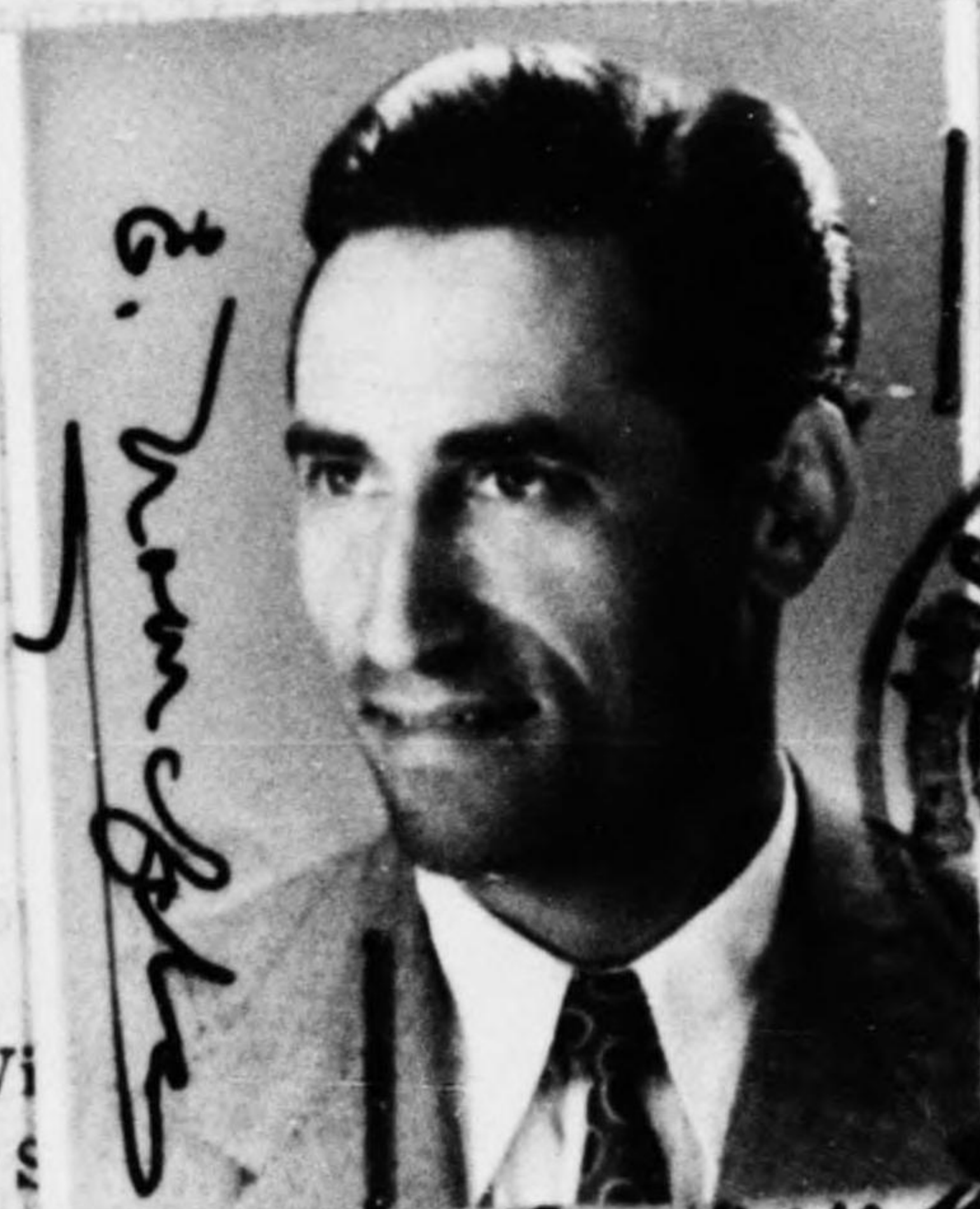



Mr. O'Brien called the Czech Embassy so that it might be informed that Mr. Zamara was cleared by SCAP to enter Japan between November 16, 1947 and November 30, 1947 for a stay of 21 days commencing the date of entry. Mr. O'Brien noted from a duplicate of Mr. Zamara's application for permission to enter Japan that Mr. Zamara was presently residing at Bangkok and requested information as to whether the Czech Government maintained a diplomatic or consular establishment at Bangkok or whether the Embassy would authorize Mr. O'Brien to send a telegram charged to the Embassy to the American representative at Bangkok so that Mr. Zamara might be documented.

