

It is undoubtedly true that since the bank-ruptcy act went into operation merchants have not been satisfied with the results attained, or with the delays and costs indured in settling up bankrupts' estates. To avoid these they have in a large major ity of cases preferred to come to a composition with the debtor, and sign his release, rather than wait the formal proceedings in bankruptcy and a doubtful distribution of the realized assets. But a great deal of the blame which is cast on the bankrupt act ought really to attach to the merchants themselves. No bankrupt law, however hedged about with checks and guarda, can ever wholly protect creditors from the sharp practice that it is alleged "characterizes many of the failures that have recently been announced." Where fraudulent conversion of goods can be proved there is law enough in all of the States, even outside of the bankrupt act, which itself prescribes heavy penalties, to punish such rases ities. Amendments to the present bankrupt law may provide for a similar, more inexpensive that quicker mode of settling up bankrupt estates and may make the penal clauses heavier, but the cases are comparatively rare in which dishonest bankrupts are pushed to conviction. The truth is that no inconsiderable part of the commercial failures that have taken place are due to the looseness with which credits were formerly given. The competition for business during the past four years, when trade has been depressed and the markets have been glutted with all sorts of commodities, has led many merchants to unload upon their customers greater quantities of goods than the latter could safely buy; the merchants themselves knowing that they were making their sales on a falling market, and consequently shifting the shrinkage in values from their own shoulders to those who dealt with them. In past times credits have been loosely given, character and standing have been too lightly looked into, and the consequence has been innumerable failures and inevitable mercantile losses that might have been avoided if hasiness had been conducted more circum. es that might have been avoided if cases that might have been avoided if passiness had been conducted more circumpactly and credit given more cautiously. There has been considerable change in this yetem latterly, but it came too late with many. Unless complete reform prevail in his matter, honest customers must suffer from the efforts made by wholesale merhants to overload them, and rogues, profitting by the ease with which credit is obtained, will get all the goods they can and finally rill get all the goods they can and finally ake refuge in bankruptcy.—Ballimore Sun.


