COSMOS

(Centura Imperialis)

The result of a cross between "C. Moschata" and "C. NEW GIANT ESCHSCHOLTZIAS

THE GOLDEN WEST—Grand New Eschscholtzias, developed from "E. Maritima," a pretty variety, having light canary yellow flowers with an orange blotch at the base of each petal, forming a Maltese cross in the center. The original flower measured two inches across. The flowers of these new giants measured from 3½ to 5 inches in diameter; they have very large overlapping petals, often delicately waved at the edges. They are beautifully and variously formed; some are flat and wide open, some saucer-shaped, others very deep with flaring edges. In some the orange blotch almost suffuses the whole flower, in others it runs into the yellow in fine penciled lines, others again have an orange center with a margin of clear yellow, while the Maltese cross in some of the flowers is very distinct, Gorgeous beyond description. 20c per packet.

Again, from a seed plot sown on the 28th of September in cultivated land, a second cutting had been made by the 3d of June weighing at the rate of 19 tons 4 cwt. per acre; subsequent cuttings the same season yielded over 14 tons per acre—truly wonderful record, hitherto unheard of in any other forage plant." Its growth being so rapid that in cultivated land at least three crops may be obtained and as many as five can be obtained under favorable circumstances during the warm months. It can be cut almost every six weeks. It also stands grazing off at all seasons of the year and is excellent for milch cows, increasing the flow of milk.

Cultivation—Sow the seeds in drills 3 feet apart in the Spring as lightly as possible as soon as the ground is warm and make successive sowings throughout the Spring and Summer until February. After this date it is necessary to sow in boxes and cover with glass at any time and transplant when about 2 inches high. It must be remembered that Paspalum requires heat to germinate the seed. See that the soil is properly prepared. $\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 pounds of seed is sufficient to sow an acre. Price, 10c packet; 25c per ounce; \$2.00 per pound.

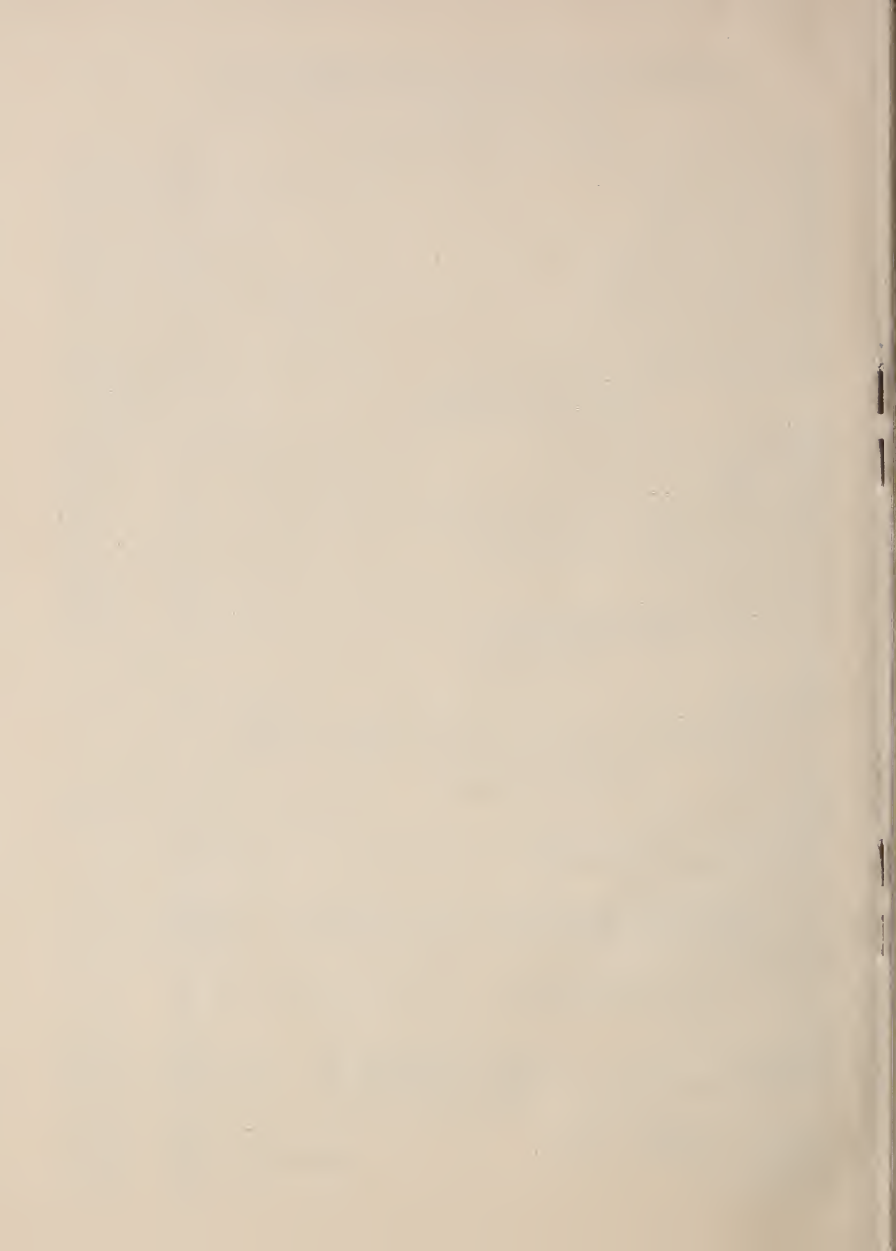