Mr. O'Brien was informed by the officer of the Czech Embassy with whom he spoke that the Czech Government maintained no establishment of any kind at Bangkok and requested that a cablegram charged to the Czech Embassy be sent to the American representative there for Mr. Zamara. A check with DC/R (Mr. Gee checked DC/R's files since 1940; Mrs. Milar checked DC/R's files from 1930 to 1939), VD (Miss Flinn) and FC (Miss Jenkins -- Miss Jenkins checked FC's regular files and the economic security files recently transferred to FC from OE) reveals no information concerning William Zamara.

Miss Jenkins in FC also checked the economic security files for record of Kotva Inc., Zlin, Czechoslovakia, but was unable to find such a record. She also checked for records of the firms with which Mr. Zamara states Kotva Inc. did business ~~with~~ before the war. There was a record of Okura and Co. only, indicating, among other things, that in 1941 it had close and extensive relations in Germany. However, in view of the steps which have been taken by the military authorities in Japan with regard to such firms, Mr. Bowman of JK feels that it is unnecessary to include any information regarding Okura and Co. in our letter transmitting William Zamara's application to the military.

As Mr. Mohler, National Catholic Welfare Conference had previously inquired on these cases and requested to be informed when the clearances had been received, Miss Wolberg telephoned him on September 8, 1947. He informed her that there had been a mixup in this case and that the Very Reverend Mother Cristina Estrada is going to Japan, the order to which she belongs, and which has been requesting her military permit, does not know who Mother Monserrat Barjau is. Instead of the latter they intend to send one Mother Henrietta C. M. Martindale, a British national, to Japan. Mr. Mohler stated that the order had sent a cable to Tokyo requesting the application for permission for Mother Henrietta C. M. Martindale to enter Japan and inquiring who Mother Monserrat Barjau is. He said that an answer to this cable should be received this week and asked that Miss Wolberg hold up action on the memorandum from the Military Permit Section until the matter was straightened out. He said that he would inform Miss Wolberg as soon as the answer was received from Tokyo. Miss Wolberg said that no action would be taken until she heard from Mr. Mohler.

On Sept. 16 Mr. Mohler called to say that neither Mother Cristina Estrada nor Mother Henrietta C. M. Martindale ^{is} going to Japan now. Mother Monserrat Barjau is not going either.

I refer to your letter of September 2, 1947 addressed to Mr. Haering of the Visa Division of this Department and to previous correspondence which is understood to have taken place between your company and the United States Department of Commerce regarding the application of Mr. Elias Nourafchan, an Iranian national, for permission to travel to Japan. The military authorities have informed the Department of State that Mr. Nourafchan has been approved for entry into Japan between October 15 and October 30, 1947.

It is understood from the Department of Commerce that Mr. Nourafchan will not be able to come to Washington to claim the military permit which has been issued in his name and that he wishes it to be sent to your office. In view of the foregoing, the aforementioned military permit is enclosed. It will be noted that the permit is valid for 21 days after the date of Mr. Nourafchan's entry into Japan and that he will need two standard passport photographs measuring one and one-quarter by one and three-quarters inches.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE FILES

Reference the underlying note of September 3, 1947 from the Legation of Lebanon requesting permission for Mr. "Cherif Soubra" to enter Japan. According to the note Mr. Soubra has been appointed by the Lebanese Ministry of National Economy to go to Japan in order to study the possibilities of trade between Lebanon and Japan. It will be noted from the attached file that the Legation previously approached the Department with a request for permission for Mr. Soubra to go to Japan. (The previous correspondence refers to Mr. Soubra as "Sherif Abdulbadie Soubra". Miss Wolberg telephoned Mrs. Ward of the Lebanese Legation to inquire whether "Sherif Abdulbadie" and "Cherif" are one and the same individual. Mrs. Ward said they are one and the same and indicated that she believed Mr. Soubra is presently in Lebanon.) A memorandum dated May 28, 1947 from the Military Permit Secretariat informed the Department that the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers had not given favorable consideration to Mr. Soubra's application. This information was transmitted to the Legation on June 23, 1947.

