

2. This directive is supplementary to and does not supersede instructions contained in reference g.

3. Submission of Applications. Applications for short tours of active duty training periods of 15 days will be submitted on DA AGO Form

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1058, in triplicate, by the individual active reservist concerned, to or through, as applicable, the commanding general of the major command in which the reservist resides, to the appropriate commander listed in paragraph 7, below. Employees of the United States Government will submit with their applications a statement of consent, by the agency or section with which employed, for active duty training. Forwarding indorsements will include a statement as to the availability of an assignment for the individual for a short tour of active duty training in a position appropriate to his MOS and branch of service.

4. The provisions of paragraph 10, reference a, will be complied with at the time of receipt of orders, and prior to travel to location of active duty training. Immunization will be accomplished in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 3, reference c. A certificate of the physical condition of the reservist will be accomplished by the individual upon release from active duty training, and forwarded to the commanding general of the major command in which the individual's records are maintained.

5. Pay and Allowances. Pay and allowances for 15-day short tours of active duty training will be made in accordance with Army Regulations 35-3420 and Special Regulations 35-210-50.

6. Attachment. Whenever feasible reservists will be attached for active duty training to a unit within the command in which the reservist resides.

7. Issuance of Orders. Authority to approve applications and to issue orders for active duty training is delegated to major commanders as indicated below:

a. For Reservists Residing in Japan. The Commanding General, Headquarters and Service Command, General Headquarters, Far East Command, is authorized to approve applications and issue orders for active duty training of applicants residing in Japan. The concurrence and designation of the unit to which the reservist will be attached for training will be obtained from the Commanding General, Japan Logistical Command, or the Chief of Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and Far East Command, whichever is applicable, prior to the issuance of such orders.

b. For Reservists Residing in the Marianas-Bonins, Ryukyus Commands, and Philippines Command (Air Force). Commanding Generals of the Marianas-Bonins and Ryukyus Commands, and Philippines Command (Air Force), are authorized to approve applications and issue orders for active duty training of applicants residing within their respective commands. If an appropriate unit for attachment for active duty training is not available within the command for a particular reservist, the

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commanding general may issue orders attaching the reservist to a unit within one of the above commands. The concurrence and designation of the unit to which the reservist will be attached for training will be obtained from the major commander concerned.


c. Active Duty Training at General Headquarters, Far East Command. Commanders listed in subparagraphs a and b, above, may issue orders attaching reservists to appropriate Staff Sections, General Headquarters, Far East Command, for active duty training only upon approval of the Commander-in-Chief, Far East.

d. Two (2) copies of all orders for active duty training of reservists will be furnished the Commander-in-Chief, Far East, Attention: AG-PA.

8. Records and Reports. a. The preparation of records and reports required by references a, b, and d are the responsibility of the commanding officer of the unit to which the individual is assigned for active duty training. Commanders issuing orders for active duty training will furnish the commander of the unit to which the individual is assigned for active duty training the required forms and instructions for forwarding such reports.

b. Reports required by reference i will be prepared quarterly and forwarded to the Commander-in-Chief, Far East, so as to arrive, in triplicate, not later than the 5th day of the month following the quarter for which the report is rendered. Negative reports will be submitted.

1. References:

2. General:

a. The category system is designed to permit an officer of the civilian components of the United States Army to remain on active duty with a reasonably definite understanding of the commitment existing between him and the Department of the Army. In the event of a forced reduction in officer strength dictated by changes in personnel requirements or budgetary limitations, the best qualified officers will be retained.

3. To whom applicable:

a. The provisions of this letter apply to all Department of the Army commissioned and warrant officer personnel of the civilian components of the United States Army on extended active duty, including those on duty with other Departments.

b. The word "officers" as used in this letter includes both commissioned and warrant officers.

4. Categories:

- a. The following categories are authorized:

Army Medical Service officers (other than MSC) who are classified priority 3 or 4 under PL 779 and all female Army Medical Service officers. 2. Cat IV officers who desire to apply for a volunteer category. Expiration date of Cat I to be executed must occur <u>after</u> expiration date of Cat IV. 3. Officers who will reach the maximum age-in-grade (para 4b, SR 135-215-5), or if maximum age-in-grade requirement is waived by the approving authority, will reach age 60, in more than 1 year but less than 2 years.

