Some Yugoslav Views Concerning CONEFO and the PKI Delegation to Communist Bloc Countries

Enclosed is a memorandum of conversation with Mr. Mihailo Lompar, the Yugoslav Political Counselor in Djakarta, concerning Yugoslav and Soviet attitudes toward CONEFO, the trips of Aidit and Njoto to Moscow and a suspicion in some Indonesian official circles that the Chinese Communists may have been behind the separation of Singapore from Malaysia (the latter idea is interesting as an indication of lingering suspicion of the Chinese among some highly placed Indonesians rather than for any validity of the idea itself).

Although Lompar's circumlocutions and obfuscation cast doubt on some of his statements, his report of differing Yugoslav and Soviet attitudes toward CONEFO was stated with greater clarity and conviction than is often the case with the source and it accordingly is probably true.
