MORNING AND EVENING STARS.

VENUS will be an Evening Star till September 25th, then a Morning Star to the end of the year.

MARS will be an Evening Star till September 26th, then a Morning Star to the end of the year.

JUPITER will be a Morning Star until April 13th, then an Evening Star to October 26th, after that it will be a Morning Star to the end of the year.

SATURN will be a Morning Star until March 25th, then an Evening Star till September 29th, after which it will again be a Morning Star to the end of the year.

SIGNS.

The following Signs are used in our Almanack to denote the different positions and phases of the Moon. ☽ denotes the Moon in the first quadrature—that is the quadrature between change and full. ☾ denotes the Moon in the last quadrature—that is, the quadrature between full and change. ● denotes new Moon. ○ denotes full Moon.

THE FAMILY FRIEND.

DANDELION COFFEE.—Gather the roots of dandelions in the Fall of the year, wash them well, taking care not to rub off the skin, dry them on boards in the sun, and then they will keep for years. When wanted for use, they are cut up in pieces about the size of coffee beans, and browned exactly like coffee, and they are then ground and used like it. If mixed along with coffee, at the rate of two-thirds coffee to one of dandelion root, a very good and healthy beverage is thus made.

Lamps will have less disagreeable smell, if you dip the wick yarn in strong hot vinegar, and let it dry.

THE FARMERS' FRIEND.

OIL FOR MACHINERY, WAGON-WHEELS, &c.—Add one part of India rubber to fifty parts of Rape oil, and boil till the rubber is nearly all dissolved. It is not only more unctuous and less affected by friction than other oils, but remains liquid below the freezing point of water. In this respect it is most valuable in cold winters.

Milch cows, in winter, should be kept in dry, moderately warm, but well ventilated quarters, regularly fed and watered three times a day, salted twice or three a week, have clean beds, be curried daily, and, in addition to their long provender, should receive succulent food morning and evening.

Feed all animals regularly. They not only look for their food at the usual time, but the stomach indicates the want at the stated period. Therefore feed morning, noon and evening, as near the same time as possible.

For High Water at Cape Sable, add 5 m. to the time of High Water at Halifax. Tide serves same hour at Annapolis and St. John, N. B.

VESSELS FOR MILK.—Experiments have been made of the comparative excellence of zinc and tin for milk. The result was that milk in tin pans curdled three hours sooner than that in zinc, and that the milk in the latter produced one-fifth more cream, and the cream one-fifth more butter, and of a sweeter flavor.

Every husbandman should carefully read and digest matters connected with his business, his success being as dependent upon a full knowledge of its principles and details as is that of a lawyer and physician with a knowledge of the science of law or physic.

All stiff clays are benefited by fall and winter ploughing; but should never be ploughed while they are wet. If at such ploughings the furrow be materially deepened, lime, marl or ashes, should be applied.

Young stock should be moderately fed with grain in winter, and receive generous supplies of long provender, it being essential to keep them in fair condition, in order that the formation of muscle, bones, &c., may be encouraged and continuously carried on.

It ought to be promulgated to the profession, and for humanity sake to be known to the whole people that in any case of burn or scald, however extensive, all the acute suffering of the patient may be at once relieved, and that in a moment of time, by sprinkling over the injured surface a thick layer of wheat flour by the hand, or, what is better, by a dredging box. Every vestige of pain produced by such injuries is instantly removed, and the sufferer not only escapes the shock to the nervous system accompanying such torture, but will generally fall into a quiet sleep the moment the atmospheric temperature is thus excluded from the wounds.

This plan of fertilizing may be applied with success to any soil whatever, no matter how poor, and the result will be astonishing.

COMPOSITION FOR LEATHER.—The following is by far the best composition for leather we have ever tried. It keeps it water-proof and pliable, and is susceptible of the highest degree of polish:—1 pint boiled linseed oil, 1½ pound mutton tallow, 6 ounces beeswax, 4 ounces rosin; melt and simmer together. Apply it to the leather moderately warm.

If black dresses have been stained, boil a handful of fig leaves in a quart of water, and reduce it to a pint. A sponge dipped in this liquid and rubbed upon them, will entirely remove stains from crapes, bombazines, &c.

Clean a brass kettle before using it for cooking, with salt and vinegar.

If the owners of trees whose foliage is annually, and sometimes oftener, destroyed by worms, will take the trouble to bore a hole in their trunks, inclining towards their roots, (now that the sap is ascending,) and fill the aperture in each with the flour of sulphur, protecting it from the weather by pitch, clay, or sealing-wax, they will find that insects will not trouble the leaves.

We frequently see farmers in a bright, windy April day, spending much labor in composting in their fields, shovelling over and over again their manure heaps, often mixing nothing with them, and oftener, perhaps, road-side sand or worthless soil. The loss by the operation is manifest to more senses than one. It was stated in a public lecture by a learned chemist that about *one-fifth* of the value of a heap of stable manure would escape by evaporation, in such a day as I have named, by a single shoveling over and shaking up in the usual way.

CARRIERS FOR HORSES.—Horses that have a hard, dry cough, or that have the heaves, are remarkably relieved by moderate feeding of carrots.

STARCHING LINEN.—Take two ounces of fine white gum Arable powder, put it into a pitcher, and pour on it a pint or more of boiling water, according to the degree of strength you desire, and then, having covered it, let it set all night. In the morning pour it carefully from the dregs into a clean bottle, cork it, and keep it for use. A tablespoonful of gum water stirred into a pint of starch that has been made in the usual manner, will give the lawns, either white, black, or printed, a look of newness, when nothing else can restore them after washing. It is also good, much diluted, for thin white muslin and bobbinet.

