

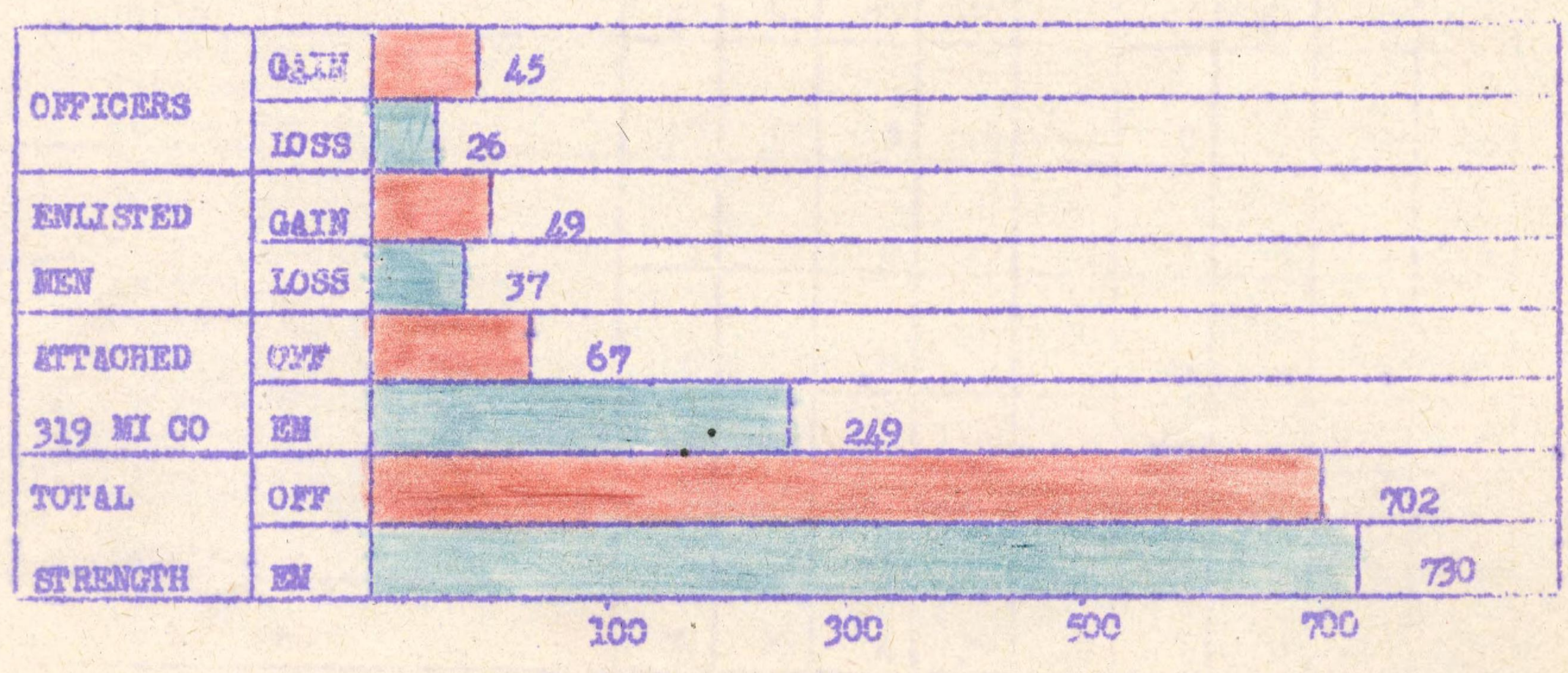

PROJECT STITCH MONTHLY STATISTICS REPORT

1 October to 31 October 1951

Project Stitch is a program initiated by this headquarters for uncovering Soviet agents among repatriates from Soviet POW camps in Russian occupied areas. P/S Cat "A" is the terminology used for an alleged Soviet agent. To date, three hundred and twenty six (326) suspected Soviet agents have been taken over for operational control by higher headquarters; of these, thirty three (33) have been dropped from operational control by higher headquarters for various reasons.

