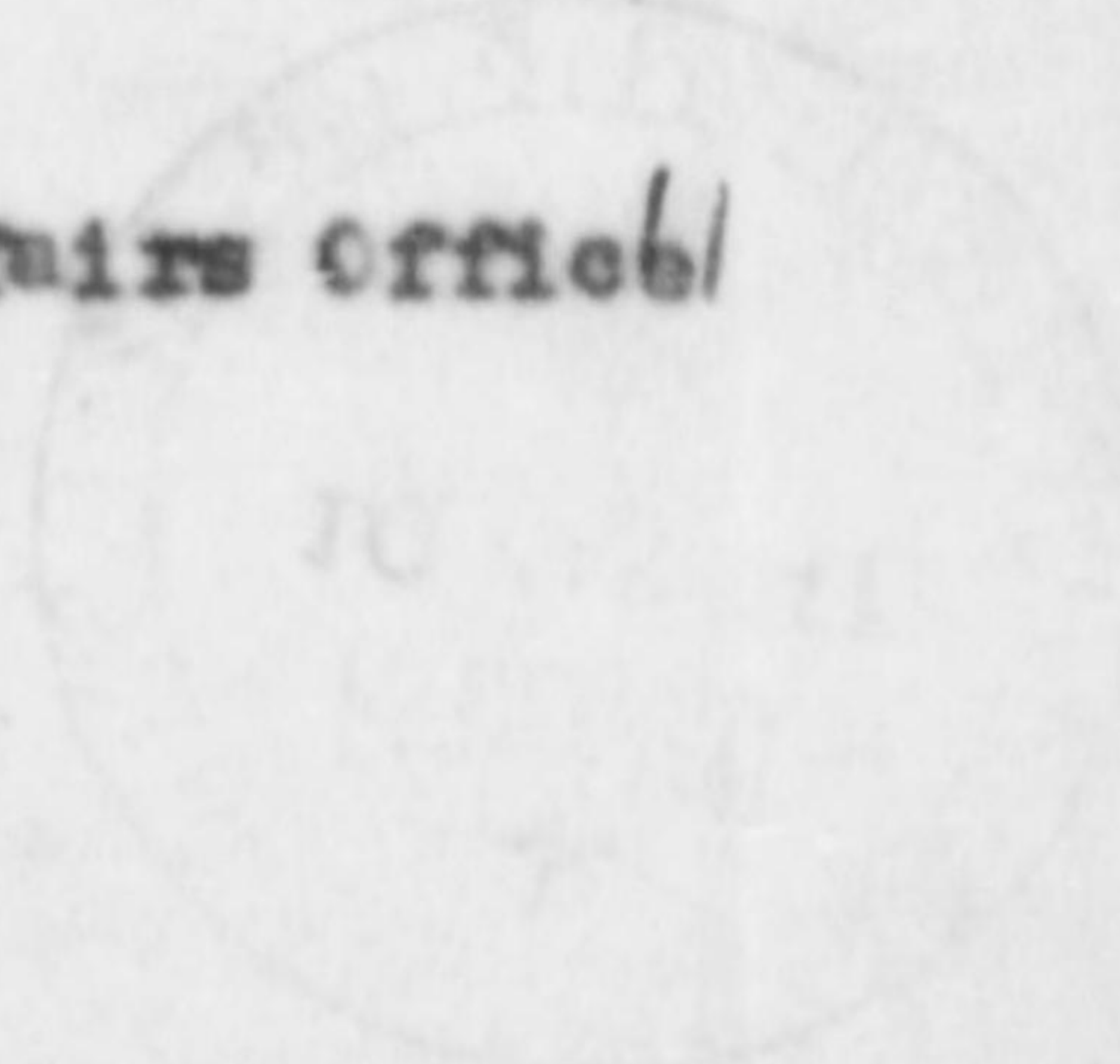
SUBJECT : Permission for 11 Chinese to Return to Formosa  
MEMORANDUM FOR: GHA, Supreme Commander for Allied Powers  
THROUGH : Foreign Liaison, G-2 Section

1. Permission is requested for eleven Chinese to return to Formosa by Japanese vessels. Names of the individuals are given in the inclosed list.
2. It is realized that these individuals have forfeited their rights to be repatriated at the expense of the Japanese Government. However, as they are desired to return to Formosa to work for the Chinese government, it will be most appreciated if accomodation is kindly given them aboard such vessels as may be sailing for Formosa in the near future.
3. In case such permission is given the individuals will be instructed to go to the port of embarkation at their own expense.
4. It is understood that the s.s. Haiyuga Maru (日向丸) will sail for Formosa from Hsibawura around the middle of the month and the s.s. Samarang Maru will leave Moji for Formosa on or about March 20.
5. Favorable consideration of the present request will be highly appreciated.

