SIR,—I have the honour to submit the Annual Report relating to the Registration of Births, Marriages and Deaths, in the Province during the year ending 31st December 1881.

The total number of registrations of Births, Marriages and Deaths for the year is 76,641, an increase over the returns for 1880 of 1,744, or 4.3 per cent.

The Births number 40,714, less by 1,598 than was registered in 1880.

There are 13,106 Marriages registered during the year, or 323 more than in 1880.

Of Deaths there are returned 22,821, being an increase over the number registered in 1880 of 3,019.

The decrease in Births is 3.7 per cent. ; the increase in Marriages, 2.5 per cent. ; and the increase in Deaths, 15.2 per cent.

REMARKS ON TABLES 1, 2, AND 3.

Of the 39 counties in the Province of Ontario 27 return this year a decreased number of births as compared with the year 1880.

The ratio of births to population according to the last census in Ontario for the year 1881 is nearly 22 per 1,000, whereas about 30 births per 1,000 are estimated to be the actual number. The returns from the county towns show a decrease of 624. In 1880 there were 8,947 births, while in 1881 there are only 8,323. Ottawa with a population of 27,417 returns only 495 births, or 18 per 1,000 of the population. St. Catharines shows a decrease of 85 or the same ratio of 18 per 1,000, showing that the returns from these two cities are very incomplete. Toronto, although showing a decrease of 105, has a ratio of nearly 30 per 1,000. Belleville, with a decrease of 86, gives a ratio of 22 per 1,000. London has a decrease of 61, with a ratio of 21 per 1,000; while the decreases in the number of births registered in remaining county towns are very small. Fourteen towns return an increase of births. The Town of Brockville returns the largest increase, viz., 38, with a ratio to population of 28 per 1,000. St. Thomas being next shows 22 of an increase, with a ratio of 24 per 1,000. Picton shows an increase of 21, with a ratio of 22 per 1,000.

The ratio of births to population in the county towns is 25 per 1,000. In the ten cities it is a little more, 25.5 per 1,000. Five of the cities return a higher ratio than this; thus Toronto gives nearly 30 per 1,000, Guelph 28 per 1,000, Hamilton 26 per 1,000, Kingston 25.7 per 1,000, and Brantford 25.6 per 1,000, while the other five cities show less than the average ratio 25.5 per 1,000.

MARRIAGES.

As the population increases, so will the number of marriages increase. This is shown by the number of marriages registered in Ontario in 1881; thus 13,106 marriages are returned as having been celebrated during the year, this number being an increase over 1880 of 323. The ratio of marriages to population in the whole Province is 7 per 1,000. In the county towns the ratio is much larger, being nearly 12 per 1,000. This excess is caused (as pointed out in former Reports) by parties residing in the rural districts resorting to the towns to have their marriages solemnized.

DEATHS.

The number of deaths registered in the Province in 1881 is 3,019, or 15.2 per cent. more than in 1880, which number increases the ratio of deaths to 12 per 1,000 of the population, while in 1880 the ratio was only 10 per 1,000. It is computed that if all the deaths were registered, the ratio would be from 16 to 18 per 1,000. This ratio is reached in the county towns, the number of deaths in 1881 being 6,298, or 18.8 per 1,000, thereby indicating that the returns from these places are more complete than from the rural parts of the Province. Nearly every county shows an increase in the number of deaths

registered. Thus Middlesex reported the largest increase, 434, or a ratio of deaths of nearly 16 per 1,000 of the population. This is, however, in a great measure due to the sad accident which occurred on the river Thames by the upsetting of the steamer Victoria, when nearly 200 persons lost their lives. York returns nearly as large an increase, viz., 426, giving a ratio of 16 per 1,000. Carleton comes next with an increase of 238, or a ratio of 22 per 1,000. Huron is next in order, reporting 179 more deaths than in 1880. Thirty-four counties return an increased, and five a decreased, number of deaths this year.

The total increase in the 34 counties is 3,082, and the total decrease in the other five counties only 63. Hence it may be inferred that the registration of deaths is steadily approaching completeness.

In the returns from the cities it will be noticed that Ottawa not only has the largest increase of deaths, 280 ; but has also the largest ratio of deaths to population, this being 30 per 1,000. This city appears to be subject to yearly epidemics. Thus last year, 1880, small-pox by its ravages carried off a large number of the population ; this year, 1881 diphtheria and diarrhoea appear to have caused a large increase in the mortality returns. These epidemics occurring with regularity from year to year should incite the authorities to investigate the cause of them with a view to their prevention or amelioration, as, no doubt, proper sanitary measures would lessen the mortality from them as it is proved to have done in other places.

Toronto returns an increase of 180, giving a ratio of 19.5 to the thousand. Of the ten cities six return more, and four cities less, deaths registered this year, 1881, than in 1880. The largest decrease is in Belleville, it being 29, giving a ratio of 17.7 per 1,000. St. Thomas has the lowest ratio of deaths, it being 11 per 1,000. Whether this is owing to the healthy condition of the city through improved sanitary measures, or to incomplete returns is not easy to determine. It is to be hoped that the first cause accounting for the low mortality is the true one. The average ratio of the total number of deaths in the ten cities of the Province for the year 1881 is 20.2 per 1,000 of the population. Last year, 1880, it was only 18.5 per 1,000.

BIRTHS BY MONTHS.

