3. Secondary Schools. (1935)

There are 19 boys' middle schools (chu-gakko) with 503 instructors and 12,937 students, 16 of which are located in Table 80.

There were 28 girls' high schools, with 567 instructors and 15,349 students, 22 of which are located in Table 80, 3 girls' technical high schools (see Table 80).

The 40 technical schools were classified as follows:

a. Six industrial schools, with 120 instructors and 1,976 students.

b. Ten agricultural schools, with 109 instructors and 1,916 students.

c. Eighteen commercial schools, with 433 instructors and 12,144 students.

d. Six trade schools, with 88 instructors and 1,704 students.

4. Special and Higher Schools.

a. Deaf, Dumb and Blind Schools. In 1935 there were 3 public blind schools, with 26 teachers and 214 students; and 3 deaf and dumb schools, with 32 teachers and 274 students. The location of the following 2 in Nagoya-shi is known:

(1) The Eighth Higher School, located in Enko-machi, Showa-ku, Nagoya-shi, had, in 1939, 48 teachers and 630 students; its library contained 50,480 volumes.

(2) The Nagoya Pharmaceutical College had 450 students in 1939.

5. Universities.

The Nagoya Imperial University is located in Nagoya-shi. In 1944 it had departments of medicine, physics, and engineering; an aviation medical research institute.

6. Young Men's Schools.

In 1935 there were 451 young men's schools with 756 teachers and 62,794 students.

7. Private Schools.

There were known to be 92 private schools in the prefecture in 1939, among which are the following:

a. Five similar to an elementary school with 20 faculty and 550 students.

b. Seven similar to a middle school with 91 faculty and 604 students.

c. Eight similar to a girls' high school with 114 faculty and 3,501 students.

d. Five similar to a special school with 109 faculty and 786 students.

e. Thirty-two business schools with 374 faculty and 3,565 students.

f. One deaf, dumb and blind school with 5 faculty and 295 students.

g. Thirty-four various other schools with 189 faculty and 3,195 students.

H. CULTURAL INSTITUTIONS.

1. Temples and Shrines.

a. Nagoya-shi. Higashi-Honganju, Shimo-Chaya-Machi. A huge Buddhist temple dating from the early 19th century. Its wide, enduring walls and small moat give the effect of a fortress rather than a temple. The main gate, Sam-Mon (with 3 portals) is finished in Keyaki wood in the early Buddhist style. The temple itself is a rather large (108 ft. by 120 ft.) and houses a figure of Amida on a gilded altar, and the massive Keyaki wood pillars and coffered ceiling and cross beams, together with richly carved decorations, give a rich ensemble to the whole. The Taimenjo or "Assembly Room" has a coffered ceiling and some fine carvings and handsome Fusuma with landscape views on a gold background.

Atsuta Jingu, near Atsuta station, Atsuta-ku. The second largest shinto shrine in Japan. It was founded in 686 but the present buildings, which are patterned after those at Ise, date only from 1893. The shrine is the repository of the Kusanagi-No-Tsurugi "grass mowing sword," one of the 3 Imperial Regalia of Japan, and thus it is highly venerated by all Japanese. The temple contains 2 famous gates, one built during the seventh century, the other in 1572.

Nanatsu-Dera (Chofuki-Ji), Monzen-Cho, Naka-Ku. A shrine originally founded in 735 in the village of Nanatsu-Deer near Nagoya-shi and removed to its present site in 1611. The temple contains many objects regarded as national treasures.

Kenchu-Ji, Tsutsui-Cho, Higashi-Ku. A temple of the Jodo sect of Buddhism and the hereditary temple of the Owari branch of the Tokugawa family. Especially noteworthy for the elaborate tower of the Owaris buried there.

Tosho-Gu shrine, Nagashima-Machi. Founded in 1619 and dedicated to Ieyasu.

Osu-Kwannon, Monzen-Cho. This shrine, dedicated to the goddess of Mercy, is at the center of the Amusement Center and is thus a Nagoya-Shi version of the Asakusa Park in Tokyo. In its treasury are found many sutras, documents and relics of early emperors and shoguns.

Nissen-Ji, (Temple of Japan and Diam), Kakuozan, Higashi-Yama. A temple built in 1904 as a repository of a relic of Shakamuni and a golden image of him presented by the King of Siam in 1900. Near the temple is a huge wooden image of Kwannon, 33 feet high, said to be the largest wooden sculpture in the world.

Nishi-Hongan-Ji, Monzen-cho, Naka-Ku. A Buddhist temple founded at the end of the 16th century by Kenryo-shonin, near Nanatsu-dera. Noted porch decoration.

Gohyaku Rakan Kakuo-Zan (Temple of the Five Hundred Rakan) Higashi-yama. A temple noted for its 500 carved figures of considerable variety and interest. The Japanese have a saying that any man after a little searching can find here the image of his own father.

b. Other shrines. Tsushima Jinsha, Tsushima-machi, Ama-gun. On Meigi Railway south of Nagoya-shi. A farmers shrine founded in 540 and held in great reverence by Oda Nobunaga and Hideyoshi, and locally by farmers for the great decorated barges which are owned by the rich at its annual fete.

Koshoji, Yagoto-Yama, Higashi-Ku. A Buddhist shrine, the grounds of which are said to have been laid out on the plan of Koya-san and during the reign of Tokugawa Yoshinao it was called the Koya-san of Owari and the scene of many pilgrimages.