Upon receipt of the note of September 3, Miss Wolberg telephoned Captain Keough, Military Permit Section, War Department, to inquire whether another application should be submitted or whether a letter from this Department setting forth the contents of the new Lebanese note would be sufficient as most of the information called for in the application is already in the Military Permit Section's files on Mr. Soubra. Captain Keough replied that he thought a letter from the Department would be sufficient, and that if any additional information were needed, he would let us know.

Miss Wolberg then telephoned Mr. Paige, JK to inform him of the contents of the Lebanese note of September 3, 1947 and to clear with him a draft letter to Colonel Lynch, Military Permit Section, War Department requesting the necessary permission for Mr. Soubra. There was a discussion as to whether the Lebanese intended Mr. Soubra to go as an official representative of his Government or in a private capacity. Mr. Paige indicated that when he had acknowledged by 'phone the Legation's note of August 11, 1947, in which it is stated that the Lebanese Government is interested in sending "commercial representatives" to Japan, it was understood both by the Lebanese and by Mr. Paige that the note referred to the desire of the Lebanese Government to have private Lebanese businessmen go to Japan under the Lebanese quota. It was understood, he said, that the Lebanese Government was not requesting permission to send delegates there as officials of the Lebanese Government.

I refer to a telephone conversation of September 9, 1947 between Captain Keough of your office and an officer of the Department of State in connection with the case of one Sherif Abdulbadie Soubra, a Lebanese businessman, to whom reference is made in this Department's letter of May 5, 1947 addressed to Commander Millett, then Military Permit Secretary, and in Commander Millett's memorandum of May 28, 1947 to this Department. It will be recalled that Mr. Soubra's application for permission to enter Japan was not approved at that time by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

As stated to Captain Keough, the Department of State has now been informed by the Lebanese Legation that the Lebanese Ministry of National Economy has appointed Mr. Soubra to go to Japan for the purpose of studying the possibilities of trade between Lebanon and Japan. Consequently, the Legation has again requested that permission be obtained for Mr. Soubra's entry into Japan.

It would be appreciated if, in bringing this matter to the attention of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers at Tokyo, the Military Permit Section would indicate that application is being made for the above-mentioned Lebanese businessman to enter Japan under the quota assigned to "other" nations by the Inter-Allied Trade Board.



MEMORANDUM FOR THE FILES

Reference the underlying memorandum of August 29, 1947 from the Military Permit Section, War Department, stating that Mr. Teofilo Homsany Missri may enter Japan between September 1 and September 16, 1947, inclusive, for a three week stay. Upon receiving the aforementioned memorandum, Miss Wolberg telephoned Mr. Chevalier, Counselor of the Panamanian Embassy, to inform him of the sense of it. It was agreed that there would hardly be time for the Embassy to transmit this information to the Panamanian Foreign Office and for Mr. Missri to get to Japan by September 16. Consequently, Mr. Chevalier requested that the Department endeavor to obtain permission for Mr. Missri to enter Japan between October 1 and October 15, 1947. Miss Wolberg said that an endeavor would be made to have this done and that meanwhile a communication would be sent to the Embassy confirming this conversation and containing certain other information on this case which has been received from the military authorities. Mr. Chevalier requested that the original and two flimsies of the communication be sent to the Embassy. Miss Wolberg then telephoned Captain Keough, Military Permit Section, War Department, and informed him of the situation described above. Captain Keough said that he would see to it that a cable was sent to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers today requesting permission for Mr. Missri to enter Japan between October 1 and October 15, 1947. He said that he would inform Miss Wolberg as soon as a reply was received.

As Mr. Missri would probably be unable to reach Japan by September 16, it is understood that your office will request the military authorities at Tokyo to grant permission for Mr. Missri to enter Japan between October 1 and October 15, 1947, inclusive. I should appreciate being informed of the decision reached in this matter in order that the Panamanian Embassy may be informed.

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MEMORANDUM

The Department of State refers the Embassy of Panama to a telephone conversation of September 8, 1947 between Mr. Chevalier of the Embassy's staff and an officer of the Department, as well as to previous correspondence, regarding the desire of Mr. Teofilo Monsany Misri to enter Japan.