(See Table 4, see Appendix, page iv.)

The same variation in the proportion between male and female births in the different months appears this year as in former years though not in the same months. In 1880 the greatest disparity was in the month of September; this year it is in the month of August, the male births being in proportion to females as 113 to 100. January comes next with the proportion of 112.6 to 100; while the months of February, March, May, and October have nearly the same proportion, viz., 108 males to 100 females. There are 1,580 more male than female births reported. The proportion for the whole year between the sexes is 108 males to 100 females. The month of March this year again returns the highest number of births, 3,859, as it did in 1880. November returns the lowest of any month, 3,074. In 1880 December reported the lowest.

QUARTERLY RETURN OF BIRTHS.

(See Tables 5, 6, 7, and 8.)

The largest number of births almost invariably occurs in the first quarter of the year, and the next largest in the third quarter—such is the case this year. Thus 26.6 per cent. of all the births occurred in the first quarter, 24.2 in the second, 25 per cent. in the third, and 24.2 in the fourth quarter, there being a difference of only 2 per cent. between the highest and lowest quarter.

ILLEGITIMATE.

(See Table 9.)

Again the registered births of illegitimate children shew an increase in numbers. In 1880 the number reported was 671, while this year shows 748 as reported, being an increase of 77, thus making the proportion of one illegitimate birth in every 54 births, or 18.3 per thousand births, an increase not desirable to record for this Province, although it may be still less than in other counties, as is fully shewn in the report for 1880. Of these 748 illegitimate births, 249, or 33 per cent., are returned from seven of the ten cities of the Province. Toronto registered 138, or 18 per cent.; Hamilton, 46, or 6 per cent.; London, 26, or 3.4 per cent.; Kingston, 25, or 3.4 per cent.; Ottawa, 8, or 1 per cent.; Belleville, 4, and Guelph, 2. St. Catharines, Brantford and St. Thomas register none of these births. The county of Carleton returns the very large number of 144 of these births, being nearly 20 per cent. of the whole number of illegitimate births in the Province. There are 1,268 births reported from this county, therefore, in every nine births one was illegitimate. The greater proportion of these births is reported from a public institution situate in the township of Nepean, on the border of and near Ottawa city.

TWINS AND TRIPLETS.

(See Table 9.)

The number of twin births registered is 384, or 23 less than in 1880. Three cases of triplets are recorded, one in the county of Huron, one in the county of Lanark, and one in the county of Welland. In 1880 there were six cases returned.

Of every 54 births one is a twin, and of every 10,178 one is a triplet.

Of the 26,212 persons married in 1881, 9,147 are Methodists. They rank the highest in number this year as they have done for several years. There is a slight increase in the numbers of Episcopalians and Roman Catholics married. The other denominations have nearly the same per centage as in 1880. Amongst Methodists, Roman Catholics, Baptists and Congregationalists there are more females of those denominations than males married. In the other denominations the males predominate.

October and December again return the highest number of marriages, as they did in 1879 and 1880. July is the lowest instead of August in those years.

The counties returning the largest number of marriages are those in which the cities and chief towns are situated. York, including Toronto, heads the list with 1,264 marriages; Middlesex, including London, 651; Wentworth, including Hamilton, 588. Northumberland and Durham, including the towns of Cobourg and Port Hope, 490, and Wellington, including Guelph, 462. Halton is again the lowest, returning only 139 marriages; but, as stated in last year's report, it is a small county and has no large towns within its limits.

It will be observed that 2,793 females and 162 males have been married before they were 20 years of age, but, the largest number both of males and females have been married between 20 and 25 years. There are 11,437 altogether (4,859 males and 6,578 females), or 43 per cent. of all the persons married this year.

Again several marriages are reported in which the parties have been far advanced in life, at the time of their marriage. Two instances are given where the bridegrooms were each 81 years old, their brides being 47 and 32 years of age respectively. The marriage which exhibited the greatest disparity in ages, was that of a man aged 74 married to a girl of only 16 years. The united ages of the oldest couple married is 154 years, of the youngest 33, the bridegroom being 18 and the bride 15.

This year the status of each person is given, as to whether they were bachelors or widowers, spinsters or widows, at the time of marriage. We find that of 13,106 males married, 11,693 were bachelors and the remaining 1,413 were widowers. Of the females married, 12,387 were spinsters and 719 were widows.

DEATHS AT DIFFERENT AGES AND MONTHS.

(See Appendix, page xxxii.)

The number of deaths returned under one year is 5,246, and from one to five years, 3,120. This is largely in excess of the number reported in 1880, but the percentage to the whole number of deaths is not correspondingly so large, owing to the increased returns in the number of deaths for the year. Moreover, 3,592 persons have lived to the allotted duration of the life of man, three score years and ten; 1,269 lived to be over 80 years, and 265 to 90 years and upwards.

(See Table 15.)

August, this year, has been the most fatal month to both sexes. 2,216 (1,121 males and 1,095 females) dying in that month. In 1880, March returned the largest number, and June, this year, returns the lowest mortality of both sexes. Last year, January was the lowest for males and June for females.

The third quarter of the year has the largest record of deaths. In previous years, the first quarter was generally the highest. The second quarter has the lowest record, or 772 less than the highest quarter. The difference between the returns for the other quarters is not very great. The number of deaths in the second half year is 731 more than it was in the first half year. This is the reverse of last year, when the first half returned 724 more deaths than the second.

