Toyama Plant has been planned in 1943 by the directive of government in order to produce special steel products for aircraft. But the institution was constructed merely small part on account of scarcity of materials etc. till the termination of war.

This building has become unnecessary after the termination of war. We think it will be decay if we let it alone. While the city of Toyama was seriously damaged by air raids and now their requirement for construction materials has increased. In these circumstances we wish to answer the proposition from Kokando Co., Ltd. who wants to remove it and reconstruct it as a medicine-manufacturing shop.

b) Reason of disposition

The subject is to dispose of a disused building of our Toyama liquidation plant. The plant in question was established as a special steel manufacturing factory for aircrafts in 1943. Although we started its construction by courtesy of the Government, the scarcity of building materials and other handicaps resulted very little progress realizing rather limited parts of the first plan till the end of the war. And the factory had been closed at the same time with the Japanese surrender, the whole plant became lost its function.

The building in question are two of those disused buildings, and in case of letting the building stand in present condition, they will be rotten away, which means the social loss.

It is regrettable to leave the buildings in such a condition while the people are crying for the shortage of building materials. In addition, the city of Toyama had an incendiary air-raid during the War, the citizens are still suffering for buildings since that time.

Mr. Kuro Sakai want to have the stated building for the residence of the war sufferers and repatriaters after removal of the building.

Mr. Zakichi Ikeda wants to have the stated building to use for the shop of manufacturing household medicine.

We hereby wish to dispose the buildings to those persons for the reasons above stated. Toyama district is deep snow fall district in Japan, therefore we solicit you for kind consideration be paid quickly for the removal be made before the winter comes.

1. Under provisions of Operational Directive Number 89 Hq Eighth Army, dated 20 November 1946, the stock-pile and installed material of the Fusco Metal Industries Ltd., Toyama Plant, No. 50 Mori, Toyama City have been registered.
2. The inclosed application for exemption for items of this registered material is submitted, by them, for the following reasons:
 - a. That due to heavy wind damage to buildings which housed a number of machines under reparational control (SCAFINs 1211 and 1263) on 2 April 1947, a part of the registered materials were used to repair these buildings.
 - b. That to be able to comply with SCAFIN 1219, subject: "Responsibilities of Imperial Japanese Government for Preservation and Care of Plants, Equipment and Records Taken into Custody for Reparation Purposes by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers", dated 20 September 1946, they used some registered material to repair reparational machines.
3. On 7 May 1947 a permit to repair buildings damaged by the wind storm of 2 April 1946 was issued by this office.
4. Paragraph 2, SCAFIN 1219, states: "Basically the necessary servicing and repair should be performed by competent mechanics associated with the particular plant and should use only materials, parts, etc., available within the plant or readily available elsewhere".
5. Paragraph 8d, Inclosure 1, to OD 89, Hq Eighth Army, dated 20 November 1946 states: "Removal of the item should not result in deterioration of machinery and equipment being stored in the building."
6. It is recommended by this office that these items be exempted from registration for the following reasons.

- a. The protection, care and preservation of reparational machinery located in this plant depends greatly on the use of this material.
- b. It would be uneconomical to remove the items listed for exemption.

7. An inspection of the Fuso Metal Industries Ltd., Toyama Plant revealed that items listed were being, and had been used, as stated in the inclosed applications.

as follows:

With regard to materials previously investigated and registered by the Japanese Contractors' Association (Nippon Kensetsu Kogyo Tosei Kumiai), an application for the exemption of some of them as is enclosed herewith was submitted by the Toyama Liquidation Office, Fuso Metal Industry Co., Ltd. No. 50, Mori Toyama City under the jurisdiction of our office.

We solicit you will kindly favour them with the exemption from registration, taking into consideration the peculiar circumstances as stated below.

1. The heavy blow attached here on April 2, 1947 caused severe damages of the building for the custody of reparations machineries and other constructions, as the result of which it became impossible to maintain the perfect custody and control of reparations machineries. Thus we were compelled to use the registered materials located within the plant for their repairs.

2. It is the real status today that no distribution is made of the repairing materials necessary to provide against an unforeseen calamity which may occur the reparations plant.

As explained above, those materials specified in an annexed application are absolutely necessary for perfecting the custody and control of the plant.

We shall be obliged very much to you if you will show your special kindness over the exemption from registration.

1. Under provisions of Operational Directive Number 89 Hq Eighth Army, dated 20 November 1946, the stock-pile and installed material of the Fuse Metal Industries Ltd., Toyama Plant, No. 50 Mori, Toyama City have been registered.

2. The inclosed application for exemption for items of this registered material is submitted, by them, for the following reasons:

- a. That due to heavy wind damage to buildings which housed a number of machines under reparational control (SCAPINs 1211 and 1208) on 2 April 1947, a part of the registered materials were used to repair these buildings.
- b. That to be able to comply with SCAPIN 1219, subject: "Responsibilities of Imperial Japanese Government for Preservation and Care of Plants, Equipment and Records Taken into Custody for Reparation Purposes by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers", dated 20 September 1946, they used some registered material to repair reparational machines.