FARM EXPERIENCE.—Twenty years' experience upon a farm has taught me that one acre of land, well manured and tilled, will produce more than two acres which received the same amount of labour and manure. That one cow, well fed, will be of more profit than two fed upon the same amount of fodder: this will apply to all other stock. That one ton of hay, cut when the grass begins to blossom, will produce as much milk as two tons cut when the seed is ripe.

Abundant crops cannot be grown for a succession of years, unless care be taken to provide, and apply, an equivalent for the substances carried off the land in the products grown thereon.

CLOVERING.—Never spare the seed when you sow clover. Four quarts are not enough to the acre; put on not less than six, and be not frightened if you scatter a peck! The great superiority of thickly sown clover fields over others for feed and manure, is too manifest to need demonstration.

To drive these midnight depreddators from your bed all that is necessary is to take a feather and oil the joints and erevices well. After remaining several days, by rubbing it off with a woollen cloth, it will give bedsteads a handsome polish, and prevent any further visits for a long time.

Perhaps it is not generally known, as it should be, that salt put into the mouth will instantly remove the convulsive movements in fits, either of children or animals.

Woollens should be washed in very hot suds, and not rinsed. Lukewarm water shrinks them.

The strongest of all manures is found in the droppings of the poultry yard. Each barrel of it will manure half an acre of land; save it, then, and add to the productive energies of your soil. Don't look upon it as too trifling for your attention; but recollect that the globe itself is an aggregate of small matters.

A Pennsylvania farmer states, in a late American journal, that the water in which potatoes have been boiled, sprinkled over grain or garden plants, completely destroys all insects in every stage of existence, from the egg to the full grown fly.

The orchard, to be productive of good, fair fruit, requires to be fed, as much as does a field of grain. The soil of each requires that the substances abstracted by the crops shall be restored. The soil should be kept clean, and open to the meliorating influences of the sun, the dews, the rain, and the air—the bark of the trees should be kept in a healthful condition, by scraping, when necessary, and by alkaline washes.

ROUGH PAINT FOR FARMERS.—Take twelve ounces of rosin, and eight ounces of roll brimstone, each coarsely powdered, and three gallons of train oil. Heat them slowly, gradually adding four ounces of beeswax, cut in small bits. Frequently stir the liquor, which, as soon as the solid ingredients are dissolved, will be fit for use. What remains unused will become solid on cooling, but may be re-melted on subsequent occasions, if wanted.—When it is melted fit for use, add some Spanish brown, or yellow ochre, or any other colouring substance of the kind that you wish to have, first ground fine in some of the oil, then lay it on with a brush while it is hot, and thin as you can have it. Two coats should always be given. Some days after the first is dry, put on a second. The wood should be perfectly dry when the composition is applied. Common white paint may be used on the top of it it, if required, for the sake of appearances. It said that it will preserve planks for ages; and keep the weather from driving through brick work.

SIMPLE REMEDY TO PURIFY WATER. It is not so generally known as it ought to be, that pounded alum possesses the property of purifying water. A large table-spoonful of pulverized alum, sprinkled into a hogshoad of water (the water stirred round at the time), will, after the lapse of a few hours, by precipitating to the bottom the impure particles, so purify it that it will be found to possess nearly all the freshness and clearness of the finest spring-water. A pailful, containing four gallons, may be purified by a single tea-spoonful.

Cotton, wet with sweet oil and paragoric, relieves the ear-ache very soon.

SCYTHES.—A complaint is often made by workmen of their scythes not acting well; of the edge not cutting uniformly, and the form being wrong, &c.; now the form suited to each mower may be tested by a very simple experiment. Let a man, with a piece of chalk in his hand, walk up to a high wall or barn door, and raising it as high as he can, strike a curve from right to left. The line so traced is the exact form that his scythe should be; and if he applies the edge of it, and finds it to correspond, it will cut uniformly from point to heel, and save himself much trouble and labor.

To EXTRICATE HORSES FROM FIRE.—Throw the harness over a draught-horse, and place the middle over a saddle-horse, and they may be led out of the stable as easy as on common occasions. If time allows, put the bridle on them rather than the halter, and the difficulty of saving them will be further lessened.

ERUPTIONS ON THE FACE.—Dissolve an ounce of borax in a quart of water, and apply this with a fine sponge every evening before going to bed. This will smooth the skin when the eruptions do not proceed from an insect working under the cuticle. Many persons' faces are disfigured by red eruptions, caused by a small creature working under the skin. A very excellent remedy is to take the flour of sulphur and rub it on the face dry, after washing it, every morning. Rub it well with the fingers, and then wipe it off with a dry towel. There are many, who are not a little ashamed of their face, who can be completely cured if they follow these directions.

ON CURING CLOVER HAY.—Whether the grass be clover alone, or clover and timothy, it should be cut when from one-half to two-thirds of the clover blossoms have a brown appearance. Let it be cut only in good hay whether. From eleven to twelve o'clock spread all the hay which has been mowed since the previous noon over the ground. Between one and five o'clock rake it up and put it in cocks. It may now stand from two to five days, as may be most convenient, when, if the weather be favourable, it will be in good order to put in the barn or stack. Roll the cocks bottom side up, an hour or two before hauling, so that the dampness arising from the earth may dry off. Sprinkle over about four quarts of salt to the ton, whether it be put in the mow or stack.

When properly cured and stacked in this manner, cattle or horses will leave good grass pasture for this hay. It is better not to tramp it much in the mow, and it will come out in the winter as bright and sweet as when it was put in.

If the law holds good that "the like begets the like," the finest and first of every thing should be preserved for seed, and in case of unsuitable climate or soil, seed should annually be obtained from remote sections, naturally favourable for their greatest development.