As stated to Mr. Chevalier, the Department has received clearance from the appropriate military authorities for Mr. Misri to enter Japan between September 1 and September 16, 1947, inclusive, for a stay of three weeks after the date of his entry. As Mr. Misri probably would be unable to reach Japan by September 16 and pursuant to Mr. Chevalier's request, the Department is endeavoring to obtain permission for Mr. Misri to enter Japan between October 2 and October 15, 1947, inclusive. The Embassy will be informed as soon as the Department learns whether such permission may be granted.

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In connection with the foregoing there is set forth below certain additional information which has been received from the military authorities:

It is noted that Mr. Misri wishes to stay in Japan for 90 days. Should he desire an extension of the three-week period of stay in Japan, he should submit his request for extension no later than ten days prior to the scheduled date of his departure from Japan. His request, if approved by the Panamanian Government, will be considered individually by the Supreme Commander. Accommodations for Mr. Misri will be provided in Japanese-operated hotels on a revenue basis. No accommodations are available in Kobe but some are available in Osaka. Mr. Misri should be instructed to bring with him two photographs measuring one and a quarter by one and three quarters inches to be used on identification cards.

I refer to your letter of August 25, 1947 addressed to Mr. Richard E. Hibbard, formerly of the Department of State, requesting assistance in obtaining permits for Chosaku Oishi and Kaemon Fukusaka, respectively, to ship merchandise to Japan. With regard to Mr. Oishi, reference is also made to your letter of July 29, 1947 addressed to Mr. Hibbard and your letter of July 3, 1947 addressed to the United States Commercial Company. The latter communication was referred to this Department. I regret that there has been a delay in replying to your letters.

It appears from the information contained in your letters that Mr. Oishi and Mr. Fukusaka wish to obtain permission to ship merchandise into Japan for commercial purposes. This Department understands that such permission is not being granted at the present time, except in the case of imports essential to the economy of Japan. 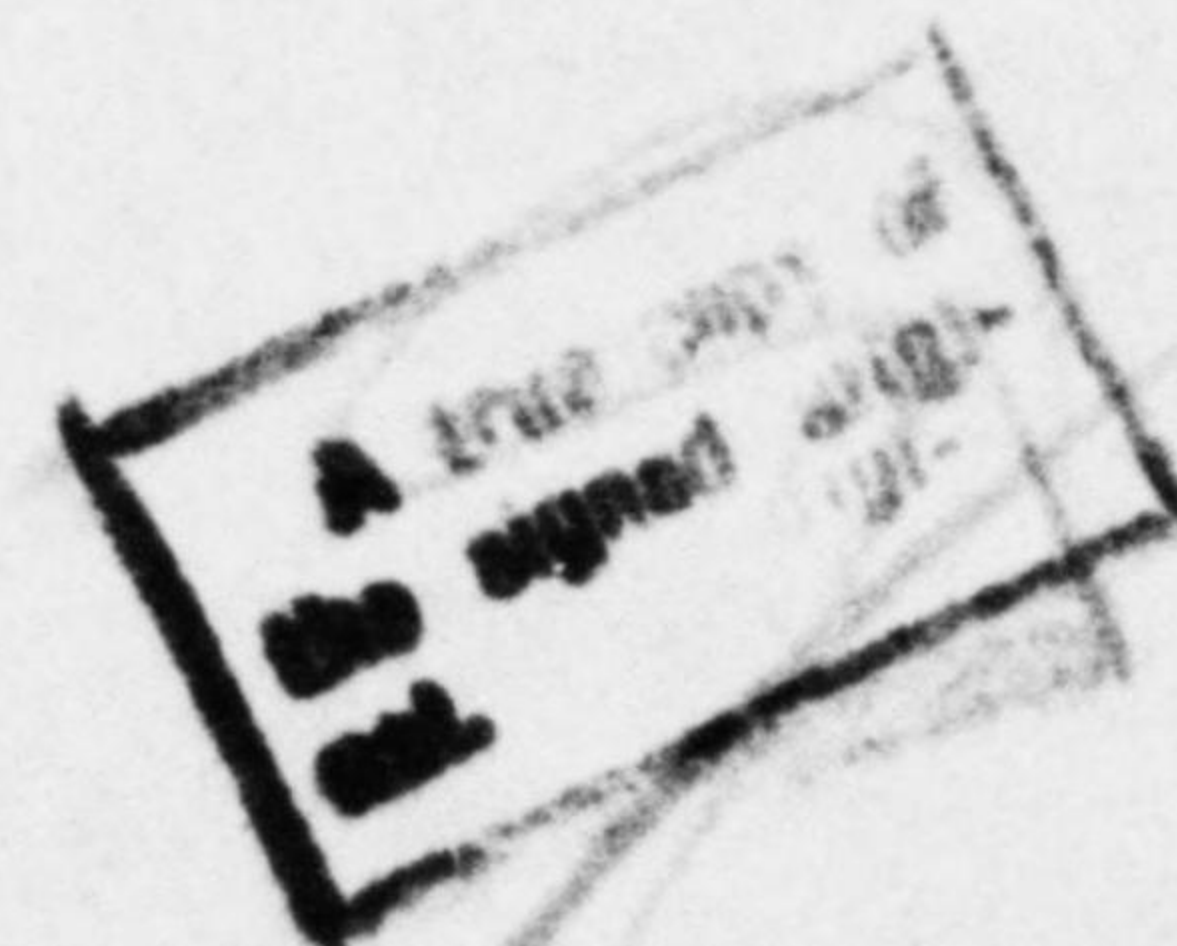

