GENERAL ORDERS,

By the Vice-President in Council.

BATAVIA, JAN. 9, 1814.

The Vice-President in Council loses not a moment in publishing for general information the glorious intelligence received this day in official dispatches; by which it appears that on the 21st June last, Marquis Wellington attacked the French army near Vittoria, and completely routed them, driving them from all their positions, taking 151 pieces of cannon, 415 waggons of ammunition, all their baggage, provisions, cattle, treasure, &c. and a considerable number of prisoners.

The French army, which had been concentrated in an advantageous position, was commanded by Joseph Buonaparte in person, assisted by Marshal Jourdan, whose Baton was taken in the field.

Subsequent unofficial accounts state that the consequences of this victory have been the evacuation of Valencia by the enemy—Tarragona taken—Barcelona invested, and the British and Allied army advancing to the frontier of France, where it is said a second decisive victory has been obtained over Marshal Soult.

Anxious that this brilliant achievement should be received with the attention and respect it is so well calculated to excite, the Vice-President in Council is pleased to direct that a Royal Salute be fired at the Stad-house of Batavia, in the Towns of Samarang and Sourabaya, and by the Honorable Company's Cruizers in those Ports respectively.—And that a Royal Salute be fired with a *Feu de joie* by the Troops at Weltevreden and at the several Military Stations and Posts in this Island and its Dependencies.

Extra Batta to be issued to the European Troops on this occasion.
