PLANETS.

MERCURY will be the *Evening Star* until January 15. It will then be the *Morning Star* until March 22, after which it will be the *Evening Star* until July 7, after which, it will be the *Evening Star* until September 13. It will then be the *Morning Star* until November 5, then the *Evening Star* to December 30.

VENUS will be the *Morning Star* until February 11, then the *Evening Star* until December 12, after which it will be the *Morning Star*.

MARS will be a *Morning Star* until May 12. It will then be an *Evening Star* to the close of the year.

JUPITER will be an *Evening Star* until May 18. It will then be a *Morning Star* until December 6, then an *Evening Star*.

ELONGATIONS OF MERCURY AND VENUS.

MERCURY will be in its greatest Western elongation April 20, August 11, and December 14; in its greatest Eastern elongation February 5, June 8, and September 29.

VENUS will be in its greatest Eastern elongation October 12.

ECLIPSES.

There will be four Eclipses this year—two of the Sun, and two of the Moon.

I. February 27. A partial Eclipse of the Moon in the evening, on the southern limb of the Moon. Only the latter part of this Eclipse will be visible in Nova-Scotia, New-Brunswick and Canada. The Moon will rise partially eclipsed:

Beginning.....3h. 32m. A. }
Ending.....8h. 26m. A. } Mean time at Halifax.

Magnitude of the Eclipse (Moon's diameter=1) 0.333, on the southern limb.

II. March 15. An annular Eclipse of the Sun. This Eclipse will be partial and visible in Nova Scotia and New-Brunswick:

Beginning.....6h. 28m. M. }
Ending.....9h. 14m. M. } Mean time at Halifax.

The Sun will rise partially eclipsed, and but a small portion of its disc will be obscured.

III. August 24. A partial Eclipse of the Moon in the morning. This Eclipse will be invisible in North America, excepting on the shores of the Pacific.

IV. A total Eclipse of the Sun, September 7. This Eclipse will be invisible in British North America, but will be total in South America.

THE COMET.

The phenomena which have created most fear and alarm amongst mankind, have been those of Eclipses and Comets; and it was not until the science of Astronomy had been cultivated for years, that any rational ideas regarding the latter were promulgated.

Dr. Halley, after laborious calculation—even nights, days and years spent in figures and planetary observations—calculated the return of twenty-four Comets. He discovered that the Comet of 1682 was the same that appeared in 1607 and 1531; whose path, in its orbit, is completed in seventy-five or seventy-six years. The Comet of 1661 was supposed to be the one of 1532, completing every journey in 129 years—that the Comet of 1680 was the same one that appeared in 1106, and previous to that period in 531; first noted forty-four years before Christ.

Some Comets, noted in ancient times, have not yet become visible, inasmuch as their range, or the distance they are permitted to sour above the planetary system, may be to within a comparatively short space of the Fixed Stars; so that thousands of years may elapse before some return to their perihelion, or point of a planet's orbit wherein it is nearest the Sun.

The great Comet of 1680 was the most magnificent object of its kind seen in modern times. Its tail was 112 millions of miles in length, reaching ninety degrees across the heavens. When in its perihelion, it came so near the Sun, that, in accordance with Sir Isaac Newton's calculations, the body of the Comet must have been heated 2000 times hotter than red-hot iron, and could not get cool again in upwards of a million of years! Our readers may congratulate themselves that this Comet of 1680 is *not* the same with the one expected to flame in the firmament in 1857—8; but our posterity will have to tremble at the approach of the terrific monster in 2255!

Halley's Comet, which appeared in 1682, two years after its big brother had winged its way from the Sun, returns, by Halley's computation, every seventy-six years. It came as predicted, in 1759 and 1835, and its next advent will be in 1911. That Comet travels a million miles or more beyond the orbit of the planet Neptune. It is, however, a pygmy compared to the one now approaching us—the Comet of 1556, whose unexpected advent struck terror throughout all Europe.

The best authorities are of opinion that the Comet of 1264 and that of 1556, which is now approaching, are identical. It does not appear

possible, in the present state of our knowledge, to prognosticate the precise period of its appearance, though some, have somewhat rashly ventured to fix the very day! We do not feel disposed to go any further in the way of prediction, than by stating that the coming Comet will most probably make its appearance between June, 1857, and August, 1858.

The approaching Comet is one of greater size than the one of 1680—the length of its tail is 130 millions of miles! and its speed, near its perihelion, will be some millions of miles in one single hour!

