1. Attention invited to basic communication and twenty inclosures pertaining to ¥114,480.00 confiscated by judgments of Provost Court #1, Osaka, Honshu. The disposition of said confiscated yen has been the subject of discussions between this headquarters and the Provost Court authorities. The discussions have been based upon the interpretation of paragraphs 54, GHQ SCAP Circular 8, 1949 and paragraphs 2 and 8 of GHQ SCAP Circular 23, 1948.

2. This headquarters interprets the two cited references to mean that all currency, when confiscation is decreed, should be reported to the Contraband Property Administrator, and any other property, only when so requested by the Contraband Property Administrator. The Provost Court interprets the term "property" in paragraph 54a to include currency.

3. Request clarification in order that proper disposition may be made of subject yen.

To comply with request contained in paragraph 3 of 1st Ind. this headquarters forwarded the entire communication to Legal Section, GHQ SCAP, for clarification. Legal Section's opinion is as follows.

"1. Reference letter, 1 May 1950, from 25th Inf Div Provost Court #1 to Kinki Civil Affairs Region and 1st Indorsement thereto from Kinki Civil Affairs Region to Chief, CAS, 15 May 1950.

2. Subject yen should be disposed of as provided for in para. 53c, SCAP, CIR. 8, 31 March 1949.

3. The conclusion in para 2 above is based on an analysis of the

Ltr, Hq 25th Inf Div, subj: "Confiscated Property," dtd 1 May 50) cont'd)

following pertinent provisions of SCAP Cir. 23, 1948, and SCAP Cir. 8, 1949:

a. Para 53c, SCAP Cir. 8, provides that fines and other moneys collected by occupation courts should be forwarded to GHQ SCAP, Funding Officer. This provision is based upon Far Eastern Commission Policy Decision, 7 Aug 1947, which provides that any fines imposed or other sums collected pursuant to (occupation court) orders should be entered in a separate account and be used to defray the costs of the Allied Occupation.

b. Para 54a SCAP Cir. 8, 1949, provides that 'property which has been confiscated by the Court' for violation of Japanese law will be reported to MG teams for disposition to Japanese Government.

c. Para 54b, SCAP Cir. 8, provides that 'property, including currency, which is confiscated by a Contraband Tribunal or requested by a Contraband Administrator will be delivered to such administrator for disposition as provided in SCAP Cir 23, 7 July 1948.

d. SCAP Cir. 23, 1948, provides that currency confiscated by an Occupation Court should be delivered to the appropriate Contraband Administrator (para 3, Incl 1 to Cir 23), who should transfer such funds to the Fiscal Director, GHQ, now Comptroller, (para 6, Cir.23)

4. It will be noted that if para 53c of SCAP Cir. 8 pertains to currency which has been confiscated by an Occupation Court as it obviously does, then of necessity, para 54a must pertain to property other than currency which is confiscated by an Occupation Court. This is borne out by the fact that para 54b of SCAP Cir 8 pertains to property and currency which has not been confiscated by an Occupation Court. Consequently, the use of the word 'property' in para 54a did not contemplate the inclusion of currency and should not be so interpreted. Further, since para 53c, SCAP Cir. 23, 1948, cited in 3d above, should not be interpreted so as to arrive at a result inconsistent with para 53c.

5. It was never intended that fines or 'other sums collected' by an Occupation Court should be disposed of other than as provided for in para 53c.

6. In conclusion, it is the view of LS that:

a. The subject yen should be disposed of as provided in para 53c, SCAP Cir. 8.

b. The word "property" in para 54 does not include currency."

