
MEMORANDUM:


MEMORANDUM:

STATEMENTS OF SERVICE

Section IV, War Department Circular Number 320, 19 October 1945, is quoted for the information and guidance of all concerned:

"IV. PAY. 1a. All commissioned officers of the Regular Army will check their record of service as contained in the latest available issue of the Official Army Register to ascertain the accuracy of their record of service and to determine that all service which may properly be credited for pay purposes is included therein.

b. In cases wherein the record of service is not complete a statement will be submitted to The Adjutant General, Washington 25, D. C. (Official Army Register), with the least practicable delay.


c. Statements of service other than Regular Army, Officers Reserve Corps, or Army of the United States, will be supported by written verification from the service or activity concerned (National Guard, Navy, Public Health, Enlisted Reserve, etc.). Statements covering service in the Enlisted Reserve Corps will be obtained from the commanding general of the service command in which the officer resided at the time of such service, while statement of National Guard service will be obtained from the adjutant general of the State in which the officer resided at time of such service.

2. Attention is directed to AG 35-1680 (18 Sep 43), as amended.
3. Commanding officers will bring this matter to the attention of all concerned under their jurisdiction."





MEMORANDUM:

CONTROL OF YEN CURRENCY

The following radio received from General Headquarters, United States Army Forces, Pacific, is quoted for the information and guidance of all concerned:

"In order to prevent military personnel in possession of Yen currency obtained from sales of property, black market currency transactions and other illicit sources from utilizing such currency to their own advantage it is directed that every instrument which transmits a dollar credit to the United States (except as pay voucher or payroll deductions) such as PTA lists or which effects a dollar credit through soldier deposits or effects the purchase of a War Bond or a Postal Money Order for cash will be accompanied by signed certificate from the appropriate personnel officer that "I certify that I have personally inquired into and examined the source of the funds herewith transmitted, deposited or used for purchase of War Bonds and Postal Money Orders and have determined that these funds were legitimately obtained as payment of pay and allowances from a Finance Officer of the United States Army and were not obtained from sale of property, black market currency operations or other illicit sources". There is no objection to the grouping of a number of such instruments as described above if the names and amounts the individuals involved are recorded on letter of transmittal. The personnel officer will require each individual so transmitting, depositing or purchasing United States dollar value through the medium of Yen currency to execute a statement indicating the source of same. However, this will not be construed as limiting the personnel officer's responsibility to the obtaining of this statement. He will satisfy himself in each case that the Yen currency was legitimately acquired. If the personnel and commanding officers are unable to arrive at determination that source is legitimate, they will forward entire file to next higher echelon of Command with pertinent finding. Officer depositions will support each PTA transmission or cash purchase of Postal Money Order or War Bond with a similar certificate written in the first person. Postal Officers in Japan will cash incoming Postal Money Orders in Yen only. Finance Officers will not exchange United States currency for Yen unless the individual desiring exchange is under orders to return to the United States and presents appropriately modified certificate as shown above from the unit personnel officer that the funds were legitimately acquired as pay and allowances from an Army Finance Officer. Officer personnel will execute a similar certificate. You will take measures to insure that United States currency is withdrawn from personnel arriving from the United States within 72 hours from date of debarkation. You are authorized to install such additional measures which you deem suitable to prevent the transmission of illicitly acquired funds to the United States. These instructions have equal application to War Correspondents, Red Cross personnel and War Department civilian employees. War and Treasury Departments seriously disturbed at the extent

of black market operations in the European Theater and it is the desire and intention to prevent this traffic in the Pacific Theater. This directive effective immediately."


ISSUE OF WAR TROPHIES



Individuals will, upon receipt of movement orders, contact the GHQ Supply, Baggage Section for instructions regarding the processing of their baggage for shipment from or within Japan. The Baggage Section is located in Warehouse #3, phone numbers 2-5414 and 23-2220.