A MODE OF PLANTING APPLE TREES.—A horticulturalist in Bohemia has a beautiful plantation of the best apple trees, which have neither sprung from seeds nor grafting. The plan is, to take shoots from the choicest sorts, insert them in a potatoe, and plunge both in the ground, having cut an inch or two of the shoot while it pushes out roots, and the shoot gradually springs up, and becomes a beautiful tree, bearing the best fruit, without requiring to be grafted.

REMEDY FOR ASTHMA.—Procure common blotting-paper, and thoroughly saturate it in a solution of nitre, (saltpetre) and let it be carefully dried by the fire, or by exposure to the rays of the sun. On retiring at night, ignite it, and deposit it, burning, on a plate or square of sheet zinc or iron, in your bed-room.

A teaspoonful of horse radish, put into a pan of milk, will preserve the milk sweet for several days, either in the open air or in the cellar, while other milk will turn quite sour.

By placing a shade of light blue tissue-paper over the lamp, the light is ameliorated.

Lands which have been long in culture, will be benefitted by applications of phosphate of lime, and it is unimportant whether the deficiency be supplied in the form of bone-dust, guano, native phosphate of lime, composts of fish, ashes, or in that of oyster-shell lime—or marl—if the land need liming, also.

Mix occasionally one part of salt with four parts of wood ashes, and give the mixture to different kind of stock, summer and winter. It promotes their appetites, and tends to keep them in a healthy condition. It is said to be good against botts in horses, murrain in cattle, and rot in sheep.

Draining of wet lands and marshes add to their value by making them produce more and better crops—by producing them earlier—and improving the health of neighbourhoods.

There is more nutriment in a quart of carrots than in a bushel of turnips.

By stabling and shedding stock through the winter, a saving of one-fourth of the food may be effected—that is, one-fourth less food will answer, than when such stock may be exposed to the inclemencies of the weather.

Time and labor devoted to the collection of materials to be converted into manure, are the most fruitful source of profit in the whole range of farm economy.

The chopping, or grinding of grain, to be fed to stock, operates as a saving of at least twenty-five per cent.

Rats and other vermin are kept away from grain by a sprinkling of garlic, when packing the sheaves.

If you want a horse who will never give out, never buy a large overgrown one. A black horse cannot stand heat, nor a white one cold.

The Mails for the United Kingdom are closed at Halifax every alternate *Thursday* evening at 8 o'clock. Letters, &c., for England—which may be dropped into the box after the hour of closing, and up to the arrival of the Packet—will be forwarded in a bag, loose, but such letters must be prepaid by stamps. The Royal Mail Steamers leave Boston for Halifax and Liverpool, G. B., every alternate *Wednesday*, arrive at Halifax on *Thursday* evening, or very early the succeeding morning, leaving Halifax immediately after receiving the Mails. Letters will also be received on board the Steamers after the Mail has left the Post Office. Must be *prepaid* by stamp.

Letters to and from England, 12½c. single rate, *prepayment compulsory*, can be prepaid by using a 12½ cent stamp. Newspapers free.

The postage on books from Great Britain to Nova Scotia, or *vice versa*, is, for a packet not exceeding 4 oz., 7c. currency; not exceeding ½ lb., 12½c.; ½ lb., and not exceeding 1 lb., 25 cts., and so on, adding 25 cts. for every additional pound, or fraction of a pound. One book package

may contain separate Books, Publications, Almanacks, and Maps and Paper, Parchment or Vellum; the latter three materials may be written or printed on; the package may contain the name and address of the sender. Rollers may accompany prints and maps, and markers may be sent with books. No letters must be sent with or written on a book package, and no such package must exceed two feet in length, width or depth. The postage must in all cases be prepaid by stamps.

Closed Mails for the United Kingdom *via* United States are made up at Halifax to meet the Steamers leaving New York for Liverpool. Letters to be specially addressed "*via New York*." Letters 17c.; newspapers 2c. each—must be prepaid.

Mails are made up to be forwarded by the Canadian line of Steamers, *via* Picton and River DeLoup—postage same as by Cunard Line. Letters must be specially addressed by this route. Letters for Canada also forwarded by this route, closing every Monday evening after the departure of the R. M. S. for England.

The Mails for the United States, *via* Boston, per Royal Mail Steamers, are made up on *Tuesday* evening of the week in which the Packet from England is due, at 8 o'clock. Postage 10 cts.; when posted in the interior, 13½ cts. Should the Steamer not arrive by 6 o'clock the following morning, *Supplementary Mails* will be made up. Should the Steamer from Liverpool arrive previous to Tuesday night, the Mails, as heretofore, will be closed *immediately on her arrival*. Letters must be addressed per R. M. Steamer, or they will not be so forwarded.

A Closed Mail for Canada is made up and forwarded at the same time in charge of the British Officer. Letters so forwarded must be specially addressed "Closed Mail for Canada." Postage 12½c., viz.: 8½c. packet rate, and 4c. Colonial rate—prepayment optional.

The Mails for Bermuda and the West Indies (*monthly*) are made up finally at Halifax on the Thursday evening of the week in which the Royal Mail Steamer is expected to arrive from Boston, at 8 o'clock. Letters 10c.; when posted in the interior, 13½c. which must be prepaid. Newspapers 2c. each, which must be prepaid by stamp.

Letters are forwarded *via* Bermuda for Chagres and the Pacific, Chili and Peru; postage 33c., must be prepaid; 5c. additional when posted in the interior. Havana, Honduras, Laguyra, Mexico, Venezuela, and the British and Foreign West India Islands. Postage to Foreign West Indies, 10c. when posted at Halifax; 13½c. when posted in the interior—must be prepaid. Newspapers 2c. each, to be prepaid by stamp.