3. On 7 May 1947 a permit to repair buildings damaged by the wind storm of 2 April 1946 was issued by this office.

4. Paragraph 2, SCAPIN 1219, states: "Basically the necessary servicing and repair should be performed by competent mechanics associated with the particular plant and should use only materials, parts, etc., available within the plant or readily available elsewhere".

5. Paragraph 6d, Inclosure 1, to OD 89, Hq Eighth Army, dated 20 November 1946 states: "Removal of the item should not result in deterioration of machinery and equipment being stored in the building."

6. It is recommended by this office that these items be exempted from registration for the following reasons.

1. Inspection was made on 20 May 1947 of the Toyama Manufacturing Works of the Fuse Metal Company, Ltd, relative to the accounting of funds received for sale of land and buildings, approved by several directives.

2. SCAPIN 2151-A approved 6 September 1946.

This directive, in part, approved the sale of land and building of the Toyama Manufacturing Works, located at Mori, Toyama Prefecture, to farmers and the Toyama Soy Union. Persons interviewed were Mr. Zukawa, manager of Toyama Plant, Mr. Sugaya, director from Osaka main office, Mr. Miyamoto, Liaison Department, Osaka Main Office, and Mr. Minami, Chief of Liaison Department, Tokyo office.

a. Land.

Sale of land approved by directive mentioned in paragraph (2), above, has not been carried out to date, due to compliance with Farm Land Readjustment Act which makes it difficult for the company to realize an adequate amount.

The company purchased the land, 463,000 tsubo, at ¥13.50 per tsubo and intended to, and received, approval to sell at an average of ¥10. per tsubo, thereby receiving ¥4,630,000. Under the Farm Land Readjustment Law, however, the company can receive no more than 4 yen per tsubo. Since this price will realize the company only forty (40) percent of expected income, it is now negotiating with the Toyama Prefectural office to have the price increased.

b. Buildings:

The buildings consisted of a smelting shop, warehouse, and dining hall which were to be sold to the Toyama Soy Union for ¥449,000. Since considerable time elapsed between date of application and date of approval, the Soy Union purchased buildings elsewhere. About this time the Toyama Plant of Nissan Chemical Company, had approval to purchase buildings, so the Fuse Metal Company on 10 October 1946 entered into a contract with Nissan Chemical Company to sell the smelting shop and dining hall. ¥440,000. was received on 21 October 1946 for the smelting shop and dining hall.

The Toyama Soy Union purchased the warehouse for ¥165,000. but resold it to a Mr. Isaku Matsumoto.

The plant, by courtesy of Japanese government, started its construction work as a special steel manufacturing plant in 1943, but the shortage of construction materials and other reasons prevented its progress, and at the end of the War, the work completed were rather limited against the plant. Then the plant closed at the termination of the War.

The building in question is a portion of the plant and is disused since the plant closed. It will go decay, in case of standing as it is.

In the city of Toyama, the people are feeling shortage of building materials since the city had been attacked by air-raid Maruyama Industry Co., Ltd. in Toyama, proposed us to buy our building stated, to build their dormitory with those materials.

3. SCAPIN 3341-A Approved 6 March 1947.

This was an approval for the sale of the Uotsu Plant to Mr. Eiji Oiwake for ¥1,140,000. Contract was entered into with Mr. Oiwake on 7 April 1946. The contract states that the deal will be void unless approved by GHQ.

First payment was received on 31 June 1946. The last payment was dated 28 March 1947. Purchaser took possession of the plant April 1947.

Company books, checked against subsidiary ledgers, transfer slips, and receipts, were in order.

4. SCAPIN 2221-A Approved 18 September 1946.

This was an approval for the sale of a machine shop located at Mori, Toyama Prefecture, to Toyama Branch of Nippon Hassoden for ¥525,000. Payment in full was received in two (2) installments on the fourth and sixteenth of October 1946. The building was removed on 31 October 1946. Company books were in order.

5. Informal application No. 2417/271 (FI/RC) approved 7 May 1947.

This informal application was for approval to sell buildings at the Toyama Plant for ¥381,000. Buildings consist of the following:

At the date of inspection the plant had not yet been notified that the application had been approved.

Payment for No. 2 warehouse was received in full in two (2) installments from Mr. Fukuda, the purchaser, on 18 January and 1 March 1947, respectively. Purchaser is not yet in possession of buildings.

6. Findings and Recommendations:

The company did not violate SCAP directives but some sort of precaution should be exercised to avoid repetition of such sales where a change of purchasers takes place between time of application and approval. In this case the alternate purchasers were not undesirable but in other instances they might be.

Industrial Company, Ltd.

1. Inspection was made on 21 May 1947 of the Shokawa Dyeing Works of the Daiken Industrial Company, Ltd, relative to the accounting of funds and progress of construction work against loans granted to this firm in the amount of ¥1,785,200. by SCAPIN 3498-A, approved 25 March 1947.