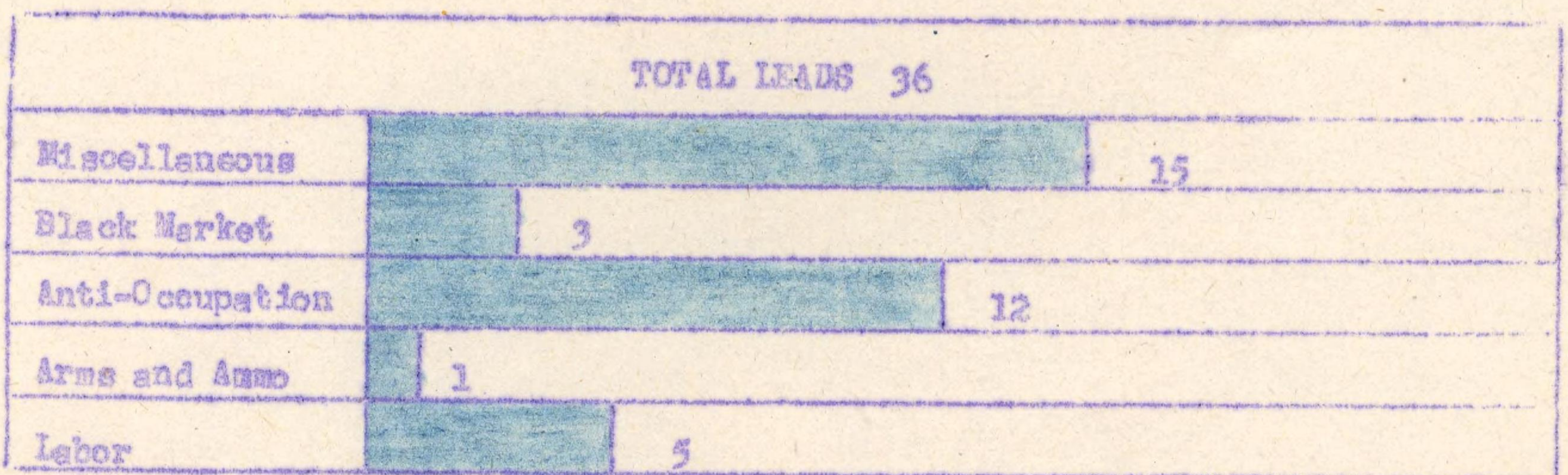

MONTHLY REPORT OF ACTIVITIES  
NOVEMBER 1951

## A. ROUTINE ACTIVITIES:

1. Investigative Correspondence: During November 1951, a total of 3341 pieces of investigative correspondence, covering incidents and individual cases and social and/or civil conditions in Japan, were processed through Headquarters 441st CIC Detachment by the Special Investigations Section. The figures do not represent completed investigations (see page 6).

2. Reports Processed: Statistical data for November 1951 was submitted to Sec Div (Operations Branch) for inclusion in the Counter Intelligence Review.

In accordance with paragraph 69, TM 30-215, September 1947, Monthly Report of CIC Activities, DA AGO Form 395, for November was forwarded to the Chief, CIC Center, Fort Holabird, Maryland.

In accordance with SR 380-320-5, 21 June 1951, Counter Intelligence Investigations and Personnel, DA AGO Form 326, for month of November, was forwarded to Sec Div (Plans & Policy) for inclusion in the FEC report to Chief, CIC Center.

3. CIGTS Conducts Agents' Basic Class: The 84th Agents' Basic Training Class of the Counter Intelligence Corps Training School (CIGTS), Tokyo, was in session from 10 October 1951 to 6 November 1951. Twenty-four (24) officers and nineteen (19) enlisted men completed the course. Of these personnel, three (3) were from CIC Detachments in Korea; five (5) from G2 Section, 45th Division, APO 86; and one (1) from G2 Section, Japan Logistical Command (JLC), APO 343. (See attached Roster.)

The graduation address was given by Colonel Robert T. Chaplin, Provost Marshal, General Headquarters, Far East Command. Letters of commendation were awarded to the following three students who ranked highest, scholastically, in the class:

A total of nine (9) hours of familiarization firing with the Revolver, Colt, Caliber .38, Special, 2" barrel, was completed by members of the 84th Agents' Basic Training Class.