V		<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Officers whose category has expired and who have been retained on active duty under authority of GO 27, DA 1950, or GO 48, DA 1951. Expiration date is 12 months from expiration date of category in which serving <u>prior</u> to being placed in Cat V. 2. Officers placed in Cat V by individual directive of DA who do not apply for new category. Expiration date is 12 months beyond original category expiration date. 3. Officers who will reach age 60 within 1 year. Expiration date is last day of the month in which age 60 is reached.

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5. Should administrative difficulty arise in determining an officer's reserve status at the time of entry on extended active duty, major commanders are authorized to communicate directly with the major commander who issued extended active duty orders. Commander-in-Chief, Far East, Attn: AG-PD, will be information addressee on such communications.

6. Qualifications:

a. Commanders authorized to approve applications for new category may waive the maximum age-in-grade limitations prescribed by paragraph 4b, SR 135-215-5, as amended, subject to the following:

- (1) Officer is serving in Cat I, II, III, or IV, and cannot complete a new volunteer category commitment prior to attaining the maximum age-in-grade.
- (2) Officer has been placed in Cat V for being over maximum age-in-grade and is applying for new Cat I, II, or III and can complete new category commitment prior to the last day of the month in which he reaches age 60.

7. Applications:

a. Qualified officers may submit a letter of application through channels for new category to extend active duty beyond current category expiration date.

b. Letter of application will be addressed to The Adjutant General, Department of the Army, Attn: AGPO-S-C, and will be in sufficient copies to insure delivery of a signed copy to the addressee.

c. Applications will be submitted not earlier than 8 months nor later than 6 months prior to expiration of current category, except that:

- (1) An officer promoted during the 6 month period prior to separation may apply for new category.
- (2) An officer serving in Category IV may apply for a volunteer category at any time prior to departure from parent unit for separation or relief from active duty.
- (3) An officer currently serving in Cat V as a result of declining to sign a new category and having been extended by GO 27, 1950,

or GO 48, 1951, or by individual directive of the Department of the Army, may apply for new Cat I, II, or III at any time prior to departure from parent unit for separation or relief from active duty.

d. Applications will contain the following statement:

"Under the provisions of SR 135-215-5, the undersigned desires to serve on extended active duty in Cat _____ to be effective _____ and expiring _____. My present category is _____, and expires _____. I understand that if this request for renewal of my category is approved, such approval is considered to be an official statement of my new category in accordance with paragraph 6c, SR 135-215-5."

e. The commander who finally approves an application for new category II or III of an officer currently serving in Category IV will issue an individual order substantially as follows: "DP, each of the following named officers currently serving on active duty pursuant to provisions of Section 21, Universal Military Training and Service Act, as amended, having made application to serve on active duty for a longer period, is hereby ordered to active duty with his consent pursuant to provisions of subsection 515 (d), Officer Personnel Act of 1947, effective this date, in grade in which serving and for period specified in his application or any subsequent renewal thereof made with his consent unless sooner relieved. These orders will not be deemed to effect dates of rank or interrupt current periods of active service of officer concerned." Two copies of orders prescribed above will be forwarded to The Adjutant General, Washington 25, D. C., Attn: AGPO-S-C.

f. Category IV-17 officers who voluntarily extend their period of service for any period up to a total of 24 months on current tour of active duty will be required to execute the following statement:

"I, (name, grade, SN), a member of the ORC having been advised of my eligibility for relief from active military service upon completion of 17 months active service under the provisions of Section 21, Universal Military Training and Service Act, as amended, hereby waive such right and voluntarily consent to remain on active duty until (date), at which time I will have completed (number of months not to exceed 24) months active service on current tour. I understand that by signing this statement I render myself liable for world-wide assignment, if otherwise qualified." The original statement will be filed in the officer's field military 201 file and one signed copy will be forwarded to The Adjutant General, Attention: AGPI-O. The order required by paragraph 7c will not be issued for officers who do not extend beyond a total of 24 months on current tour.

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c. Processing of applications:

a. Applications for renewal of category will be processed
as follows:

(1) Department of the Army agencies will forward two signed
copies of each application direct to The Adjutant General, Attention:
AGPO-S-C, for final action.

(2) Applications of Army officers serving with the
Department of the Air Force will be processed under this directive,
except that commands normally commanded by a general officer will
forward applications to Headquarters, Department of the Air Forces,
for transmittal to The Adjutant General.