SECTION I

SHIPMENT FROM AND WITHIN JAPAN

1. Classification of Baggage.

- a. Hand Baggage is that carried in the hands of individuals or stored in their quarters and accessible to them during the trip.
- b. Accompanied Baggage is that carried by the same ship or other means of transportation on which the owner is traveling and usually is not accessible to him during the trip.
- c. Unaccompanied Baggage is that not accompanied by the owner on the same ship or other means of transportation.

2. Packing, Marking, and Inspection of Personal and Household Baggage

- a. The GHQ Supply, Baggage Section will upon request:
 - (1) Perform necessary crating, packing, and marking.
 - (2) Furnish necessary forms and instructions prior to inspection.

Per 2 Memo. No. 63, 15 Oct 46 (Cont'd)

(3) Inspect baggage.

(4) Forward unaccompanied baggage.

b. Accompanied and unaccompanied baggage will be packed and marked in accordance with Circular 159, Headquarters Eighth Army APO 343 dated 25 May 1946, subject, "Procedure for Water Shipment of Unaccompanied Baggage to the United States".

c. Hand baggage, accompanied baggage, unaccompanied baggage, and household goods will be inspected for customs and compliance with laws and regulations governing prohibited and restricted articles and art objects in accordance with Circular 159, Headquarters Eighth Army APO 343 dated 25 May 1946, subject, "Procedure for Water Shipment of Unaccompanied Baggage to the United States."

3. Baggage Allowance The weight allowances of baggage for personnel moving from or within Japan under appropriate movement orders will be as follows:

a. Officers, enlisted personnel and War Department employees,

(1) On temporary change of station:

(a) General Officers; 800 pounds

(b) All others; 175 pounds

(2) On permanent change of station:

(a) General Officers; 800 pounds

(b) Field Grade Officers; 600 pounds

(c) Company Grade Officers; 400 pounds

(d) Enlisted men; 200 pounds

(e) Civilians; 400 pounds

b. Dependents:

Shipment of personal baggage and household goods will be in accordance with the provisions of War Department Circulars Number 83 and 157 dated 22 March and 30 May 1946 respectively.

SECTION II

BAGGAGE ARRIVING IN JAPAN

1. Upon notification from 2nd Major Port APO 503 (Yokohama), the GHQ Supply, Baggage Section will secure all incoming personal and household baggage and move same to Warehouse No. 3, GHQ Supply.

2. Personal Baggage

a. Personal baggage will be delivered or forwarded to the owner from Warehouse #3 by the GHQ Supply, Baggage Section.

b. Baggage not delivered, forwarded, or claimed within 120 days after arrival will be turned over to the QM Depot for disposition.

3. Household Baggage

a. The Baggage Officer of the Second Major Port, APO 503, (Yokohama) notifies the GHQ Supply, Baggage Section when household baggage destined for GHQ families arrive in Yokohama. This baggage is then brought to Warehouse #3 for delivery to the owner.

b. It is desired that the owner, (or their appointed representatives) of household baggage so arriving in Japan be present when household goods are delivered.

SECTION III

LOST SHIPMENTS

1. Inquiry Concerning Shipments

a. (1) Incoming shipments of baggage, if addressed to APO 500, may be traced through the GHQ Supply, Baggage Section after shipment arrives in Japan.

(2) Prior to arrival in Japan inquiries should be made to appropriate POE and "Baggage Clearance Unit", Traffic Control Division, OCT 50, Broadway, New York, 4, New York.

b. Outgoing Shipment of Baggage

(1) Baggage shipped to a destination within Japan may be traced by a written inquiry addressed to GHQ Supply, Baggage Section.

(a) Baggage Officer, Second Major Fort, APO 503

2. Claims for Loss or Damage


a. It is recommended that a list of contents be accomplished in duplicate for each container, both copies to be signed by the owner and the inspecting officer. The original will be retained by the owner and the duplicate will be placed in the container. In the event of a claim for loss or damage in transit, this document can be presented as evidence.

b. Claims from GHQ personnel for loss or damage to personal or household baggage should be addressed to Group Inspector Hq & Sv Gp, APO 500 (Claims Officer, Finance Building, Room 225).

