



REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

FOR 1892,

As Read and Adopted at the Annual Meeting, Monday, February 20th, 1893.

HE Council of The Zoological and Acclimatisation Society of Victoria have the honour to present their Twenty-ninth Annual Report to the Subscribers.

The Council regret to state that the depression through which the colony is passing has been severely felt by the Society, for not only has the annual vote on the estimates for the current year been reduced by the sum of £500, but the takings at the gates have also considerably diminished. This curtailment of an already insufficient income is a very serious state of affairs, as it prevents any extension by purchase of the Zoological collection, and it, in fact, embarrasses the management in every way; the Society has always been administered on strictly economical lines, and it is not possible to do much in the way of reducing the expenses without injury to the Gardens. This state of affairs is very disheartening both to the Council and the Directors, as it does not arise from any default in the management, the Gardens having been quite as attractive, if not even more so, during the past year than they have hitherto been. It will be the aim of the Council and the Directors to tide over the present unfortunate position of affairs with as little loss to the Society as possible.

In consequence of the diminished revenue, it has been found impossible to send an officer of the Society to any other part of the world this year for additions to the Zoological collection.

The works undertaken and completed in the Gardens have been the clearing away of a large number of old and unsightly pines and laying out new flower beds, which have tended very much to beautify the grounds; new paths have been laid out and a small enclosure, with a high wire netting fence, made for birds. The front entrance to the Gardens has been entirely altered and much improved, and the series of enclosures, with a small pond in each, for the numerous kinds of ducks have been altogether reconstructed, and made much more ornamental than they formerly were.

Also other varieties of Deer, Kangaroos, &c., &c.

Six thousand Trout Fry from Sir Samuel Wilson's fishhatching establishment at Ercildoune have been liberated in suitable streams; three thousand of these were sent to Bright for the Upper Ovens, and the rest were placed in Western waters by the Hon. Mr Connor, M.L.C.

The Council have noticed with regret the recent death of the Director of the Adelaide Zoological Gardens, Mr. R. E. Minchin, who was an honorary member of this Society, and had always cooperated in a friendly way with Mr. Le Souef in making exchanges between the two Gardens. He is succeeded in the Directorship by his son, Mr. Alfred Minchin.

The accounts have been as usual audited by Messrs. Langton, Holmes and McCrindle, and the balance-sheet will be published in the yearly proceedings of the Society.

The Council desire to record their appreciation of the services rendered to the Society by Mr. C. M. Officer, the retiring President; Mr. McLachlan, the Hon. Treasurer; and the Directors and other officers of the Society. The Council also desire to thank Mr. Kendall, the Society's Hon. Veterinary Surgeon, for his ready attention to the duties of his office.

The Report as read was unanimously adopted, but it was decided to add a clause having reference to the advisability of the Government taking steps to sell the Reserve at Gembrook formerly held by the Society.

The election of officers for the present year (1893) was then proceeded with.

Mr. Godfrey and Mr. Bruce were re-elected as members of the Council.

Mr. Bruce was elected President, and Messrs. C. M. Officer and R. W. Best, M.P., Vice-Presidents.

Mr. Ronald McLachlan was re-elected Hon. Treasurer, on the motion of the Hon. Robert Simson.

Colonel Rede was elected a member of the Council of the Society, vice Mr. Alex. Sutherland, who retires.

The meeting closed with a vote of thanks to the Chairman, Professor Spencer, V.P., and that gentleman responded, and expressed the pleasure it would give him to assist the Society whilst in England.

REGULATIONS

MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE

ZOOLOGICAL & ACCLIMATISATION SOCIETY

Pursuant to the Zoological and Acclimatisation Society Incorporation Act No. 794, 1884, Section 8, and approved by the Governor in Council.

- 1. Membership.—A subscriber of one guinea annually shall be a member of the society, and shall be entitled to a member's ticket admitting himself and one lady, or two children to the garden. A subscriber of two guineas annually shall be entitled to a family ticket to admit himself and family to the garden. And a contributor of ten guineas or upwards in one sum shall be a life member of the society, and shall have the same privileges as the holder of a family ticket. Any person who has rendered special services to the society may be elected an honorary member by the council, and shall have the same privileges as the holder of a family ticket. Members of the council of the society and the directors have power to admit visitors to the colony free of charge to the garden.
- 2. Election of council.—At the annual meeting to be held in the month of February, 1885, nine members, comprising the whole of the elected members of the council, shall be elected by ballot, and thereafter the president, vice-presidents, and treasurer shall annually retire from office, and also three other members of council (namely those who have attended the fewest meetings of the council since their appointment) shall retire annually, but shall be eligible for reelection, subject to Regulation No. 9.
- 3. Vacancy in council, how supplied.—In the case of a vacancy occurring by the death, resignation, or non-attendance of any member of the council for a period of two months, without leave of the council, the remaining members shall, in due course, appoint another member of the society to be a member of the council in the place and stead of the member who shall so die, resign or absent himself; but such new member shall be nominated at an ordinary meeting of the council prior to the meeting at which he is elected.
- 4. Council to fill up vacancies.—In case of a vacancy occurring by the death or resignation of the president, vice-president, or honorary treasurer, the council may appoint from amongst themselves, or the other members of the society, a person to fill the vacancy so occurring, and the person elected shall hold office only until the next annual meeting, but shall be eligible for re-election for the subsequent year. Provided that such vacancy shall not be filled up unless seven days' notice in writing shall have been sent to each member of the council, stating the vacancies which it is proposed to fill up.
- 5. Eligibility of members of council.—No person shall be eligible as a member of council unless he be a subscriber to the funds of the society of at least one

guinea per annum, and any member of Council whose subscription shall be in arrear for three months after his subscription is payable shall cease to be a member of council. Provided that this rule shall not apply to persons who may have become life-members of the society, by a payment of ten guineas, or who may he honorary members of the society; and provided also that a month's notice in writing shall be sent to the member so in arrear before his place can be filled up.