The Mails for Newfoundland (and Cape Breton during the Summer months) are made up at Halifax once a month during the months of December, January, February and March, and once a fortnight during the months of April, May, June, July, August, September, October and November, closing finally on the Thursday evening of the week in which the R. M. Steamer is expected to arrive from Boston. Postage 10c.; when posted in the interior, 13½c. Newspapers 2c. each, which must be paid by stamp at the time of posting.

All letters are charged by weight, and a uniform rate of postage of 5c. on a letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight has been established throughout British North America; less than ½ oz., 5c.; more than ½ oz. and less than 1 oz., 10c.; more than 1 oz. and less than 1½ oz., 15c.; more than 1½ oz. and less than 2 oz., 20c. Throughout Nova Scotia and to the United States prepayment is compulsory.

Letters addressed to any part of Nova Scotia or the United States, posted at any office in Nova Scotia wholly unpaid, will be forwarded to the Dead Letter Office at Halifax, and from thence returned to the writer.

Letters addressed to any part of Nova Scotia being insufficiently paid will be forwarded, taxed with the deficient postage.

Letters addressed to the United States insufficiently paid will be retained in the office at which they are posted, and the party to whom they are addressed will be notified of such detention, and that on receipt of the deficient postage they will be forwarded.

Letters posted in Nova Scotia for Prince Edward Island must be prepaid by stamp. Letters not prepaid will be forwarded with an *additional* tax of 5c.

To any part of the United States, 10c; to Oregon and California, 15c.

Letters posted in any town within the Province for delivery in the same town are liable to the rate of 2c. for every half ounce—double rate if not prepaid when posted.

The postage on all letters posted in Nova Scotia, and addressed to any place in this Province, the United States, P. E. Island, as well as to the United Kingdom, must be prepaid by stamp.

Official letters, addressed to the Provincial and Military Public Departments, are to be treated as heretofore.

Newspapers pass free to any part of the Province, British North America, (Newfoundland and Bermuda excepted,) and the United States when sent by land mail—to be put up in covers open at the ends.

Pamphlets, Magazines, Periodicals, or Books (bound or unbound), Printed Circulars, Prices Current, Handbills, and other printed matter of like description, put up in covers open at the ends, and without any written communication, may be sent to any part of the Province to any place within the same, as well as through Nova Scotia, at the rate of 1c. per ounce, prepaid by stamp, up to 48 oz., beyond which weight they cannot be sent by mail.

Periodicals (other than Newspapers) printed and published in a Foreign Country, when specially devoted to religious education, to general education, to agriculture, to temperance, or to any branch of science, or addressed directly from the office of publication, shall be transmitted to any place in Nova Scotia to which they are addressed, free of charge.

Newspapers printed and published in any Foreign Country, when received in Mails, and addressed to any place in Nova Scotia, are taxed one cent each.

All British and Colonial Newspapers are sent free.

British reprints of copyright works from the United States, by *land mail or steamer*, charged letter postage.

For Dartmouth *daily*, postage 2c.

For Musquodoboit Harbor, Monday, Wednesday and Friday morning at 6 o'clock. Return Mail due on Monday afternoon at 6 o'clock.

For Prospect on Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Return Mail due on Thursday morning at 11 o'clock.

For Turns Bay, Ketch Harbor, Portuguese Cove and Sambro on Saturday morning at 7 o'clock. Return Mail due on Monday.

Letters for *Registry* must be posted half an hour previous to the closing of the mail by which they are to be forwarded, and the postage as well as the registration fee must be *prepaid* by stamp.

Letters *prepaid by stamps*, and dropped into the Letter Box during the night, and up to 5 o'clock, A.M., will be forwarded by the mails despatched same morning.

When the mails from England arrive before 9 P.M. they are delivered the same evening, and after that hour at 6 next morning.

All other mails arriving before 7 P.M. will be delivered the same evening; if after that hour, at 7 o'clock the following morning.

The Postmaster General is not liable for the loss of any letter or package, unless such loss should arise from his own default.

3. The Money Orders shall be made out upon forms supplied by the Head Office, and no Order will be valid or payable unless given upon the regular printed form.

4. Persons applying for Money Orders will be required to state the particulars upon a Form of Application provided for that purpose.

5. When, for sufficient reason, the purchaser of a Money Order desires to change the place of payment named therein, the issuing Postmaster will take back first Order and issue another, charging commission as for an original Order.

6. If a wrong name has been inserted in an Order the remedy is similar to that in the foregoing case.

7. Parties procuring Money Orders will please to examine them carefully, to see that they are properly filled up and stamped. This caution will appear sufficiently important when it is understood that an Order defective in any important respect will throw difficulties in the way of its payment.

8. When a Money Order is presented for payment at the office on which it is drawn, the Postmaster, or Clerk employed, will use all proper means to assure himself that the applicant is the party named and intended in the advice, and upon the payment of the Order will be careful to obtain the signature of the payee to the receipt at foot.

9. When, through illness or other insuperable difficulty, the payee—that is, the person named in the advice—is prevented from presenting the Order in person, the Postmaster will be at liberty to accept a written

authority from him in favor of a second person, provided always that such written authority is satisfactorily proved to be genuine.

10. Any Money Order Post Office may repay an Order issued by itself, such Order to be signed by the remitter. If remitter be unable to apply personally, caution to be observed as provided in paragraph 9.

11. For the present, the Offices in this Province which are authorized to grant and pay Money Orders are as follows, viz.: General Post Office, Halifax, Post Offices at Amherst, Amigonish, Annapolis, Arichat, Baddeck, C. B., Digby, Guysborough, Kentville, Lunenburg, Liverpool, Pictou, Port Hood, Port Mulgrave, Shelburne, Sydney, Truro, Windsor and Yarmouth.