The 85th Agents' Basic Training Class of CIGTS commenced training on 21 November 1951 and is scheduled to be completed on or about 19 December 1951. (See attached schedule and Roster.)

4. Troop Training Schedule: Weekly troop training required by Headquarters and Service Command, GHQ, FEC, for November 1951, included four (4) hours per week of instruction for approximately one hundred and twenty-five (125) enlisted personnel of the Headquarters Detachment.

As per instructions contained in GHQ, FEC, Circular No 3, 24 Jan 49, troop training for approximately eighty (80) officers of the Headquarters Detachment was conducted.

A total of seven hundred and twelve (712) persons from the various CIC Districts have satisfactorily completed the CFT Examination and a total of one thousand two hundred and nineteen (1219) persons have satisfactorily completed lessons on CFT 101-108 as of 30 Nov 51.

During the month of November four (4) hours of Disaster and Alert Plan training, which included a CPX (for all units of this detachment) and practice of PAD Plan, was conducted for officers and enlisted personnel of Headquarters, 441st CIC Detachment.

On 26 and 27 November 1951, a make-up course on Chemical, Biological and Radiological Warfare, Phase II, was held at the Ernie Pyle theater for officers of this headquarters.

## B. HIGHLIGHTS;

1. Rotation Program for CIC Personnel in Korea: This headquarters, which has been designated Replacement and Processing Center for CIC personnel in the Far East by GHQ, FEC, processed a total of thirty-nine (39) CIC replacements for Korea and a total of twenty-three (23) CIC rotations from Korea during the month of November 1951.

2. Maizuru Sub-Area Closed: Maizuru Sub-Area of Kyoto CIC Area was closed effective 26 November 1951. The zone of responsibility formerly covered by the Sub-Area will now be covered by two (2) Resident Agents from Kyoto CIC Area, with offices at Camp Maizuru.

3. 45th CIC Detachment Relieved From Attachment: Effective 24 November 1951, the 45th CIC Detachment was relieved from attachment to the 441st CIC Detachment, for operational control and training, and returned to 45th Division control.

## C. SPECIAL ACTIVITIES;

One of CIC's most important jobs in reporting information is the separation of authentic data from false or brokered information. It is known that a number of private individuals and organizations in various parts of Japan acquire considerable income from the distribution and sale of information concerning the Japan Communist Party (JCP) and its activities. Such peddled information is purchased to a large extent by business management groups and newspapers, and occasionally becomes channeled to CIC through Japanese Police and other sources. Some of the information peddled in this manner has some basis in fact, but much of it is fabricated or grossly exaggerated.

Among well-known intelligence peddlers and distributors are the Japan Management Association and a group of former Communists. Much of the doubtful or fabricated information which recently has been circulated by management groups and various Japanese publications indicates that Tanaka, Seigen (prominent Communist who was a leader of the JCP in 1930) and his associates may be the source.

On 28 May 1951, First CIC District submitted a report on two (2) pamphlets which were examples of information allegedly offered for sale by the Industrial Current News Company of Osaka. The documents were entitled "The Japan Communist Party Issued the Following Instructions on the Selection of Putilov Factories (key positions for the revolution)" and "Japan Communist Party Plans Seizure of Automobiles in Event of Revolution." Careful study of these pamphlets revealed that the format and content were similar to the material put out by Yamao, Hajime, a well-known information broker, on whom a background case was initiated by CIC in 1949.

In July 1951, Fifth CIC District reported on the proceedings of a meeting of the Joetsu Japan Communist Party District Committee, Takada City, Niigata Prefecture. Discussion was centered on a JCP member whom the committeemen present suspected of being a "spy" for CIC. It was stated that the "spy claimed that the enemy is most interested in obtaining material concerning Party 'Y' activity." The committeemen decided to give the suspected individual "some false information concerning illegal Party structure to determine the type of EEI desired by the enemy."