THE DEATH WAVE FOR THE YEAR.

(See Table Appendix, page liv. and lv.)

The two highest points in the mortality appear to be in March and August, and the two lowest points in January and June. For tracing these two rises and falls in the death wave, we commence with the low point, in January, which returns 1,767 deaths, the lowest month but one in the year, or 150 less than in the previous December. A change

takes place in the next month, February, and we find a rise of 51 deaths; in the next month, March, this rise in the mortality becomes very rapid, the deaths being 2,035, or 217 or 12 per cent. more than in February, and attaining the first of the two high points in the year. The wave descends in April, there being 73 less deaths, while this fall is greater in May, the decrease being 175. It drops still lower in June, and here reaches the lowest point of mortality, the deaths in that month being 1,644, or the lowest record of any month of the year. In the next month, July, a rapid rise takes place, the number of deaths increasing by 233. This rise in the death rate increases in August, when it attains the highest point in the year, 2,216 deaths being registered. A fall, but not a rapid one, takes place in the next two months, September and October; but still a high rate of mortality is maintained.

In November the fall becomes more rapid, the decrease being 238, or 11 per cent. In December, the mortality changes and a slight increase appears to be followed by a fall in January, which month invariably has a low mortality. Of the total deaths recorded in the year, only 7.7 per cent. were registered in that month. Last year, 7.2 per cent. were so recorded. In preceding years it was much larger. This year, the highest point in the death wave was during the hot dry weather in summer; in 1879 and 1880, it was during the cold wet weather of early spring.

The same remarks in reference to the high mortality in March and April, made in the last Report, are applicable this year, viz.: "That it was owing to the large number of deaths from diseases of the lungs at that season of the year."

REMARKS ON THE TEN HIGHEST CAUSES OF DEATH.

(See Tables 18, 19, and 20.)

Phthisis, Old Age and Infantile Debility, still maintain, as they have done for several years, their positions of first, second and third respectively on the list ; Diphtheria, Pneumonia and Heart Disease are next in order, Diphtheria, this year, preceding Pneumonia ; Convulsions have fallen to the bottom of the list, while Diarrhœa and Typhoid Fever take the places of Bronchitis and Congestion of the Lungs.

PHTHISIS (CONSUMPTION OF LUNGS).

The total deaths from Consumption exceed by 243 the number returned for 1880 ; but, as the increase in the total number of deaths from all causes is 3,019 more than in 1880, the percentage of deaths from Consumption to the total number of deaths in the Province, is less, viz. : 10.5 per cent. this year, as compared with 10.8 per cent. in 1880.

The proportion of deaths of females to males is less than in 1880, there being 26 per cent. more females than males. From 5 to 10 years, four more females than males have died of this disease ; from 10 to 15 years, eighteen more ; from 15 to 20 years, ninety-two more ; from 20 to 30 years, one hundred and thirty-one more ; from 30 to 40 years, seventy-six more, and from 40 to 50 years, four more.

The decennial period between 20 and 30 years is always the most fatal one ; this year, 763 (316 males and 447 females) have succumbed to this scourge ; this being 31 per cent. of the whole number of deaths from Consumption, and about the same rate as in 1880.

The number of deaths from this disease does not vary from the average much for any month with the exceptions of April and September. April returns the highest number, 212, and September the lowest, 179. The first half year returns a few more deaths than the second ; while the last quarter of the year appears to have been the most fatal, 620 deaths being returned in that period.

The average of deaths per month is nearly 200, while in 1880, it was 180. In every month, more females than males have died. October appears to have been the most fatal month for females and March for males.

DEATHS FROM CONSUMPTION IN THE DIFFERENT COUNTIES.

The total number of deaths recorded in the Province, in 1881, is 22,821 ; of that number, 2,397, or 10.5 per cent. died from Consumption. Some counties, however, returned a much higher, and others a much lower rate than that ; but the returns of deaths are not proportionately alike, as is shown by the very low ratio of deaths to population in some of the counties as compared with others. For example : Grey returns a death rate of only 6 per 1,000 of the population, while Essex returns 18 per 1,000. No serious epidemic occurred in Essex during 1881, and there is no reason to believe that the county is so much more unhealthy than Grey, as the returns would indicate. Evidently the registration of deaths is very incomplete in Grey. Prince Edward returns of this disease 17 per cent. of the total number of deaths, its death rate being 11 per 1,000 of the