If this Comet, then, be a solid, dense substance, and it appear during the approaching summer, going as near the Sun as the Comet of 1680, we may expect a very hot season, as certainly so large a body, if the theory be true that it becomes heated 2,000 times hotter than red-hot iron, cannot come within our view without increasing our temperature greatly.

The celebrated M. Arago and other astronomers of France, aver that there are 250,000,000 chances to one, against a collision between the Comet and the earth; and these learned observers of the heavens know far better than those pretended seers, who are always looking out for signs of horror and dismay.

It is an erroneous idea that improvements will not pay; this, in many instances, is urged merely as an excuse for carelessness and negligence. There are many instances, where improvements have been made, with a greater profit on the money so expended, than is realized in the ordinary routine of farming.

A farm that has not a plot of ground adapted to the purposes of a garden, had better be abandoned at once. There is no good reason why the real luxuries that spring from the soil, under the culture of the practical gardener, should be confined to the hands of the gentleman of leisure. They belong as much to the farmer, and indeed more so; for he who labours most actively, should reap the richest harvest. All that serves to make life more desirable, that tends to the improvement of the soil, the mind, and the heart, is not beneath the attention of man. We cannot conceive of a more fit place to commence the careful cultivation of a farm, than the garden. It would soon be evident that the greater care bestowed on the soil, the greater its product, and so a system of culture would by degrees be adopted, till the whole farm should become a fruitful field. In the cultivation of a garden, can be noted on a small scale, all the phenomena of growth, and from date there gathered, one can advance successfully from the tilling of narrow beds to that of broad acres. The knowledge necessary to success in gardening, is rather the result of experience, than of fixed rules. We do not profess to teach gardening "in six easy lessons," but we assert that any one so disposed can make a beginning—try!

WHEN spring comes every good farmer will have a field or garden or orchard, where he can profitably apply all the manure he can save or make during the winter. Every shovelful of manure judiciously applied will increase the amount of his crop. Now is the time to think of this, and to make preparation accordingly. Let those near the sea shore collect sea-weed—and those who live near saw-mills draw home and put under cover loads of saw-dust. This may be used to good advantage, in absorbing the urine of horses and cattle, and retaining the fertilizing ammonia which they contain. Saw-dust and dry meadow manure well saturated with urine will be a fertilizer almost equal to guano. On most farms there is nearly a total loss of the urine of the stock, during the time it is kept at the barn, and even the other portion of the excrement is often so much exposed that one half its value, probably, is lost. It is often washed into the highway, and is seen in the colouring of the water of brooks. It would not, probably, be an over estimate of this loss, to say that with many it is more than equal to their amount of poor and scanty rates.

THE Plough and the Harrow are now in requisition. Do you take an Agricultural paper? No doubt you do; and you will there find sufficient instruction for every month's business. In so small a compass as these columns you cannot expect any lengthened details. Our endeavours are mostly to call attention to the duty, and awaken the slumbering energies. If we happen to afford any profit, amusement or entertainment so much the better. But some very strangely object to reading for information, as though they were already fully stocked with knowledge. Lawyers, Clergymen and Physicians, say they must read as well as practice, and why not the farmer? Some, treading in the footsteps of their forefathers, say they want neither books nor papers to instruct them how to manage the soil. As for chemistry and botany, so much talked about believe they have no more to do with farming than spirit-rapping. Thus they talk, and all we can say or do is, let experience settle the matter. For raising onions it is recommended to prepare the beds as early in the spring as convenient, and suffer them to remain 8 or 10 days, for the noxious plants to vegetate, then to cover them with straw and brush to the depth of 10 inches, and burn them over; after which plant the seeds immediately. This process it is stated, has proved perfectly successful in driving away the insects and procuring good crops, and in addition, has furnished a capital top dressing to the soil. Onion beds prepared from the hearths upon which charcoal has been burned, have likewise been mentioned as producing the perfect vegetable entirely free from the attack of worms. The onion worm is exceeding difficult to destroy. Sowing the earth with ashes has proved of little avail—powdered charcoal answers a much better purpose—but if the method above mentioned be adopted, we have little doubt but that this insect will in a short time be greatly reduced in numbers, and afford a better chance for a more healthful crop of the onion plant in future. Onions and weeds do not agree well together in the same bed—the hoe and the fingers must be used as long as a weed is to be found.