Department is informed that military authorities in Japan have granted permission for Sister Assunta R. Prestofilippo, stated to be residing at Victor Grotta Perfetta, Rome to enter Japan for missionary work; military authorities have also indicated that detailed information is forthcoming re: shipment of household goods and food authorized for her. Latter information not yet received.

Department's files appear to contain no adverse information concerning subject; if no such information is available to Embassy and if, as Department presumes, subject is an Italian national planning to transit United States en route Japan, case may be handled without further reference to Department. Italian Foreign Office should be given information contained in first paragraph above. In this connection refer PSS 867 and 868 of January 17, 1947. 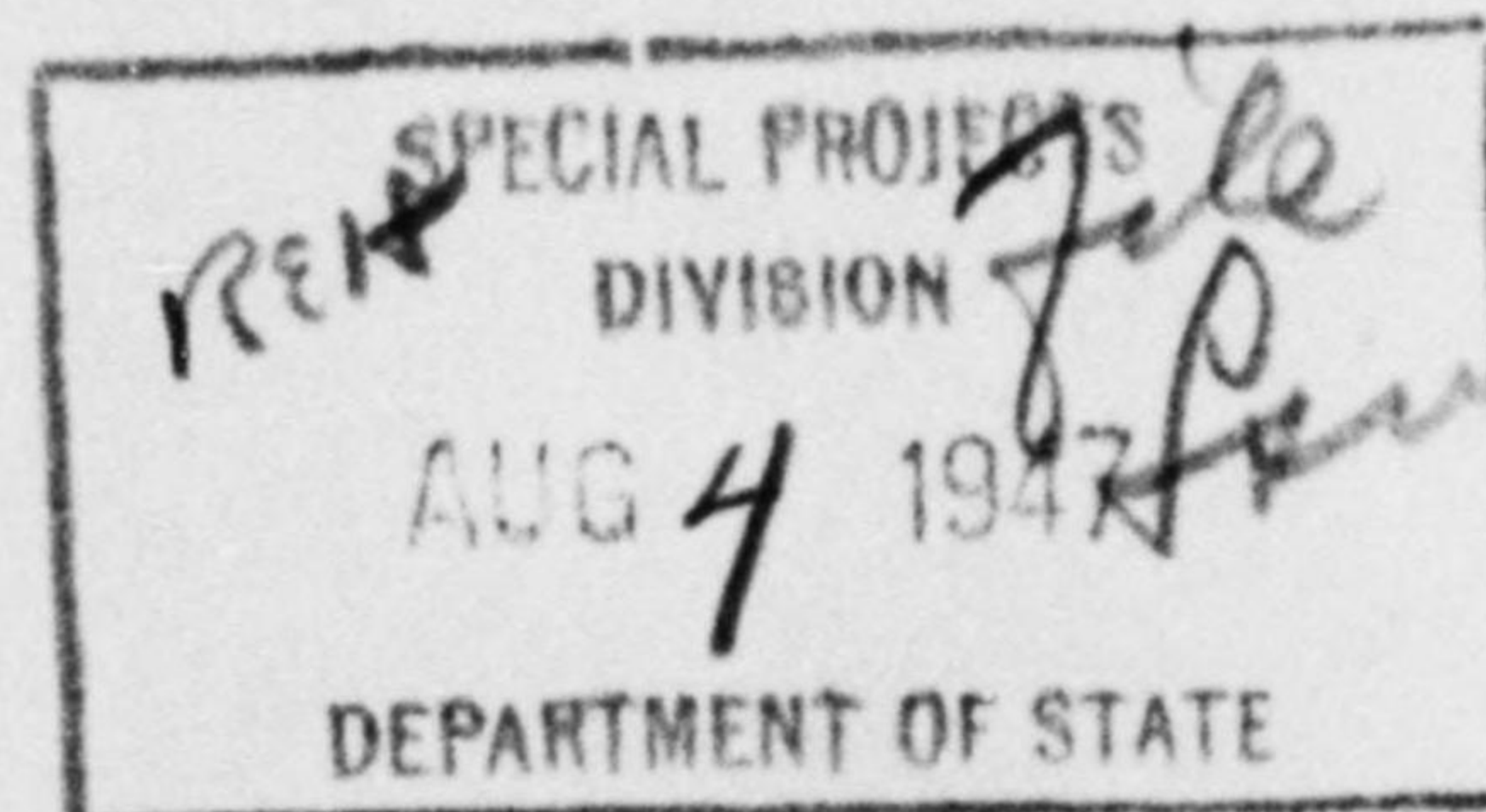

