

## LA ABEJA.

### DECRETO.

El Excmo. Sr. presidente de los Estados Unidos, meritanos se ha servido dirigir el decreto que sigue:

El presidente de los Estados Unidos manda a los habitantes de la república saber:

Que deseando proporcionar un asilo a los militares beneméritos que han espuesto su vida por la patria y sacrificado una parte de su existencia en el honor, penetrado de que los monumentos que se erigen en favor de la humanidad engrandecen el nombre de las naciones y elevan el espíritu de los ciudadanos, y haciendo uso de sus facultades extraordinarias con que es autorizado por el congreso general, he venido en decretar:

Art. 1º Se formará un establecimiento bajo la inmediata inspección del gobernador, con la denominación de casa nacional de inválidos, destinada para los militares inutilizados en la campaña. A este obfeto se destinará el convento que fue de Bélemitas.

Art. 2º Servirán para fondos de dicho establecimiento: primero, las fincas de los oficios de Filipinas existentes en el distrito; segundo, las rentas y fincas del colegio mayor de Santa María, que quedarán extinguidas; tercero, un descuento que se hará a los generales, oficiales y sargentos del ejército; cuarto, el 2 por 100 de todo lo que se declare buena presa en el mar perteneciente al erario conforme a las leyes; quinto, las donaciones que se dicieren para el establecimiento; sexto, un real sobre cada pieza de cualquiera tamaño que se introduzca a las aduanas marítimas, siempre que sea de país extranjero.

3º Se exceptúa del artículo anterior, el edificio principal del colegio de santos, que se destinará para el museo nacional.

4º El descuento de que habla el artículo segundo, se hará en esta forma: dos pesos mensuales los generales de división; uno los de brigada, los coronelones cuatro reales; tres reales los tenientes coronelones; dos y medio reales los primeros ayudantes, un real y medio los tenientes; los subtenientes ó alferces con un real; y con medio real los sargentos.

5º Disfrutarán del beneficio de este establecimiento, no solo los individuos del ejército de mar y tierra, sino todos los que lo hayan inutilizado en el servicio de la patria.

6º Este establecimiento tendrá un director y un segundo, que será uno de los consultores del cuerpo de sanidad nombrados por el gobierno.

7º El director tendrá la inmediata inspección, y presentará al gobierno los proyectos de mejoras, reformas ó engrandecimientos que sean convenientes, para que reciba la suprema resolución.

8º Todo proyecto de reforma ó mejoramiento, antes de ser sujeto a la aprobación del gobierno, discutiránse en junta de tres generales nombrados por el comandante general, y acompañarán su informe con el mismo proyecto, para que reciba la suprema resolución.

9º Habrá un salón en el establecimiento destinado a conservar las espadas de los generales que murieron en campaña y los trofeos tomados al enemigo. La memoria de los ilustres militares, se perpetuará en una noticia succincta escrita en cuadros destinados al efecto.

10º Para calificar si debe constar el nombre de algún militar muerto en campaña a los términos expresados, se pondrá al director del establecimiento, por la persona interesada, y ésta pasará la instancia al gobierno con su informe para su resolución. No se pondrá nunca inscripción alguna sin este requisito.

11º El gobierno encargará a una comisión de tres individuos de conocida aptitud y celo, para la formación de los reglamentos de este establecimiento importante, el cual deberá ser aprobado por el mismo gobierno.

Y para que todo lo contenido en este decreto tenga su mas cabal cumplimiento, mando se imprime, publique y circule á quienes corresponda.

### AVIS.

Art. 14. The mayor is and remains charged to attend to the faithful execution of the dispositions of this ordinance, and in case of negligence on the part of the officer commanding, the mayor is authorized to make a report of it to the Council who shall report, in that respect, according to the circumstances which shall be submitted to them.

Art. 15. The said guard shall enter upon its duties on the 1st. of November next, and shall remain in actual service until the — of May 1830, at which epoch the mayor is to reduce and discharge it.

A respectible Mercantile House of this city has had the politeness to loan us a file of the Censor of Vera Cruz up to the 9th ultimo; the last Mexican dates are of the 3d. These papers contain many interesting articles. We content ourselves, for the present, to give a summary only.

In a proclamation of the 22d of Sept. which breathes the purest patriotism, the President addresses to the army, its officers and to the people generally, felicitations on the happy result of the campaign against the invading army, and facilitates himself that during his presidency the Spaniards have received a lesson that must oblige them forever to renounce all ideas of the reconquest of Mexico—he terminates by stating that the recent discomfiture of the Spaniards will probably cause foreign nations to recognize the Independence of Mexico. A consequence that would seem probable even with Spain herself, were she governed by a man who understood her real interests.

The Legislature of the State of Vera Cruz had voted thanks to Gen. Santa Anna for his firm and efficient conduct at Tamaulipas. By a Decree of Sept. 21st the President of Mexico ordered the formation of an Establishment under the name of National Hospital for Invalids where will be received all such soldiers as are disabled, from wounds received in the service, from further serving their country. An unoccupied convent has been selected for that purpose; funds are provided for its support, and one vestibule is reserved for the deposit of the arms of all generals killed in battle, and also for the preservations of all trophies taken from the enemy. It will be perceived that President Guerrero has made the most satisfactory use of the high power entrusted to him and must ever be entitled in the gratitude of the Mexican people for the many improvements he has already perfected and is continually projecting.

Art. 5. The men composing it shall be armed with a sabre, and a pair of pistols, which they shall carry in their belts, and shall furnish themselves with horses and shall be bound also to provide for their keeping; and the said horses must always be in good condition for service.

Art. 6. The commanding officer as well as the men composing the guard shall repair to the guard-house designated by the mayor, every evening at 8 o'clock precisely; at that hour the said officer shall cause three patrols of three men each shall be marched off to relieve the patrols returning to the guard-house, and shall perform the same services in the square of the city, the faubourg St. Mary and the faubourg Marigny as the others. In the course of their patrols the said horse-guards shall have the same powers and attributes as are allowed to the foot guards of the city. At day-break the said patrols are to return to their guard-house.

Art. 7. The officer commanding, must every day at the opening of the mayor's office make to him an exact report of the patrols for the night, and shall receive such orders as the mayor shall think proper to give him.

Art. 8. In case of the sickness of any man of the said guard, he must find another man, at his own expense, to replace him, and in case of the sickness of any horse, an other horse must be furnished at the expense of his master.

Art. 9. The men composing said guard shall be appointed by the mayor; and the officer by the mayor and City Council.

Art. 10. In case of negligence in their duties the said men shall upon the report of their commanding officer be dismissed by the mayor, if he thinks the circumstances of the case require it, and which is left entirely to his discretion.

Art. 11. The duty of the officer commanding shall be to repair, exactly every evening to the guard-house designated by the mayor, to ascertain that the men repair thither at the precise hour, to march off the patrols; confide the command of them to one of the three men of each, whom he shall judge most fit for that purpose; to visit himself, once every night, the city and faubourgs to assure himself that the duties of the patrols are well performed and finally to maintain the necessary order and discipline in the said guard.

Art. 12. The allowances to the commanding officer are and remain fixed at \$—those of each man of said guard at that of \$—payable at the expiration of each month.

Art. 13. In case of the sickness of the officer commanding the mayor is and remains authorized to appoint one for replacing him, also shall during his time of service be intitled to the same allowances as the officer originally appointed and be bound to perform the same duties.