The improvement of domestic animals, by encouraging skilful and systematic breeders, deserves attention. The improvement of animals by the art of breeding, is one of the most important branches of husbandry, and yet it is but very little understood. It necessarily follows that we have made slow progress in this department, and although we have had frequent importations of stock from other countries, producing in many instances, a marked improvement in their immediate progeny, the truth is our farmers have given so little attention to the subject, or have examined it under such false impressions, that it is difficult to find a man who is really capable of selecting a proper animal to breed from, and much more difficult is it to find one who is capable of breeding a herd or flock, without degeneracy, for several generations. The successful breeding of animals for particular purposes, requires a critical judgment and skill, which can only be obtained by a long course of the closest observation, and a habit of comparing animals, united with a natural taste for the subject, and a determination to understand its principles—hence the number of real IMPROVERS in this line have been very small.

We once knew a man who was very jealous of "his rights." He would rather lose ten dollars worth of time in attending a law-suit, than have his neighbour wrong him one dollar. He would go 7 miles and lose 2 hours to get one penny more on a few pounds of butter. He once drove 5 miles round, over a rough road, to save a few pence bridge toll, and broke his waggon which cost a pound to mend. Yet this same man, whose indignation was always aroused at the thought of a foreign or domestic foe, tamely allowed an army of at least 20,000 millepins, 8000 horse thistles, 50,000 Canada thistles, 3,000 burdock, and 900 elder bushes, to invade his fields, and the general opinion among his neighbours, was, that the same strength of soil and amount of land which these required for their growth, would have grown 40 bushels of wheat, 90 bushels of corn, and 120 bushels of potatoes. One of the first objects to which attention should be directed, is the eradication of bushes and pernicious plants in fields, along lines of fences, roadsides, &c. These are not only great drawbacks on the beauty of the farm, being unsightly to the eye, but they are very detrimental to the pecuniary interest of the farmer.

The latter part of August is considered the most favourable part of the year for making improvements on the farm. At this season, the earlier crops have been secured, the cultivation of the late ones has been finished, and the farmer is only waiting their maturity. In addition to the comparative leisure which is thus afforded, there are other circumstances which render this a suitable period for such operations. The ground is generally drier than at any other time during the year, which permits the labour of men and teams on places which at other times are inaccessible from wetness. This is particularly favourable to the drainage of bogs and the excavation of peat or muck for manure—the growth of bushes and shrubs has also reached that particular crisis in which they may be more easily killed by cutting or bruising. The reclamation of waste lands generally, but especially those of a wet and swampy nature, may be prosecuted with advantage—with these drainage is the first object—as the water is taken away, the soil will settle, and this settling will facilitate further operations.



Those farmers who succeed best in their operations, are noted for their strict adherence to system and order; and those who set at naught all order and system, are always in a hurry—never know where to find anything—never have a place for anything, except somewhere on the farm—and they never accomplish but little in comparison to what they might, were system and order their watchwords. Slovenliness does not belong to farming, neatness and neatness should not be strangers—in short, where there is neither system or rule, the party has no claim to the title of agriculturist.

There is a great advantage in commencing the fattening of animals early in the fall. There are many articles on a farm which may be profitably used at this season, but which, from their perishable nature, would be lost, or greatly depreciated in value, by long keeping. Early apples, squashes, pumpkins, humberlantable potatoes, and unsound corn should be used first. But besides the advantage in saving these kinds of food, there is another important argument in favour of early fattening; the same amount and quality of food will go further, or will produce a greater amount of meat, in mild weather, than in cold—less food being required to supply the waste of the animal system under a mild temperature, than under a low one. For SWINE there is a great advantage in cooking food, as it has been ascertained that pigs fatten much better on cooked than on raw food.

PREPARATIONS must now be made for a long and severe winter. The summer vehicles should be dried, cleaned and stowed away. The fences should be put in order, so that none of the fields may be exposed to the poaching of cattle, sheep or hogs. The farmer should walk about daily with a hammer and pocket full of nails, patching and repairing the barns and sheds where they require it. Finish digging and storing of roots, and the fall ploughing—one good ploughing of clay land in the fall is worth two or three in the spring. Husk the corn—make cider—examine and make cuts for the drainage of surface water—underground drains are preferable to surface ones. The children should be kept close at school, and the farmer should never forget that more attention is due from him toward the improvement of his children than to that of the land or stock. Let everyone take in and study an agricultural periodical, and strive to combine science with practice—practice with science.

