What is the concept of Wikipedia Takes Your City

- A photo scavenger hunt.
- Wikipedians build a list of wanted pictures.
- Give high points if picture is really wanted.
- Gathering wikipedians on a specific day.
- Make them upload the pictures on Commons.
- Calculate points and declare a winner.

Wikipedia Takes Montreal

What was done?

- We built a list and [map of 400 targets](#);
- Over 300 inscriptions;
- An hurricane hit Montreal;
- 110 participants showed up;
- Despite the hurricane, we broke the record for the number of participants for a Wikipedia Takes Your City;
- 5,700 pictures uploaded on Commons;
- Total cost \$3,225.

Why was it done that way?

- Our first experience, no chance to innovate. We chose to follow what was done before.

- No list of targets was made;
- 30 participants;
- Clear weather;
- 1000 images of great quality;
- Cost: around \$3,000.

Why was it done that way?

- Learned from last year's mistakes;
- Quality over quantity;
- No list: unleash creativity;
- Many things in a city are encyclopedic, not only buildings and statues;
- Upload tools.

Bad stuff / Good stuff

Bad stuff

- High cost (>\$1/picture);
- People resources: list & map, helpers on-site, judges, etc;
- Dependent on the weather (hard to have plan B another day)
- Time consuming.



Bad stuff / Good stuff

Good stuff

- 6000 new images for Commons;
- [Media coverage](#);
- Recruiting new contributors;
- Collaboration with outside organizations (City of Montreal, Cégep Limoilou, Tourism Office);
- Outreach to outsiders vs Wikimedians;