12. Postmasters, when not in funds, may defer payment of money for six days for the purpose of obtaining a supply from the Head Office.

PARCEL POST.

Parcels closed at the ends and sides may be posted at any Post Office in Nova Scotia, for conveyance to any other Post Office (not Way Office) in the Province, at a rate of postage subject to the following conditions:

- 1. No letter or letters shall be enclosed.
- 2. The parcel shall not contain any explosive substance, glass, liquids, or other matter likely to injure the ordinary contents of the mail, under penalty of the forfeiture of the parcel.
- 3. The weight of the parcel shall not exceed 3 lbs., nor the size exceed one foot in length or breadth, or six inches in thickness.
- 4. Parcels must be prepaid at the following rates, and by postage stamps (not by money):

5. The parcel may be registered, on prepayment, also by stamp, of a registration fee of 10c., in addition to the above rate.

6. The parcel shall have the words "By Parcel Post," plainly written over the address. It should be well and strongly put up, and be legibly addressed to the Post Office address of the intended receiver, including the name of the County in which the Post Office is situated. The following is an example of the mode of address recommended

7. If the name and address of the sender be written on the parcel, it will, if delivery should fail from any cause, be returned unopened to the sender on payment of an additional rate of 25c. for the return conveyance.

8. If the number of stamps affixed to a packet be insufficient to prepay the proper rate, the amount deficient will be rated unpaid, with a fine of 10c. in addition.

EXEMPTIONS UNDER THE RECIPROCITY TREATY WITH UNITED STATES.

Grain, flour, and breadstuffs of all kinds; Animals of all kinds; Fresh, smoked and salted meats; Cotton Wool, seeds and vegetables; Undried fruits, dried fruits; Fish of all kinds; Products of fish, and all other creatures living in the water; Poultry, eggs; Hides, furs, skins, or tails, undressed; Stone or marble, in its crude or unwrought state; Slate; Butter, cheese, tallow, lard, horns, manures; Ores of metals of all kinds; Coal, pitch, tar, turpentine, ashes; Timber and lumber of all kinds, round, hewed, and sawed, unmanufactured in whole or in part; Firewood; Plants, shrubs and trees; Pelts; Wool; Fish oil; Rice, broom corn, and bark; Gypsum, ground or unground; hewn, wrought or unwrought Burr or Grind-stones; Dye stuffs; Flax, hemp and tow, unmanufactured; unmanufactured Tobacco; Rags.

PACKETS FROM HALIFAX.

The Steamer for England arrives from the United States at Cunard's wharf fortnightly, that is about midnight every other Thursday, and the same week the Steamer from England arrives and proceeds to Boston.

Messrs. Cunard & Co., have also Steam Packets running to Bermuda monthly and St. John's, N. F., fortnightly,—the latter touches at Sydney during the summer months.

Messrs. J. M. Watson & Co., have two packets running continually to Boston, viz: the barque *Halifax*, and the brig, *Boston*.

A packet runs between Halifax and Liverpool, Queen's Co., leaving Cronan's wharf occasionally through the month.

Two fine schooners—the *Sylvia* and the *Friend*—sail about every ten days for Lunenburg,—the former from Black's and the latter from J. M. Watson & Co's wharf.

The Guysboro' packet sails from the Long Wharf.

The Sydney (sailing) packet generally starts from Caldwell's wharf.

LIGHT HOUSES.

On the coast of Nova Scotia, and on the coast of New Brunswick, in the Bay of Fundy, Cape Race, Newfoundland, Gulf and River St. Lawrence, and Strait of Belle Isle.

MEAGHER'S BEACH—East side Halifax Harbor. *A fixed light.*

SAMBRO ISLAND—West entrance Halifax Harbor. *A fixed light.*

CROSS ISLAND—Entrance to Lunenburg Harbor. *Two lights—flash light above, fixed light below.*

IRON-BOUND ISLAND LIGHT—Off the entrance of LaHave River. *A bright, flash light of ten seconds duration, followed by an eclipse of thirty seconds. The lantern is placed on a square wooden tower, painted white on the southern side of the Island, and is visible from all points of approach. Elevation seventy-five feet above sea level.*

PORT MEDWAY—*A fixed white light on Admiralty head, W. side of the entrance of the port. Building square, painted white with black square*

in the centre of seaward sides, forty feet above sea level, and stands within thirty fathoms of the shore.

LIVERPOOL.—South end of Coffin's Island. *A plain revolving light.*

FORT POINT harbor light, at the head of Liverpool harbor, southern entrance of the river. *A bright fixed light*, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the larboard hand when entering the harbor.

RAGGED ISLAND HARBOR LIGHT.—On Gull Rock, off the entrance of the harbor. Building square, and painted *white*, exhibiting a *clear, fixed light*, at an elevation of fifty-one feet above the sea level, and is situated in lat $43^{\circ} 39'$ N., and long. $64^{\circ} 66'$ W.

SHELburne.—McNutt's Island. *Two fixed lights*, one above the other.

BARRINGTON.—Baccaro Point, east side of the entrance to Barrington Bay. *A flash light* of fifteen seconds.

CAPE SABLE.—The lighthouse now building on Cape Sable, in the County of Shelburne, is intended to show a *red fixed light*. The building is an octagon, and is to be painted *white*.

SEAL ISLAND.—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy is on the south point of Seal Island. *A plain, white light*, elevated about eighty feet above high water mark, and may be seen, on approaching the Island, from any point of the compass. A very dangerous rock, under water, but upon which the sea always breaks, called Blonde rock, about three and one-third miles S. by W., by compass, from the Light House. Between this rock and the Island there are some dangers—the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels, therefore, ought not to attempt passing between them.