2. a. This directive approved application for permission to borrow ¥1,785,000. for improvements to the mill. Application requesting permission to borrow ¥200,000. for the purchase of eight (8) electric boilers was denied.

b. Persons interviewed were Mr. Ebara, plant manager, Mr. Takakura, chief engineer of the Shokawa Mill; and Mr. Kimura and Mr. Yamagiwa, liaison officers from the Tokyo office.

c. Construction of boiler rooms started in April and first payment on the project was paid on 10 April 1947. As of 19 May 1947, ¥132,000. has been expended and ¥645,000. obligated. The boiler room is seventy (70) percent complete and installment twenty (20) percent complete. Company officials stated that completion is expected by the end of June or the early part of July 1947. A separate account was set up for this project and all book entries were checked and substantiated by transfer slips and receipts. The boilers to be installed in the new boiler room were transported from the Oyodo Plant in Osaka, which was bombed.

d. After installation of the two (2) Babcock type and one (1) Lancashire type boilers, in addition to the present four (4) electric boilers, the mill can be operated efficiently at fifty (50) percent of capacity. At present, the mill is operating at about ten (10) to thirteen (13) percent of capacity, partially due to shortage of raw material. This mill suffered no war damage. This plant has three (3) Takuma type boilers which are idle at the present time. Two (2) are badly in need of repair and only one (1) is serviceable. In the past, two (2) of these boilers were used to operate this mill and the Kureha Plant, located across the street, and one was kept as a spare. One (1) Takuma boiler is sufficient to keep the Shokawa Mill operating at 100 percent capacity, but since these boilers require high calorie coal, which cannot be obtained at the present time, there is no alternative but to leave these boilers idle.

Industry Company, Ltd

1. Inspection was made on 21 May 1947 of the main office and Daiman Plant of the Kureha Industry Company, Ltd, relative to the accounting of funds and progress of construction work against loans granted to this company by a SCAP directive.

2. SCAPIN 3410-A, approved 13 March 1947. This directive approved application for permission to borrow ¥6,700,000. from the Industrial Bank of Japan, Ltd, and withdraw ¥151,266. from company's bank deposits for reconstruction of its Daiman Factory. Persons interviewed were Mr. Morita, president; Mr. Mori, managing director; and Mr. Ohshima, director.

a. The company has been unable to borrow approved loan from bank to date. It has been negotiating for an unsecured loan with the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, but the RFC has not given definite answer whether it will grant this loan or not.

b. From bank deposit withdrawal, company has expended ¥149,400. to date. This expenditure included purchase and installment of a magneto tester, fuel pump tester and plug tester. Outstanding obligations amount to ¥240,000. which includes three (3) machines which were purchased at a CPC auction held in Tokyo on 31 March 1947. In addition, the company has an agreement to purchase eight (8) machines at ¥473,800.

3. CCD report on the activities of Kureha Industry in the Toyama area.

It was found that Daiken Industry is renting part of the Kureha Mill of Kureha Industry on a pre-restriction agreement. The rented portion is separately enclosed and referred to as the Daiken Kureha Mill. But with the Daiken compound are machines designated for reparations and belonging to Kureha Industry. To avoid responsibility of guarding these machines, Daiken requested Kureha to remove them. Since Kureha has no storage space at this time, it is contemplating to build a warehouse, for which application was made to the Japanese Government on 20 March 1947.

4. Findings and recommendations:

No violation of SCAP directives was found at this plant. A physical check disclosed that this company has an immense plant which is seventy five (75) percent vacant. The spinning and weaving equipment was removed by the

Japanese Government during the war and the plant turned over to Mitsubishi Heavy Industry for airplane manufacture. The plant had just begun operations when the war terminated. Mitsubishi then removed all equipment and that is the present status of the plant.

This plant is industrially ideal because it is all under one roof. It is a modern factory design suitable for production which demands "assembly line" efficiency.

SUBJECT: Inspection and Surveillance Trip of Japan Soda Company,
Ltd

1. Inspection was made on 22 May 1947 of the Takaoka plant of the Japan Soda Company relative to accounting of funds received from sale of land and buildings as approved by seven (7) separate SCAP directives.
2. Persons interviewed were Mr. Kawamura, director; Mr. Oga, plant manager; and Mr. Moriwake, chief of liaison section, main office.
3. In each case of sale of property a lease agreement was first signed, permission applied for, then a sale contract signed. The money deposited with the company originally by each prospective purchaser was deposited in the bank and later applied to the purchase price.
4. It was pointed out to the company that such an arrangement is a violation of SCAP directives. A plausible explanation was offered by the company for this conduct.
 - a. During wartime the company manufactured aluminum at this plant and, to obtain sufficient help, dormitory space had to be provided. Consequently, dwellings outside the plant compound were purchased to house employees. Upon cessation of hostilities, the plant shut down to a point where only twenty (20) percent of the entire plant is now in operation. The release of employees vacated the houses outside the compound.
 - b. So that the vacant houses would not suffer destruction by heavy winter snows and at the hands of people seeking materials for house construction, the company would be obligated to employ a caretaker for each house. Instead of assuming the additional cost of maintenance, the company found a purchaser and allowed him to occupy the dwelling under a rental agreement until sale of the dwelling was approved by GHQ. The down payment of the rental, upon approval of purchases, automatically became a down payment on the purchase price.
 - c. Physical inspection of several of these houses, and destructive conditions referred to, was made and the conclusion reached that it was sound business practice to do as the company did. To employ a caretaker or leave these dwellings unoccupied would have appreciably devaluated the property. Officials were definitely warned that any such future action would be turned over to the Japanese Government, but no comment was made as to whether or not action will be taken on past instances.

