The witness stated he lived in Tokyo. He identified Exhibit 2583 as his affidavit and verified it. The affidavit stated \* that from December 30, 1936 to April 5, 1940 the witness was in charge of movements of warships in the Naval Affairs Bureau of the Navy Ministry.

While it is stated in Prosecution Document 9550-1 that two Japanese destroyers were sent to the Indian Ocean to receive a cargo of Shanghai-bound Persian opium, during his term there were no cases of Japanese destroyers operating in the Indian Ocean. At that time Japan and Britain were at peace and the Indian Ocean area was outside the sphere of operational activity of the Navy, which meant that all movements of Japanese warships there would have followed the Navy Ministry directives. There were no directives issued during the period.

MAJOR POSITIONS HELD

FUJII was a Naval Career Man.

28 April 1938 appointed Secretary of the Investigation Committee for Damages of the Chinese Incident.

3 March 1939 appointed Administrative Official of the Chinese Affairs Board.

5 April 1940 appointed attache to the ambassador extraordinary and plenipotentiary to the Republic of China.

28 October 1940 ordered on an official tour to the Republic of China.

15 November 1940 appointed officer of the Naval Affairs Bureau, Navy Department, and constant attache to the Minister of Navy at the general headquarters.

1 November 1942 appointed captain.

In this document FUJII denies statement contained on page 1 of Prosecution Document No. 9550 to the effect that in November 1939 the Japanese authorities dispatched two destroyers to the Indian Ocean to receive a cargo of Shanghai-bound Persian opium; that he was in charge of movements of warships at the Naval Affairs Bureau for some time before and after this time and that there were no directives issued by the Naval Ministry during that period, and no Japanese ships were in that territory.

On 26 November 1945 Captain FUJII was interviewed by Major Barnard and others. Copies of this interview are in Case File No. 119, Serial 3. The original is in the Document Section in our exhibit file marked "Exhibit No. 5". He said that after October 1940 he was on duty with the General Staff of the Combined Fleet as Staff Aide to the Commander-in-Chief, Admiral Yamamoto, and at that time plans were complete to attack America. He first heard of it on 2 December 1941, that all the naval officers <sup>thought</sup> should be declared prior to the attack, and that "something must have gone wrong at the Foreign Office". FUJII stated that

those who had intimate knowledge of the full plan to attack America were the Commander-in-Chief of the Grand Fleet (Admiral Yamamoto) and the Chief of Staff of both the Army and Navy, and the Chief of the Bureau of naval operations.

In the interview referred to in the preceding paragraph Major Barnard appended some comments to the effect that in the preliminary discussion with FUJII it was ascertained that he had been with the Japanese Naval Intelligence in the United States at which time his superior had been Captain Yamaguchi, IJN, who was then on duty with the Japanese Embassy at Washington, D. C. At the outset of the interview FUJII stated that he spoke no English but was thrown off his guard when he was suddenly asked when and where he first met Commander Farnsworth, and answered the question in English before the interpreter had an opportunity to ask it in Japanese (page 3, Serial 3).

Commander Farnsworth was a former American Naval Officer who was cashiered from the Service and who subsequently was convicted of stealing plans of naval vessels from the Navy Department and selling them to the Japanese.

FUJII was also interrogated 28 March 1946 by Lt. Commander John D. Shea, Member of IPS (Case File 119, Serial 10). This concerned a trip in March 1941 when FUJII accompanied Foreign Minister Matsuoka to Germany, Russia and Italy as Naval Liaison Officer. He remembered that the trip had to do with the Tri-Partite Pact, but, for a shrewd intelligence officer, his memory was terrible. He remembered nothing of the details of any conversation, information, or conferences, that would in any way involve himself.

(NOTE: It is indeed strange that Captain FUJII has such a remarkable memory about the subject matter of his affidavit as to an alleged occurrence in November 1939, yet throughout the 20 typewritten pages of interrogation referred to in the preceding paragraph concerning the trip with Matsuoka, he exhibits the memory of a moron. It is also significant that he lied to Major Barnard about his ability to speak English at the outset of a previous interview -- Serial 3 referred to above.)

"Capt. Shigeru FUJII, member of the Naval General Staff and executive officer of the Southern Governmental Affairs Dept. (Nampo Seimu Bu), Navy Ministry as of Oct 1943. Born in March 1900; commissioned as Ensign in May 1922; from 1935 to 1936 he was stationed in Washington State and Alaska as a "language officer"; while in the U. S. he is known to have gathered intelligence; from 1937 to 1940 he was in the Military Affairs Bureau, War Ministry, on the Technical Council and on the Staff of Gen. Nobuyuki ABE, then Special Envoy to Occupied China; in 1941 he was promoted to the post of Private Secretary to the Naval Staff, Imperial Gen'l Hq.

On the 20th January 1947, a check was made of the files of the International Prosecution Section in an effort to uncover any leads which might develop into the prosecution of FUJII as a war criminal. These files reveal the positions held by subject during the war, but disclose nothing that would lead to his prosecution as a war criminal.

Accused of espionage activity in the United States in a letter to Chief of Investigation, Legal Section, SCAP from YASHIMA, Jiyuji (false name), 1, 2 chome, Togashi, Ebara ku, Tokyo-to.

Subj: FUJII, Shigeru, dtd 29 Jul 47, contd

From 1935-1936 subject was stationed in Washington State and Alaska as a "language officer," but is known to have gathered intelligence. He trained Lieutenant Commander Sadatomo OKADA to replace him and together they directed activities among Japanese in the Thirteenth Naval District and the collection of intelligence information for the Japanese government. In May 1935 he secured confidential maps of Alaska and sent them to Japan, and it is believed he obtained much information from Kanekichi YAMAMOTO, former head of the Toyo Gambling Syndicate in Seattle, and Charles Theodore TAKAHASHI of the China Import-Export Company, both men known to be involved in espionage activities. Subject departed for Japan on 10 August 1936.

From 1937 to 1940 he was in the Naval Affairs Bureau, Navy Ministry, and on the Technical Council and Staff of General Nobuyuki ABE, then special envoy to occupied China.