population. This county has, for the last five years, returned a larger percentage of deaths from this disease than any other county in the Province, the average being 17.4 per cent. of all the deaths in the county. The united counties of Leeds and Grenville return a less percentage this year, from this disease; but still, it is 5 per cent. above the average for the whole Province, its average for the past five years being very high, viz. : 16.4 per cent., and its ratio of deaths to population, 11 per thousand. Lennox and Addington show a large falling off in the number of deaths from Consumption, the percentage, this year, being only 13 per cent., as against 18 per cent. in 1880. The average, however, for the last five years, is high, being 15 per cent., with a ratio of 10.7 deaths per 1,000 of population. The county of Lincoln returns show 14, and the united counties of Northumberland and Durham 15 per cent., having each a ratio of only 9 deaths per 1,000. Generally, it will be found that those counties which return the largest ratio of deaths per 1,000 of the population have comparatively the smallest percentage of deaths from Consumption, as the following counties show: Carleton, with a ratio of 18 deaths per 1,000, only returns 8 per cent. of deaths from this disease; Brant, with a ratio of 13 deaths per 1,000, 8 per cent.; Frontenac, a ratio of 14 per 1,000, 11 per cent.; Middlesex, a ratio of 16 per 1,000, 9 per cent.; Peel, a rate of 17 per 1,000, 10 per cent.; Perth, a ratio of 15 per 1,000, 8 per cent.; Waterloo, a ratio of 14 per 1,000, 11 per cent.; Wentworth, a ratio, of 17 per 1,000, 10 per cent., and York, with a ratio of 16 per 1,000, 9 per cent. On the other hand, as will have been seen, there was a high percentage of deaths from Consumption in those counties which returned a low ratio of deaths to population, viz. : the united counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry return a death rate of 13 per cent. from Consumption, and a ratio of only 9 deaths to 1,000 of the population; Renfrew, 12 per cent., with a ratio of only 8 per 1,000; Prince Edward, 17 per cent., with a ratio of 12 per 1,000; Northumberland and Durham (united), 15 per cent., with a ratio of 9 per 1,000; Leeds and Grenville (united), 15 per cent., with a ratio of 11 per 1,000; Lanark, 13 per cent., with a ratio of 8 per 1,000, and Hastings, 13 per cent., with a ratio of 11 per 1,000. There are some exceptions, such as Lincoln, which has a ratio of 14 deaths per 1,000, and the same per centage of deaths from Consumption; other counties, with a low ratio of deaths to population, have a large percentage of deaths from Consumption, as in Dufferin, where the ratio is 8 per 1,000, the deaths from Consumption are only 7 per cent., and in Simcoe ratio, 8 per 1,000, and 9 per cent. from Consumption.

Fifteen counties return a higher rate than the average for the Province, 10.8 and 24 less.

From these facts, it may be inferred, that in those counties which return the highest percentage of deaths from Consumption, but which have returned a small ratio of deaths to population, the deaths cannot have been all registered.

CONSUMPTION IN THE CITIES.

(See Table 3.)

The total number of deaths in the ten cities is 4,662, and from Consumption 464, or very nearly 10 per cent. of all the deaths, and one-half per cent. less than the average of

the whole Province. St. Catharines returns the largest percentage (16) of deaths from this disease. Its ratio of deaths to population is also the largest, except Ottawa, it being 20.2 per 1,000. Guelph is the next highest with 15.2 per cent. and a ratio of 18 per 1,000; Belleville is also very high, 13.6 per cent., with a ratio of 17.7 per 1,000; and Brantford is the lowest, 5.6 per cent., with a ratio of 18.4 per 1,000. Hamilton, Brantford, Ottawa, and St. Thomas appear to have less deaths from this disease, in proportion to population, than the other cities.

The death rate for the 10 cities is very high, 20.2 per 1,000. Last year it was only 18.5, and has, in fact, never been so high before. Ottawa returns the highest death rate, 30 per 1,000; in 1880, it was 20.9 per 1,000. This may, however, be accounted for by the large number of deaths returned under the heads of Infantile Debility and Diphtheria; the former disease having carried off 134, or nearly 16 per cent. of all the deaths, and the latter, 81, or nearly 10 per cent. The percentage of deaths from Consumption is low, being 7.3 per cent. Last year, this city suffered from the ravages of Smallpox.

OLD AGE.

This is the sixth year that Old Age has stood second in the list of the ten highest causes of death, 1,972 persons (969 males and 1,003 females) being registered as dying from it, or 314 more than in 1880; but, in consequence of the increased number of deaths reported, the percentage to the whole in the Province is only slightly increased, *i. e.*, 8.9 per cent. this year to 8.5 in 1880. The non-attendance, in many cases, of medical men upon these old people at the time of their death accounts, in a great measure, for no particular disease, although present, being assigned as the cause of death. It is a remarkable fact, that those counties which return the highest death rate from Consumption also return the largest percentage of deaths from Old Age; Prince Edward, which returned 17 per cent. of deaths from Consumption, also returned 11 per cent. from Old Age; Hastings returned 13 per cent. from Consumption and 10 per cent. from Old Age; Leeds and Grenville, 15 per cent. from Consumption and 13 per cent. from Old Age, while the county of York, which had only 8 per cent. from Consumption, has only 6 per cent. from Old Age, and Lambton, which returned only 6 per cent. from Consumption, returns only 4 per cent. from Old Age.

INFANTILE DEBILITY.

The large number of 1,481 deaths (829 males and 652 females), being 181 more than last year, is registered under this unsatisfactory heading. The highest number registered in any one month is 201, in August, and the lowest in any one, 77, is in December.

DIPHTHERIA.