To the first the amount is trifling, but to the latter it is often of importance.

The Mails for the United Kingdom are closed finally at Halifax every alternate *Thursday Evening* at 8 o'clock. Letters, &c., for England, which may be dropped into the box *after the hour of closing* and up to the arrival of the Packet, will be forwarded in a bag, loose—but such letters **CANNOT BE PREPAID**, either in money or stamps. The Royal Mail Steamers leave Boston for Halifax and Liverpool, G. B., every alternate *Wednesday*; arrive at Halifax on *Thursday evening* or very early the succeeding morning, leaving Halifax immediately after receiving the Mails.

Letters to or from England, 7½d., *prepayment optional*;—can be paid by using a 6d. or two 3d. Stamps, together with *half of a three-penny Stamp* cut diagonally. Newspapers free.

The Postage on Books from Great Britain to Nova Scotia, or *vice versa*, is at the rate of 7½d. currency, if not exceeding ½ lb.; exceeding ½ lb. and not exceeding 1 lb., 1s.3d.; and so on adding 1s. 3d. for every additional pound or fraction of a pound. One book package may contain separate Books, Publications, Almanacks, and Maps and Paper, Parchment or Vellum; the latter three materials may be written or printed on—the package may contain the name and address of the sender. Rollers may accompany prints and maps, and markers may be sent with books. No letter must be sent with or written on a book package, and no such package must exceed *two feet* in length, width or depth. The Postage must in all cases be *prepaid* by Stamps.

Closed Mails for the United Kingdom *via* United States are made up at Halifax to meet the Steamers leaving New York for Liverpool. Letters to be specially addressed "*via New York*." Letters 10d.; Newspapers 1d. each.

The Mails for the United States *via* Boston, per Royal Mail Steamers are made up on *Tuesday Evening* of the week in which the Packet from England is due, at 8 o'clock. Should the Steamer not arrive by 6 o'clock the following morning, *supplementary Mails* will be made up. Should the Steamer from Liverpool arrive previous to Tuesday night—the Mails as heretofore will close *immediately on her arrival*.

A closed Mail for Canada is made up and forwarded at the same time in charge of the British Officer. Letters so forwarded must be specially addressed "*Closed Mail for Canada*"; postage 7½d.; viz.: 5d. Packet Rate, and 2½d. Colonial Rate—*prepayment optional*.

The Mails for Bermuda and the West Indies, are made up *finally* at Halifax on the *Thursday Evening* of the week in which the Royal Mail Steamer is expected to arrive from Boston, at 8 o'clock.

Letters 5d.—when posted in the interior, 3d. additional, this must be prepaid. Newspapers 1½d. each, which must be paid by Stamp.

Letters are forwarded *via* Bermuda for Chagres and the Pacific, Chili and Peru, Havanna, Honduras, Lagunyra, Mexico, Venezuela, and the British and Foreign West India Islands.

Postage to Foreign West Indies, *five pence* when posted at Halifax: 3d. additional when posted in the interior—*must be prepaid*. Newspapers 1½d. each to be prepaid by Stamp at the time of Posting.

The Mails for Newfoundland, (and Cape Breton, during the Summer months,) are made up at Halifax, *once a month*, during the months of December, January, February and March; and *once a fortnight* during the months of April, May, June, July, August, September, October and November, closing *finally* on the *Thursday Evening* of the week in which the Royal Mail Steamer is expected to arrive from Boston.—Postage 5d.; when posted in the interior 3d. additional. Newspapers 1½d. each, which must be paid by Stamp at the time of Posting.

The Mails for St. Pierre and Miquelon are forwarded to Sydney, C.B. from whence they are despatched by the French Packet during the summer months, and from Halifax direct in the winter months. Letters 5d packet rate, and 3d. inland, *prepayment optional*.

All letters are charged by weight, and a uniform rate of postage of 3d. on a letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight has been established throughout British North America. To any part of the United States 6d.; to Oregon and California 9d., *prepayment optional*.

Letters posted in any Town within the Province for delivery in the same Town, are liable to a rate of *one penny* for every $\frac{1}{4}$ ounce.

Newspapers pass *free* to any part of the Province, British North America and the United States when sent by *land Mail*—to be put up in Covers open at the ends.

