


Safety tip: don't leave your stuff unattended


The Hilton Tallinn Park hotel is a safe place and also a **public space**, with lots of people walking around on all the floors.






Photo policy

Photos of people with **dark blue lanyards** are OK. Photos of people with **red lanyards** are NOT OK.

If someone asks not to have their photo taken but has no lanyard, direct them to the organizers to get one. **Do not** take their photograph.

Do not upload pictures of people in awkward, intimate, or embarrassing situations. For example, in the middle of a yawn, having a private conversation, or eating something.





Trust & Safety



Enforcement of UCoC

During the Wikimedia Hackathon we will be enforcing the Universal Code of Conduct, with a clear expectation that every participant will follow what is expected of them in the UCOC. To maintain the UCoC it is important for all participants to review the documentation and support a safer environment for all. It will be required for all participants to review the UCoC upon arrival at the hackathon venue and online platform.

If organisers and the event safety team are concerned about the conduct of an individual, or receive a complaint, they may take action appropriate to the situation. This can include a private warning to the person concerned; in more serious cases it may be necessary to ask them to leave.

An incident report will be created for each instance of concern raised within the event; reporters will be given the opportunity to remain anonymous.

Any concerns with the implementation of this policy should be raised with the organisers of the event in the first instance, or with the larger Wikimedia community as desired.

Keep it safe

 - the Technical Code of Conduct