(3) Applications of Army officers serving with the
Department of the Navy will be forwarded to The Adjutant General,
Attention: AGPA-A, through the local naval commander and the Army
unit of administrative attachment.

(4) All other applications may be approved by commands
normally commanded by a general officer. Applications which are
disapproved by such commanders will be forwarded through channels to
The Adjutant General, Attention: AGPO-S-C, for final action.

b. Applications will be indorsed with a recommendation for
approval or disapproval, with detailed reasons for disapproval. The
first forwarding indorsement will also state that data contained in
basic communication have been verified. Disapproval will be recommended
if:

(1) Waiver of maximum age-in-grade limitation is not
granted as authorized by provisions of paragraph 6, above, or

(2) Officer is considered undesirable for further retention
on extended active duty by reason of relatively low efficiency, inaptness,
misconduct, lack of attention to duty, lack of initiative, or other
cogent reasons.

(3) Attention is invited to statement required by para 3 a
or b, AR 600-186, in those cases when derogatory information is included
concerning the officer.

c. Final action on each application will be forwarded by

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letter through the same channels to the organization having custody of the officer's records for inclusion in his field military 201 file. Appropriate entries will be made in items 11 and 22, WD AGO Form 66 (Officers', Warrant Officers', and Flight Officers' Qualification Record) and on the unit morning report, indicating new category and date of expiration.

d. New categories will be computed as beginning the first day of the month following the expiration date of current categories.

e. Categories I, II, or V signed in accordance with paragraph 4, this letter, will expire on the last day of the month in which the officer reaches the maximum age-in-grade, or age 60, whichever is applicable.

f. The expiration date of Category II, signed by officers currently serving in Category IV, will be the last day of any month which is at least 2 years but less than 3 years after the month in which the new category is approved.

g. The expiration date of Category III, signed by officers currently serving in Category IV, will be three years from the last day of the month in which the new category is approved.

h. Officers whose applications are disapproved by the Department of the Army will be relieved from extended active duty upon expiration of current category, or placed in Category V, with expiration date of 12 months from the expiration of the present category, as directed by The Adjutant General.

9. Separation:

a. Officers who have completed 12 months service under provisions of GO 27, 1950, or GO 48, 1951, if applicable, and who do not desire extension of active duty, will be relieved from active duty upon expiration of category (Cat V). Subsection 515 (d), Officer Personnel Act of 1947 (Bulletin 18, WD, 1947) will be cited as authority for separation and orders will state "By direction of the President."

b. Officers who entered upon a new volunteer category on or after 25 June 1950 will be relieved from active duty upon expiration of such category unless they volunteer for a new category.

c. Major commanders are authorized to effect release of Cat IV-17 officers at any time during the last 60 days of their 17 months service.

(1) If local conditions make it necessary to stagger the

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release of eligible officers, a major factor to be considered in determining release sequence will be the maintenance of unit effectiveness.

(2) Insofar as is practicable, consideration will be given to length of WW II service, combat service in Korea, and dependency or hardship.

c. Officers eligible for separation because of expiration of category will not be retained beyond completion of their obligatory period of service.

d. Critical Cat IV specialists individually designated by the Secretary of the Army and notified by the Department of the Army will be released as soon as possible, but not later than completion of 24 months service.

e. Officers who decline to apply for new volunteer category will not be permitted to apply for renewal after departure from parent unit for separation or relief from active duty.

10. Processing for Separation:

a. Officers, without dependents in Japan, returning from Korea, will be processed through the Sasebo Replacement Depot (Provisional).

b. Officers in Japan will be processed through the processing center nearest their assignment station.

c. Officers in the Philippines Command (AF), Ryukyus Command, and the Marianas-Bonins Command will be processed so as to arrive in CONUS or territory of residence not earlier than 60 days and not later than 15 days prior to completion of category commitment.

d. Officers in Japan and Korea will be released in order to arrive at the processing center within Japan not earlier than 75 days nor later than 30 days prior to completion of category commitment.

e. Officers with dependents in Japan will be processed through the 2d Transportation Major Port, APO 503.

11. Nothing in this letter will preclude normal rotation of eligible officers in accordance with current rotation criteria.