The acquisition of this type of information has a detrimental effect on CIC operations. In an effort to eliminate as much as possible the reporting of false or brokered information, CIC has opened a case on information brokers. The object of the case is to catalog the producers and/or distributors of this type of information as a guide to sources to be avoided and to the type of false or brokered information currently being disseminated.



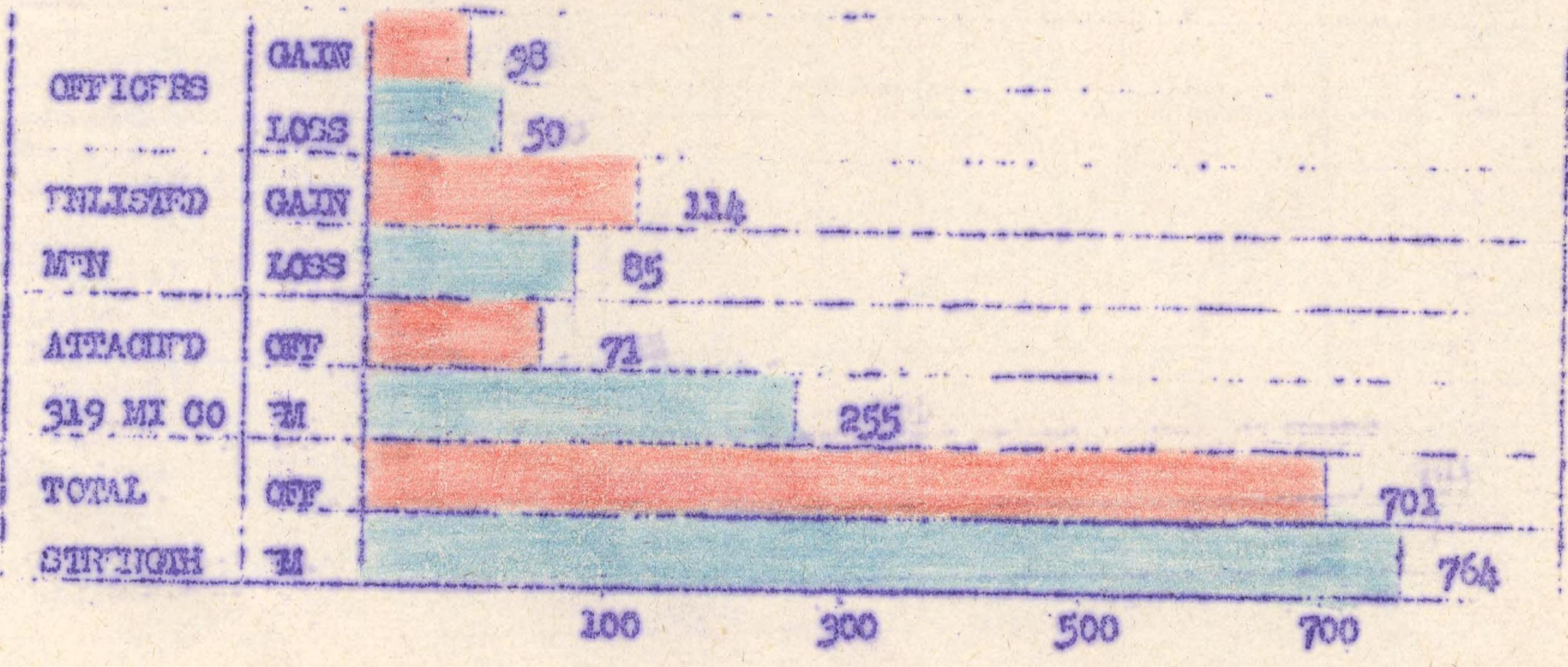

To date three hundred and thirty eight (338) suspected Soviet agents have been taken over for operational control by higher headquarters; of these, thirty three (33) have been dropped from operational control by higher headquarters for various reasons.

## A. ROUTINE ACTIVITIES:

1. Investigative Correspondence: During December 1951, a total of 3182 pieces of investigative correspondence, covering incidents and individual cases and social and/or civil conditions in Japan, were processed through Headquarters, 441st CIC Detachment by the Special Investigations Section. The figures do not represent completed investigations (see page 6).

