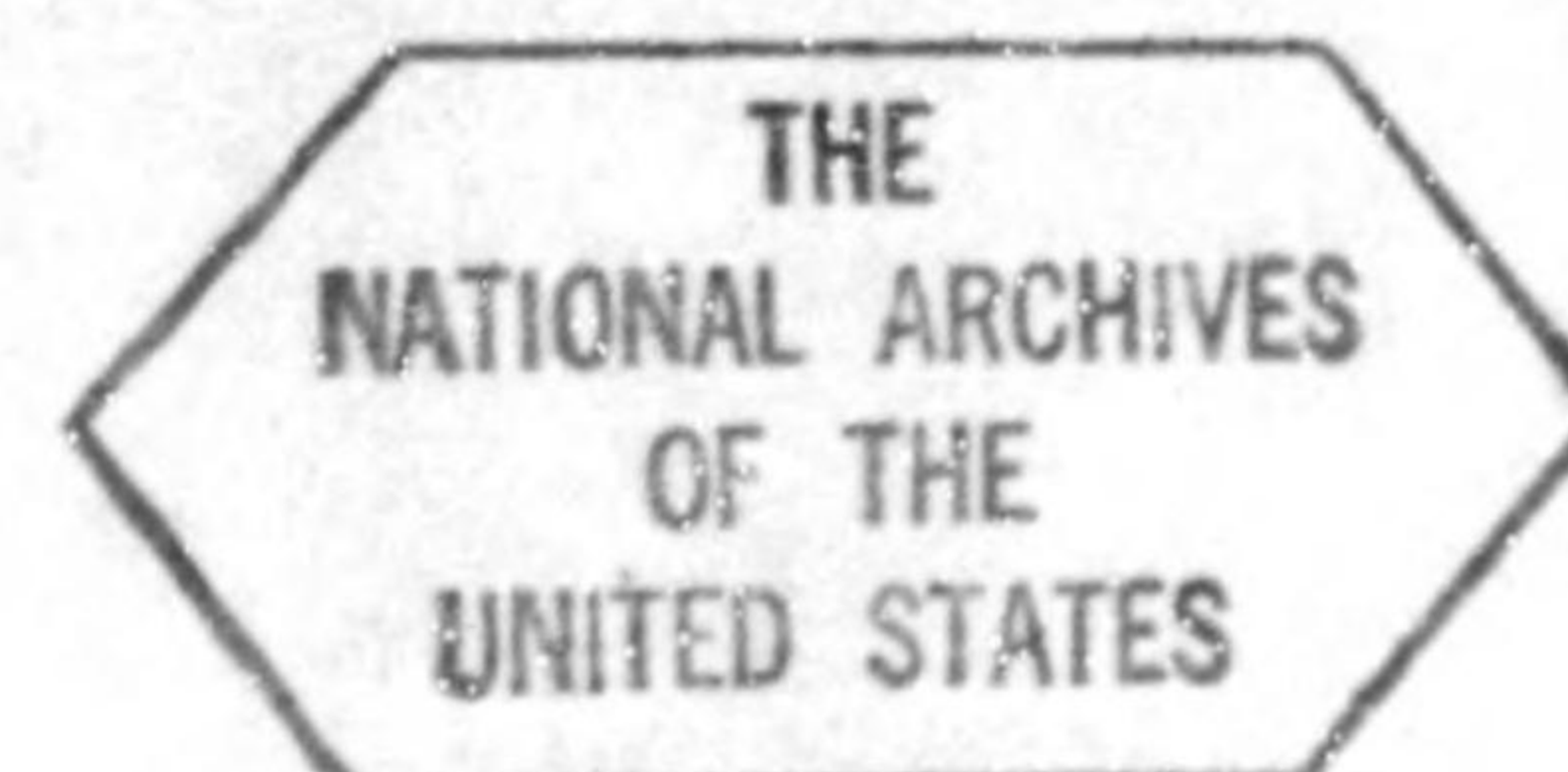

## SECTION I

### PURPOSE

1. Civil Affairs Teams are organized and equipped as indicated herein to effect the following in connection with the implementation of the directives issued to the Imperial Japanese Government by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

- a. Effect a wide and uniform surveillance of Japanese compliance with these directives.
- b. Report the results of this surveillance.
- c. Execute such enforcement as may be specifically directed.

2. Civil Affairs Teams are organized to operate both on regional and prefectural levels and, accordingly, are classified as regional, prefectural, and special-area teams. The latter are employed because of special problems found in metropolitan areas. Each team is designed to perform civil affairs functions in a particular area of responsibility. Hence all teams are not uniform in organization and equipment.

3. In addition to performing surveillance missions on the regional level of the Japanese government, regional teams will coordinate the operations and provide an administrative office to supervise the prefectural teams within each region.

4. Officers are expected, and will be trained, to perform work in more than one section. Where personnel are not allotted to a particular job title, the work will be performed by one or more officers of the team as additional duties. In certain prefectures some of the functions will not demand the full time of an officer.

5. To effect a more equitable distribution of personnel within prefectures because of seasonal activities, emergencies, or other unforeseen problems, such changes in the assignment of personnel as may be necessary will be made by the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army.

6. Job titles embrace but are not necessarily limited to:

- a. Resources, Commerce, Industry - All industries exploiting natural resources including agriculture, mining, forestry, fishing, petroleum; wholesale and retail trade, exports and imports, commodity and price control; manufacturing facilities, plant reconversions, raw materials; custody of Japanese property (except foreign exchange) held for reparations. In connection with inventory of plants held for reparations, specially trained personnel will be needed from time to time on a limited-period basis.

b. Legal - Government - Surveillance and reporting of legal matters pertaining to allied and neutral nationals and offenses against occupation forces; elections; labor laws, organizations and labor disturbances; functioning of the civil police and other Japanese officials and agencies.

c. Information and Education - Civil information to include such media of expression as radio, press, motion pictures and stage plays; religion; arts and monuments; and civil education.

d. Money and Banking - Custody of seized financial assets; digest financial trends; supervision of inventory and liquidation of banks and other financial institutions.

e. Public Health - Spread of communicable diseases, preventive measures, sanitation, nutrition, medical supply, hospitalization, veterinary matters.

f. Public Welfare - Civilian relief; relief of foreign nationals; repatriation; public and private welfare agencies; distribution of relief supplies.

g. Procurement - Procurement from the Japanese of supplies, services, facilities, labor and real estate; processing and maintenance of records pertaining thereto.
