Subject: House Guests in Japan Who Travel Space Available

- 1. G-1 (Maj Groves) hand carried 24 Apr 50 proposed C/N to C of S and message to DA subject as above, to G-4 requesting formal concurrence. Proposed message to DA cites shipping conditions in FEC re shortage of spaces from Japan to ZI during summer months and requests DA secure CINCFE approval prior to granting SA travel authority from ZI to Japan.
- 2. At present DA is processing SA transportation requests by Stateside individuals by use of one of the following two procedures:
- a. Publishing travel orders granting SA travel and then requesting entry clearance from CINCFE, thus precluding any control by CINCFE.
- b. Requesting CINCFE entry clearance without indicating approximate periods and then publishing SA travel orders, thus precluding knowledge by CINCFE of date transportation will be required.
- 3. Trans O concurs in proposed message (Tab A), but submits a recommended revision (Tab B) of G-1's message. G-1 (Maj Groves) advises that Trans O revision will be presented to G-1. The proposed revision constitutes only a regrouping, and from a G-4 standpoint permits approval of either Tab A or Tab B, thus leaving G-1 the choice of message to be submitted.
 - 4. Recommend G-4 concurrence by initialing opposite G-4 on C/N 1.
 - 5. This proposes new FEC policy.
 - 6. Completes action on G-4 JN 4770.

Subject: IG Investigation of Diversion From Air to Water Transportation

- 1. Reference your note. Please contact G-1 reaction on question of airlift.
- 2. The travel of OCS students and bowling teams is official travel whereas emergency leave travel is personal in nature. G-1 (Lt Col Cook) concurs in this opinion. Normally, students and teams travel after emergency leave personnel; however at the time the diversion was made both students and teams had deadlines to meet. This headquarters attempts to arrange travel of OCS students and sports teams so as to preclude their travel interfering with that of emergency leave personnel, since it is recognized the individual on emergency leave has difficulty understanding how any travel is of more importance than his own.
- 3. When the emergency leave personnel were diverted to surface transportation a backlog had accumulated which was greater than foreseeable space capabilities and a diversion of lower priority personnel was necessary. Had no diversion been made the travel period via air before reaching destination would have been greater than was experienced through use of surface transportation.



Maj Groves from Capt Carlisle

Subj 53: Following is list of IG complaints of personnel arriving SEPE from FEC: passed for your info and pass to Unit concerned for corrective action.

l. The USNS AINSWORTH arrived at SEPE for debarkation of personnel from FEC. At that time, the individulas listed complained that they were on emergency leave orders and had air priority to return to the US. While at Camp Cole, their air priority was disregarded and they were returned to the US via surface transportation which resulted in undue delay. It was further stated, in their opinion, there was sufficient air transportation available to have them return to the US by air. They stated that students returning to the US to OCS were given air travel and there was sufficient air transportation for bowling teams and other reasons which, in their opinion, was not as important as their emergency leave.

These 40 men were only a part of the EM on emergency lv but the others wouldn't give their names. There were 42 or 45 total).

- 2. Capt Donald A. Travis contacted IG on arrival of USNS AINSWORTH, 12 April 1950. Complained that he and wife were assigned to stateroom C-lh3 which had no toiled facilities. His wife suffers from kidney trouble and the lack of toilet facilities was a hardship. Besides, the room was near machinery and his wife was unable to sleep. Furthermore, the port in Yokohama had not notified him of sailing date he accidentally learned of date at a party. Capt Travis stated he had been assigned to G-h GHQ and inferred that he had been requested to report on QM General on voyage and would include this in his report. Capt Travis had not approached the CO, Military Pept re reassignment of quarters.
- 3. It Col Alfred Prahinski complained that he did not receive proper berthing on the USNS AINSWORTH and it is his opinion that berthing on the AINSWORTH is not handled impartially and there must have been favoritism shown. In addition, he submitted following statement: "The undersigned has been under the impression that cabins aboard army transports are assigned according to rank or grade. This impression was formed as a consequence of 8 months duty with the Transportation Section at MARBO, Guam, followed by 18 months duty with the Civilian Personnel section at the same Hq. Both assignments required knowledge of policy regarding securing space and berthing on army transports. Apparently accepted policy of berthing passengers according to rank and trade has not been followed on voyage No. 2 of the USNS AINSWORTH. Of the 4 1t cols on the passenger list, 3 were assigned cabins on "B" deck, one of them, Lt Col Smith, was assigned 2 "B" deck cabins to a ccommodate his family. Mrs. Prahánski and myself were assigned to No. 102, an inside cabin on "C" deck, one of the 6 cabins on the AINSWORTH without a porthole. The passenger list indicated that majors and capts were assigned cabins on "B" deck. Company grade officers and NCO's were assigned cabins on "B" deck while a field grade officer, Major Breese, was placed in a "C" deck cabin with 2 other officers. separated from his wife who was assigned to a cabin with 2 women passengers. The passenger list further reveals that capts and lts were berthed on "E" deck. Attached are copies of the passenger list made available at the beginning of the voyage and after the ship had gotten under way. Since either discrimination

or carelessness is responsible for a situation in which one lt col is given 2 cabins on "B" deck while another is given one of the most undesirable cabins on "C" deck, in which a field grade officer is unnecessarily separated from his wife, and in which company grade officers are given berths less desirable than those assigned to NCO's, I wish to make this letter a formal complaint in the hope that cognizance will be taken of this discrepancy and that in the future, officers returning to the ZI will be accorded a more equitable assignment of cabin space."

These were passed to us by the IG, SEPE for your info and action.

Restrictions such as loss of oversea differential in pay for officers, relative high cost of ocean trans because of distances involved, extended separation periods for officer and enlisted families in FEC due to shortage of dep qtrs along with this new restriction, continue the diminishing desirability of serv in FEC and tend to increase rgsts for separation fm serv fm highly qualified officer, enlisted and civ pers.





Transportation officer, GHQ, submits two proposals (ref Incl 1 with Tabs A. B and C) as follows:

- a. A directive to CG Eighth Army requesting the following:
 - That Japanese owned and operated ferryboats be placed "Off Limits" to all Allied personnel.
 - That an inspection be made of certain Japanese owned and operated ferryboats to determine what deficiencies exist and what will be required to bring them up to reasonable standards using U.S. Coast Guard standards as a criteria.
- b. Another directive to CG Righth Army requesting an order be published proposing the following:
 - That Allied passengers traveling in railroad passenger cars transported on ferryboats will proceed immediately to the passenger space assigned on ferryboats as soon as the railroad car has been secured.
 - 2. With reference to proposals contained in para la above:
- a. Occupation force personnel are using Japanese owned and operated ferryboats for transportation for both duty and leave travel. These ferryboats are generally maintained at comparable safety standards as are required for U.S. shipping in comparable passenger service.
- b. Since the beginning of the Occupation of Japan, Allied personnel have taken a calculated risk in traveling aboard these ferryboats without reported less of life. Prohibiting the use of these by this personnel will result in a loss to the Japanese Economy.

With G-2 Public Safety Division Guidance, the Japanese Maritime Safety Agency is currently conducting scheduled inspections of these vessels for the purpose of maintaining standards required by Japanese Ship Safety Laws. The above cited agency is considered to be the proper agency qualified to perform desired inspections and require ferryboat owners to maintain desired standards.

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