2. Reports Processed: Statistical data for December 1951 was submitted to Scty Div (Operations Branch) for inclusion in the Counter Intelligence Review.

In accordance with paragraph 59, TM 30-215, September 1947, Monthly Report of CIC Activities, DA AGO Form 395, for December was forwarded to the Chief, CIC Center, Fort Holabird, Maryland.

In accordance with SR 380-320-5, 21 June 1951, Counter Intelligence Investigations and Personnel, DA AGO Form 326, for month of December, was forwarded to Scty Div (Plans & Policy) for inclusion in the FEC report to Chief, CIC Center.

3. CICTS Conducts Agents' Basic Class: The 85th Agents' Basic Training Class of the Counter Intelligence Corps Training School (CICTS), Tokyo, was in session from 21 November 1951 to 19 December 1951. Twenty-six (26) officers and nine (9) enlisted men completed the course. Of these personnel, five (5) were from CIC Detachments in Korea, and one (1) from US Navy Fleet Activities, FPO 3923, San Francisco. (See attached Roster.)

The graduation address was given by Lt Col (USMC) Donald R. Nugent, Chief, Civil Information & Education Section, General Headquarters, Far East Command. Letters of Commendation were awarded to the following three students who ranked highest, scholastically, in the class:

A total of four (4) hours of familiarization firing (70 rounds) with the Revolver, Colt, cal .38, Special, 2<sup>nd</sup> barrel, was completed by members of the 85th Agents' Basic Training Class.

Other activities of CICTS instructors included four one-hour talks on the CIC Mission in the Far East Command, given to the WAC Battalion, Hq & Svc Command, and a one-hour lecture on Safeguarding Military Information, presented at the Far East Command Intelligence School.

4. Troop Training Schedule: Weekly troop training required by Headquarters and Service Command, GEQ, FEC, for December 1951, included four (4) hours per week of instruction for approximately one hundred and fifty (150) enlisted personnel. Three (3) hours of instruction in Geneva Conventions were attended by approximately fifty-two (52) officers and one hundred and fifty (150) enlisted personnel of the Headquarters Detachment.

As per instructions contained in GEQ, FEC, Circular No 3, 24 Jan 49, troop training for approximately fifty-five (55) officers of the Headquarters Detachment was conducted.

A total of seven hundred and twenty-seven (727) members of 441st CIC Det have satisfactorily completed the CFT Examination and a total of one thousand two hundred and thirty-four (1234) persons have satisfactorily completed lessons on CFT 101-108. A total of one hundred and forty (140) persons have satisfactorily completed the examination on CFT 114 as of 31 December 1951.

### C. SPECIAL ACTIVITIES:

During the months of November and December 1951, it became increasingly evident that the Japan Communist Party (JCP) had become determined to undermine the Emperor system in Japan.

The first mention of opposition to the Emperor in high level JCP policy directives was noted in a JCP Provisional Central Guidance Department document, dated 25 August 1951, and entitled "Immediate Demands." This document advocated the abolition of the Emperor system and the establishment of a democratic republic in which the nation's head could be a president chosen by the people in free elections every fourth year. The document also accused the Emperor system of dragging Japan into WW II, which ended in defeat for Japan, and of attempting to drag Japan into a new War.

A recent trip of the Emperor to Kyoto University resulted in an incident which amplified this trend on the part of the JCP. The Emperor was met by approximately 800 students displaying anti-Emperor placards and singing Communist-inspired songs. The group became so out of hand that it was necessary to call the local police to quell the disturbance. The Japanese "Yomiuri Weekly" stated that the demonstration had been a carefully laid plan on the part of the JCP to discredit the Emperor in the eyes of the Japanese people.

The Japanese people greeted the Kyoto University demonstration with mixed feelings but generally voiced the opinion that it was Communist-led and merely showed the students' bad manners and disrespect. On the other hand, the JCP publications displayed the story prominently, asserting that the incident was a "True expression of the students' desires for peace."

