H.W. F. & C. X<sup>n</sup> Spring Tides rise 6 feet Neaps 4 ft  
Their diurnal inequality at times causes a difference of 2 hours  
in the two tides of the same day and of two feet in their height.

Figures on the Sound show the Height in Feet.