1. Reference is made to Chinese Mission memorandum (Ref. 0259/ST) of 3 March 1947 requesting ATC transportation from Tokyo to Shanghai for General Chu, Chief of this Mission.

2. We have just learned from the Diplomatic Section of General Headquarters that a U. S. ship, Admiral Hughs, will be in Tokyo on 7 March 1947. On Doctor's advice General Chu would prefer to travelling by water transportation if it could be arranged before the 10th of March. 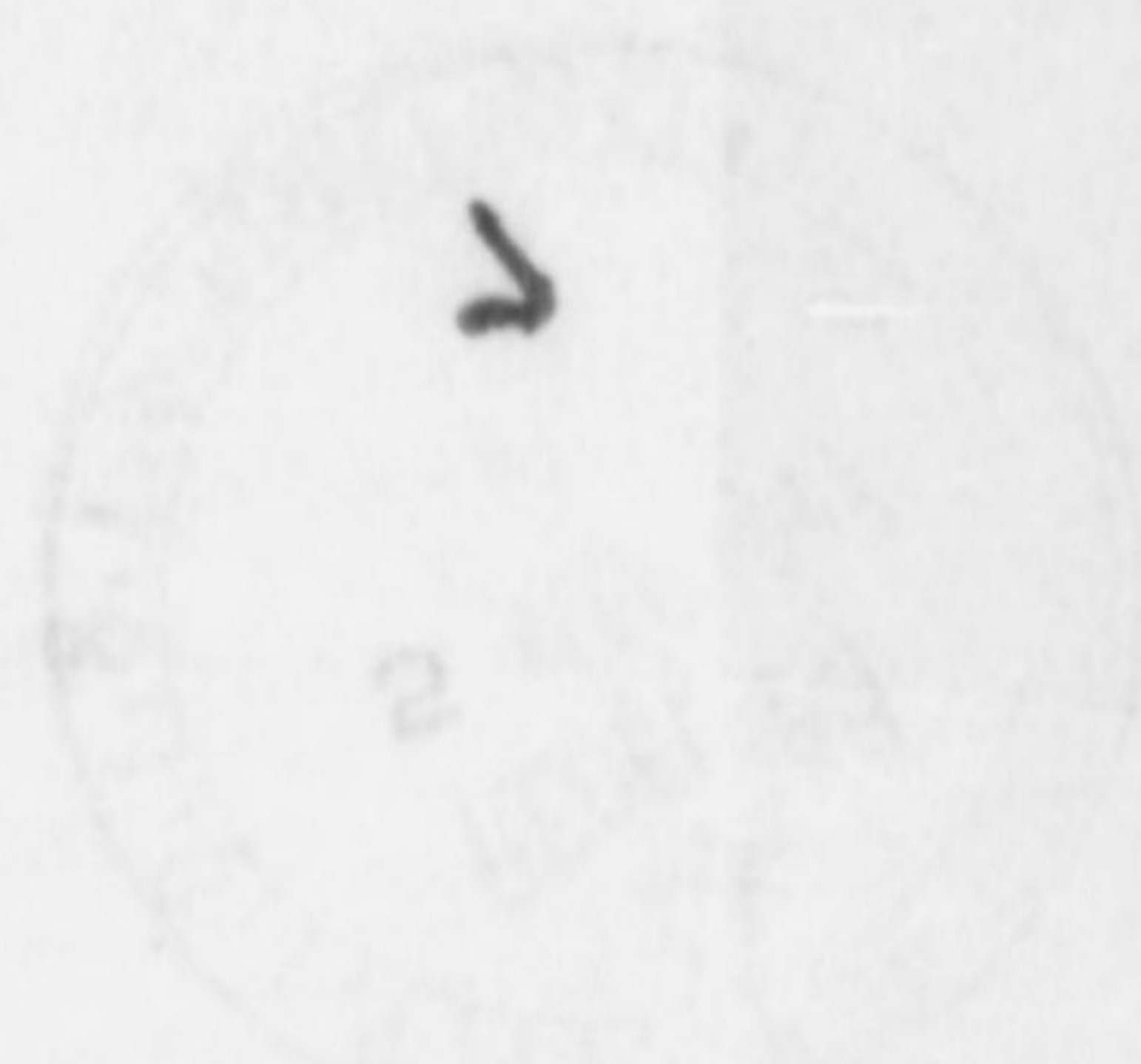

