SPLENDID PROGRESS OF FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH

Few churches in California have enjoyed greater prosperity than has the local Baptist church of Glendale under the thoroughly Baptist leadership of Rev. John Henry Troy. Fifteen months ago Pastor Troy came to the pastorate of the First Baptist church from the Atherton Baptist of Los Angeles, not for any increase of salary, but for the health of his family. The Atherton congregation with a debt of over seven thousand dollars, offered far better financial inducements than the local congregation, but the healthful locality of Glendale, with her mountain breezes, carried the day. Pastor Troy was not a candidate for his present pastorate, but never did a people work harder to secure the services of a clergyman. The brilliant record of the past few months would seem to confirm the good fortune of the Baptists of Glendale. All records have been broken. A full house is the rule and a very large percentage of visitors drop in to enjoy the Bible lectures from time to time. The statistics of the Los Angeles Baptist association record 55 churches, and at the time of Pastor Troy's settlement the First Baptist church of Glendale stood 25th in the list. They now stand 17th. There has been a growth of 70 per cent. A year ago the Bible school stood 20th; it now ranks 11th, after an increase of 65 per cent. Many of the best financial supporters of the church have been received during the past year and the average of the new members in leadership and social, financial and spiritual standing is favorably classed with the rest of the constituency. The enlarged financial obligations are being met more successfully than were the smaller obligations in former years.

Up to date 126 have received the right hand of fellowship from Pastor Troy, 82 of these by regular letter and 44 by baptism, restoration and experience. The records of former years show practically no baptisms outside special revival efforts under the leadership of employed evangelists. More have been baptised without special revival services than during all the preceding history of the church. Many have looked forward to the rich harvest bound to come as a fruitage of faithful preaching of the gospel when the church enters upon special evangelistic leadership. The Brown and Curry meetings will prove the promise of God's word that faithful sowing means a big harvest. Of the 55 churches of the association only 17 report more baptisms than the Glendale church, and of the 17 all but six are of larger membership and practically all have incurred the expense of special revival services.

One of the secrets of the success of the First Baptist church is its appeal to young people. The Sunday evening services are composed largely of young people. The splendid chorus of young people under the leadership of Mr. Cunningham is proving a great attraction. The men's athletic association is another avenue for the expression of the young Baptists of Glendale. Last Tuesday evening Pastor Troy spoke before the local convention of the Baraca and Philathea classes at which time he told many interesting stories of young people he had known—many of whom have developed into prominent men of the day. The pastor's intimate acquaintance with the problems of youth was greatly appreciated.

To build up a strong Baptist church is the ambition of the pastor and members of the First Baptist church of Glendale. Five hundred members is the mark set for 1915. By loyalty to the word of God and insistence on Baptist principles the goal can be reached. The hour of boundless opportunity has struck. Loyalty is the word.