This disease is evidently on the increase in the Province. In 1877, it ranked fifth in the ten highest causes of death; it rose to fourth place in 1878, dropped down to sixth position in 1879, and rose again in 1880 to fifth place, and this year, takes the fourth place. The increase in the number of deaths from it, this year, is 349, and after allowing for the increased return of deaths, the percentage of the whole number of deaths returned has increased 1.1 per cent. In the ten cities, there has been one death from Diphtheria

in every 28 deaths, and in the remaining portion of the Province, one in every 15 deaths. Though this fact shows but too closely the fatal character of the disease in rural districts, yet it would be unfair to conclude that the disease is really more prevalent in the latter than in the cities and towns. If we make a comparison of the number of cases of deaths per 1,000 of population occurring from this disease we obtain, after deducting the deaths of children under one year, the following results:—

While, as will be seen from these figures, the rate per 1,000 is lowest in rural districts, yet it must be remembered that the registrations in these are less complete, and hence the actual death rate from this disease is higher than appears from these figures. The per centage for the whole Province is 5.3 per cent. Renfrew returns 13 per cent., Leeds and Grenville 9 per cent., Perth 8 per cent., Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry 9 per cent., and Essex 7 per cent. Of the ten cities, Ottawa returns the largest mortality from this disease, viz. : 81., or 9.6 per cent. of all the deaths in the city. Toronto is next, with 44 deaths, but the percentage is only 2.6 per cent. In the other 8 cities, the numbers and percentages are small. November returned the most deaths, 182; next in order came October with 154 deaths, and then December, with 147 deaths, being a total of 483 deaths, or 41.2 per cent. of all the deaths from this disease in the last quarter of the year; August had the fewest deaths, viz. : 58. It is the young chiefly who die of this disease. In the decennial period, between 1 and 10 years, 843 died, or 72 per cent. of the whole, and in 931 cases, those who died from this disease had not reached their 16th year.

PNEUMONIA (INFLAMMATION OF THE LUNGS).

This disease stands fifth on the list this year, while it was fourth last year. Although Pneumonia varied its position in the first years of the decennial period from 1871 to 1881, it has, during the last six years, occupied the fourth or fifth place in the ten highest causes of death. The number of decedents this year from this cause is 1,137, a decrease of 120 from 1880, of which 641 were males and 496 females, or 22 per cent. more of the former than of the latter. This proportion is nearly uniform every year. This excess of males over females appears also in every decennial period of life, except between the ages of 20 and 30 years, when the deaths of females were more numerous. This was the case as well in 1880. Under the age of 5 years, 410 children died from this disease, this being 36 per cent. of the whole number. The next most fatal period appears to be between 60 and 80 years, when 200, or 17 per cent., died. The four months, January, February, March and April return together 602 deaths, or 52 per cent.; April has been the most

fatal month, with 164, and August, the least, with 38 deaths. The different counties return a nearly equal mortality from Pneumonia, but Norfolk and Brant show the highest mortality, as 9 per cent. of the total deaths have been recorded in those two counties; while Carleton and Waterloo shows the lowest, there being only two per cent. from this cause.

HEART DISEASE.

There is a slight increase in the number of deaths from this disease, but the percentage to the whole is about the same. In 1880, there were 760 deaths, or 4 per cent., while this year there are 886; but, as the return of deaths is much larger this year, the percentage to the whole number is about the same. Of the deaths, 462 are of males and 424 of females. This disease has caused 5 per cent. of the deaths (larger than the average) in the counties of Brant, Elgin, Leeds and Grenville, and Middlesex. In 18 counties the percentage is 4 per cent., the same as the average. Prince Edward and Muskoka show only one per cent., and are the lowest in the Province. In the four decades of life from 40 to 50, from 50 to 60, from 60 to 70, and from 70 to 80 years, there have been 554 deaths from Heart Disease, or 62 per cent. of the whole number; 91 died over 80 years, while 52 died under 10 years, so that the disease appears to be mostly confined to middle life and old age, though 152 died between the ages of 20 and 40 years.

DIARRHŒA.

Diarrhœa was not in the list last year, but is now seventh in order, while the registered number of deaths from it is very large, viz.: 818 (433 males, 385 females). In 1880 there were only 407 so reported. The increase is, therefore, 411, or over 100 per cent. Every county except Prescott and Russell, Prince Edward and Welland, reports a large increase in the deaths from this disease. This is especially the case in the following counties: Carleton with an increase of 62, York 59, Wentworth 28, Simcoe 22, Middlesex and Kent 19 each, and Ontario 17. During the last ten years, Diarrhœa has ranged in the ten highest causes of death from 6th to 10th; but no year returned so large a mortality as has this year. Thus, 1877 had 666 cases, or 3.4 per cent. of the whole number of deaths in the Province, but the average for ten years (leaving out 1877) was only a little over 2 per cent., while this year it is 3.7 per cent. It appears to have been epidemic in the counties of Carleton and York, their percentage being much higher than the average. Thus, Carleton has 7 and York 6 per cent. of the total deaths recorded. This is a disease especially of infancy and old age. Thus, 681, or 83 per cent. of the deaths were of children under five years of age, and 82, or 10 per cent., of persons over 60 years; only 55, or 7 per cent., dying between the ages of 5 and 60. More males than females died from this disease during childhood; but more females than males above the age of 60. July, August and September, hot months of the year, were the most fatal, 543 deaths, or 66 per cent. of all the deaths from Diarrhœa, having taken place in these three months, while only 53 deaths from it were registered in the first quarter of the year.

Four of the ten cities return a high mortality from this disease. Thus Ottawa returns 72, or 8 per cent.; Toronto 109, or 6 per cent.; London 24, or 6 per cent., and

Hamilton 36, or 5 per cent. In the other cities the death ratio has been very low from this disease.

TYPHOID FEVER.