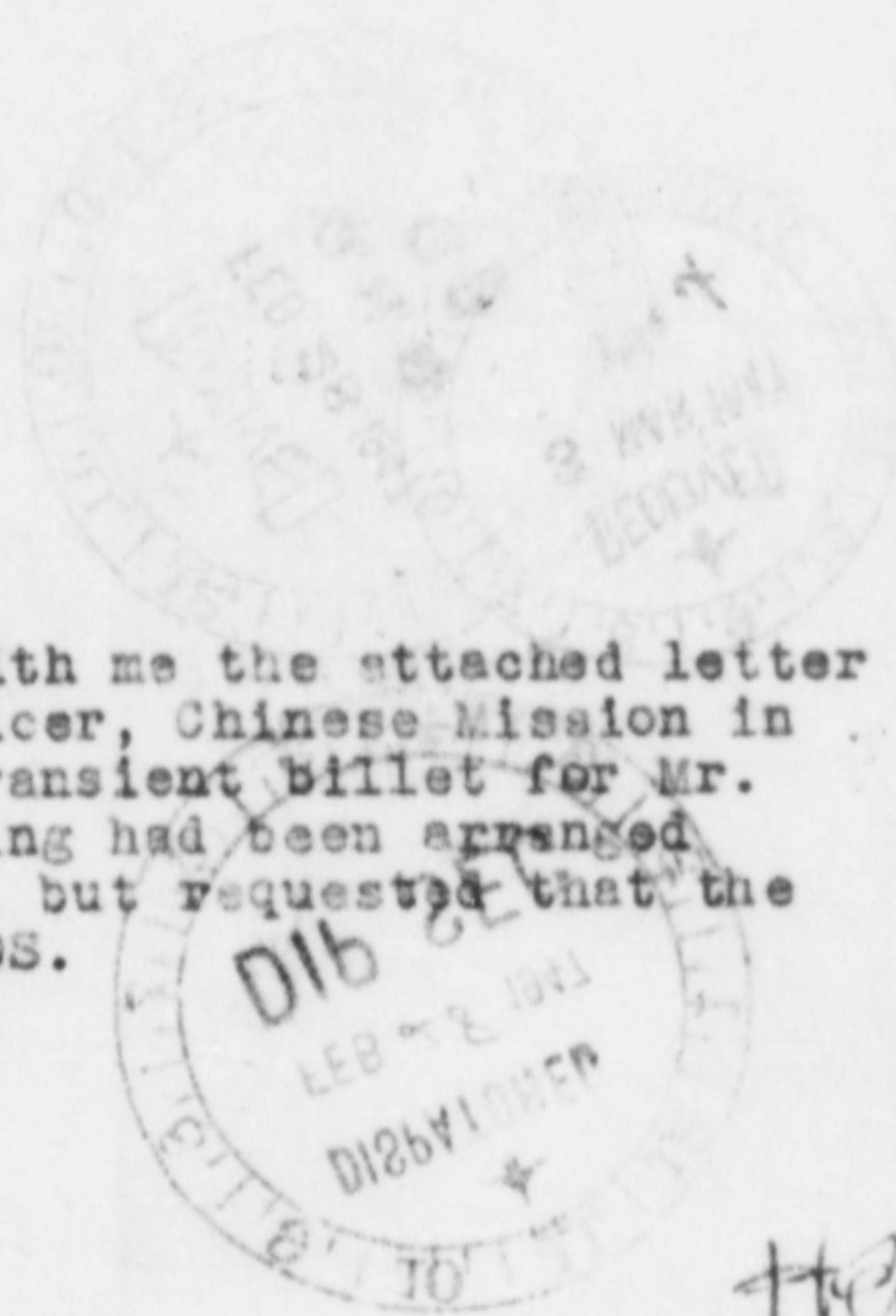

The Diplomatic Section of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, presents its compliments to the Chinese Mission in Japan and has the honor to refer to the latter's note No. CMF/189 of December 23, 1946, concerning the production of two witnesses, Heiji Okamura and Takuro Matsui, for the War Crimes Trials at the request of the International Military Tribunal for the Far East.

The presence in Japan of Takuro Matsui is requested for a period of one month, commencing May 10, 1947. It is understood arrangements are being made for the re-establishment of a Chinese courier plane service and it is therefore suggested that Matsui and his escort might be brought to Japan by that means. In the event the anticipated service is not operating when transportation is required, it is suggested the Mission consult with this Section concerning alternative arrangements.

It is noted that the Chinese Government has advised that Heiji Okamura is at present unfit for travel and that his presence in China is required by the Chinese Government. If his health permits and if the Chinese Government will allow him to return to Japan for one month, it would be appreciated if he could be brought to Japan under the same circumstances as Matsui. Should this course prove impracticable, the Mission is requested to advise this Section in order that alternative arrangements may be made.

This note may be considered as a clearance for entry into Japan of Major Huang King-fah as escort of Takuro Matsui and, if practicable, of Heiji Okamura.
