BERMUDA – Tropical Cyclone GABRIELLE

- At 09:00 UTC 11 Sep, its center was ca. 85km WNW of Bermuda and had a max. sust. wind speed of 84 km/h (Tropical Storm).
- Tropical Storm warning discontinued, as of 12:00 UTC 11 Sep. Rainfall accumulations of 25 to 75mm might affect Bermuda.
- In the next 24h it is forecast to continue moving roughly N, over open waters, keeping its strength.

NIGERIA – Severe weather

- Plateau State: heavy rains on 7-8 Sep caused floods. As of 11 Sep local media report ca. 300 houses destroyed and an unspecified number of people missing in four local government areas. Heavy rains continued to affect parts of central Nigeria on 9-10 Sep.

MEXICO – Landslide

- Veracruz state: a landslide, caused by the heavy rains of the past few days, killed at least 14 people on 10 Sep in Coscomatepec municipality (local media); 16 municipalities affected by rainfall and floods; 261 people housed in shelters as of early on 11 Sep (UTC).
- Heavy rainfall was forecast to continue affecting large parts of Mexico on 11 Sep.

BENIN – Floods

- Floods have been affecting northern Benin in the past few weeks, caused by heavy rain in Niger and Nigeria.
- Mainly affected: regions of Malanville and Karimama (next to river Niger).
- Humanitarian Organisation CARE reports ca. 10 000 people displaced by the floods, local media report 5 000 ha of cropland damaged.

Factsheet on SOUTH SUDAN

- Humanitarian situation in South Sudan remains grim and unpredictable, especially in the northern states bordering the Republic of Sudan. 4.1 million individuals in South Sudan are expected to be food insecure and up to 4.5 million people may require humanitarian assistance in 2013.
- There are over 222 000 refugees and 125 000 IDPs living in the country. Nearly 200 000 of the refugees are from Sudan, fleeing the conflict in South Kordofan and Blue Nile.
- As of early Sep, 27 000 South Sudanese need assistance following flooding, most of them in Warrap State. The actual number of people in need could rise.
- ECHO is supporting life-saving activities in South Sudan with nearly €160 million allocated in 2012/2013 to help internally displaced people, refugees, local host communities and returnees. Special attention is given to aid projects aimed at building the resilience of communities to shocks which cause humanitarian distress.