Upon receiving a memorandum dated July 7, 1947 from Dublin regarding the case of the Reverend Joseph Francis O'Brien, Miss Wolberg called Mrs. Flickinger to ask whether the Military Permit Section had any knowledge of the above-mentioned telegram. After searching her files Mrs. Flickinger indicated that the telegram had been received in her Section but that they had not yet been able to give the information to the State Department. 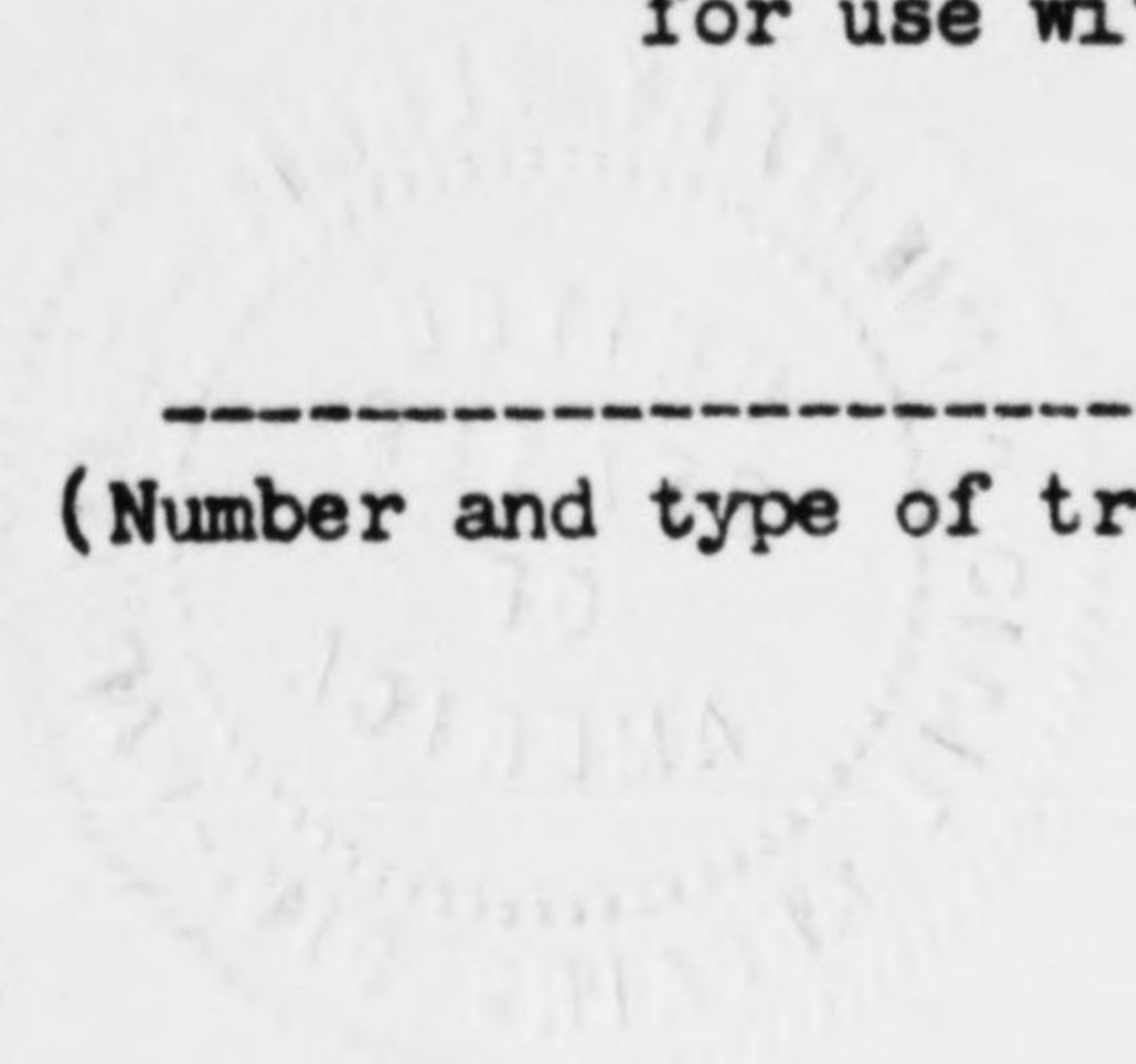