5. Findings and recommendations:

a. In the operating portion of this plant the company is operating equipment scheduled for reparations and making sulphuric acid and caustic soda. In a portion of the non-operating part of the plant was found idle equipment suitable for manufacturing salt and others suitable for penicillin. Officials explained that an application for permission for penicillin manufacture was already pending at GHQ. The company had planned to manufacture its own salt with other idle equipment, but the adverse SCAP action made them abandon the plan. The officials were expressly warned that no construction or repair on either set of equipment should take place until officially approved by SCAP.

SUBJECT: Inspection and Surveillance Trip of Nissan Chemical
Company

1. Inspection was made 24 May 1947 of the Toyama Plant of Nissan Chemical Company relative to accounting of funds, reconstruction and expansion work against loans granted to this company by SCAPIN 2136-A, in the amount of ¥83,537,000.

Persons interviewed were Messrs. Kodama, plant manager, Hidaka, chief engineer, and Yasui, chief accountant.

2. SCAPIN 2136-A, approved 6 September 1946, amount ¥83,537,000. This directive approved borrowing of funds by company to reconstruct and enlarge the Toyama Ammonium Sulphate Plant.

a. Work on this project started in March 1946, which consisted of general preparation such as making concrete foundation and purchase of construction materials. First payment was made on 31 March 1946 for leveling ground. By 31 August 1946 company had expended ¥25,703,707. on this project. At the end of April 1947 company had expended ¥79,239,425.

b. Company expects to complete this project by October 1947, but in order to complete project, an additional ¥40,000,000. will be required, application for which has already been submitted to SCAP.

c. Upon completion of this project, the present production of ammonium sulphate which is 80,000 tons yearly, will be increased to 120,000 tons. The plant is presently operating at ninety (90) percent of capacity and it is estimated that the production for 1947 will approximate 100,000 tons.

d. The expansion program not only includes increased production of sulphuric acid and nitric acid but also provides for installment of a new coal belt conveyor, building of warehouse, etc.

e. Book entries were in order and substantiated by transfer slips and receipts.

3. The Toyama plant suffered no war damage and has about 1,900 employees and workers, who are working on three (3) shifts a day. The plant receives about ¥12,000,000. monthly from main office for operating and building expenses. At present the Toyama plant is operating at a loss due to the low price of ammonium sulphate.

4. Findings and Recommendations:

a. This plant of the Nissan Chemical Company is in the process of expansion. When it is completed it will be one of the largest and most efficient chemical plants in Japan. In granting permission for this company to expand this plant, it is very evident that the vague phraseology contained in the application was not sufficiently studied because of the "pressure" exerted by the Chemical Branch, Industry Division, to achieve its chemical fertilizer production program. Had more attention been given to actual work involved in the expansion of this Zaibatsu plant, in all probability it would not have been granted.

b. This plant, as well as other plants of this company, have violated SCAP directives in expending funds for construction before SCAP permission was granted. This violation will be referred to the Japanese Government.

1. In compliance with SCAPIN 1263 dated 11 October 1946 the Toyama Plant and the Uozu Plant of the Fuso Kinzoku Kogyo K.K., an affiliate of the Sumitomo Industrial Organization, were placed under reparational custody and control as aircraft factories.

2. Before the above company was officially placed under reparations all the machinery had been removed from the Uozu Plant, and assembled in the Toyama Plant. Subsequently the machinery of both plants were inventoried under one code number 42-18, and the land and buildings of the Uozu Plant were later removed from reparations under authority granted in Eighth Army letter directive dated 5 December 1946, subject: "Machinery Inventory of Fuso Kinzoku Kogyo K.K."

3. Inclosure #1 petitions for the exclusion of eighty-one (81) machines, originally in the Toyama Plant, on the grounds that the plant was not constructed as an aircraft plant and that the resultant product was a "raw material."

4. Evidence, however, shows that in July 1944, while the Toyama Plant was still under construction and before any machinery was brought into the factory, that word was received from the main plant at Osaka that in order to obtain sufficient materials for operation the Toyama Plant would have to start work on hollow steel propeller blades. Consequently after the machinery arrived, all the time was spent in experimenting with an forging the new type of propeller until the plant was forced to shut down as a result of bombing. No other type of work was ever attempted.

