

# **ROSE-GROWING AS A RECREATION**

### "NATURE THE ONLY PHYSICIAN"

Health and recreation for yourself and joy unmeasured for others also are the fruits of growing your own Roses.

What more wholesome recreation can you imagine to restore jaded nerves or refresh one after a weary round of the day's work than growing one's *own Roses?* 

But even Rose-growing may be discouraging, unless, in the first place, you have the knowledge of *how to get what you want*.

It's the "know how" at the start that insures success and satisfaction at the finish.

#### You or your architect must picture your house before you build it; to do this, seeing what others have done will help you to formulate your own ideas, and, what is quite as important, to know your materials and their possibilities. These two pages are intended to remove the mystery from "Success with Roses."

### HOW TO SELECT YOUR ROSES

No other family of plants, probably, is more widely spread over the face of the earth than the Rose. Few other plants have in the same genus so many different types and species. Thus it is that, from the tiny midget Roses to those of untold age and marvelous dimensions, we find every size of bush and almost every habit of growth.

Landscape architects, the expert users of Roses, call for many different types to fashion *their* garden pictures. *You, too,* reader, may add refreshing variety and the charm of novelty to *your* garden picture *if*, first, you know each separate family and its traits. To help you we indicate below only a few of these families and the broader classifications. On the opposite page are some of the ways in which Roses may best be used.

Compare each paragraph as numbered with corresponding illustration below, to assist in comparing types.

#### 1. Creeping Roses. See kinds marked • on page 28.

A few varieties in the Wichuraiana family which cling close to the ground. They throw out runners which sucker and fasten themselves tightly, thus making them valuable on embankments, as "a thing of beauty," and also to prevent the soil from washing.

#### 2. Baby Roses. See page 21

*Polyantha*, also called Baby Ramblers, even in the bush form which do not ramble at all. They are remarkable for an almost constant display of bloom. Quantities of small blossoms in clusters cover the bushes throughout a longer uninterrupted period than almost any other family. They are used as individual specimens, for low hedges, for solid beds or for edging.

#### 3. Bush Roses

We describe them here in two sizes (a) and (b).

#### (a) SHORT. 15. to 30 inches. See pages 10 to 15, 16 to 19, and 22

Most of the Roses in the Tea and Hybrid Tea classes, also the Bourbon, Bengal and Chinas, belong to this group, like the Killarneys, Cochets and the Roses in our Reliable Dozen (p. 34). See the garden scenes on pp. 12, 13, 14 and 15.

### (b) TALL, 3 to 4 feet or more. See pages 32, 33 and 35

Most of the Hybrid Perpetuals with larger and fewer flowers are in this group, and some Hybrid Teas, like Gruss an Teplitz. Among Hybrid Perpetuals, Hugh Dickson, J. B. Clark, and Frau Karl Druschki often grow larger than the others.

#### 4. Shrub Size Roses

We speak of this group in this manner because they are too large to plant with other Roses in the Bush Rose beds, but rather do they lend themselves for use on the lawn, either in groups or as specimens, much as you would plant shrubbery. The Rugosas, on page 29, make robust bushes, 3 to 4 feet through and 4 to 6 feet high. Some grow stronger than this. Their compactness and uniformity also commend them for hedge uses. Harison's Yellow (p. 30) is in the shrub class, as is the wonderful new Hugonis (front page); also the Sweetbriar and Moss Roses, p. 30.

This term, or phrase, is better known and more used abroad than in America. May Queen Rose (p. 27), Golden Rambler (p. 25), and other Roses, including Birdie Blye (p. 22), and some too large to be well-behaved Bush Roses and not large enough to be vigorous climbers, are tied to a stake or support and called Pillar Roses. The stronger growing climbers, like American Pillar (back cover), may likewise be cut back and so trained.

There is almost as much variety in Climbing Roses as in all above five groups combined. The most valuable group of Climbers are the hardy ones which bloom only during the spring and early summer—the *Multifloras*, and the *Wichuraianas* and *their Hybrids*, bloom in clusters. See pp. 26, 27, and 28. Nearly all of these grow to a great height (see cut, p. 26). The Wichuraiana family has most pliable branches and is easily trained. The other large group of Climbers are less hardy but bloom riotously in the spring and some during summer and fall; they are climbing sports of the Teas, Hybrid Teas and Polyanthas (see pp. 23 to 25).

#### Hardiness

All Roses on pp. 26 to 35 (except pp. 31 and 34) are hardy. Roses, pp. 10 to 25 inclusive, need winter protection in latitude north of Philadelphia. For winter protection see pp. 28 and 29 in "How to Grow Roses" (p. 7).

# A ROSE FOR EVERY PLACE AND PURPOSE

"The success of the Rose in this country is very largely a question of the selection of adaptable varieties."—DR. LIBERTY H. BAILEY.

The opposite page has helped you, no doubt, to avoid selecting those Roses *not* well suited to your climate, and to a choice of the right ones for your locality. That is very important. Having received your Roses, do you yet realize in how many different ways they may be used, what clever, original, and decorative arrangements may be employed to make your home beautiful?

Let us note the climbing Roses, for example. It is difficult to imagine a home with grounds at all that is too small for at least one climbing Rose. A climbing Rose that covers the entire side of a house may need only two cubic feet of soil to grow in. (Please note in passing the rose-embowered house on page 26.) The ingenuity of our readers will conceive a greater variety of uses than the few examples pictured on this page. A much more complete treatment of the subject will be found in our book, "How to Grow Roses."