Typhoid Fever has not appeared on the list since 1878, but it is now seen to be eighth in order, this being a very large increase in the number of deaths from it. Thus, 616 cases, 273 more than in 1878 (343 males and 273 females) are reported, this number being 2.8 per cent. of the deaths from all causes; while in 1878 there were 379; in 1879, 308, and in 1880, 372. It appears to have been very fatal in the counties of Essex, Kent and Waterloo, as the large percentage, as compared with the average for the whole Province, 2.8 per cent., plainly shows. Essex returns 39 deaths, which is 4.6 per cent. of the deaths in that county; Hastings, 26 deaths, or 4 per cent.; Kent, 44 death, or 7.6 per cent., and Waterloo, 36 deaths, or 6 per cent. The total number of deaths from all causes in the county towns (which includes the cities), is 6,266; while that from Typhoid Fever is 172, or 2.7 per cent. For the rest of the Province, there is a return of 444 deaths, or 2.6 per cent., or nearly the same as the county towns; and if the ten cities are taken separately, it is found that in them the percentage is about the same; Toronto is the only city above the average. It returns 57 deaths, or 3.3 per cent. of all the deaths in that city.

More deaths are recorded between the ages of 15 and 30 years than during any other period of life. Thus, during this period, 280, or over 45 per cent. died; 87 died under 10 years, 148 between 10 and 20, and 180 between 20 and 30. Of the total deaths, 369, or 60 per cent. occurred during the months of October and November, there being respectively, in those months, 118, 142 and 109. No other month approached any of these months in the number of deaths from this disease.

CROUP.

This is the second time that Croup is found on the list, it occupying the same position of 9th that it did last year. Thus, 104 more cases are recorded than in 1880; the number registered this year, is 533 (300 males and 233 females). All the deaths from this disease (except in the case of one female, who died in the period between 15 and 20) are of children under 10 years of age; 332 have died between the ages of one and five; 98 under one, and 90 between 5 and 10. The mortality was the greatest in the months of November, December and January; and was least in July and August.

CONVULSIONS.

This cause of death stood seventh in order in 1878, 1879 and 1880; but, this year, it has declined so much, as compared with the whole number of deaths, that it ranks only tenth. Thus, 518 deaths were registered in 1880; while this year, there are 509—a decrease of 9; but, the percentage, this year, is only 2.3; while, last year, it was 2.7 per cent. of all deaths recorded. The highest number of deaths, 59, was registered in March, and the lowest, 29, in November. The males and females dying of this disease are nearly the same, there being 258 of the former and 251 of the latter.

DEATHS BY AGES.

(For Table, see Appendix, page lxxvi.)

(Also, Table 21.)

The number of deaths in every year, from 1 to 100, as well as those dying under one year is given in this table. The average age of all who died in 1881 is 28.2 years; that of males being 28.0, and of females 28.4 years.

In 1880, the average for the whole, was 31.4; that of males being 31.6, and of females 30.7; hence the average duration of life, this year, for all ages, is less by 3 years; that of males being 3.6, and of females 2.3 years. This decrease is accounted for by the large increase in the return of deaths of children dying at and under one year of age. In 1880, there were, at and under one year, 5,597, or nearly 29 per cent. of the whole number of deaths recorded. This year, there are 6,653 recorded; this being an increase of 1,056; and, as this increase naturally affects the average age, the decline in the average duration of life may thus be accounted for. Twenty-three counties return a higher, and 14 a lower, rate than the average 28.2 years. The rate, in some counties, is very high, in comparison with that in the rest of the Province. Lanark returns 37 years, as the duration of life; while Halton, 36; Leeds and Grenville, Prince Edward, Victoria, Ontario and Frontenac, each returns 34 as the average age of death. These counties will be found to have the lowest percentage of deaths under one year, and largest percentage of persons dying at 70 years and upwards.

In Lanark, 42 deaths are registered as occurring under one year; this being 15 per cent. of the whole number of deaths in the county, while in the whole Province the percentage is 23. There are, also, 76 deaths in this county, of persons who lived to be 70 years and upwards; this number being 27 per cent. of the whole deaths recorded; while the Province, at these ages, only returned 15 per cent. of the total deaths at those ages. Halton returns 15 per cent. of deaths under 1 year, and 19 per cent. at 70 and upwards; Leeds and Grenville 15 per cent. under 1 year, and 23 per cent., at 70 and upwards; while the other counties named have nearly the same proportions. The reverse is the fact in those counties, which return a low average age. In Carleton, where the average duration of life given is only 20 years, the percentage of deaths, under one year, was 36 per cent. of all the deaths in the county; while only 9 per cent. lived to be 70 years and upwards. Essex, with an average of 21 years, has a mortality of 27 per cent. of deaths under 1, and only 9 per cent. of deaths at 70 and upwards. Prescott and Russell, with an average age of 22, returns 30 per cent. of deaths under 1, and 12 per cent. of deaths of persons aged 70 years and upwards.

In the ten cities, the proportion of deaths of children under one year is much larger, and, therefore, the duration of life is much lower; the number of deaths, under one year, in the ten cities, is 1,485, or 32 per cent. of the whole, while the average age is only 24 years. Ottawa leads, with the alarming number of 360 deaths under one year, or 42 per cent. of all the deaths returned for that city; Hamilton is next, with 34 per cent. of deaths

at this age ; St. Thomas is third, with 32 per cent. ; Toronto is fourth, with 31 per cent. of deaths under one ; while Kingston returns the lowest number, it being only 16 per cent.