5. Inclosure #2 applies for the exemption of fifty-four (54) machines which were originally at the Uozu Plant. This plant was established in September 1944 as a dispersal plant of the parent plant at Osaka which has been recently removed from reparations. The work at the Uozu Plant consisted of manufacturing circular steel bars and yokes used in making

magnets for communication purposes and electrical equipment. Two kinds of steel bars were made. One type was for "H" magnets especially used in aircraft communication systems. The other type was for "L" magnets, which were used in the communication setups for steam-ships, for gauges and meters on locomotives, electrical equipment such as radios and electric motors, wattmeters, ammeters, pressure gauges, and testing meters. Approximately 15% of the steel bars produced were of the "H" type while the rest were of the "L" type.

6. In view of the above findings this office recommends the following:

- a. That the application for exemption of the eighty-one (81) machines of the Toyama Plant be denied since evidence shows that the plant was especially set-up to fabricate semi-finished parts especially designed for incorporation in finished aircraft.
- b. That consideration be given by higher headquarters for the exclusion of the fifty-four (54) machines of the Uozu Plant because the plant was neither constructed for nor was principally engaged in producing especially designed components or accessories for incorporation in finished aircraft.

1. This headquarters concurs with the recommendation contained in paragraph 6, basic communication.

2. The Toyama Plant of Fuso Kinzoku Kogyo K.K. was organized especially for production of semi-finished aircraft parts and meets the criteria for selection of aircraft plants for reparations, as set forth in Section III, Operational Directive No. 5/5, Headquarters Eighth Army, dated 24 September 1946.

3. The Uozu Plant was established as a dispersal plant of the Fuso Kinzoku Kogyo K.K. Steel Works, located at 249 Shimayacho, Konohana-ku, Osaka. The parent factory has a pre-war history as a producer of steel castings and forgings, both for civilian and military purposes. Before and during the war the company produced guns, shells, torpedo and aircraft parts. In letter, Osaka Military Government Team, subject: "Inclusion of Fuso Metal Industry Co., Ltd., Steel Works, on List Appended to Operational Directive No. 5/2," dated 25 July 1946, the Osaka Military Government Team recommended that the parent company be included on the list of reparations selections. In 2nd indorsement to this letter, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to Commanding General, Eighth Army, dated 5 October 1946, the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers rejected this recommendation on basis that subject plant "is one of the old electric steel producers in Japan and represents seven and one-half (7½) percent of the total steel production. In view of the current steel shortage, the plant will not be included on the list of plants available for reparations removal at this time." The parent company has not been added to any reparations list subsequent to this correspondence.