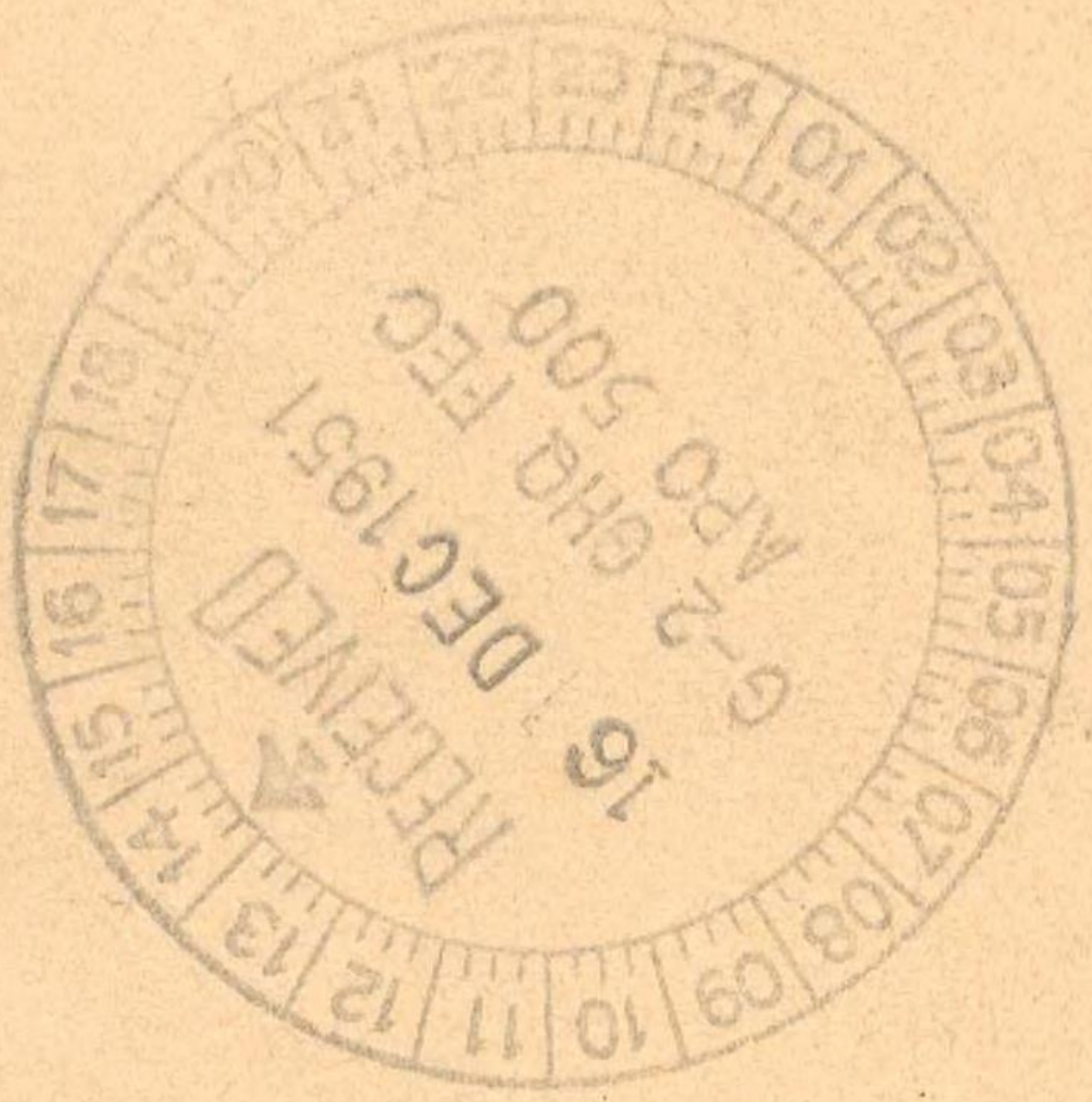
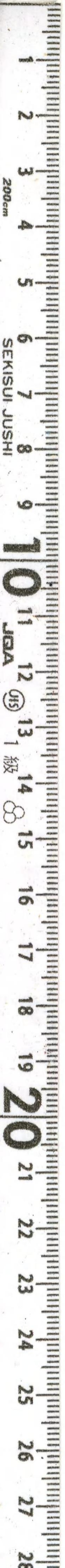
