NOTICE TO MERCHANTS TRADING WITH THE MEXICAN PORTS.—In Art. 40 of the Law of 1st of March 1831, which is incorporated in this city in May of said year, it is stipulated that "Besides the insults, damages, and expenses, which may be sustained by the exporter, minutely expressing the contents of each case, barrel, or other package, according to their several marks, which shall be rendered at the time of the anchorage of the vessel. These particular manifest must be certified by the consuls or vice consuls of the republics, nearest to the port from whence the cargo is despatched."
