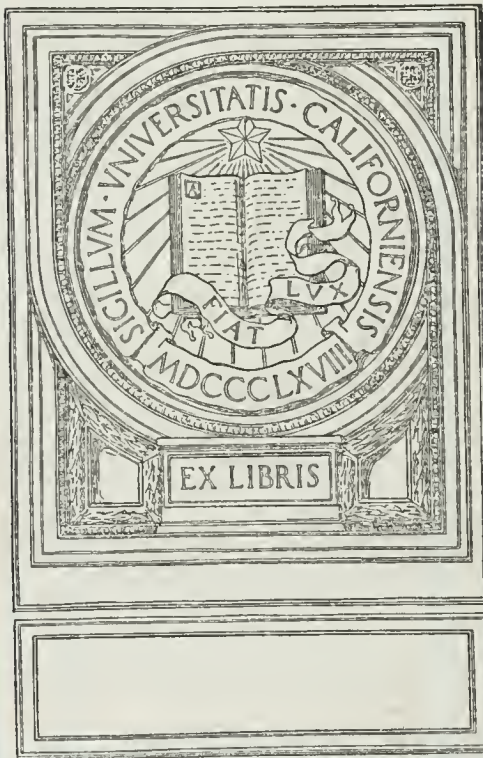

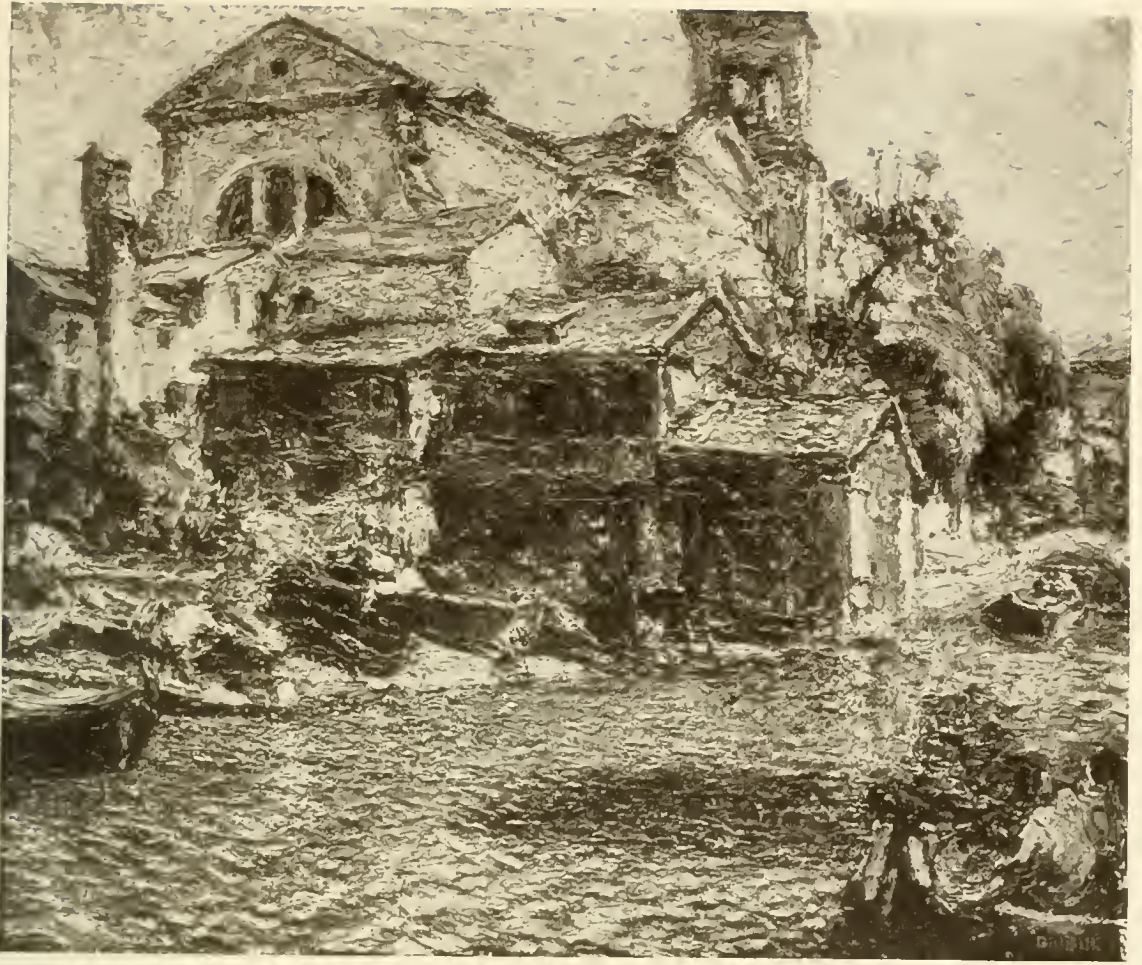

ST. MEMIN, CHARLES B. J. FEVRET DE

Born Dijon, France, 1770; died there, 1852. Came to Canada in 1793, and soon after to New York. He introduced the engraving of portraits by means of the "physionotrace," a machine invented by Edme Queneday of Paris. St. Memin made some improvements upon this device, and with it he made on a tinted paper a profile a little less than life size; this he finished by hand with crayons directly from the sitter. Taking this finished crayon drawing as a guide, he used a pantograph of special design to reduce the profile, so that it would go inside a circle of about two inches in diameter, faintly scratching the reduced drawing directly on the copper plate. This copper was now etched and finished in aquatint, with some assistance by the roulette. These portraits became very popular, and St. Memin, traveling from North to South over the country, produced about 800 small plates. He returned to France in 1810, but came back to the United States two years later and remained until 1814. He then settled permanently in France, and from 1817 until his death he was the director of the museum in his native city of Dijon.

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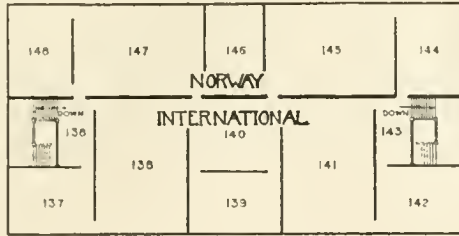
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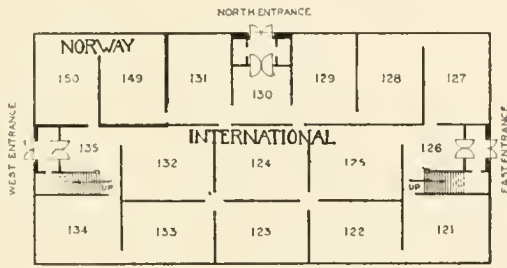

SECOND FLOOR PLAN



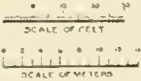

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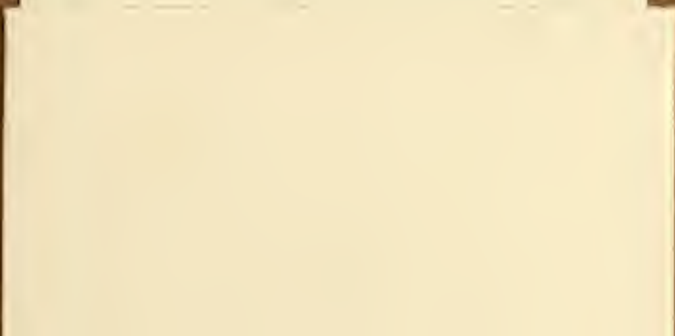
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