Printed Circulars, Prices Current, Handbills, and other printed matter of a like description, put up in covers open at the ends, and without any written communication, may be sent from any part of the Province to any place within the same, as well as through Nova Scotia, at the rate of *one penny* per oz.—*prepayment optional*, except when addressed to the United States, in which case the postage must be *prepaid*.

Pamphlets, Magazines, Periodicals, or Books, bound or unbound, done up in covers open at the ends, unaccompanied by any written communication, may be transmitted as above mentioned through the Mail in this Province: not exceeding 2 oz., in weight—*free*; 2 oz. and not 3, 1d.; 3 oz. and not 4, 1½d.; 4 oz. and not 5, 2d; adding ½d for every additional oz. up to 48 oz., beyond which weight they cannot be sent by Mail.

British reprints of copyright works from the United States, by *land mail* or steamer, charged letter postage.

For Musquodoboit Harbor, every Tuesday morning, at 9 o'clock. Return Mail due on Monday afternoon at 5 o'clock.

For Ketch Harbor and Sambro, on Friday evening at 10 o'clock. Return Mail due on Saturday.

 Letters for *Registry* must be posted half an hour previous to the closing of the mail by which they are to be forwarded, and the *postage*, as well as the registration fee, must be *prepaid*.

Letters *prepaid by Stamps*, and dropped into the Letter Box any time during the night, and up to 5 o'clock, A.M., will be forwarded by the mails despatched same morning.

When the mails from England arrive before 9, P.M., they are delivered the same evening, and after that hour, at 7 next morning.

All other Mails arriving before 7 P.M., will be delivered the same evening,—if after that hour and before 8, at 6 o'clock,—and if after 8, at 7 o'clock the following morning.

The Postmaster-General is not liable for the loss of any letter or packet, unless such loss should arise from his own default.

LIGHT HOUSEES

On the Coast of Nova Scotia, and on the Coast of New-Brunswick in the Bay of Fundy.

MEAGHER'S BEACH—East Side Halifax harbor. *A fixed light.*

SAMBRO ISLAND—Western entrance Halifax harbor. *A fixed light.*

DEVIL'S ISLAND—An *Octagonal Light Beacon* on the S. W. point of Devil's Island, at the entrance of the Eastern passage to Halifax harbor, and exhibits a *red light* on the seaward sides, to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach lights; stands forty-five feet above high water mark; rise and fall, six feet. The Tower painted dark brown, with a white belt between the Balcony and Lantern, to distinguish it in day time.

CROSS ISLAND—Entrance to Lunenburg harbor. Two lights—*flash light above ; fixed light below.*

LIVERPOOL—South end of Coffin's Island. *A plain, revolving light.*

FORT POINT harbor light, at the head of Liverpool harbor, southern entrance of the river. *A bright, fixed light*, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the larboard hand, when entering the harbor.

PORT MEDWAY—Beacon Light on Admiralty Head, west side of the entrance to the port. Building square, painted *white*, with *black square* in the centre of the seaward sides, *plain white light*, forty-four feet above sea level, and stands within thirty fathoms of the shore.

SHELBURNE—McNutt's Island. *Two fixed lights—one above the other.*

BARRINGTON—Baccaro Point, east side of the entrance to Barrington Bay. *A flash light*, of fifteen seconds.

YARMOUTH—West side of the harbor. *A plain, revolving light.*

CAPE SABLE, SEAL ISLAND—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy, is on the South point of Seal Island. *A plain, white light*, elevated about eighty feet above high water mark, and may be seen, on approaching the Island, from any point of the compass. A very dangerous rock, under water, but upon which the sea always breaks, called Blonde Rock, lies about three and one-third miles S. by W., by compass, from the Light House. Between this rock and the Island there are some dangers—the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels, therefore, ought not to attempt passing between them.

BRIER ISLAND—*A plain, white light*, situate about half a mile N. E. from the N. W. point of the Island.

WESTPORT—Peter's Island, at the south entrance of the east side of the Bay of Fundy. *Two white lights*, placed horizontally, to distinguish it from Brier Island Light, at an elevation of forty feet above high-water mark.

DIGBY GUT LIGHT—On the west side of Digby Gut, from Brier Island north-eastward. This light is chiefly intended as a guide into Digby Basin. *A fixed, white light.*

BLACK ROCK LIGHT—On the south shore of the Bay of Fundy. *A fixed, white light.*

HONTON BLUFF LIGHT—In the Basin of Mines, ninety-five feet above sea level, high-water; rise and fall forty to forty-five feet. Building square, painted white; stands sixty feet from the Bluff, and shows a *white light*, which may be seen, in clear weather, over the greatest part of the Basin of Mines, (after passing Cape Blowmedon), and above the Five Islands, and up Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it.