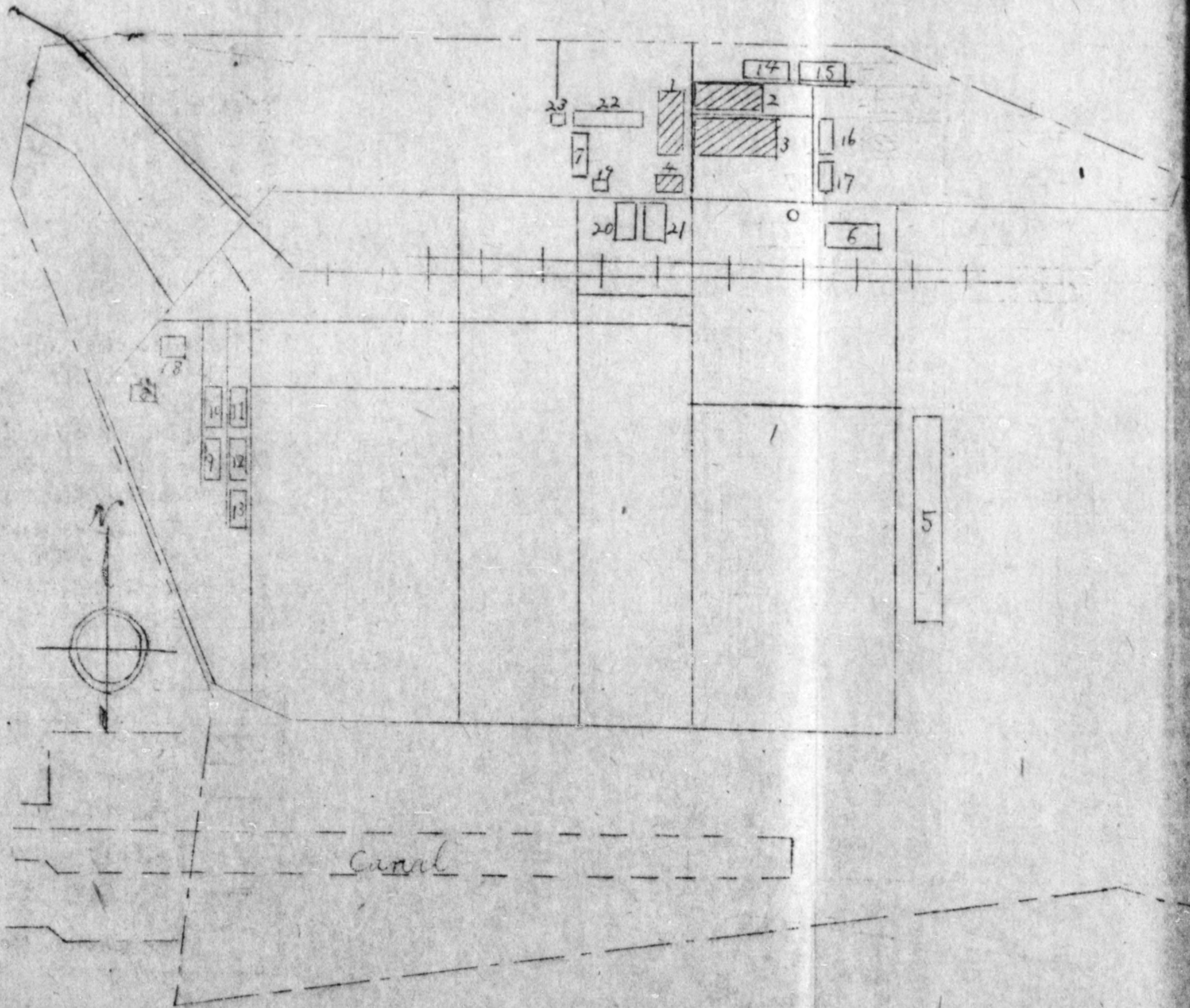

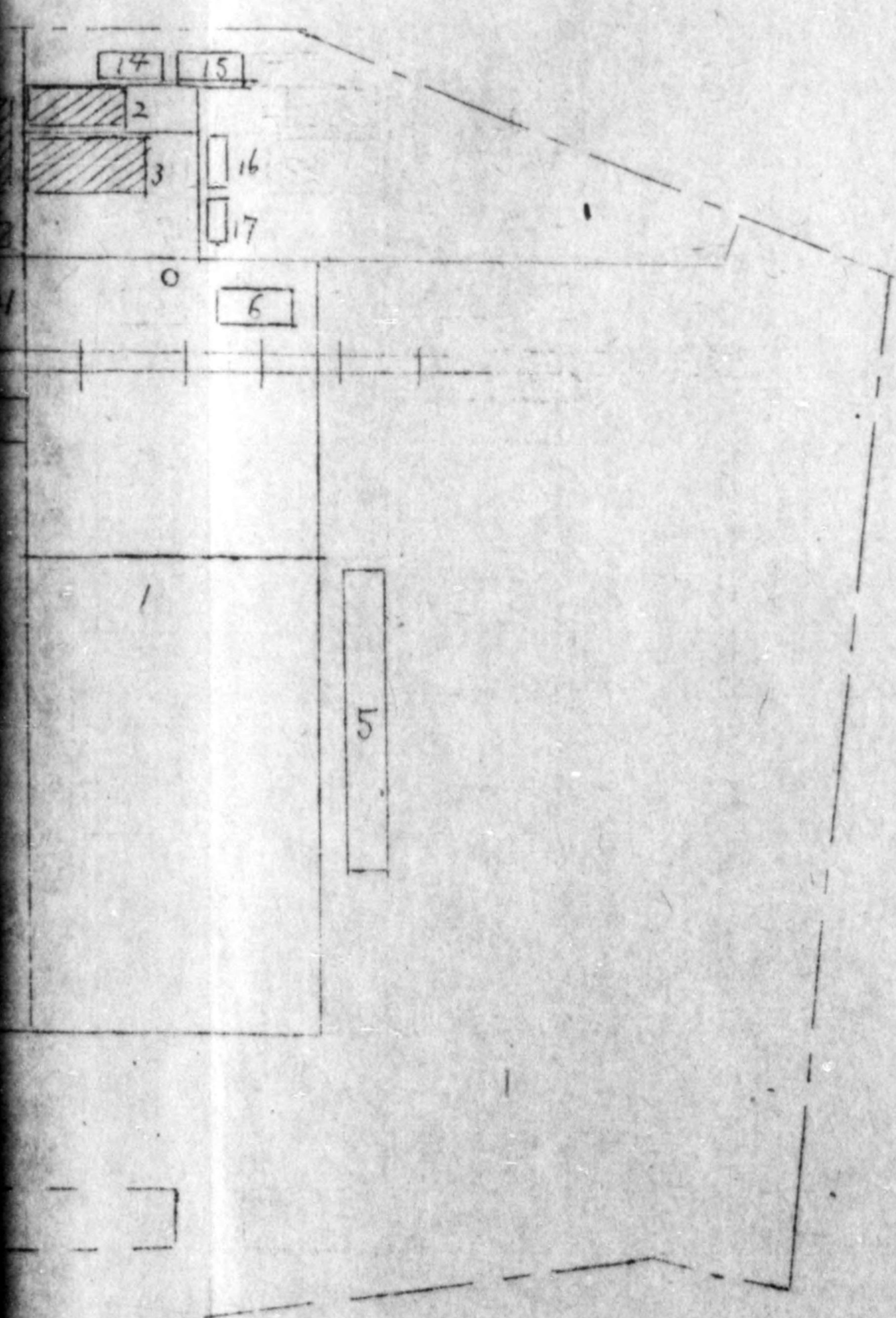

We shall be much appreciated if you would kindly pay your special attention on the above, and except the above factory from reparation purposes.

