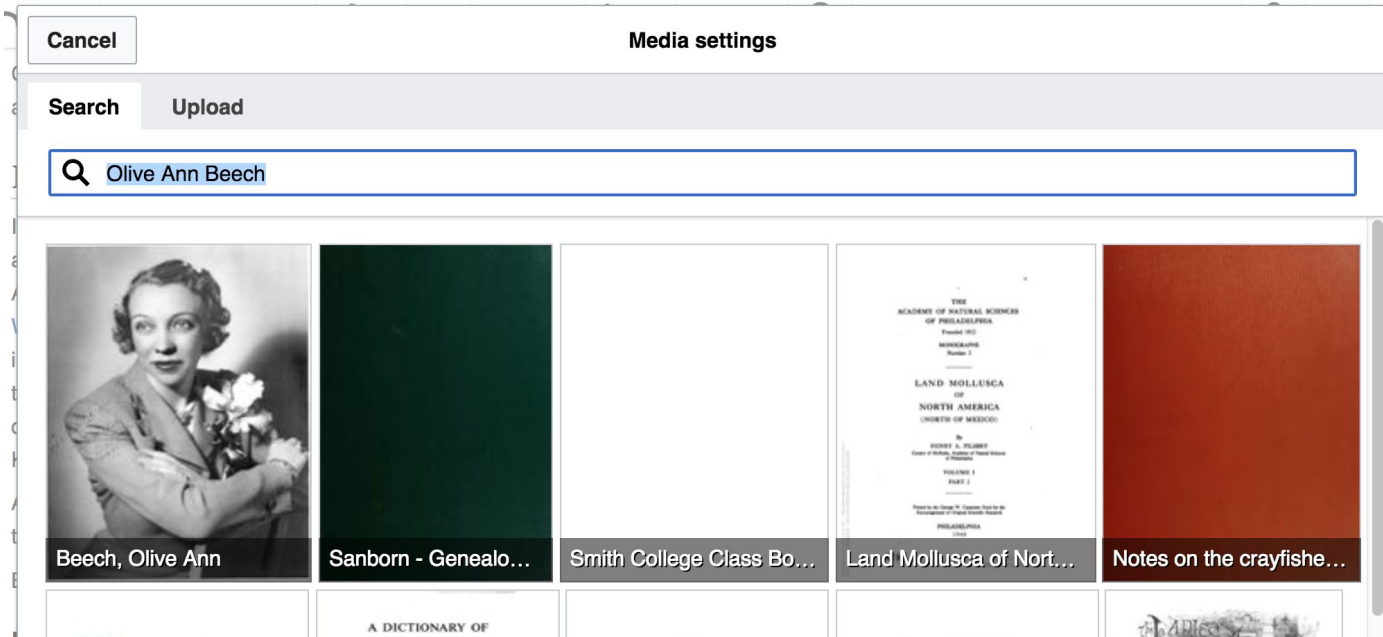
In 1932, Walter Beech named himself as president, Olive Ann as secretary, and Ted C. Yankey as vice president.^{[7][8][4][1]} She played an important role in major company decisions.^[4] The first aircraft was the [Model 1](#), which had a uniquely staggered wings which became known as the [Model 1](#).

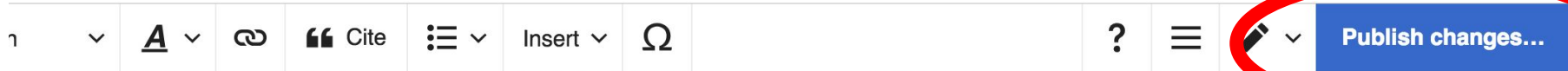

Each Aircraft built cabin pressurization equipment used in the [Gemini](#) series of spacecraft.^[1] In response to the introduction of [Cessna](#) Wichita rival [Bill](#) [Boeing](#) [jet](#) in 1964, Olive Ann decided that Beechcraft should produce a turboprop version of the Queen Air instead of a jet. Asked by a reporter for *Forbes* magazine if Beechcraft would be producing a jet, Beech replied "We will, when it is compatible with our other activities."^[9] This was another example of her "Slowly We Grow" policy. The company had adopted after government contracts were cancelled after World War II and the Korean War.^{[10][11]} Although piston aircraft sales for Beechcraft were high in the 1960s, her policy would affect the company's late entry into the jet market.^[9]

Beech announced Frank E. Hedrick, her nephew, as her successor to the presidency of Beech Aircraft while retaining the position of chair of the board of directors.^{[12][13]} In 1980, [Raytheon](#) purchased Beech Aircraft and Beech remained as chair while also being seated on the Raytheon board of directors.^[8] Hedrick was the largest individual shareholder of Raytheon stock.^[14] On December 12, 1980, the U.S. [National Aeronautic Association](#) awarded her the [Distinguished Achievement Award](#), the highest honor the aviation fraternity bestows, for her contributions to the aviation industry.^{[15][16]} The following year, she was inducted into the [National Aviation Hall of Fame](#).

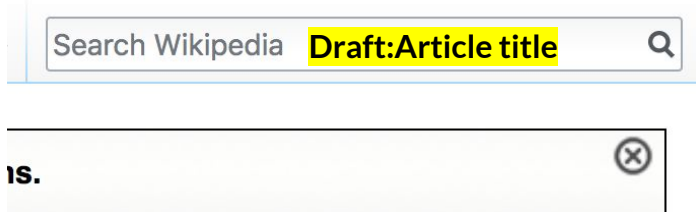


1. Start a 'Draft'
