Choice Seed Novelties.

It gives us pleasure to present the following list of choice seeds, several now offered for the first time. All are perennial unless otherwise stated.

Aplopappus Fremonti. Dwarf plant, smooth foliage and rather large star-like yellow flowers for a long

period. Trade pkt., 25 cents.

Astragalus pictus. Bird's Egg Plant. Foliage linear and upright, having the appearance of slender leafless stems, among which are clusters of beautifully mottled, inflated pods, as large as bird's eggs, and which they strongly resemble. Seed per ½ oz., \$1.00; per Tr. pkt., 25 cents.

Cacalia tuberosa. Indian Plantain. A robust plant three feet tall, producing one to several ample cymelike panicles of tassel-shaped white flowers. The panicles are often two feet broad and remain in bloom a long time. Per ½ oz., 50 cents; pkt., 25 cents.

Cucurbita perennis. A trailing hardy perennial with triangular, grayish-green leaves, yellow flowers and yellow striped melon-shaped fruit two to three inches in diameter. Very curious. Sandy soil. 1/4 oz., \$1.00; per pkt., 25 cents.

Delphinium bicolor. A very early dwarf sort, blooming in April, only one foot tall, flowers deep blue and freely produced. Per ½ oz., \$1.00; per pkt., 25 cents.

Erigeron caespitosus. Six inches tall, flowers large, pure white, stems clustered at the root, very fine new sort. Seed per ½ oz., 75 cents; per pkt., 25 cents.

Gaillardia pinnatifida. A very rare sort from Southern Colorado, producing beautiful miniature flowers similar to G. grandiflora; a great acquisition. Per pkt., 50 cents.

Gentiana frigida. New, flowers white, speckled and dotted with blue, very large, plant six inches tall.

Trade packet, 50 cents.

Gentiana serrata. Western Frigid G. Flowers large, bright blue, beautifully fringed, plant six inches tall, annual. Trade packet, 50 cents.

Gilia pungens. One of the few perennial species, very dwarf, with evergreen mossy foliage, thickly set in spring and summer with star-like pearly white flowers. We believe this to be entirely new to cultivation and we predict a wide popularity. Fine seed per ½ oz., \$1.50; per trade pkt., 25 cents.

Gilia pinnatifida. Annual, pale purple flowers for a

long period. Seed 25 cents per pkt.

Gilia aggregata alba. A very beautiful biennial with an abundance of long tubular star-shaped white flowers; rare. Seed \$4.00 per 02, 25 cents per pkt.

Gymnolomia multiflora. Multitudes of yellow radiate flowers on wiry stems and will bloom first season. 25

cents per pkt.

Hymenantherum aureum. A small pleasant-scented annual with an abundance of radiate yellow flowers. Grows only five inches tall and is very compact and free flowering so that when used as an edging plant it makes a "solid gold" border. Trade packet 35 cents, three for \$1.00.

Lathyrus polymorphus. A very rare species with large showy purple and white flowers; grows one foot

tall. Small pkts. 25 cents.

Lepachys puicherrima hybrida. An improved strain having very large flowers and broad rays, the colors ranging from orange through yellowish brown to deep maroon; some flowers self-colored while others are beautifully striped and mottled. Hardy perennial but blooms first year from seed, continuing to bloom from early summer till frost. ½ oz., 75 cents, per trade pkt. 25 cents.

Melampodium cinereum. An entirely new Composite, six inches tall, producing continuously medium-sized flowers, with broad crystal-white rays and yellow cen-

ters; neat and desirable. Pkt.. 50 cents.

Pectis angustifolia. Small annual Composite, with a strong yet delightful lemon fragrance from the foliage as well as from the numerous small vellow flowers. Dwarf and compact, excellent for edgings. Packet, 50 cents.

Pentstemon albus. A new rather low white flowered species from the Platte river valley. 1/8 oz., 50 cents; pkt., 25 cents.

Polemonium foliosissimum. A robust new sort distinct and desirable. Per oz., \$3.00; packet 25 cents.

Polemonium confertum. Magnificent sort with large deep blue flowers and very rare. 1/8 oz. \$1.00; pkt., 25 cents.

P. confertum var. mellitum. A variety of the last with white or straw-colored flowers, larger grower. 1/2 oz., \$1.00; per pkt., 25 cents.

Polemonium humile. Small plant, pale blue flowers, distinct. 1/2 oz., \$1.00; pkt., 25 cents.

Valeriana septentrionalis. A very showy, early, white-flowered species, easily grown and desirable. Trade packet, 50 cents.

Zinnia grandiflora. A beautiful perennial Composite, six inches tall, flowers exceedingly abundant, rays four, broad, bright yellow, changing to white, blooms a long time. Per packet, 50 cents.