If we deduct all who died under one year, the increase in the average age amounts to 9.4 years for the whole Province ; for males, 10.5 years, and for females, 8.4 years. In the cities, the increase is much larger ; the duration of life for the whole being increased to the extent of 10.8 years ; for males, 12 years, and for females, 9.7 years. This shows that the mortality amongst young children is greater in the cities than in the rest of the Province. The proportion of deaths at ages under 20 years, is 48.3, or nearly the same as in 1880. In previous years (with the exception of 1879) it was higher, especially in 1877, when it was 51.4 per cent. There were 660 more males than females who died during this period of life ; but, there were 1,580 more males than females born.

The deaths, in 1881, of persons whose occupations were given, reach 9,676, or $42\frac{1}{4}$ per cent. of the whole number registered.

In 1880, there were 8,251 deaths, or 41.6 per cent. so returned. From 1873 to 1880, there was a gradual rise in the average age, at death, of those whose occupations were given. In 1880, there was a decline of 0.37 of a year, and this year, of 1.3 years. This corresponds with the decrease in the average age of all who died in those years.

(See Table 25.)

The average age of those persons, who followed 18 of the 68 occupations enumerated, is above, and the remaining 50 below the general average. Prominent amongst those whose ages appear above the average are Gentlemen and Farmers, their ages being respectively, 70 and 60 years. A few other occupations return a larger average age than Farmers; but the numbers, of those callings dying, are small in comparison to the number of deaths of Farmers, which this year, amounts to 2,519, while the average number of deaths of those of the occupations, where the ages are greater than those of Farmers, is only 34; hence, Gentlemen and Farmers appear to live longer in this Province than do people of any other class.

Pedlars, Contractors, Bakers, Tailors, and Public Officials who occupied places in the list of the ten occupations, which returned the highest average ages, do not appear there this year by reason of decrease in the average age. Their places are taken by Masons, Gardeners, Clergymen, Farmers and Shoemakers, whose average ages at death have increased. Farmers have always occupied a place in the list with the single exception of last year.

The five occupations on the list giving the lowest average of life last year are those of Telegraph Operators, having 24 years, Tinsmiths 30, Painters 32, Milliners and Dress-makers 34, and Bankers 35. This year, Telegraph Operators again have the lowest average age, it being 25, or but one year in advance of their former length of life. Tobacconists and Cigar Makers are greatly reduced this year in their average duration of

life. Last year, their average age was 43 years ; this year, only 29. Artists and lumbermen, also, show a large decrease ; their average ages, last year, being 42 and 43 years respectively ; while, this year, they are only 31 and 34 years. Milliners and Dressmakers are the third lowest this year, with 31 years ; last year, they were fourth, with 34 years.

The calling of most of these persons-is well known to be prejudicial to long life ; the incessant toil and care of a long day's indoor work, depressing the spirits and tiring the body so much, that the desire for outdoor vigorous exercise, so necessary for them, is very much weakened, and they become, in consequence, an easy prey to those diseases arising from a lack of fresh air and exercise. The occupation of lumbering is generally considered healthy, and the low average age recorded against them is, no doubt, caused by the many accidents endangering life, to which they are subject while following their occupation. But, while these facts are doubtless important factors, in the explanation of the low life averages for these several occupations, it must be remembered that the great proportion of those engaged in such occupations are young persons. Especially is this true of workers in tobacco factories, lumber shanties and telegraph operators. The great proportion of those employed in banks are young men ; while, it is doubtless true, that many of those engaged as Milliners and Dressmakers become enrolled in the marriage register while comparatively young. Such causes serve to explain, at least in some degree, the low average ages for those in these several businesses.

This classification of deaths by occupations presents many interesting features. As might be expected, cultivators of the soil live the longest; their average age, this year, being 60 years, or four years above the general average of all occupations. There is, however, a falling off of one year, from the average, in 1880. This decrease is the case with every class (except Professional Men, who remain at the same average, 58 years,)