PUBLICO HARBOR LIGHT.—A Beacon Light on the S. E. side of the entrance to Publico Harbor, situate on the E. side of the entrance to the Bay of Fundy, about thirteen miles northerly of Cape Sable. Building square, painted *white*. *A fixed red light*, on the seaward side, twenty-eight feet above high water level, (rise and fall twelve feet,) and stands fifteen fathoms from low water mark. The point of bench is bold.

YARMOUTH.—West side of the harbor. *A plain, revolving light.*

A **FOG BELL** has been erected on the E. Cape of Yarmouth harbor, a few feet to the southward of the Light House, and about one and a quarter miles from the extreme outer point of the Cape. Strikes *seven* times per minute. Bell not in operation at night.

BRIAR ISLAND.—*A plain, white light*, situate about half a mile N. E. from the N. W. point of the Island.

WESTPORT.—Peter's Island, at the South entrance of the Grand passage. *Two white lights*, placed horizontally, to distinguish it from Briar Island Light, at an elevation of forty feet above high water mark.

DIGBY GUT LIGHT.—On the W. side of Digby Gut, from Briar Island north-eastward. *A fixed, white light.*

PORT WILLIAMS, LATE MARSHALL'S COVE.—A Beacon Light building, *square* and painted *white*—exhibits at a distance of about five miles a white light, and on nearer approach a green light. Port Williams is distant from Digby Light House East 25 miles, and from Black Rock Light House West 27 miles.

MARGARETVILLE BEACON LIGHT.—Building square and painted white—exhibits at a distance of about five miles a white light, and on nearer approach a red light. Margaretvile is distant east thirty-seven miles from Digby Light House, and West 15 miles from Black Rock

Light House. These Lights in the above Beacon Lights distinguish them from other lights in their vicinity.

BLACK ROCK LIGHT—On the southern shore of the Bay of Fundy. *A fixed, white light.*

APPLE RIVER LIGHT—North side of the entrance to Apple River, in Chignecto, or Cumberland Bay. *Two fixed lights, placed horizontally.*

PATRIDGE ISLAND RIVER—An octagonal light beacon, on the W. side of the entrance to Patridge Island River, Parrsborough, on the N. side of the Basin of Minas, and exhibits a *plain, white light*, at an elevation of thirty feet above high water,—rise and fall about forty-five feet. The tower is white, and stands close to high water mark on the beach. Vessels can only enter the harbor at high water, and must lie aground on the soft bottom when the tide is low.

HORTON BLUFF LIGHT—In the Basin of Minas, ninety-five feet above sea level, high water; rise and fall forty or forty-five feet. Building square, painted *white*; stands sixty feet from the Bluff, and shows a *white light*, which may be seen in clear weather over the greatest part of the Basin of Minas, (after passing Cape Blomedon,) and above the Five Islands, and up Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it.

BURNCOAT HEAD LIGHT, BASIN OF MINAS—The Lantern is erected on a square tower attached to the main building, and shows a *plain, white light* about 75 feet above high water level, and visible from all points of approach. Tower and building painted white. Bearings and distances—Cape Blomedon N. 70° , W. 26° 5', 10 miles. Brick Kilo Ledges N. 52° , W. 7° 5', 10 miles. Economy point N. 36° , W. 3° 9', 10 miles.

DEVIL'S ISLAND—An octagonal building on the S. W. point of Devil's Island, at the entrance of the Eastern passage to Halifax harbor, and exhibits a *red light* on the seaward sides, to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach lights; stands forty-five feet above high water mark; rise and fall six feet. The tower painted dark brown, with a white belt between the Balcony and Lantern to distinguish it in the day time.

EASTERN BEAVER, OR WILLIAM'S ISLAND—*A white, revolving light.*

WHITE HEAD ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. W. point of White Head Island. The tower is square, painted *white*, stands seventy-five fathoms from the water's edge, with an octagonal iron lantern, sixty feet above sea level at high water; rise and fall six feet. The light is distinguished by *bright flashes* of ten seconds duration, followed by eclipses of ten seconds, displaying alternately three flashes and three eclipses in a minute. The light will not be totally obscured during the eclipse.

CANSEAU, CRANBERRY ISLAND—*Two fixed lights, one above the other.*

GUYSBOROUGH HARBOR BEACON LIGHT—On the W. side of the entrance to the harbor, head of Chedabucto Bay. *A fixed light.*

ARICHAU BEACON—A light on Point Morichi, on the south-east side of the southern entrance to the harbor. Building square, painted *white*. *A white light* thirty-four feet above the sea level.

EDDY, OR SAND POINT LIGHT—On Eddy, or Sand Point, on the west side of the south entrance to the Strait of Canseau, distinguished by *two white lights* placed horizontally, twenty-five feet above sea level. Building square, painted *white*, with a *black diamond* on the seaward side.

WEST SIDE OF THE GUT OF CANSEAU—A *fixed white light*.

CAPE GEORGE—The lighthouse now building on Cape George, in the County of Sydney, is intended to show a *white* revolving light, at intervals of thirty seconds. It is a square building, and is to be painted *white*.

PICTOR HARBOR LIGHT—On the south-east side of the entrance to the harbor. *Two fixed lights*, vertical—upper one *white*, lower one *red*.

PICTOU ISLAND LIGHT—On the south-east point of the Island. Building square, and painted *white*. A *white fixed light*, fifty-two feet above high-water mark.

PORT HOOD LIGHT—Changed from *white* to *red*, when seen from the northern entrance, to distinguish it from Margaree and North Canso Lights.