1. References:

- a. Staff Memorandum No. 26, SCAP & AFPAC, 10 September 1946.
- b. Circular No. 260, Headquarters Eighth Army, 28 August 1946.
- c. Circular No. 279 Headquarters Eighth Army, 23 September 1946.

2. a. In accordance with instructions from Commanding General, Eighth Army, all commissary cards now in use will become void after 14 October 1946, except as indicated in paragraph 3, below.
- b. Authorizations for new commissary cards for personnel occupying dependent housing under control of this headquarters will be prepared on or before 11 October and forwarded to individuals by the Dependent Housing Section, Headquarters and Service Group. For personnel of this category, two types of cards will be issued, namely:
 - (1) Full privilege card for families occupying dependent housing with kitchen facilities.
 - (2) Limited privilege card for families occupying dependent housing without kitchen facilities.
- c. All other personnel entitled to and desiring the new commissary cards will make application to the Adjutant, Headquarters and Service Group, Room 247, Finance Building.

3. Officers' and Enlisted Mens' Clubs:

- a. Commissary cards issued to Officers' and Enlisted Mens' Clubs will become void after 24 October 1946. Application for new cards will be made according to the provisions of Section IV, Eighth Army Circular No. 275, quoted below:

"1. a. A letter of approval will be obtained from this headquarters before an officers' or enlisted men's club may purchase sub-

sistence from a quartermaster commissary. Effective 25 October 1946, all sales officers will cease to honor commissary cards held by clubs having commissary privileges not authorized or renewed under the provisions of this circular.

b. All requests for club commissary privileges will be submitted thru channels. Each successive commander will enter thereon his recommendations. Consideration for the authorization of commissary privileges will be given only when such clubs are so consolidated as to care for all troops within a reasonable area regardless of attachment or assignment.

c. The application from a club for permission to purchase subsistence will state the location by city, building number or name, the number of members to be served and in the case of a club serving more than one (1) organization, the designation of all units whose members make up the club.

2. Sales to authorized clubs will be made as outlined below:

a. Officers' Clubs:

- (1) The club officer will present to the sales officer the letter of approval referred to in paragraph 1 above together with a letter signed by the club president identifying him as club officer.
- (2) The sales officer will then issue a commissary card to the club. This card must be accompanied by the statement outlined in paragraph 3 below each time a purchase is made.

b. Enlisted Men's Clubs:

- (1) The organization commander will present to the sales officer the letter of approval referred to in paragraph 1 above.
- (2) The sales officer will then issue a commissary card to the club. This card must be accompanied by the statement outlined in paragraph 3 below each time a purchase is made.

3. All purchases authorized under the provisions of this circular will be accompanied by the following statement signed by the club officer in the case of an officers' club or by the unit commander in the case of an enlisted men's club:


4. In General the types of subsistence and allowances set forth in Section, II Circular 87, this headquarters, 25 March 1946, subject: "Quartermaster Supplies and Equipment for Operation of Supplementary Feeding Establishments" will apply to sales made to authorized clubs." (AG 430)

b. Reference paragraph 1b of above quoted circular applications for commissary cards for the Officers' Clubs of GHQ will be submitted through the Headquarters Commandant; applications for commissary cards for the Enlisted Mens' Clubs of GHQ will be submitted through the Commanding Officer of the unit concerned and the Headquarters Commandant.