- 6. Meetings of council.—The council shall meet at least once a month, three members to form a quorum, and transact the business of the society. And the director shall have power to call a special meeting of the council whenever occasion may require.
- 7. Minutes of proceedings.—Minutes shall be made in books kept for the purpose of all proceedings at general meetings of the members, and minutes shall also be made of the proceedings of the council at their general and special meetings, and of the names of the members attending the same, and such minutes shall be open to inspection by any member of the society at all reasonable times.
- 8. Moneys to be paid to treasurer.—All subscriptions and other moneys received on account of the society shall be paid to the treasurer, or some person authorised by him, who shall place the same in a bank, to be named by the council, to the credit of the society; and no sum shall be paid on account of the society until the same shall have been ordered by the council, and such order be duly entered in the book of the proceedings of the council and all cheques shall be signed by the treasurer as such, and be countersigned by the president or one of the vice-presidents, and by the director.
- 9. Annual meeting.—An annual meeting of members shall be held in the month of February in each year, and the council shall report their proceedings during the past year, and shall produce their accounts duly audited for publication; and the meeting shall elect by hallot the office-bearers for the ensuing year, and fill up any vacancy which may exist in the council: Provided that no person shall hold the office of president or vice-president for two years successively.
- 10. Medals.—No medal of the society shall be awarded to any person except by the vote of at least seven members of council, present at a council meeting, and after notice of motion for awarding such medal shall have been given at the next preceding meeting of the council.
- 11. Time of garden's opening and closing,—The gardens are open from half-past nine a.m. till half-past four p.m. in winter, and six p.m. in summer, except on Sundays, when the gates are not opened until half-past one p.m.
- 12. Dogs not allowed in gardens.—Visitors are not allowed to bring dogs into the gardens. A penalty of two pounds is imposed for an offence against this regulation, in addition to which the owner of any dog found in the gardens will be held responsible for any damage done by such dog.
- 13. Prohibitions.—Visitors are especially prohibited from teasing or disturbing the animals or birds; also from interrupting the workmen by conversation or otherwise; also from leaving bottles, broken glass, or crockery, paper, or litter of any kind in the gardens; from lighting any fire therein; from posting any bills on the fences, houses, or trees; and from playing cricket, football, or other games within the gardens. A penalty of ten shillings is imposed for an offence against this regulation.

- 14. Children, unprotected, not allowed in gardens.—Children under twelve years of age will not be allowed within the gardens unless with a parent or other adult, and if found therein may be expelled therefrom.
- 15. Prohibitions.—Walking across the shrubberies or flower borders, pulling flowers or branches from the plants, shrubs or trees; standing upon or climbing over any of the fences, climbing trees or bird-nesting, cutting names or letters or marks of any kind, or writing on any of the seats, or trees or fences, or any building erected for the accommodation of the public, are strictly prohibited. A penalty of ten shillings is imposed for an offence against this regulation.
- 16. Entrance except by gate prohibited.—Entering the gardens by climbing over the fences or by any gate other than the one by which the public are admitted, or without having paid the charge for admission, or entering into those parts of the grounds which are specially closed for plantation, or other purposes, is strictly prohibited. A penalty of not less than twenty shillings is imposed for an offence against this regulation.
- 17. Smoking prohibited.—Smoking in the summer time, at such times as may seem necessary to the directors for the safety of the gardens and the property therein, is prohibited, and at such times notices to that effect will be posted at the gates. A penalty of five shillings is imposed for an offence against this regulation.
- 18. Expulsion on misbehaviour.—Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency, or swearing or using bad language, or committing a breach of any of the above regulations, may be forthwith removed from the gardens, and any member of the society so misbehaving shall cease to be a member.
- 19. Preaching or public harangues, whereby a crowd is collected within the gardens, or on the grounds under the control of the council of the society, are strictly forbidden. A penalty of five pounds is imposed for an offence against this regulation.
- 20. No person shall be permitted, without the permission of the council, to carry on any traffic whatsoever, or distribute handbills in the gardens. A penalty of twenty shillings is imposed for an effence against this regulation.
- 21. No musical band or other instrumental or vocal performers shall be permitted to perform in the gardens, unless with the express permission of the directors. A penalty of two pounds is imposed for an offence against this regulation.
- 22. Charges for admission.—Admission to the gardens is free on Sundays. On Mondays non-subscribers will be admitted on payment of one shilling for each adult and sixpence for each child under twelve years of age, but the society shall have power to charge one shilling for each adult and sixpence for each child under twelve years of age on any day (Sunday excepted) that an instrumental concert may be given in the gardens. On all other days of the week non-subscribers will be admitted on payment of sixpence for each adult and three-pence for each child under twelve years of age. State and other schools will be admitted to the gardens on application to the director at half the usual entrance fees. Members of the society admitted free.
- 23. Repeal of pre-existing rules.—All rules and regulations of the society in force prior to its incorporation and up to the date of these regulations coming into effect are hereby repealed.