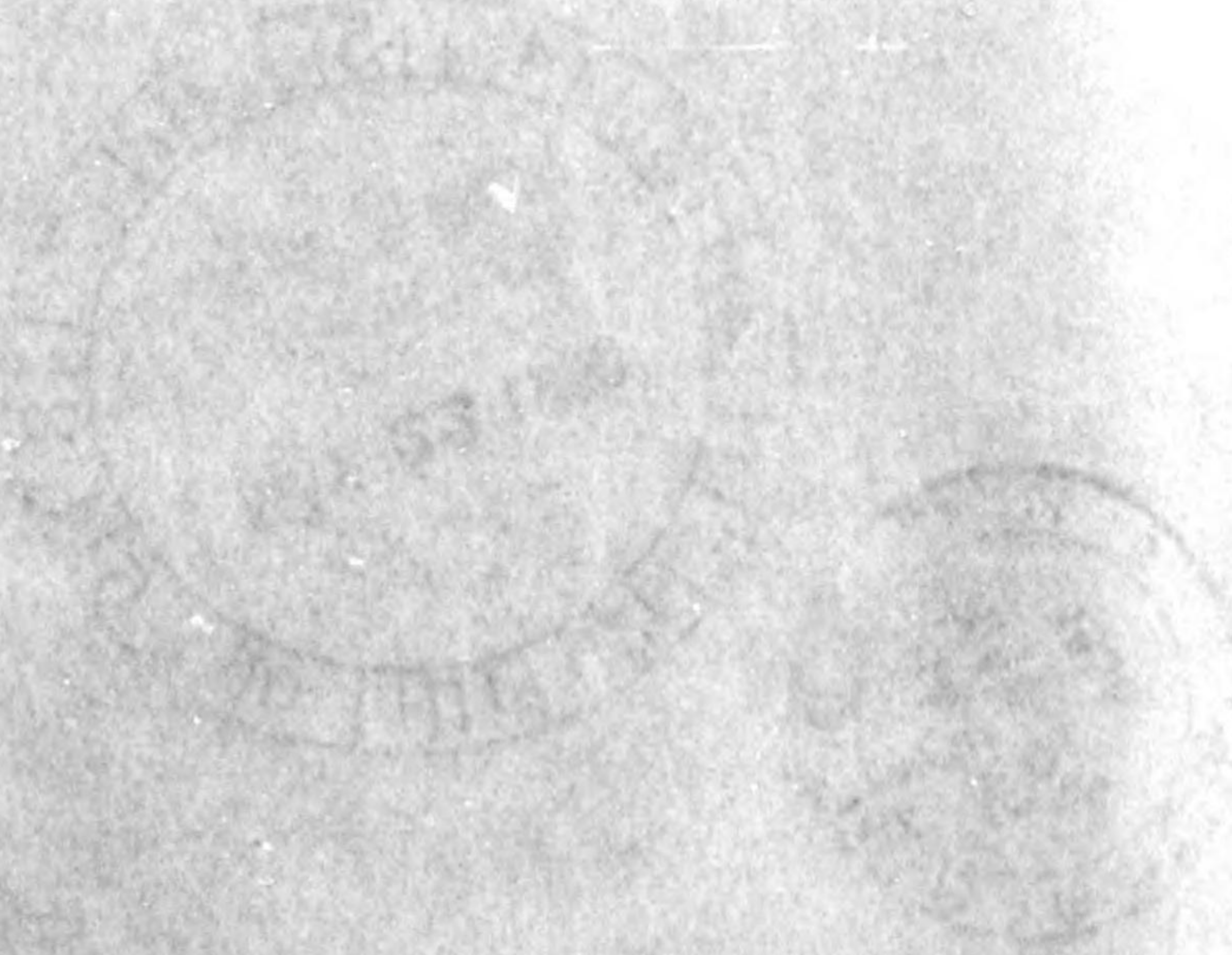

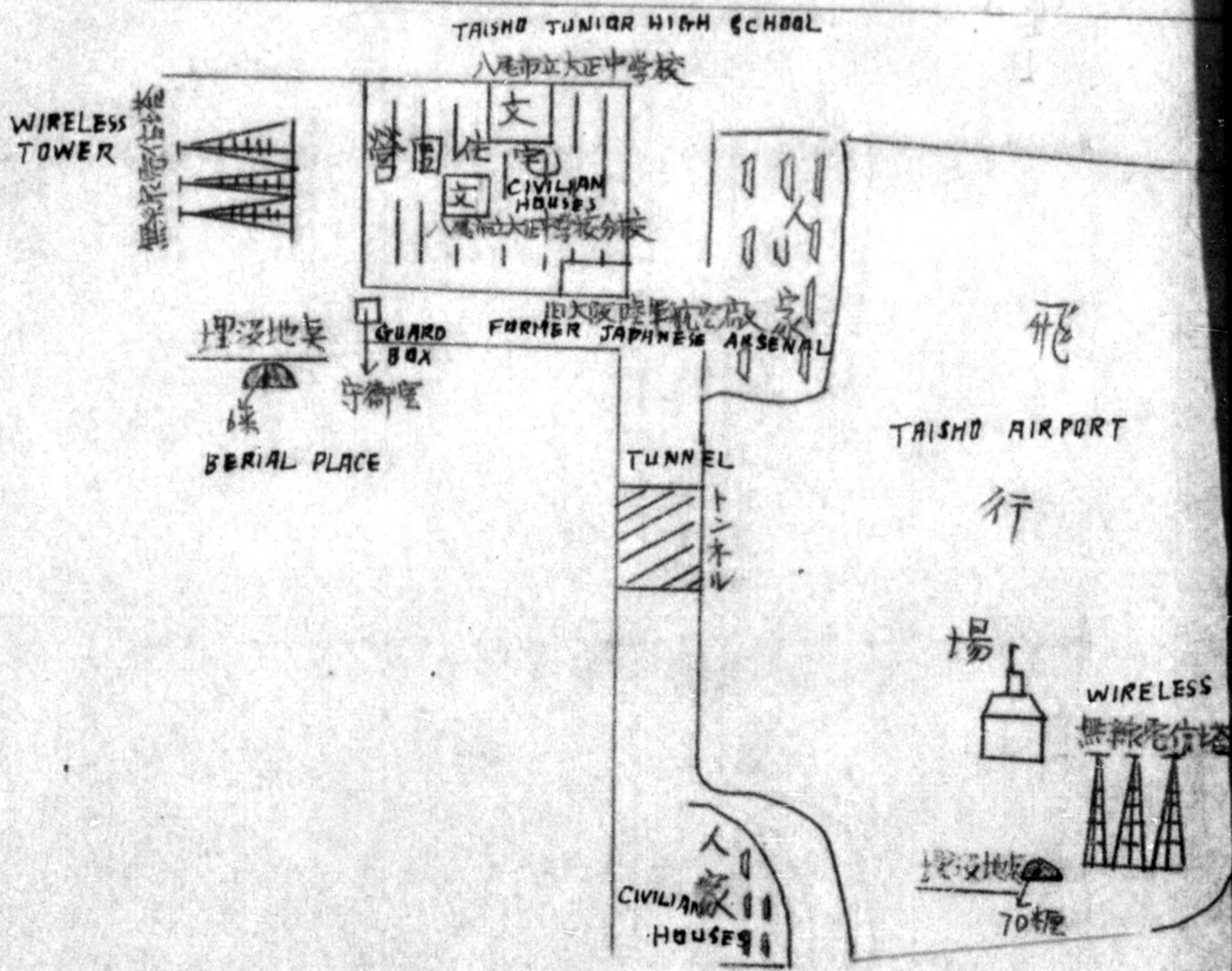

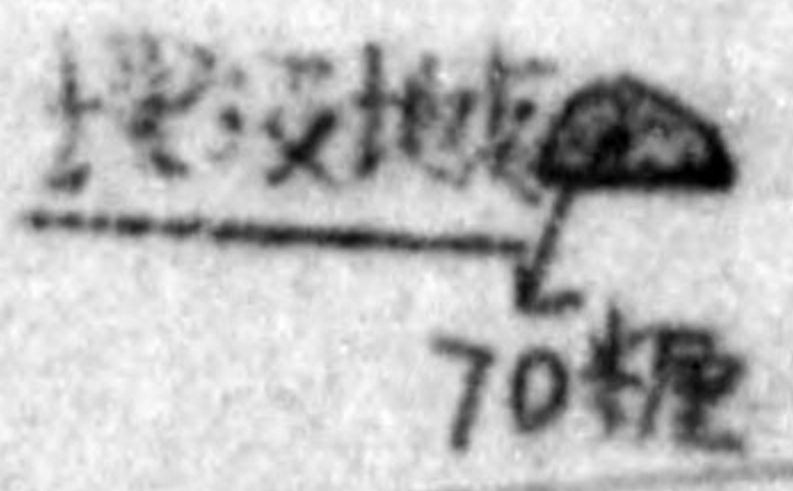

1. Reference is made to SR 35-520-1, AFR 173-25, 26 May 1949. Paragraph 4 of these regulations requires all disbursing officers to confiscate any counterfeit United States Currency (or Military Payment Certificates) presented for exchange, give receipt for same and attempt to secure information regarding the source of such counterfeit currency.

2. Effective this date, pending revision of Circular 19, General Headquarters, Far East Command, 1949, all United States Occupation Force Personnel, military and civilian, in the Far East Command, whose employment entails the receipt, disbursement or handling of Military Payment Certificates will confiscate any counterfeit United States Currency or Military Payment Certificates, which are presented for exchange, tendered as payments or otherwise come into their possession. A receipt will be given for the counterfeit currency and an attempt made to secure information concerning the source of such counterfeit currency and any information obtained regarding its source will be transmitted at once to the nearest Provost Marshal for further investigation by the appropriate Army Criminal Investigation Division or Air Force Office of Special Investigations Unit and report in accordance with referenced regulations, paragraph 1, above, and Far East Command directives.

3. Indigenous personnel employed in positions to accept payments in United States Currency, to include Military Payment Certificates, will be instructed to call their immediate supervisor upon discovery of any counterfeit or presumed counterfeit currency and further action will then be taken by the supervisor in accordance with paragraph 2, above.