and is caused by the general decline in the duration of life for the whole Province, the cause of which has already been stated. Mechanics, the second of the various classes, average 52 years. Last year, their average was 54 years. Carpenters and Shoemakers return the largest number, viz. : 159 and 93, with an average life of 53 and 60 years respectively. Masons and Weavers, this year, have the highest average age, viz. : 66 years ; Weavers have, in many years, had a higher average than this. Tobacconists and Cigarmakers return the lowest average, viz. : 29 years ; but, there were only 8 deaths reported. Labourers show an average of 56 years ; while their average would, no doubt, have been higher, if, as is the case every year, so many had not lost their lives through accident. Their average age is, however, good, being four years below that of the general average age. The next class, that of Merchants, appears to have had short lives, in comparison with some of the other classes, their average age being only 46 ; while not one of this class reached the general average, 56 years ; their age, in 1880, averaging only 48 years. Some of the workers in this class, such as Telegraph Operators, Salesmen, Clerks and Book-keepers, always, according to the returns, have low life averages, and they, therefore, affect the other occupations in the class, whose average life is large. The class of Professional Men shows a larger average length of life than any other class (except Farmers), it being 58 years. The three professions, Law, Divinity and Medicine are included in this class ; their average age being 53 years. Clergymen, as usual, rank the highest in length of life, their average being 61 years ; Physicians rank next, viz. 50 years ; while Lawyers are the lowest, being 47. Public Officials have not been, apparently, so long-lived in 1881 as in 1880 ; this year, their average age is 57 years, but, last year, it was 63, being a decrease of 6 years in their average length of life. Teachers also exhibit a falling off ; in 1880, they averaged 44, this year, only 40 years. Gentlemen, that is, those who do not have to earn their own livelihood, show the highest average of all the callings assigned to those who have died in 1881 ; their average age is 70 years, or three years in advance of 1880. It would, however, be much more satisfactory, if those who make the returns of the deaths of these Gentlemen, would state the occupations which these persons had followed in the previous part of their lives. Artists have the lowest average in the class, it being 31 years ; but, why this should be, is not easy to determine ; their occupation is not supposed to be unhealthy ; but, as only five of them died this year ; no just conclusion as to their average duration of life can be formed. In the class "other employments," we find that Soldiers and Pensioners have lived, on an average, the allotted term of human life, viz. : 70 years. The largest number of these Pensioners was from the British army, and they have been generally advanced in life before becoming Pensioners ; and, as we have no returns of Soldiers, who died in early life, it would be erroneous to conclude that the average life of a Soldier is 70 years. Correctly speaking, we have no Soldiers in Ontario. Volunteers are seldom returned as such on the Schedule ; their calling, as civilians, being the one generally given in the return of their deaths. The last class, "Females," like several other classes, returns a lower average age than in 1880 ; the length of life, this year, for them, is only 38 years, while last year it was 41. Milliners and Dressmakers have the lowest duration of life, it being 31 years.

CAUSES OF DEATH OF THOSE WHOSE OCCUPATIONS ARE GIVEN.

(For Table, see Appendix, page clxxiv.)

The total number of deaths in this class are more this year, hence the number of deaths from each disease will be correspondingly larger. This is shown, by the returns, to be the case; but the percentage of these deaths to the whole number must be compared, in order to form a correct conclusion as to whether the mortality from these diseases is increasing or not.

There is an increase of 102 deaths from Old Age, but an increase of only .1 in the percentage. Of the 2,519 Farmers, whose deaths are recorded, 554, or 22 per cent. died from old age. It may here be noted that the diseases most fatal to Farmers are, Phthisis, Heart Disease, Apoplexy, Paralysis and Lung Disease. These diseases and Old Age carried off 1,429, or 56 per cent. of all the Farmers who have died this year.

In the total deaths of all whose occupations are given, it is found that nearly as many die from Consumption as from Old Age—831, or 14.8 per cent. of all the deaths from the former disease, and 913, or 16 per cent., from the latter.

This number of deaths from Phthisis, is a larger total number than in 1880, but the percentage is .6 smaller. Of the 831, who died from this disease, 308 of them, were Farmers, or 12.2 per cent. of all their deaths. This percentage is small when compared with those of other occupations such as Teachers, whose deaths numbered 68, and of those 22 or 32 per cent. died from Phthisis. Of the ten occupations which have returned the largest number of deaths from Consumption, it will be found that (with the exception of Gentlemen, of whom, only 6 per cent. died of this disease) they all have a higher rate per cent. from Consumption than Farmers; Servants and Tavern keepers have also very high death rates from Consumption, 26 and 23 per cent. respectively. Heart Disease and Apoplexy together, carried off the large number of 740, or 13 per cent. of the deaths from all causes. They have been particularly fatal to Farmers and Labourers, no less than 393, or 53 per cent. of them dying from these diseases. Probably many of the Farmers and Labourers registered as dying from Old Age, died from one or other of these diseases, as those who died from them were persons advanced in life. Cancer caused the death of 135, or 2.4 per cent., against 109 or 2.1 per cent. last year, this being an increase of 26, or .3 per cent. Farmers and Labourers together make up 73 of these deaths, or 53 per cent. of the whole number. There is a large decrease in the return of deaths from Pneumonia, but there is a corresponding increase in the deaths from Lung Disease, which disease was not in the list last year. In 1880, 350 deaths were from Pneumonia and 138 from Lung Disease, being a total of 488, or 9.8 per cent. of the deaths from all causes. The deaths of Farmers from these two diseases amount to 238, or 9 per cent.; while the mortality amongst Merchants, from the same diseases, is 17, or 12 per cent. Bakers, Confectioners and Labourers, make up 10 per cent. The number of accidental deaths is exactly the same as last year, being 221; but, the percentage to all the deaths is less by .5 per cent. Dropsy has decreased from 168, or 3.5 per cent., to 162, or 2.9 per cent.

Amongst the return of deaths for the year 1880 no less than twenty-nine persons were returned as having reached the age of 100 years or more. Inquiries were instituted by the Department to verify the ages of these deceased persons, the result being that no reliable information could be obtained as to the fact of any one of them having attained the ages mentioned.

The amendment to the Registration Act, which came into operation on the first day of January last, requires the Assessors of each Municipality, when making their annual Assessment, to inquire of each householder whether there had been a birth or death in the family during the previous year that had not been registered, if so, the Assessor must report the fact to the Division Registrar of the Division within which such birth or death happened. This amendment doubtless will be the means of causing a very large increase in the number of Birth and Death registrations over any previous year.
