- Talk pages prevent new users from doing productive content work *and* becoming part of the community.
- The software needs to facilitate good discussion and deal with vandalism, spam, off-topic posting, and trolling.

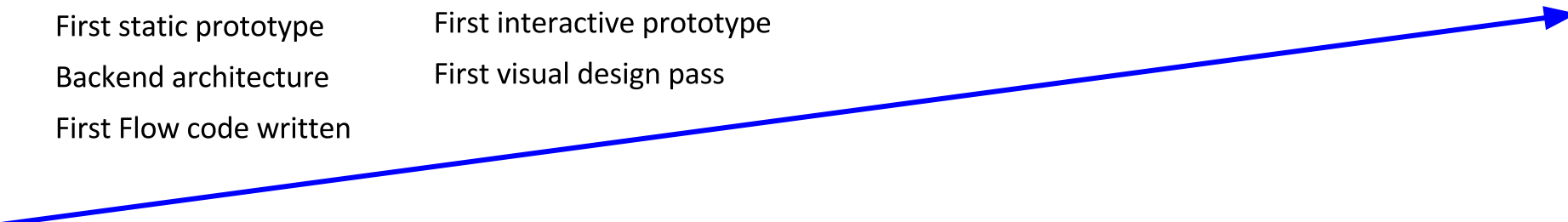

User experience

In Q2/Q3:

2 in-person user experience/usability testing sessions

- + 2 rounds of community feedback
- + Remote usability testing (usertesting.com)

= Flow features validated with ~100 users

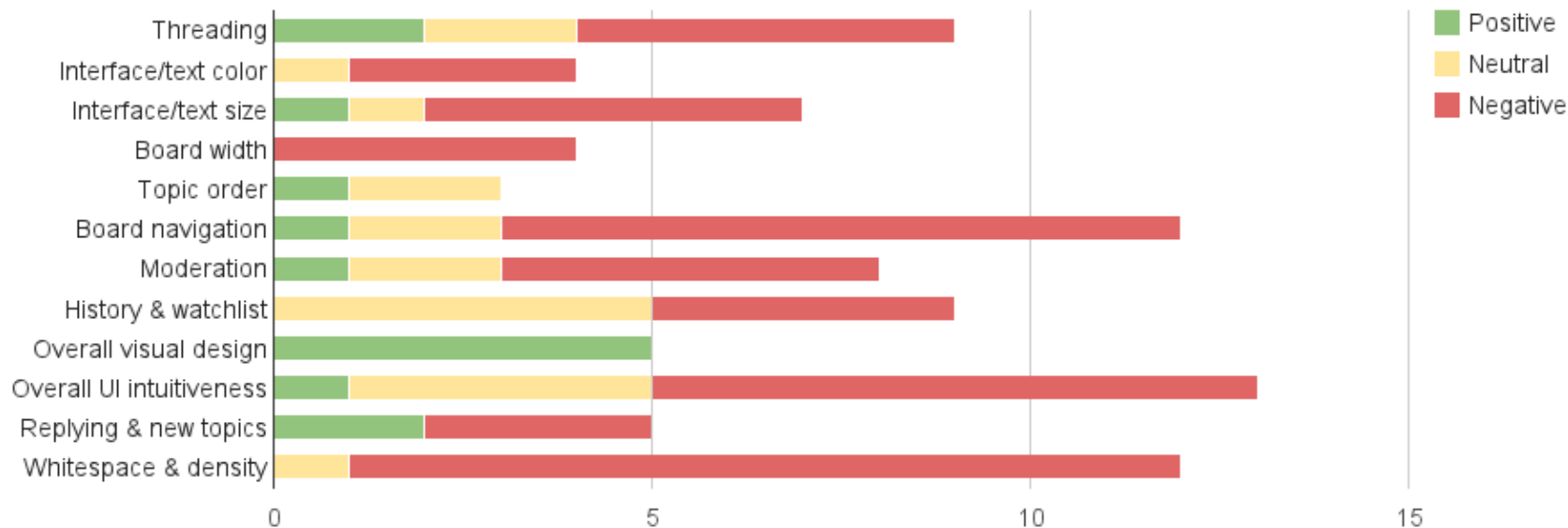

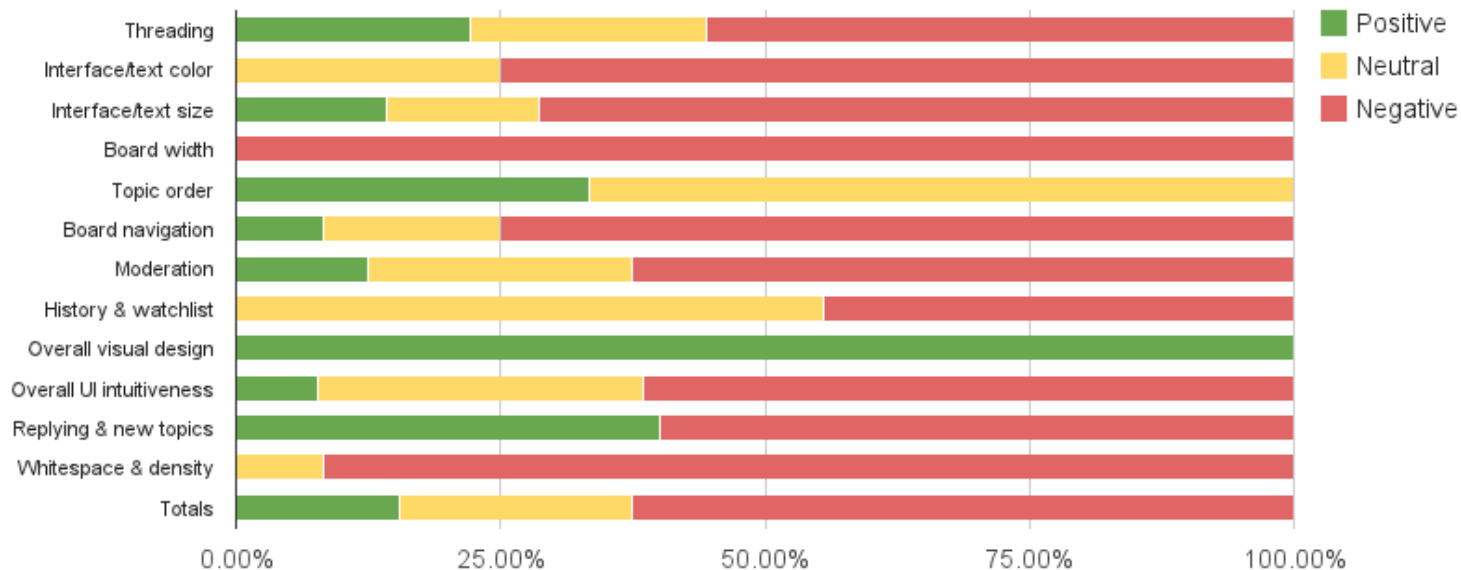