SECTION I

ISSUE OF POST EXCHANGE CARDS TO PERSONNEL OF GHQ

The rules governing the issue of Post Exchange Cards to authorized personnel of the GHQ, SCAP, and AFPAC are outlined below:

1. Enlisted Personnel

- a. Enlisted personnel will be issued exchange cards thru the company orderly rooms of the unit to which they are assigned or attached.
- b. It is the responsibility of the unit commanders that cards are issued promptly to all authorized personnel and that only one card is issued to each person.
- c. Only enlisted men of the United States Army or Navy who are assigned or attached to Headquarters and Service Group, or who are members of units assigned or attached to Headquarters and Service Group will be issued cards. Enlisted personnel of Allied Nations will not be issued cards except when directed by the Headquarters Commandant.
- d. A roster will be maintained in each organization showing the name of the individual receiving the card, and the number of the card issued. The roster will be signed by the receiver when the card is received. This roster will be checked periodically by the Exchange Officer.
- e. PX cards will be signed in the presence of a person designated by the company commander as his representative.
- f. When a man is transferred out of the headquarters his card will be turned in and the date of turn in marked on the above roster. Turned in cards will be marked VOID and returned to the Exchange office immediately, and a notation will be made on the roster as to the date of turn in. When a man is transferred to another unit within the headquarters he will not turn in his card.
- g. See inclosure #1 for Sample form of required roster.

2. Officer Personnel

- a. Officer personnel will be issued exchange cards through the billeting officer in their respective billets.
- b. Only officers of the United States Army or Navy in the categories listed below will be issued post exchange cards.
 - (1) Assigned or attached to staff sections of GHQ, SCAP and AFPAC.
 - (2) Assigned or attached to Headquarters and Service Group.
 - (3) Members of units which are assigned or attached to Headquarters and Service Group.

Officers of Allied Nations will not be issued cards unless directed by the Headquarters Commandant.

- c. A roster will be maintained in each billet showing name of the individual receiving the card, and the number of the card issued. The roster will be signed by the receiver when the card is received. This roster will be checked periodically by the Exchange Officer.
- d. When an officer is transferred out of the headquarters the exchange card be turned in to the GHQ Supply Officer when the above individual clears this station. In case an officer is transferred to another billet he will not turn in his exchange card but will retain the old card at his new billet.
- e. Officers who are billeted separately may obtain exchange cards from the Exchange Office, Room 3, Finance Bldg. by presenting the orders assigning the individual to a separate abode, or a letter authorizing the individual to be billeted and to mess separately.
- f. Visiting military dignitaries of Allied and Neutral Nations will be issued temporary exchange cards by the Visitors Bureau, SCAP.
- g. Billets will issue cards only to those individuals who are living in the billet.
- h. See inclosure #1 for Sample form of required roster.

3. Civilian Personnel

- a. Only War Department Civilian employees who have been approved by the Office of Civilian Personnel, and who are citizens of the United States are authorized to receive exchange cards. Civilians who are citizens of Allied Nations but are paid from U.S. funds may receive cards if specifically authorized by the Headquarters Commandant.

- b. Male and female civilians will be issued cards through the billeting office in their respective billets.
 - c. A roster will be maintained in each billet showing the name of the individual receiving the card, and the number of the card issued. The roster will be signed by the receiver when the card is received. The receiving individual will also sign the card in the presence of the individual issuing the card. This roster will be checked periodically by the Post Exchange Officer.
 - d. When an individual is transferred to another billet the exchange card will not be turned in. If the individual is transferred out of the headquarters the card will be turned into the billeting office. Turned in cards will be marked VOID and returned to the Exchange Office immediately, and a notation will be made on the roster as to the date to turn in.
 - e. Civilians who are billeted separately may obtain exchange cards from the Exchange Office, Room 3, Finance Bldg. by presenting orders assigning them an abode, or a letter authorizing them to billet and mess separately.
 - f. Visiting civilian dignitaries will be issued temporary exchange cards by the Visitors Bureau, SCAP.
4. Exchange Cards for Dependents.
- a. Authorized dependents of military or civilian personnel attached to the headquarters are entitled to exchange privileges. One card per dependent is authorized, but dependents under 18 years of age will not be entitled to any tobacco or beer ration.
 - b. After arrival of the dependents in the Tokyo area the military or civilian personnel assigned to the headquarters may draw necessary exchange cards through the Exchange Office, Room 3, Finance Bldg. A letter authorizing the individual to billet or mess separately, or an order assigning the individual to an abode must be presented as a basis for issuing the cards.
 - c. Future cards for both military or civilian personnel and their dependents will be issued thru the Exchange Office. Individuals will not be issued cards through their former billets.
5. Miscellaneous Information:
- a. All information on the exchange cards must be filled in completely and signed, or the card will not be valid.
 - b. Loss of card will be reported to the unit commander, or billeting staff, and a new card will not be issued for a seven day period after the reported loss.

