





#### General Information.

Key holders upon positive information of a fire in the vicinity, that is nearer their box than any other, will unlock the box, and if the church bells are not striking, nor the small gong in the box, they will then pull the hook down once, and let go. Do not pull the hook if the small gong or the alarm bells are striking, as in that case a box is already running, and to pull a second one would confuse the firemen. After pulling a box, remain, or leave some one at the box, to direct the firemen to the exact locality of the fire.

Pulling a box a second time, or two boxes, does not (as might be supposed) accelerate the arrival of the firemen, as the bell ringers always wait until the alarm bells have completed their rounds be-

fore striking the church bells.

One stroke on the alarm bells, or two strokes, with an interval

between them, only indicates that the alarm is being tested. The Chief Engineer will use the Fire Alarm to transmit his orders to the whole department, or any details thereof.







#### WARD BOUNDARIES.

Ordinance passed by City Council of the City of Newport, December 5, 1882.

The FIRST WARD shall comprise that portion of the city embraced within a line commencing at a point at the extreme north point of the shore at Coddington Point, then following the shore of Coddington Cove to a point opposite the centre of a straight prolongation of the road running northerly from Sunset avenue, the running through the centre of said prolongation and said road, through the centres of Sunset avenue, Coddington avenue, Malbone avenue, Warner street, Burnside avenue, West Broadway, Marlborough street, Thames street and Long wharf, in a continuous line to City wharf, then around and including City wharf, and taking in all the remainder of Long wharf westerly, and following the shore, including all the wharves and docks and Coasters' Harbor Island, to the point of beginning at Coddington Point.

The SECOND WARD shall comprise that portion of the city embraced by and within a line commencing at the centre of Marlborough street at the junction of West Broadway, running across Broadway, through the centres of Bull street, Kay street, Ayrault street and Catharine street, in a continuous line, directly across Easton's Pond to the Middletown line—following the Middletown line to Coddington Cove, and along the shore of said cove to the line of the First Ward, and along the First Ward line to the point of beginning at Marlborough street and West Broadway.

The THIRD WARD shall comprise that portion of the city, including the docks and wharves, bounded northerly on the said First and Second Wards, and southerly on a line commencing at the centre of Kinsley wharf at the harbor, and running thence in an easterly direction along the centre of said wharf and the centre lines of Pelham, Spring, Mill, Beach and Buena Vista streets, continuously, and across Easton's Pond in a straight continuation of saidcentre of Buena Vista street, to the Middletown boundary line.

The FOURTH WARD shall comprise all that portion of the city, including the docks and wharves, bounded northerly on said Third Ward, and southerly and easterly by a line beginning at the centre of Lee's wharf at the harbor, and running easterly along the centre of said wharf and the centres of Young, Bowery, and East Bowery streets to the Annendale road, then northerly along the centre of Annendale road and Bath road, and easterly again along the centre of said Bath road to Easton's beach, and along the sea shore at said beach to the Middletown line; provided that said south line shall run northerly from the centre of Young street, and around the number seven engine house back to said centre of Young street, so as to include said engine house in the Fifth Ward.

The FIFTH WARD shall comprise all the remainder of the southern portion of the city lying south of the Fourth Ward aforesaid, including the docks and wharves.