Omido-ji, Noma-machi, Chita-gun. A temple historically associated with the Minamoto family, and the spot where Yoshitomo, the father of Yoritomo, was murdered and where he was buried. It stands 9 miles southwest of Taketoyo.

Yoyokawa Inari, Toyokawa-shi. A farmer's temple dedicated to Dakiniten, the god of good fortune, which attracts pilgrims from all of Japan.

Horai-ji, north of Nagashino-mura, Minamishitara-gun. A famous Buddhist temple founded in the early 18th century. The buildings are noted for their architecture, the 3 storied pagoda being especially famous.

2. Castles.

Nagoya Castle (Tensho-Kaku, O-Shiko), Nagoya-shi. This castle ranks among the finest castles Japan has ever produced. It was completed in 1610 after 5 years work, by Tokugawa Ieyasu. The design and construction were supervised by Dato Iyomasa, the most famous castle architect in Japan. Its cost was divided among 22 feudal lords of Western Japan, the idea being not only to strengthen the Shogunate but to impoverish the lesser nobles. The castle is well planned, being situated on higher ground and protected on the north and west by stone walls and moats and on the south by a deep waterless moat. It is renowned for its 5-story dungeon which towers some 144 feet above the ground, and for its huge stone walls which are from 15 to 18 feet thick. The castle has 6 floors surmounted by 5 successive roofs, the first one, shingled with tile and the successive ones roofed with copper, and on the topmost ridge surmounted by two golden

"shachi" or dolphins. The exterior walls are plastered with white and the combination of the white walls and the picturesque grouping of towers and roofs produces an extremely picturesque building.

The castle was the residence of the Lord of Owari for about 2 centuries. The residential buildings are gorgeously decorated with pictures on a background of gold leaf of the Kano school of the Momoyama period, and are unique examples of the gorgeous palaces of the powerful Daimyos of the early Yedo period. The castle is a national treasure and is well preserved and maintained.

Inuyama Castle - Hakutei Castle - Inuyama-machi. On Meigi Railway. This castle was built by the Lord of Shiba in 1440 and later used by the Lords of Ishikawa until the Meiji restoration. The castle is of the "Castle on Plain and Mountain" type, and has a very picturesque situation on the banks of the Kiso-gawa overlooking the open plains of Owari and Mino. The lower half is of 3 stories, with 5 inside floors, the topmost of which is enclosed by a balustrade. Because of its relatively early date, this castle covers many of the steps in the development of castle architecture in Japan.

3. Libraries.

Nagoya Municipal Library, Nagoya-shi. Founded in 1915, it has 146,619 volumes.

Shinpuku-ji Library, Nagoya-shi. Contains manuscripts of great historical value.

VI. WHO'S WHO IN AICHI-KEN

This chapter consists of a listing, divided into 2 parts, of prominent persons reported to be residents of Aichi-ken. List "A" classifies persons, by cities, according to occupation. Those names starred with an asterisk (*) indicate persons who are believed to have some knowledge of English.

List "B" is an alphabetical directory which presents available biographical information concerning persons in list "A". A date in parenthesis placed after a statement, e.g. "(1940)", indicates the date of the report giving that information.

The use of the occupational List "A" will aid in locating experienced personnel in various fields. The alphabetical directory, List "B", will in some instances aid in identifying persons and in checking their background and experience.

Local Japanese records or files on persons should prove useful whenever they can be secured. Certain key sources of this nature are listed here:

1. The Koseki.

Each city, town and township maintains a record of all families domiciled within the unit, including the names of all members of the family, even though they may be living elsewhere, together with the dates of their birth, marriage, and death. The files of the village also indicate the following classifications of individuals: foreigners, Koreans, and laborers. It will be noted that every individual is listed in at least 2 different places, the Koseki of his native village and the police box of the district where he actually resides.

2. Police Registers.

a. The central files of the Special Higher Police (Tokubetsu Koto Keisatsu) which are kept in the police stations.

b. Kempei (Military Police) records of political offenders. The location of these files is unknown except that they would be under military custody.

c. Local police box records which list the name, age, address, and occupation of each person living within the district.

d. Fingerprint files. Finger-printing is less extensively used than in the United States; only about 5,000,000 prints are available. Files are maintained by the Tokyo and Osaka metropolitan police.

3. Files of National Employment Exchanges.

These exchanges, located in Nagoya-shi, Toyohashi-shi, Toyokawa-shi, Okazaki-shi, Ichinomiya-shi, Seto-shi, Handa-shi, and Kasugai-shi maintain a record of all employable persons; listing their occupations and present employment. In towns and townships having no employment exchanges, the same information is found in the town office or city hall.

4. Files of Public Welfare Offices.

Lists are kept of the *homen-iin*, prominent persons in the community doing volunteer welfare work. These persons are of the wealthy, leisured class, and have training in public relief techniques. The *homen-iin* number about 10 to 200 persons in each city, depending upon its size.

5. Postal Savings Accounts Records.

Records of postal savings accounts are kept in local post offices. Each account lists the name, address, occupation, and amount of deposit.

6. Other Sources.

Bank records, municipal tax rolls, corporation employment records, military draft records, and the *Shokuin-roku* (Roster of Government officials, an annual Registry of the Imperial Cabinet).