- c. The exchange card cannot be transferred from one person to another.
- d. The exchange card is valid in all Army Post Exchanges in Japan, except for purchases of extremely critical items such as watches, cameras, fountain pens, etc. The critical items will be purchased through the GHQ Branch Exchanges.

Custodians, All Individuals with Dependents in Tokyo

SECTION I

1. In accordance with the provisions of 8th Army Circular #205, 1 July 1946, the following policy will govern the GHQ Laundry and Dry Cleaning service effective 1 August 1946.

2. Enlisted men desiring laundry service will be charged a monthly flat-rate of 15 Yen per month and will be allowed to send one bundle per week containing any item. No bundle will contain more than thirty (30) pieces. For a period of less than one month, a weekly price of 5 Yen per week will be charged. Payment will be accomplished by deduction from payroll.

3. Unit commanders will submit in duplicate an alphabetical Monthly Roster and Statement WD AGO Form 10-73, copy attached, to the GHQ Laundry officer prior to the first of each month, filling in name, laundry mark, organization, station, and month. The present laundry slip will be used and will be placed in each bundle of the weekly pickup. A Weekly Collection and Delivery Sheet, WD AGO Form 10-71, copy attached, will be made out alphabetically in triplicate and two copies forwarded with the unit laundry.

4. Laundry for officers and WD civilians residing in GHQ Billets will be handled in the same manner as indicated in paragraph 3, except that payment will be made on a cash basis at a flat-rate of 5 Yen per bundle per week. Custodians will collect the cash each week and turn in the proceeds to the GHQ Laundry Officer. Proper Memorandum Receipts will be kept on file to reflect the transfer of funds.

5. Each family occupying a dependent housing abode will be charged for finished laundry service as follows:

5 Yen for bundle up to 30 pieces.

10 Yen for bundle of 31 to 60 pieces inclusive.

15 Yen for bundle of 61 to 90 pieces inclusive.

20 Yen for bundle of 91 to 120 pieces inclusive.

6. Dry cleaning service is provided on a piece-rate basis for enlisted men, officers, dependents and WD Civilians at the same price. A dry cleaning price list is attached. This form replaces the present Dry Cleaning List. Unit commanders and billet custodians will collect the amount due each week after delivery, and transmit the funds to the GHQ Laundry Officer in the same manner as indicated in paragraph 4 above. WD AGO Form 10-71 will be made out alphabetically in triplicate and two copies forwarded with the unit dry-cleaning. In the case of dependents, payment will be made to the truck driver on delivery.

7. Unit commanders and billet custodians are cautioned to prepare the required forms carefully and completely in order that proper deduction may be made from the enlisted payrolls, and in order to avoid any complaint on cash collections.

8. WD AGO Forms 10-71 and 10-73 are available at AG Publications, Room 102, Mitsubishi Ssoji Building. The new Dry Cleaning List is available at the GHQ Laundry or at Service Battalion Headquarters, Room 215, Finance Building.

SECTION I

MEDICAL CARE FOR DEPENDENTS OF GHQ PERSONNEL

1. ROUTINE MEDICAL SERVICES: The Officers Dispensary at the Dai Ichi Building, phone AFPAC 22402 or 22451, is available for medical attention of dependents daily between the hours of 0830 - 12-- and 1330 - 1700. Those desiring medical attention are requested to phone in advance when possible for appointments.