Following the Kyoto affair the Emperor's entourage often encountered wall posters that decried the expenditure of millions of yen for the Emperor's trips and "exposed" the Emperor as a "warmonger" and a "pawn of the American Imperialists." Throughout the month of December, JCP publications continued to follow this propaganda line and to accuse the Emperor for Japan's entry into WW II with its attendant loss of life and property.

The Counter Intelligence Corps has a definite interest in the activities and strength of the Communist Party in Japan because of the potential threat that the JCP presents to the security of the US Military Establishment and overall mission in Japan. As of 18 Nov 51, all CIC units in Japan opened case files which were concerned with the investigation and report of all attempts by the JCP to agitate against the Emperor of Japan. It will be interesting to note in the future whether or not the JCP has strengthened or weakened its stature with the Japanese people through the use of such tactics.

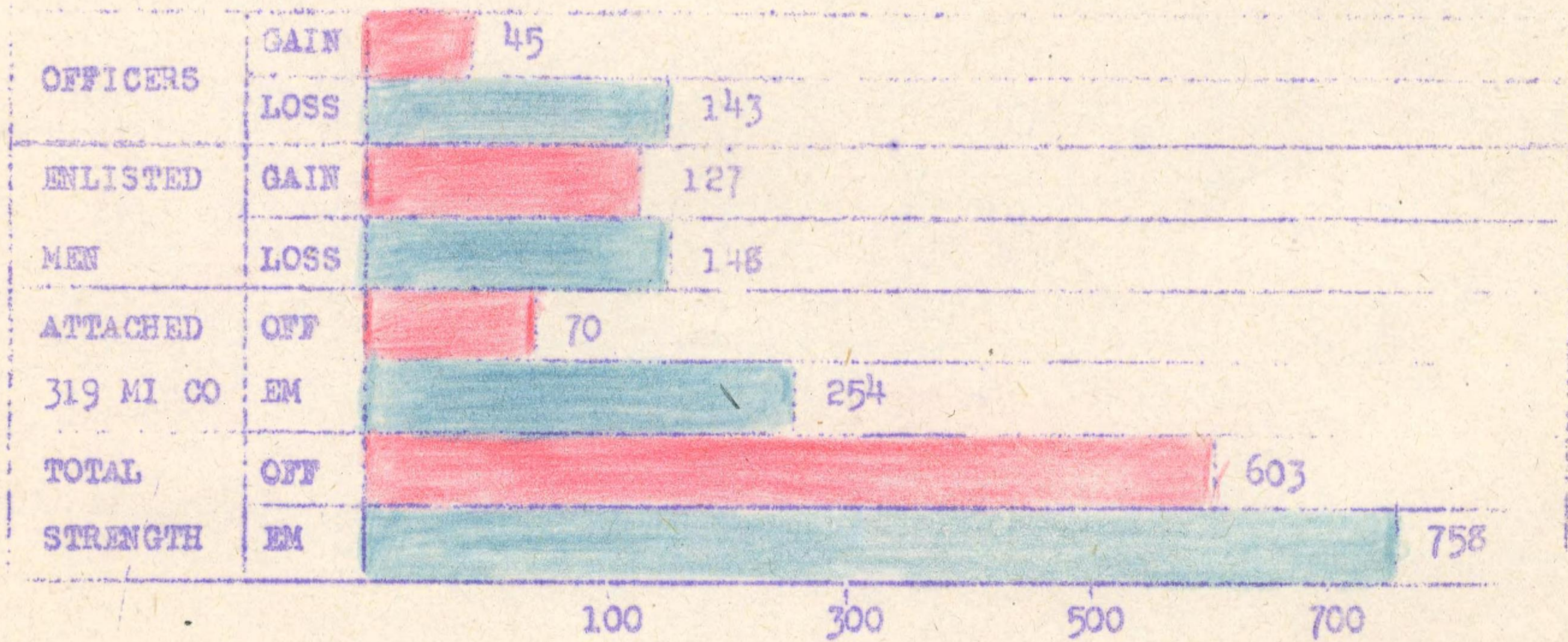

To date, three hundred and fifty (350) suspected Soviet agents have been taken over for operational control by higher headquarters; of these, thirty-three (33) have been dropped from operational control by higher headquarters for various reasons.