- 1. For Trellis. For covering a trellis, select from the climbers, pages 23 to 28, inclusive, and especially those on page 26. A trellis may be made of wood, wire, or other materials, and may be used about the house, porch, or garden, or for a screen.
- 2. For an Archway. Use the same varieties as for above. "Dig deep while sluggards sleep," and you'll have Roses galore. The archway is most effective over a pathway or entrance.
  - **3. Pergola.** A pergola, like an open tunnel, made up of a series of connected arches, should be covered with the same varieties recommended for arches, and is a great addition to any garden.
  - **4.** Fences. First of all, plan for a substantial support, and choose, according to taste, from the long-branched climbers on pages 23 to 28, but especially on pages 26 to 28.
  - **5.** Banks or Stumps. Any ugly or unsightly objects, from stumps to buildings, may be transformed into bowers of beauty. Expense is trifling, compared with the satisfaction. The hardy climbers, and especially Wichuraianas, are best for this purpose.
  - 6. Tree Roses are more fully described on page 9. We cannot begin to tell in this small space all the great variety of uses of the Rose. For complete information, we recommend that you refer to our book on the subject, "How to Grow Roses." See below.

### "HOW TO GROW ROSES" By ROBERT PYLE

To a lover of Roses there is more than this; for a beginner is told how to begin, how to establish ideals, and get started right; after which comes the valuable "Calendar of Operations," telling when and how to prune, spray, fertilize, and otherwise care for Roses the year round. There is a chapter on "Where to

Plant Roses," and others on drainage, soil, and fertilizers. You are told how to handle the plants when you receive them and the best way to nulch and protect them during the winter. Farther on is a most valuable list of 158 Roses, with instructions for pruning each one. The book ends with a comprehensive list of "Roses Arranged in Classes," that should be of value to any lover of "the Queen of Flowers." Price \$1, postpaid.

The Hybrid Perpetuals are considered the most valuable of all Roses, because they bear the largest, sweetest and most brilliantly colored flowers, and are so hardy and vigorous they live over winter with slight protection, and continue to bloom regularly from year to year. Their grand flowers are of all shades of red, crimson, scarlet, pink, and white, but no yellows. They thrive and bloom finely in all sections of the country, and should generally be planted in the open ground, as but few varieties are suitable for house culture. Some kinds do not bloom till the second year, but when fully established bloom regularly at the usual time and occasionally during the summer and fall months. Though called "Perpetual," they are not constant bloomers, with the exception of a few, such as Charles Wagner, Mme. Masson, Frau Karl Druschki, and Mrs. John Laing, but are the finest and most beautiful of all hardy Roses.



#### HOW TO ARRANGE CANNAS IN A CIRCULAR BED


Get the tallest-growing varieties in the center, and then carefully grade each succeeding circle, using dwarf kinds for the outside. Plant one Canna in center of bed, next six Cannas 18 inches apart in a circular row 18 inches from center. For each succeeding circle use six more Cannas than were used in the previous circle and make 18 inches farther away from the center. A 10-foot bed thus planted will contain 1 Canna in center, 6 in first circle, 12 in second circle, and 18 in outer circle, all 18 inches apart. HOW TO PLANT and GROW C. & J. IMPROVED CANNAS

Dormant Canna roots may be started indoors during March or April, but should not be set out until weather is settled and the ground warm—usually May or June in this latitude. When planting dormant roots do not set too deep. The eye should show a little through the ground when done. Plant in good, rich garden soil mixed with one-half of old, rotted stable manure. Set them about 18 inches apart each way. Water sparingly the first two weeks after planting; when growing freely, water liberally.







# **USEFUL ORNAMENTAL HEDGES**

Beautiful hedges add much to the appearance of a property, and are everywhere coming into more general use. They look better than fences, last longer and cost less. When once established, they require only a little cultivation and pruning each year to keep them the desired shape and size. A fence is more trouble; a hedge grows better looking every year.

## Germination Table, with Index to Flower Seeds

It is important to know the approximate time required by seeds for germination in order to sow them with satisfaction and Many seeds are condemned and neglected before they have had sufficient time to start. Always divide the packages and success. sow at different times. You can then give them a second or third trial. Sow seeds that start about the same time together. Keep the seed-box or bed moist, but not wet, and do not let the soil dry out until the seeds have had ample time to germinate. (See Selfwatering Boxes, page 79.) Seeds are influenced by conditions, and the plants may appear 25 per cent earlier or 25 per cent later than the table indicates, according to circumstances. Following is the page reference and the key to germination: **a**, 5 days, **b**, 8 days, etc. The star (\*) added means that the seeds may take much longer time than stated, some lying dormant for weeks or months before starting.

Flowers from Seeds. Any ordinary soil will grow beautiful flowers if you make it fine and mellow, and plant about the time the fruit trees are coming into bloom. Very fine seeds should be merely pressed in with the hand, therefore do not cover too deeply and do not plant when ground is wet and soggy.

Do not allow plants to stand too thickly; transplant if neces-sary. If crowded, they cannot grow or bloom satisfactorily. **Transplanting.** Nearly all flowers are improved by trans-

planting except sweet peas, poppies, nasturtiums, etc., which are usually sown where they are to grow. By starting tender seeds in window-boxes, hotbeds or coldframes, and transplanting at proper time when ready, you escape danger from frost.