1. Gist of Uozu Branch Work.

This factory was established in Sept., 1944, for the purpose of making up the shortage of natural magnet steel of Osaka Steel Works of the same firm.

In carrying out the work this firm purchased the Okazaki Textile works, which had been established by gathering the factories in accordance with Enterprise Curtailment Law. This being the case, we sincerely wish that you would kindly except the 54 machinery (49 tool machines 5 others) from the reparation list.

All 54 machinery are under custody of Toyama Factory.

When the machinery was excepted from the reparation list, the machinery is going to be removed to Osaka Steel Factory, and there they are going to produce natural magnet steel, which is badly needed by the market in making radio-metres and other pre-war civilian rehabilitation essentials, and thus the firm intend to deserve for the rehabilitation of Japanese economy.

(a) Demand for magnet by the metre and radio makers is extremely large as a civilian commodity for reconstruction after the termination of war. Therefore we want to remove these machines for working up to magnet, which belongs to Joze branch (at present these machines are removed to and kept in Toyama plant in order to maintain good condition) to Steel Works in Osaka and contribute to reconstruction of economy by increasing of his manufacturing ability for magnet.

(b) This branch was engaged only in machining magnet in the war time as we had already described.

This machining magnet is sent to the factory for meter or to the factory for radio. At these factories the magnet which we sent is worked up by machines and comes to a finished one. Accordingly, our magnet is, indeed, only raw material and not finished one.

From this view point this branch is not factory for aircraft, but one for raw material.