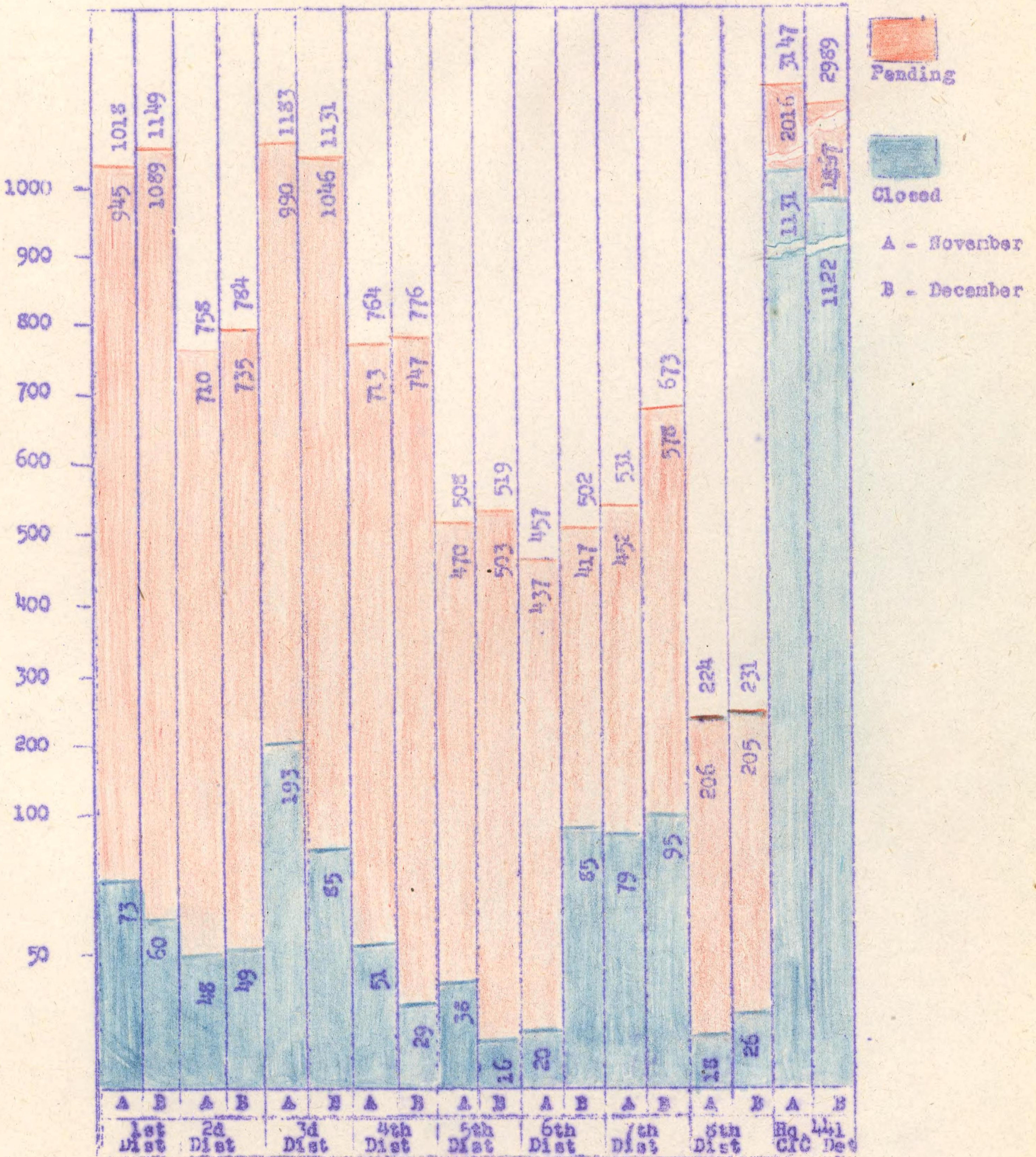
