Gladioli Descriptive List

The following descriptive list is given for those who may care for only small quantities of gladioli, and who are not altogether familiar with the different varieties of this wonderful bulb.

The prices given in this part of our catalogue are for the largest size (No. 1) bulbs, all of which will produce the very finest spikes of bloom the first year.

Read instructions carefully on the first page and avoid any misunderstanding as to our regulations.

Alice Tiplady (Prim)—Probably the best known of this type. Orange-saffron color. Extra fine for cutting. Very dainty color and shape.....**50c Dozen**

American Beauty—An outstanding variety. American Beauty rose color with distinctive creamy yellow throat. Flowers large and well placed with many florets open at one time.....**\$1.00 Dozen**

Anna Eberius—An unusual shade of rich velvety purple with throat shading somewhat deeper. No other glad quite like this in color.....**50c Dozen**

Bengal Tiger—Flaming scarlet vermilion flower with deep crimson blotch. Tall spike. A most unique variety, attracting instant attention.....**60c Dozen**

Break O' Day—Extra early blooming sort with tall massive spikes of soft, lustrous LaFrance pink. Pink is flushed over a cream ground, shade deepening towards tip of petals. Zone of martius yellow on lower petals that adds a most distinctive touch to the flower. One of the earliest bloomers. Extra choice.**40c Each**

TIGRIDIA PAVONIA



(Mexican Tiger Flower)—One of the most gorgeous flowering bulbs grown. Plants attain a height of 15 to 20 inches, bulbs being planted and harvested in like manner to gladioli. Colors are largely scarlet and rose carmine (few yellows) with unique center blotch. Our bulbs all have several noses and will produce blooms throughout the summer and fall. Full cultural directions with each order.