SEA WOLF, OR MARGAREE ISLAND LIGHT—Situate on the N. W. side of the Island of Cape Breton, nearly midway between Port Hood and Cheticamp Harbors, and distant from Cape Breton two and a half miles. A *plain white light*. The lantern is placed on a square wooden tower, painted *white*, near the centre and summit of the Island. The lantern is 298 feet above sea level—visible from all points of approach. To vessels in proximity to the Island the light may become obscured by the abrupt cliffs or sides of the Island, which may serve as a guide to tack or anchor by, as hundreds of vessels find anchorage on the south-east side. The chief landing is near the south-east end, in shore, where a few fishing stages and boats are kept in use during the fishing season.

ST. PAUL'S ISLAND—A *fixed light* on the north-east end, and a *flash light* on the south-west end. Both *white lights*.

LOW POINT LIGHT—East side of Sydney, C. B., Harbor. A *fixed white light*.

FLINT ISLAND LIGHT—On Flint Island, on the eastern coast of Cape Breton. Lat. $46^{\circ} 11' 5''$ N., and Lon. $59^{\circ} 45' 20''$ W., and exhibits a *bright, flash light*, every fifteen seconds, visible from all points of the compass. The light is sixty-five feet above sea level, and can be seen at the distance of twelve miles.

SCATTERIE ISLAND.—A *white revolving light* at the east end of the Island.

LOUISBURG—On the east side of the entrance to the harbor. A *fixed light*.

GANNET ROCK LIGHT—This light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Islands, off Machias, a distance of about twenty miles. A *white, flash light*, twenty seconds dark and forty seconds light, in each minute. Building painted in stripes, *vertical, black and white*. Between the northernmost and southernmost of the Murr Ledges, there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them *almost* above water, and extend eastward from the Light House about four miles. From this range farther *southwardly*, about six miles from the Gannet Light, lies a dangerous breaker called the Bull—this may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands near the S. W. end of Grand Manan open.

MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND LIGHT—*Two fixed, white lights* upon the Machias Seal Islands, forty-five feet above high water, and bearing from each other E. S. E. and W. N. W., distant about 200 feet, by which circumstance, of two Light Houses at the same station, they will be immediately distinguished from all other lights upon the coast, British or

American. Both buildings painted *white*. Vessels standing to the northward between these lights and the Gannet Rock, should tack or haul off the moment they bring these lights into one, as they will be then not more than three-fourths of a mile from the Murr Ledges, if more than five miles to the east of the light.

HEAD HARBOR LIGHT.—Next in order after passing Grand Manan and the plain white light (American) on West Quoddy Point, is Head Harbor Light, placed on the N. E. extremity of Campo Bello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles, Moose Island, and the Inner Bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels also at all times to enter Head Harbor. *A fixed, white light. Building painted white, with a red cross on it.*

POINT LE PREAU LIGHT.—Upon this projecting headland two lights are placed, one above the other, in the same house, and distant twenty-eight feet. Both lights are seen from every point of the compass where they may be useful; both are *fixed* and *white*. Building painted *white* and *red*, in stripes, five feet broad each, horizontally.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND LIGHT.—At the entrance of the river and harbor of St. John, N. B. *A fixed, white light.* The building painted *red* and *white* in vertical stripes.

BEACON LIGHT.—Within Partridge Island, and upon a spit or bar, which extends about half a mile south south east off Sand Point, and which dries at two-thirds ebb, stands the Beacon Tower. *A fixed white light.* Building painted *white* and *black* in stripes vertically.

QUACO LIGHT.—*A revolving, white light*, placed on a small rock, off Quaco Head, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute. The light can be seen from any quarter where a vessel can approach. Building painted *white* and *red*, in horizontal stripes.

CAPE ENRAGE LIGHT.—On a point of that name in Westmoreland, nearly opposite Apple River Harbor, N. S. Building painted *white*, and about 120 feet above the tide mark. *A plain, white light.*

WEST QUODDY LIGHT.—This is an American light, placed on the west side of the entrance in the St. Croix, by Lunenburg and Eastport.

A LIGHT HOUSE has been erected upon CAPE RACE, Newfoundland. *A fixed white light*, from sunset to sunrise. The light is visible to seaward from N. E. by E. round by the S. E. and S. to W., and is elevated 180 feet above mean water level of the sea, and may be seen in clear weather 17 miles from a ship's deck. The tower is striped red and white vertically. It stands close to the old beacon which has been cut down. The lighthouse is in Lat. 46 degrees, 39 minutes, 19 seconds, N., Long., 53° 2' 28" W. Barings magnetic. Var. 24° W.

In the River and Gulf of St. Lawrence and Strait of Belle Isle:

BELLE ISLE LIGHT.—An island at the eastern entrance of the Strait of Belle-Isle, separating Labrador from Newfoundland, situated at the extreme south-west point of the island. *A single fixed white light.* Building—circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour. Lat. N. 51° 53' 0"; Long. W. 25° 26' 0". Whole horizon lighted, and seen in fair weather 28½ nautical or 32½ statute miles.

POINTE AMOUR LIGHT, Labrador Coast, Strait of Belle-Isle, at the south-east point of Forteau Bay, Lat. N. 57° 27' 30"; Long. W. 56° 53' 40". *A single fixed white light*—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 18½ nautical or 21½ statute miles. Build-

ing—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

ANTICOSTI LIGHT at the extreme west end of the island of Anticosti Lat N. $49^{\circ} 52' 30''$; Long. W. $64^{\circ} 35' 0''$. A single, fixed white light—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 15 nautical or 18 statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

CAPE ROZIER LIGHT.—East coast of Gaspe, at the extreme point of the Cape. Lat. N. $48^{\circ} 51' 0''$; Long. W. $64^{\circ} 35' 0''$. A single fixed white light—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather $16\frac{3}{4}$ nautical or $19\frac{1}{2}$ statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light color.

