## OUTDOOR FALL BULB CULTURE

FOR OPEN-GROUND PLANTING.-Most of the suitable sorts should be planted in the fall, and they will flower the following season, commencing in March or earlier with Snowdrops, Crocus, etc., which are followed with Hyacinths, Tulips, Daffodils, and a host of other bulbous beauties. In April and May appear late Tulips, late Narcissus, Lily-of-theValley, Bleeding Heart, etc., being followed in succession until frost, with Peonies, Iris, Hemerocallis, Lilies, ctc.
TIME TO PLANT.-Remember that the "fall" is the time to plant all spring fowering bulbs. They may be put in almost any time from October first until the ground freezes; in fact, we have succeeded with even later planting, but earlier planting brings best success

HOW TO PLANTT.-The soil should be well spaded. and the surface of the beds slightly raised at the center, so that no water will stand, but soak the bed good with water when first put in and then later if it dries out. The soil will be better if enriched with well-rotted manure or bone dust.
AFTER TREATMENT.-All bulbs like a sunny exposure, and if protected from the north will bloom earlier. The bulbs do well for a number of years, without lifting or replanting. When through flowering the beds may be planted with shallowrooted annuals, as nasturtiums, petunias, verbenas, etc. If necessary the bulbs may be taken up when the leaves begin to ripen, to be again replanted the coming fall.

## Wyatt's Selected Hyacinths

## For Outdoor or Indoor Planting

The culture of Hyacinths is very easy. For early spring blooming out of doors the bulbs should be planted 5 inches deep. After planting give the beds a covering of well-rotted leaves or litter, or wellrotted manure.

## FOR POT CULTURE

Hyacinths are excellent for indoor growing. See that the pots are well drained and use the best soil possible Plant the bulbs about an inch below the surface. Water thoroughly and put away in a dark cellar, or stand them out of doors and cover pot and all with about 8 to 10 inches of sand. Let them stand this way about 6 or 7 weeks or longer if necessary. The tops should be 4 inches high before brought in the house to the light. If brought in sooner the Hyacinths will make short, inferior flowers. A 4 -inch pot will hold a good sized single bulb, and a 6 - to 8 -inch pot will hold 3 to 5 bulbs. The sprouts are yellow by keeping them covered in this way, but this does not matter, as they turn green quickly as soon as exposed to light.

## Wyatt's Superb Darwin Tulips

The late-flowering Darwin Tulip has out-classed all its predecessors in type, style and beatuty, and is at the present the Queen of the Tulip family. It attains a height of 2 or 3 feet, with strong, heavy foliage, erect and robust stem, terminating in large and massive flowers. The colors of the Darwin embrace all the shades of white, pink, lilac, rose, scarlet, crimson and maroon, and most of the flowers show a particular satiny effect. Darwin Tulips are the finest among shrubbery and perennials; they grow tall, bloom for a long time, and, if planted 6 to 8 inches deep and left undisturbed, will bloom for many seasons. A great many of the varieties will force to good advantage and may be had in bloom during March. They also thrive in semi-tropical climates, like those of California and the Southern States, better than the early Tulips.

## Selected Single Early Tulips

October to December are the best months for planting, and to grow them to perfection the bulbs should be planted about 5 inches apart and 5 inches deep. Generally speaking, the single flowering varieties are by far the most brilliant and showy for outdoor planting. Tulips grow very well in pots with from 3 to 12 bulbs in each pot or bowl.

The letters A, B, C, etc., following the varieties indicate their earliness of bloom-the A's flower together and are the earliest; B's follow before the A's are out of bloom, etc. The height is indicated in inches to aid in arranging the flower beds.

## Last Call for Narcissus

The Federal Horticultural Plant Board has prohibited the importation of many varieties of bulbs, among which are Narcissus. This act goes into effect December 31, 1925. Order early for the demand will be greater than the supply.

They are easy to grow, and bloom in the spring when flowers are scarce. After blooming the tops die down and the bulbs stay dormant all during the summer, and then the following spring they come up and bloom again, and continue to bloom from year to year. All that is necessary is to dig them up occasionally and divide the roots, so that after you once buy these bulbs they contintie to bloom indefiniteiy. There has been a great improvement in Narcissus and Daffodils in the past few years, and some of the flowers now grow to enormous size. We call your attention to the Van Waveren's Giant, Emperor, and Empress Narcissus, which are the largest and most beautiful flowers we have ever seen, and should be included in every collection. Plant the bulbs about 5 inches deep and about the same distance apart.

NOTE.-The Federal Horticultural Board has given notice that no Narcissus bulbs may be imported for sale after January 1, 1926, and so far as we know no American grown bulbs of Paper White or other Polyanthus Narcissus have been produced that will give satisfactory results when forced. Growers are experimenting in New Jersey, Florida, California and other places, therefore it is possible that a reliable source of supply will be developed in the United States within the next few years.