APPLE RIVER LIGHT—North side of the entrance to Apple River, in Chignecto, or Cumberland Bay. *Two fixed lights*, placed horizontally.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND RIVER—An Octagonal Light Beacon, on the west side of the entrance to Partridge Island River, Parrsboro', on the north side of the Basin of Mines, and exhibits a *plain, white light*, at an elevation of thirty feet above high-water; rise and fall about forty-five feet; the Tower is *white*, and stands close to high-water mark on the beach. Vessels can only enter the harbor at high-water, and must lie aground on soft bottom when the tide is low.

EASTERN BEAVER, OR WILLIAM'S ISLAND—*A revolving light.*

CANSEAU, CRANBERRY ISLAND—*Two fixed lights*, one above the other, **WEST SIDE OF THE GUT OF CANSEAU**—*A fixed light.*

EDDY, OR SAND POINT LIGHT—On Eddy, or Sand Point, on the west side of the south entrance to the Strait of Canseau, distinguished by *two white lights*, placed horizontally, twenty-five feet above the sea level. Building square, painted *white*, with a *black diamond* on the seaward side.

GUYSBOROUGH HARBOR BEACON—On the west side of the entrance to the harbor, head of Chedabucto Bay. *A fixed light.*

PICOU LIGHT—On the south-east side of the entrance to the harbor. *A fixed light.*

PICTOU ISLAND LIGHT—on the S. E. point of the Island. Building square and painted *white*. *A fixed light*, fifty-two feet above high-water mark.

ARICHAH BEACON—A Light on Point Marichi, on the east side of the southern entrance to the harbor. Building square, painted *white*. *A white light*, thirty-four feet above the sea-level.

LOUISBURG—On the east side of the entrance to the harbor. *A fixed light.*

LOW POINT LIGHT—East side of Sydney, Cape Breton, harbor. *A fixed light.*

SEA-WOLF, OR MARGARIE ISLAND LIGHT—Situated on the N. W. side of the Island of Cape Breton, nearly midway between Port Hood and Cheticamp harbors, and distant from Cape Breton two and a-half miles. *A plain, white light.* The lantern is placed on a square, wooden tower, painted white, near the centre and summit of the Island. The lantern is 298 feet above sea level—visible from all points of approach. To ves-

sol's in proximity to the Island, the light may become observed by the abrupt cliff or sides of the Island, which may serve as a guide to tack or anchor by, as hundreds of vessels find anchorage on the south-east side. The chief landing is near the S. W. end, in shore, where a few fishing stages and boats are kept in use during the fishing season.

PORT HOOD LIGHT—Changed from *white* to *red*, when seen from the northern entrance, to distinguish it from the Margerie and North Canoe lights.

WHITE HEAD ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. W. point of White Head Island. The tower is square, painted *white*, standing seventy-five fathoms from the water's edge, with an Octagonal Iron Lantern, sixty feet above sea level at high-water; rise and fall, six feet. The light is distinguished by *bright flashes*, of ten seconds duration, followed by eclipses of ten seconds, displaying alternately three flashes and three eclipses in a minute. The light will not be totally obscured during the eclipse.

FLINT ISLAND LIGHT—On Flint Island, off the Eastern coast of Cape Breton. Lat. 40 degrees, 11° 5' N., and Long. 59 degrees, 45° 50' W., and exhibits a *bright, flash light*, every fifteen seconds, visible from all points of the compass. The light is sixty-five feet above sea level, and can be seen at the distance of twelve miles.

ST. PAUL'S ISLAND—A *fixed light* on the north-east end, and a *flash light* on the south-west end.

SCATTARIE ISLAND—A *revolving light*, on the east end of the Island.

IRON-BOUND-ISLAND LIGHT—Off the entrance to La Havo River. A *bright, flash light*, of ten seconds duration, followed by eclipses of thirty seconds. The lantern is placed on a square, wooden tower, painted *white*, on the southern side of the Island, and is visible from all points of approach. Elevation seventy feet above sea level.