Signals will be given at or near each of the above four light houses by means of an air or fog whistle, sounded at short intervals during foggy weather and snow storms, or by a nine pounder gun, fired every hour, in case of the whistle being out of order.

Made on the Flag Staff at Citadel Hill, when vessels are seen or reported from an Outpost.

A Brigantine, a cross close up to the outer halliard.

Two or more do., a cross half hoisted.

A Topsail Schooner, a cross close up at the inner halliard.

An upper yard having been added to the Ship Staff, it will be used exclusively to designate Steam Vessels, thus:

One ball East or West indicates a Steam Vessel repeated in that quarter.

A small ball out and a large one in, a Branch Packet or Merchant Vessel.

A large Ball out and a small one in, a Man-of-War Steamer, or Royal Mail Steamer.

Numbers will be indicated as directed from the lower yard.

The lower yard is now used for sailing vessels only.

When the description of vessel in sight is ascertained from the Citadel, the following descriptive colours will be hoisted at the mast head :

A Union Jack, Flag Ship.

Do. with a red Pendant over it, a two decker.

Do. with a blue Pendant over it, a Frigate.

Do. with a blue and white Pendant over it, a Ship or Barque rigged Sloop-of-War.

Do. with a white Pendant over it, a Brig rigged Sloop-of-War.

Do. with a red and white Pendant over it, a Schooner or Cutter-of-War.

A white Pendant with two blue crosses, a Transport or a vessel with troops on board—if a Man-of-War, the Union under.

A white Pendant with a blue ball, a Steamer—if a Man-of-War, the Union under.

A red Flag pierced white, Royal Mail Steam Packet from England.

A blue and red Flag crossed white, do. from Boston.

A white and blue Pendant, do. from Newfoundland.

A white and red Pendant, do. from Bermuda.

A blue Pendant, a Ship.

A red Pendant, a Brig.

A red and white Pendant, a Brigantine.

A white Pendant, a Sloop or Schooner.

HACKNEY CARRIAGES.

[*Extracted from an Ordinance of the City, passed May 15th, 1860.*]

Any person or persons having a license in full force, who shall stand his carriage in any other than its appointed place or manner, or not have it properly numbered, or any driver or person in charge of a licensed carriage who shall not produce the tables of fares and distances when thereto required, or who being upon his stand dis-engaged shall refuse to convey any person seeking to employ him, or who shall in any way violate this ordinance, shall for each offence, besides being liable to have his license revoked, forfeit and pay such fine as under and by virtue of this Ordinance may be adjudged against him. And the owner or driver of any such carriage who shall demand or extort from any person or persons a sum beyond the rate of fare herein established, or hereafter to be established, may be so fined, and shall forthwith forfeit the license for such carriage and be liable to refund to the party grieved the sum so extorted, with costs of prosecution. Livery stable keepers not occupying the stands of said City shall be liable, in every respect, to this Ordinance, except as to going on the stands.

For every carriage hired by the hour for one person, 2s. 6d., each additional grown person, 1s., each child, 6d. Any number of minutes over ten and less than fifteen shall be counted as one quarter hour on time of hiring; for each quarter hour detention the party or parties carried shall pay one-fourth of the sum they are bound to pay for the one hour.

To and from any steamer, passenger vessel—to and from any hotel or dwelling-house to any stage office or other place within a mile, with half cwt. luggage,—1s. 3d.

As above, with more than $\frac{1}{2}$ cwt. and less than 2 cwt. of luggage, 2s. 6d.

TRUCKMEN'S REGULATIONS.

Extract from an Ordinance of the City Council, passed May 15th, 1860.

No Licensed Truckman, being on his stand, shall refuse or neglect to cart, truck, or employ his horse and cart, truck, or sled, within the said City of Halifax, for any person when requested.

The following shall be the table or rates and prices of truckage payable to, or to be demanded by the truckmen of the City of Halifax for their service, subject however to be altered from time to time by the resolution of Council :

Clap Boards $1\frac{1}{2}$ M.; Grain, Wheat 20 bushels; Barley 25 bushels; Oats 30 bushels; Potatoes and other vegetables 20 bushels; Salt $2\frac{1}{2}$ hhd.; Fish, loose, 10 quintals; Leather or hides $\frac{1}{2}$ ton; Cables 10 cwt.; Loose Articles 10 cwt.

In removing the furniture of a house the rate to be settled by agreement of parties, if not settled, 2s. 6d. a load per half Mile.

If any Licensed Truckman shall ask, demand, or receive, from any person any greater rates of fare than is allowed by the table aforesaid, or may hereafter be allowed and prescribed, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of not less than five shillings nor over twenty shillings.

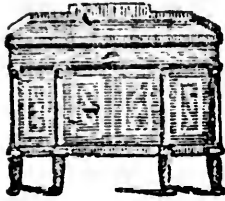

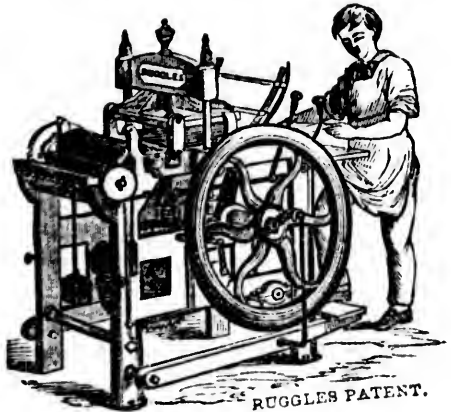