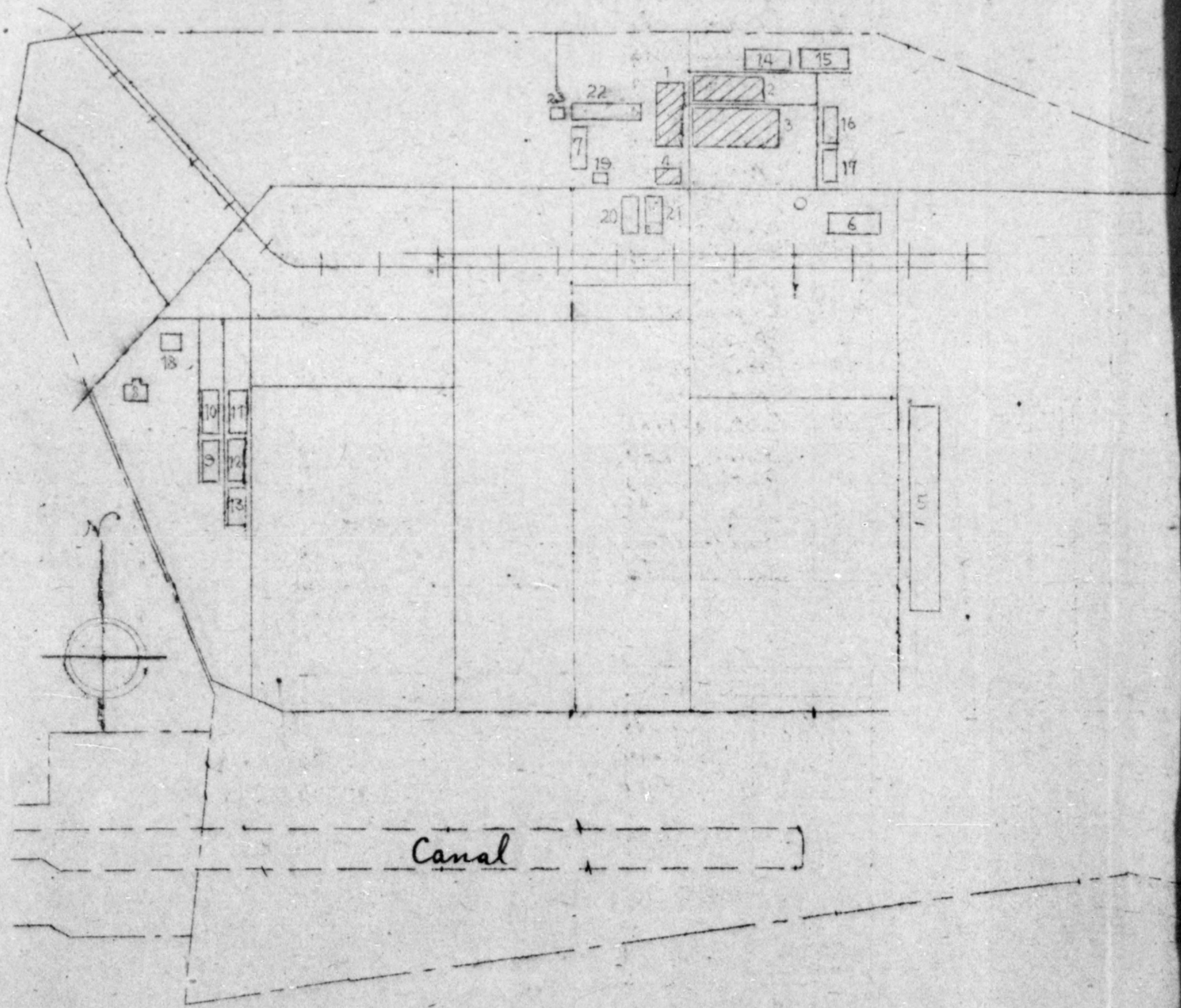

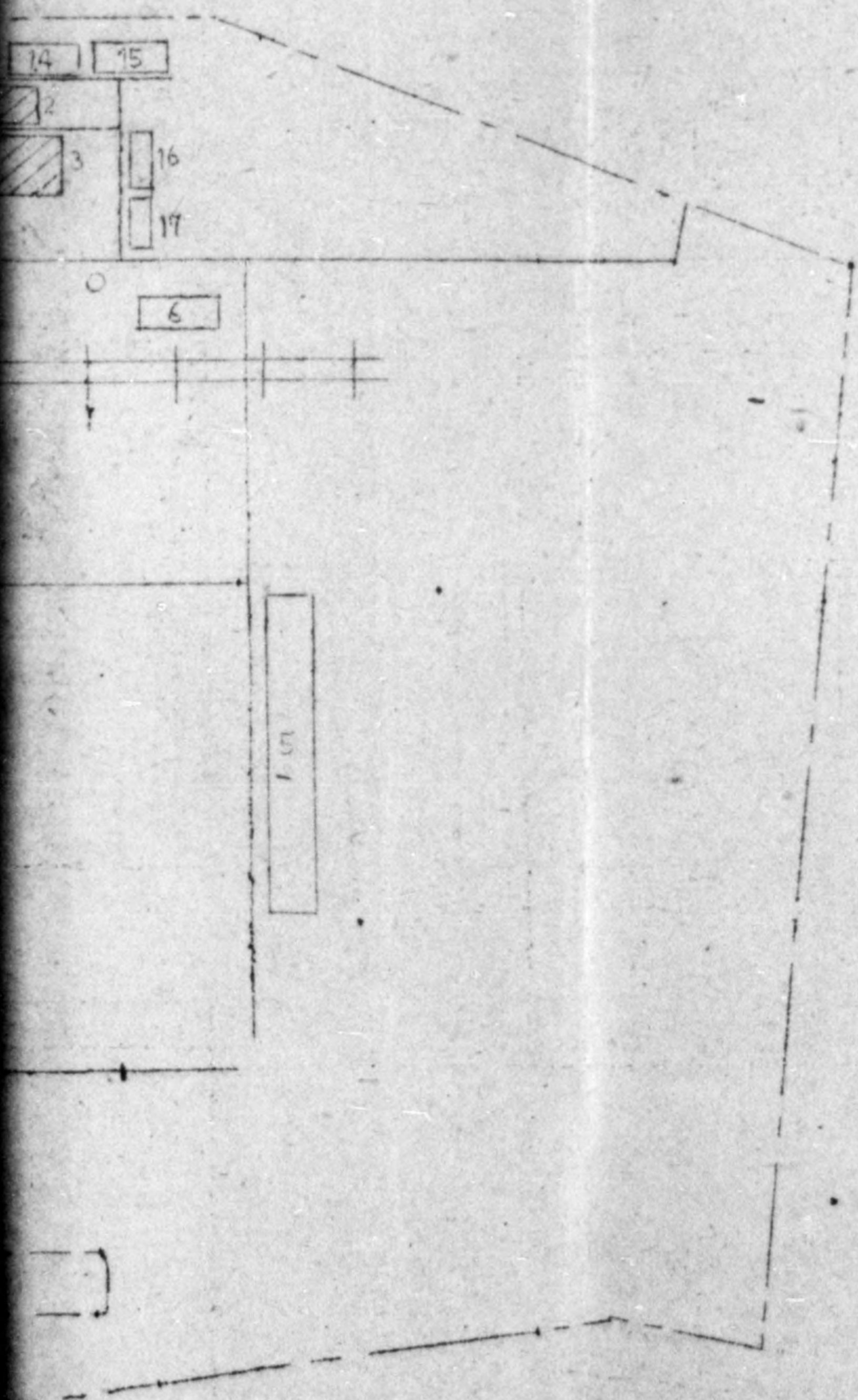

3. SCAPIN-1263 listed separately the Uozu Kojo as well as the Toyama Kojo as being under reparations.
