Neutral Point of View - NPOV



- Fundamental principle of Wikipedia & other Wikimedia projects
- One of three core content policies together with "Verifiability" and "No original research"

On Wikipedia NOPV means "carefully and critically analyzing a variety of reliable sources and then attempting to convey to the reader the information contained in them fairly, proportionately, and as far as possible without editorial bias" (<u>[WP:NPOV]</u>)

Neutral Point of View - NPOV



Principles for achieving the level of neutrality that is appropriate for an encyclopedia:

- Avoid stating opinions as facts.
- Avoid stating seriously contested assertions as facts.
- Avoid stating facts as opinions.
- Prefer nonjudgmental language.
- Indicate the relative prominence of opposing views.