RAGGED ISLAND HARBOR LIGHT—On Gull Rock, off the entrance of the harbor. Building square and painted *white*, exhibiting a *clear, fixed light*, at an elevation of fifty-one feet above the sea level, and is situated in Lat. 43° 39' N., and Long. 64° 66' W.

PUNNICO HARBOR LIGHT—A Beacon Light on the S. E. side of the entrance to Punnico Harbor, situated on the E. side of the entrance to the Bay of Fundy, about thirteen miles northerly of Cape Sable. Building square, painted *white*. A *fixed, red light*, on the seaward side, twenty-eight feet above high-water level, (rise and fall twelve feet), and stands fifty fathoms from low-water mark. The point of beach is bold.

A **FOG BELL** has been erected on the E. Cape of Yarmouth harbor, a few feet to the southward of the Light House, and about one and one-quarter miles from the extreme outer point of the Cape. Strikes *seven* times per minute.

GANNET ROCK LIGHT—This light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Islands, off Machias, a distance of about twenty miles. A *white, flash light*, twenty seconds dark, and forty seconds light, in each minute. Building painted in stripes, vertical, black and white. Between the northernmost and the southernmost of the Murr Ledges, there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them always above water, and extend westward from the Light House about four miles. From this range further westerly, about six miles from the Gannet Light, lies a dangerous breaker called the Bull—this may be

avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands near the S. W. end of Grand Manan, open.

MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND LIGHTS—*Two fixed, white lights*, upon the Machias Seal Islands, forty-five feet above high-water, and bearing from each other E. S. E. and W. N. W., distant about 200 feet, by which circumstance, of two Light Houses at the same station, they will be immediately distinguished from all other lights upon the coast, British or American. Both buildings painted *white*. Vessels standing to the northward between these lights and the Gannet Rock, should tack or haul off the moment they bring these lights into one, as they will be, then, not more than three-fourths of a mile from the Murr Ledges, if more than five miles to the E. of the lights.

HEAD HARBOR LIGHT—Next in order after passing Grand Manan and the plain, white light (American) on West Quoddy Point, is Head Harbor Light, placed on the N. E. extremity of Campobello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles, Moose Island, and the Inner Bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels, also, at all times to enter Head Harbor. *A fixed, white light.* Building painted *white*, with a *red* cross on it.

POINT LE PREAU LIGHTS—Upon this projecting headland, two lights are placed, one above the other, in the same house, and distant twenty-eight feet. Both lights can be seen from every point of the compass where they may be useful; both are *fixed* and *white*. Building painted *red* and *white*, in stripes, five feet broad each, horizontally.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND LIGHT—At the entrance of the river and harbor of St. John, N. B. *A fixed, white light.* The building painted *red* and *white*, in vertical stripes.

BEACON LIGHT—Within Partridge Island, and upon a spit or bar which extends about half a mile S. S. E. off Sand Point, and which dries at two-thirds ebb, stands the Beacon Tower. *A fixed, white light.* Building painted *white* and *black*, in stripes, vertically.

QUACO LIGHT—*A revolving, white light*, placed on a small rock, off Quaco Head, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute. The light can be seen from any quarter where a vessel can approach. Building painted *white* and *red*, in horizontal stripes.

CAPE ENRAGE LIGHT—On the point of that name in Westmoreland, nearly opposite Apple River Harbor, N. S. Building painted *white*, about 120 feet above the tide mark. *A plain, white light.*

WEST QUODDY LIGHT—This is an American light, placed on the west side of the entrance into the St. Croix, by Lubec and Eastport.

A Schooner, a cross close up at the inner halliard.

An upper yard having been added to the Ship Staff, it will be used exclusively to designate Steam Vessels, thus :

The charge on all books posted in Nova-Scotia for GREAT BRITAIN, is as follows : For a packet not exceeding 4 oz., 4d.; 4 oz., and not exceeding 4lb., 7½d.; ½ lb., and not exceeding 1 lb., 1s. 3d.; 1 lb., and not exceeding 1½ lb., 1s. 10½d.; 1½ lb., and not exceeding 2 lb., 2s. 6d., and so on, increasing 7½d. for every additional ½ lb. or fraction of a ½ lb. Printed or lithographed letters addressed to any part of the UNITED KINGDOM, can be sent like other printed matter, as follows : For a single letter or packet of letters, open at the sides or ends, not exceeding 4 oz., 4d., and so on, according to the scale above, for charging books. All such matter must invariably be *prepaid*.


