



First-Mr. Swan begins his article

with the following statement: 'We are all resigned to have Manhattan built up solidly with tenements—that is something we regretfully accepted as inevitable years ago. And no doubt he would everywhere be regarded as a hopelessly hopeful individual who for a moment thought that the greater part of the Bronx, two-thirds of Brooklyn and large tracts in Queens could be reserved for anything else but tenements in any zoning scheme adopted

Second-The "zoning" ordinance of New York appears to be essentially "building" ordinance limiting the height of buildings, restricting their bulk and regulating the size of courts and yards, "but," says Mr. Swan, "if a building conforms to these provisions it may house as many families as the builder can crowd within its four walls."

Third-Mr. Swan closes his article with a plea to limit "the number of families that may be housed on a given unit of land"-for what purpose? To save owners of outlying vacant lots from bankruptcy! A real estate proposition!