Dear Sirs:

With reference to your letter No. M-130 - Elmaleh, Lucien Joseph, dated September 3, 1947, the contents of which we cabled to Mr. Elmaleh in Shanghai, we have just received a cable in reply from Mr. Elmaleh, requesting that the United States Consul in Shanghai be advised by cable of the fact that permission has been granted him to enter Japan between September 16 and September 30, 1947. We would greatly appreciate your kindly cabling this information immediately to the Consulate in Shanghai, as our representative is anxious to visit Japan under the September quota.

As has been previously indicated, Mr. Lucien Joseph Elmaleh is at the present time in Shanghai, where he represents this concern as well as the parent company, Leval & Co. Inc., New York, both incorporated in the State of New York, Louis Dreyfus & Co. (Overseas) Ltd., New York, being an affiliation for Far Eastern business. When applying for the permit, we pointed out that Mr. Elmaleh is a French citizen, bearing Passport No. 124, issued on November 24, 1946 by the Haut-Commissaire du Gouvernement de la République Française in Indochina, and therefore he will not require the issuance of an American passport, but only a visa permitting him to visit Japan.

Kindly advise us of the cost of your cable expenditures in this connection, in order that we may send you our check to cover this.


MEMORANDUM FOR THE FILES

SUBJECT: Exit Permit Case of Jean L. Ashman.

Mr. Williams checked with Mr. Weymueller, American President Lines agent in Washington, regarding the Ashman case as outlined in George Ashman's letter of August 11, 1947. It was ascertained (1) that no exit or military permit is required for a British national traveling to Bombay from San Francisco, even though the vessel involved stops at Japan, if the individual does not propose to disembark at the Japanese port; (2) that the passenger list of the MARINE LEOPARD which actually sailed from San Francisco on September 5 carried the names of Mr. and Mrs. George L. Ashman.

Presumably, therefore, the entire matter was straightened out at San Francisco and the Ashmans were able to sail despite their earlier difficulties with the Immigration Service.

Mr. Williams then checked with Mr. Horner of the INS in Philadelphia to ascertain whether a reentry permit had been issued to Mrs. Ashman before her departure from the United States. He described the circumstances and Mr. Horner agreed that there was no reason why the permit should not have been issued. Mr. Horner said he would look into the matter and that (a) if the permit had been issued no further action would be necessary; (b) if the permit had not been issued but the application was on file at Philadelphia he would issue the permit and send it to Mrs. Ashman via the American Consulate at Calcutta; (c) if no permit had been issued and no application received, he would consult again with Mr. Williams with a view to clearing the matter up. It was agreed that if Mr. Horner did not call Mr. Williams on the case within the next few days the whole matter could be regarded as closed and the papers sent to file without action by the State Department.
