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# Japanese gas warfare, 1937 - 1943

The followings are captured in China theater during the 2<sup>nd</sup> world war.

- ✓ ① Type "92" - 50 kg - Vesicant bomb with Vesicant agent (Lewisite & Mustard gas).
- ② "6<sup>th</sup> year" or type "38" Vesicant shell of 7.5 cm. mountain gun, with Vesicant agent (as above).
- x ③ Type "38" field gun shell with gas, Lacrimatory, Vomiting & sneezing agents. (Chloropicrin & stannous chloride)
- ✓ ④ Toxic smoke projector, with <sup>sneezing</sup> tear gas and smoke agents (Diphenylchloroarsine, ~~Chloracetophenone~~ Clark I.)
- ⑤ Type "C" Tear cylinder, with tear gas. (Chloroacetophenone soluble in carbon tetrachloride)
- ✓ ⑥ Type "A" Green cylinder, with tear gas. (Chloroacetophenone in nitrocellulose plate)
- ✓ ⑦ Type "89" Tear gas cylinder (as above)
- ✓ ⑧ Toxic smoke candle (2 kgs), with sneezing gas (Diphenylcyanoarsine solution absorbed by pumice stone) Clark II.
- ✓ ⑨ 15 kg - gas bomb, with tear gas. ? (Chloropicrine ?)
- ⑩ 15 cm. cal. <sup>Howitzer</sup> shell. (2) with toxic gas. (Hydrocyanic acid)

Statement of Dr. S. C. SHIH, Bachelor of Science, Peking University  
TUNG Kai Chow

I am a graduate chemist from Peking University. I am now the curator of Museum of Firearms and Ordnance of China at the above place. The articles enumerated on the other side of this sheet are poison gas weapons taken from the Japanese, and used in the Japanese war. I have analysed the gases referred to, and they are as stated on other side of this sheet. I have been curator here for the past six months, my predecessor, C. W. Chao, now in Shanghai still with ordnance dept Chinese Army. I brought all this gas equipment with me when I came here, and obtained from Ordnance Dept, Chinese Army. Numbers 1, 4, 6, 7, & 8 still contain poison gas, & possibly 9. Ordnance department records will have to be checked <sup>in attempt</sup> to prove when and where these were obtained. I am signing this on the word of my Heavy Chief, that he has translated this statement correctly. Signed in Chinese