2. EMERGENCY CALLS: a. In cases of emergency, medical attention at the patients home can be obtained as follows:

(1) Between 0830 - 17--, phone the Dai Ichi Building Officers Dispensary, AFPAC 2-2402 or 2-2451

(2) Between 1700 - 0830, phone

(a) Mitsubishi Main Building Dispensary 238169 or 238218.

(b) Finance Building Dispensary 237502.

b. For ambulance service phone 238218.

c. To expedite the Medical Officer's reaching the proper destination of the house, call with the least delay, explicit directions insofar as possible will be given with respect to specific route numbers, public buildings, prefecture sub-divisions, and well known landmarks, etc.

d. Whenever possible, when individual means of transportation is available, it should be used to contact the medical officer at the above mentioned dispensary buildings so that he may be escorted to the exact location of the patient.

3. DENTAL CARE: Dental service is available for dependents at the Dental Clinic in the Dai Ichi Building phone AFPAC 22723. Office hours daily from 0830 - 1200 and 1330 - 1700.

4. Reference Unnumbered Memo, this Hq, dated 5 June 1946. Dependents of GHQ personnel may be immunized against Japanese "B" Encephalitis on a voluntary basis by reporting to the Dai Ichi Building Dispensary.

REQUISITIONING PROCEDURE

1. Reference is made to the following:

a. Staff Memorandum #39, GHQ SCAP, subject: "Supply Procedure" dated 7 June 1946 file AG 400.321.

b. Unnumbered memorandum, Hq & Sv Gp., GHQ AFPAC, subject: "Clothing and Equipage for Enlisted Personnel", dated 28 December 1945.

c. Army Regulations, War Department Circulars and Technical Manuals as listed on Annex B.

2. The requisitioning procedure as outlined below has been established for compliance by all General and Special Staff Sections and troop organizations organized under theater overhead bulk allotment whose logistical support is the responsibility of the Headquarters Commandant, General Headquarters, United States Army Forces, Pacific, as indicated in Section III, Staff Memorandum #39, GHQ SCAP.

a. Clothing and Equipage.

(1) Requisitioning units will address and forward requisitions to Clothing and Equipage Section, GHQ Supply, APO 500, in accordance with reference memorandum in paragraph one (1) above.

b. Station Supplies and Equipment.

(1) Requests for supplies and equipment will be submitted in triplicate on a Property Issue Slip (WD AGO Form #446).

(a) Property Issue Slips will be addressed and forwarded to GHQ Supply, APO 500. Complete name and building address of originating unit or section will be entered in space provided therefore.

(b) Property Issue Slip will be complete, i.e., columns "Unit", "Auth. Allowance", "On Hand", "Due In" and "Quantity Desired", will be filled accurately upon requests for property.

(c) Standard nomenclature and federal stock number will be utilized for requests for all U.S. Government property and supplies. Items will be double spaced.

(d) Items peculiar to the individual branches of the Army Service Forces will be requisitioned on separate Property Issue Slips, i.e., Quartermaster items and Ordnance items will not appear on the same requisition.

(e) Signatures of responsible officers will appear in ink, will be legible and will indicate grade and area of service.

(2) Responsible officers, or their authorized representatives as designated in accordance with Circular 170, 1943, will receipt for all issues of supplies and equipment.

c. General.

(1) Property Issue Slips will arrive at the GHQ Supply Office on the day indicated on "Annex A". In the event a weekly requisition does not arrive on day indicated it will be held in suspense and processed the following week. Delivery may be expected three (3) days after submission date of the requisition.

(2) United States postage stamps will be requisitioned in accordance with existing Army Regulations.

(3) Requests for rubber stamps and printing (GHQ, SCAP only) will be submitted on separate Property Issue Slips with three samples of item requested attached.

(4) In accordance with the provisions of Par 33 TM 58403 only one requisition for expendable supplies will be accepted each week.

(5) Basis will indicate item is included on T/A as submitted to G-3, GHQ AFPAC for War Department approval.


